More I-77 closures this weekend for bridge work

Below is a quick overview of projects with updated lane closures and restrictions along I-77 while bridge deck work is being done this weekend from Friday, May 1, at 8 p.m., through Monday, May 4, at 5 á.m. fór the I-77 widening over I-490.

Limited local access will be maintained within the I-77 closure.

• I-77 northbound between I-480 and Broadway

The detour will be I-480 westbound to SR 176 northbound to I-490 eastbound to Broadway Ave.

- I-480 eastbound and westbound ramps to I-77 northbound. The detour will be I-480 to SR 176 northbound to I-490 eastbound to Broadway Ave. north to I-77.
- I-490 eastbound to I-77 northbound. The detour will be Broadway Ave. north to E. 30th to I-77 north.
- •I-77 northbound to I-490 westbound. The detour will be Pershing Ave. north to I-490 west.

Monday, May 4, through mid-May, I-77 northbound over I-490 will be reduced to one lane for bridge deck work.

Garfield Muny Court begins surrender program for those with warrants

The Garfield Heights Municipal Court has started the E-Safe Surrender Program during this COVID-19 public health emergency effective now thru July 30, 2020. It works like this.

Rather than surrendering to the police or court in person, anyone with an outstanding arrest warrant who has not complied with probation or a payment plan now has three ways to clear his/her case.

- •The person may now surrender via email at safe@ghmc.org.
- Their case can be taken care of over the phone by calling the Garfield Municipal Court at 216-475-1900, Monday through Friday, between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.
- Or the information can be mailed to the Clerk of Court, 5555 Turney Rd., Garfield Heights, Ohio 44125. The person needs to provide the Court with his/her current mailing address, email address, telephone number, text number, the last four digits of his/her Social Security number, date of birth and all known case numbers.

The Court will recall any warrants immediately without any appearance and without payment of any

Bill to establish COVID-19 Emergency Relief Fund in Independence needs more discussion

At its April 14 meeting, held virtually, Independence 2020 Creek, Utility and Infrastructure Maintenance and City Council passed a variety of legislation which included an ordinance authorizing funding for emergencies and other catastrophic events, but removed from the agenda an ordinance to establish a city COVID-19 Emergency Relief Fund for citizens and businesses affected by the COVID-19 virus protections for further discussion.

The following were all passed by council last week:

- •Renewing a contract with Qwestcom Graphics for printing of the Community Spotlight and the city's newsletter for the period July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2021, at the same prices as originally bid, not to exceed
- •Accepting the bid of Kokosing Materials, Inc. to purchase asphalt paving materials on an as-needed basis for 2020, in an amount not to exceed \$10,000;
- •Accepting the bid of Specialized Construction, Inc. for the city's 2020 Crack Seal Program contract not to exceed \$138,380;
- •Accepting the bid of Geotech Services, Inc. for the 2020 Creek, Utility and Infrastructure Maintenance and Repairs Contract, not to exceed \$200,000;
- Accepting the bid of Catts Construction, Inc. for the

Repairs Contract, not to exceed \$200,000;

- the city's law director and Taft Stettinius & Hollister LLP as the city's law department;
- •Authorizing a change order to the agreement with Fabrizi Trucking & Paving for the Rockside Woods Boulevard North Road Extension Improvements (Part A) and Brecksville Road Improvements (Part B), for an added amount not to exceed \$300,000;
- Authorizing a change order with Catts Construction $for the \, Lafayette \, Subdivision \, Improvements \, Project \, in \, an$ added amount not to exceed \$150,000;
- •Authorizing the mayor to make a payment of \$229,489.66 to J.D. Williamson Construction Co., Inc. for extra work performed on the Hemlock All-Purpose Trail Project.

Approved for first reading was establishing the Chestnut Woods Phase VI Incentive District.

> E-Safe Surrender benefits include being free of the warrant and possible arrest; being able to reinstate driver's licenses with the OBMV; receiving credit for accepting responsibility for his/her actions at the time of sentencing; asking the Court to reevaluate unpaid fines and costs based on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic; asking the Court to complete community control sanctions in lieu of a jail sentence; and being returned to probation to complete rehabilitative programs rather than going to jail.

Valley View Council news

The Village of Valley View Council met last month and passed the following legislation:

- To enter into a general agreement between the U.S. Department of the Interior National Park Service and the Village of Valley View Police Department regarding law enforcement assistance.
- To enter into an agreement with Cuyahoga County to consent and cooperate with the county in repairing the Hillside Road Bridge, an ODOT project.
- •To upgrade guardrail end treatments on Rockside Road in Valley View as part of a larger ODOT project to upgrade guardrail end treatments on national high system routes within Cuyahoga and Lake counties.
- To authorize the mayor to enter into a grant agreement administered through the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant

 Laws of the Land Program Fiscal Year 2018.
- •To designate Paul Dey as the project manager and person responsible for implementing the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program on behalf of the village.

- •To renew the annual membership in the Southwest Enforcement Bureau at a cost of \$22,500, an increase of \$2500 from 2019.
- •To authorize Fire Chief Ken Papesh to hire the Geopfert Company for various repairs to the HVAC system at the Safety Center at a cost of \$11,605.

Chief Papesh reported that he was very proud that the ISO (Insurance Services Office) rating for the Valley View Fire Department had changed from a Class 3 to a Class 2. He said his department had been working very hard on their training and certifications to make this happen.

