#### G.H. Civic Center to open after May 15th; garbage service back to normal

Mayor Vic Collova announced at Garfield Heights Council's virtual meeting last Monday, April 27, that Kimble Recycling & Disposal will go back to its normal trash collection services effective immediately.

Earlier in April, Kimble had restricted trash and recycling materials to only what would fit in its waste cart and recycling cart. No bulk items were being picked up, and yard waste would only be collected if it fit in the customer's waste cart. All these restrictions have now been lifted, the mayor said.

Collova also said the civic center, which has been closed due to coronavirus restrictions, will be opened to the public after May 15, excluding the senior center.

He said the city could lose as much as \$1 million by the end of 2020 due to the virus. To compensate for this shortfall, Collova said all city employees have been reduced to a 32-hour work week for the next 10 weeks, including a voluntary cutback of his own salary. He said there have been layoffs in the recreation department, senior center and one in the law department.

"We've gotten no help from the stimulus package so far," the mayor said, but hopes that would be changing.

The following legislation was passed at last Monday night's council meeting:

- •To issue and sell notes not to exceed \$3 million in anticipation of issuance of bonds to pay costs of improving streets and roads by resurfacing, grading, draining, curbing, paving, and improving and constructing catch basins and other improvements designated in the plans.
- •To authorize the mayor to renew an agreement on behalf of the city with Court Community Service. Collova said the cost has gone up \$100 a month, the first increase in several years, and is well worth it for the outstanding job it does for the city.

## Recycling in Cleveland - is it a waste of time?

Cleveland residents learned last week following a Fox 8 I-Team investigation that all the items they had put out for recycling in the past four weeks are now sitting in a Lorain County landfill.

Mayor Frank Jackson issued a statement Thursday explaining why that is the case. He said residential recycling is collected by employees from the Cleveland Department of Public Works and those materials are taken to the city's Ridge Road Transfer Station before being hauled away by a third party agency for processing.

Jackson said the city's contract for handling residential recycling expired April 1, 2020, so his administration went out for bids on two different occasions. The first time no companies bid to take the city's recycled materials. The second time the city tried to secure a new contract for these services, only one bid was received.

This bid would have charged the city of Cleveland tonnage costs that were well above market prices – potentially increasing program costs by \$6 million annually, the mayor said

These unbudgeted, increased costs can be attributed to several factors, he said.

First, fundamental changes in the global market for recycled materials have changed dramatically since Cleveland's citywide program was launched. Back then the city was paid for its recyclables, but that is no longer the case.

Second, the company that bid on the latest contract had higher than anticipated transportation costs due to the fact that materials would be hauled to Southwest Ohio.

"Finally," Jackson said, "the rate of contamination in materials is higher than we would like to see – about 68% of recycled materials are contaminated and have to be sent to a regular landfill – which increases the price we would have to pay."

He said a consultant has been hired to evaluate the entirety of how the city addresses the local waste stream—including regular solid waste and recycling. As a part of this effort the consultant has been asked to identify what actions make sense based on the local context, what is consistent with the city's commitment to environmental sustainability and what is financially responsible.

"We expect this work will take a few months to complete and during this process we intend to have opportunities for public input," the mayor said.

In its I-Team report last week, Fox 8 investigators said the mayor stated he does encourage residents to continue separating the recycling so they don't get out of the habit.

As a city, we remain committed to being good environmental stewards and we remain committed to recycling," Mayor Jackson said.

Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli serves on council's Municipal Services & Properties Committee. He said he will be requesting a hearing at his May 12th committee meeting to gather more information on recycling to clarify how the city should be moving forward.

#### County weighs in

The Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District issued a media alert last Thursday concerning Cleveland's recyclable materials being landfilled. The district wants Cuyahoga County residents to know that this situation pertains to the city of Cleveland only.

Curbside recycling collected in the other 57 communities in the county are sent to three northeast Ohio material recovery facilities to be processed. The problems experienced by Cleveland were due in large part to residents not recycling properly. Proper recycling reduces the cost of recycling by reducing the amount of non-recyclable material that has to be removed from the marketable materials.

Recycling is as important as ever, district officials said. County residents can continue to support the success of their community recycling program by reducing contamination and recycling right. Recycle right by only placing cans, cartons, glass bottles and jars, mixed paper and boxes plus plastic bottles and jugs unbagged in your recycling cart or bin.

Some drop-off recycling options are available for Cleveland residents, including for aluminum cans, mixed paper and cardboard at different locations throughout the city. See a list on the county's website: www.cuyahogarecycles.org/cleveland








#### Bedford Council passes tax abatement bill for local firm

Bedford Council passed several pieces of legislation at Monday night's meeting, live streamed on YouTube, including an ordinance to create a Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) agreement with APEC Holdings, a Fire and Safety for installation of security cameras and company already based in Bedford that plans to move its operations into the former Bedford YMCA building on \$30,900. Northfield Rd.

explaining that the engineering firm was going to put "an expensive investment into that facility, well over half a million dollars," before moving their employees there

> An ordinance regarding the resurfacing of Forbes Rd. was also passed. The legislation states that the anticipated project cost is \$388,000, with the county contributing 50% of the cost, up to a maximum of \$194,000. Oakwood a neighboring municipality which shares a portion of Announcements Forbes Rd. with Bedford, has chosen not to participate in the project this year, the ordinance states.

And okayed was legislation for a contract with PVS for liquid ferric chloride, which is used to treat water at the city's Wastewater Treatment Plant before it is released into the city's waterways. PVS's bid for the water treatment chemical came in at \$608 per dry ton, versus the next lowest bid, which was \$729 per dry ton, Mallis said.

#### On first, second reading

Three pieces of legislation regarding street lighting in the city, which appear on council's agenda for passage every year, were placed on second reading, as was an ordinance levying assessments for garbage collection,

recycling and disposal.

An ordinance to retain GPD Engineering Services for sanitary sewer flow metering was placed on first reading. Part of the process for the renewal of the EPA permit for the city's wastewater treatment plant requires the city to conduct a study "as it relates to bypasses and other measures taken down at the plant," Mallis said.

Cost of the analysis as proposed by GPD is \$88,800, according to the ordinance, which will be discussed by council before possible passage at a future meeting.

Council unanimously approved a motion to abide by the Zoning Board of Appeals decision to accept a variance on an existing ordinance that states a single family dwelling shall be limited to a maximum square footage of 30% of the lot area in a residentially zoned district, requested by Angelo Amato (Ang's Contractors, LLC) representing Barbara R. Bruno of 230 Paul St.

The fire department has taken delivery of its newest vehicle, a rescue pumper; Kimble has reinstated its normal collection services after several weeks and is once again picking up bulk items; and 50 trees have been planted in the city, paid for through a Cuyahoga County grant, Mallis said.

He noted that city buildings will remain closed at least until June 1, as government restrictions caused by the coronavirus continue.