The ISO rating ranges from 1-10, with one on the scale considered "superior," and 10 meaning it does not meet the minimum standards.

> **Question** – I own a commercial vehicle - where should I park it?

> **Answer** – You CANNOT park tow trucks, dump trucks, etc., in your drive or yard. Likewise, commercial vehicles CANNOT be parked on any street in residential areas at any time unless the operator is rendering a service to a resident in the area.

> You may park a panel or pickup truck, having a gross vehicle weight of less than 4000 pounds that you use in connection with your livelihood, inside a garage during the hours it is not in use. You may NOT drive the vehicle over your neighbor's lawn and it must not make loud noises during the late evening or early morning hours.

> You may NOT park a school bus, commercial tractor, truck, panel truck, jeep-type truck, bus trailer, semitrailer, pole trailer or moving van on any street between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise. Ordinance Sections 1143.01 (c)(5) & 351.14.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RESTATING CHAPTER 898 "COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREAS" OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

On December 4, 2002, Ordinance No. 2002-073 was passed by Council enacting Chapter 898 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Maple Heights pertaining to Community Reinvestment Area, Housing Officer, Housing Council and Tax Incentive Review Council within the City of Maple Heights. This legislation established the boundaries of the Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) in the City of Maple Heights, designated a Housing Officer to administer the program and created a Community Reinvestment Housing Council and a Tax Incentives Review Council.

Subsequently, on June 12, 2003 by Ordinance No. 2003-029 and on September 4, 2019 by Ordinance No. 2019-76, Chapter 898 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Maple Heights was amended to establish new CRA boundaries.

By this notice, be advised that Chapter 898 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Maple Heights was hereby amended and restated in Ordinance No. 2020-39 passed by Council on April 15, 2020. The new Maple Heights Community Reinvestment Area 1 was re-stated to be Area Number 03547306-01 and updated criteria for tax exemption and fees were established. A complete description of this area is contained in Ordinance No. 2020-39 that was previously published in its entirety in the April 22, 2020 issue of *The Neighborhood News* and online at: www.theneighborhoodnews.com.

Here's some delicious recipes to get you started - all taken from "The Neighborhood News 80th Anniversary Cookbook."

Blueberry-Lemon Tea Bread

½ cup butter or margarine, softened

- 1 1/3 cups sugar
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- ½ tsp. salt
- 2 large eggs
- ½ cup milk
- 1½ cups blueberries, fresh or frozen
- 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice

In a large bowl with mixer at low speed, beat margarine and 1 cup of the sugar, just until blended. Increase speed to medium, beat until light and fluffy, about 5 minutes. Meanwhile, in a medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder and salt. Reduce speed to low and add eggs, one at a time, beating after each addition until well blended,

scraping sides of bowl occasionally. Alternately add flour mixture and milk, mixing just until blended. Gently stir in blueberries. Spoon batter into 9x5-inch loaf pan that has been greased and floured. Bake at 350-degrees for 65 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool loaf in pan on wire rack for 10 minutes, then remove from pan. With skewer, prick top and sides of warm loaf in many places. In small bowl, mix lemon juice and remaining 1/3 cup sugar. With pastry brush, brush top and sides of warm loaf with lemon glaze. Cool on wire

Combine lime juice, water and sugar. Pour over nectarines, banana, strawberries, watermelon, grapes and kiwi fruit, and stir gently

Apple Ham Pancakes

1 cup all-purpose flour

1 T. baking powder

½ tsp. baking soda

1 T. brown sugar

1 cup buttermilk

3/4 cup applesauce

1 apple cut into small slices

 $2\,T.\,melted\,butter\,or\,margarine$

3/4 cup diced ham

In a bowl combine flour, baking powder, baking soda and brown sugar. In a small bowl, beat egg and combine with buttermilk, applesauce, sliced apple, butter. Add to flour mixture and fold in ham. Pour batter onto hot griddle using $\frac{1}{4}$ cup per pancake. Turn over when bubbles form on top. Cook until both sides are brown. Makes about 15 pancakes.



Fruit-Cheese Breakfast Bars

11/4 cups quick Quaker Oats

1 cup flour

1 cup granulated sugar

1 cup flaked coconut

1 cup chopped nuts

3/4 cup margarine or butter, softened

½ cup brown sugar

1 cup raspberry jam or Solo filling

1/3 cup granulated sugar

8-oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened

Heat oven to 350-degrees. Mix oats, flour, 1 cup sugar, coconut, nuts, margarine and brown sugar until crumbly. Reserve 1½ cups. Put remaining crumb mixture into ungreased 13x9x2" inch baking pan. Bake 15 minutes. Cool 5 minutes. Spread with jam. Mix 1/3 cup sugar, eight and cream cheese and pour over jam. Sprinkle with reserved crumb mixture. Bake until top is golden brown, 20-25 minutes. Cool and cut into bars.

2 cups shredded Swiss cheese

2 T. flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. baking soda

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1 cup pared, chopped apple

Grease 12 muffin cups. Stir together dry ingredients. Combine egg, yogurt and oil. Add liquid all at once to cinnamon crisp mixture, stirring only until moistened. Fold in apples. Fill muffin cups 2/3 full. Bake in preheated 400-degree oven for 20-25 minutes, or until golden brown.


