Cuyahoga Hts. Council notes

The Village of Cuyahoga Heights Council met last Wednesday, Aug. 12, and passed the following legislation:

- •Accepting Medical Mutual of Ohio's "Insured Renewal Rate" for the period Sept. 1, 2020, through Aug. 31, 2021;
- •Accepting Delta Dental's renewal rates for the period Sept. 1, 2020, through Aug. 31, 2021;
- Purchasing life insurance from Principal Life Insurance for full time village employees effective Sept. 1, 2020;
- Confirming the initial appointment of Jeffrey Heintz as a firefighter in the Cuyahoga Heights Fire Department;
- Entering into an agreement with the city of North Royalton for prisoner housing services;
- Amending the compensation schedule ranges for village employees to clarify and correct certain job titles listed on the compensation
- Entering into a Community Cost-Share Agreement with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District;
- •Acquiring a portion of 4550 Willow Parkway necessary for the Nicky Boulevard Slope Stabilization and Storm Sewer Extension Project;
- •Accepting an access and utility easement for Permanent Parcel No. 522-11-003 for the Nicky Boulevard Storm Sewer Extension and Slope Stabilization Improvements Project;
- •Accepting the alternative tax budget information of the village for the fiscal year beginning Jan. 1, 2021 and submitting it the Budget Commission of Cuyahoga County;

Cleveland Central Catholic to begin school year remotely

Officials at Cleveland Central Catholic High School have announced that for the safety and wellness of the faculty, staff and students and to support student learning, they have made the decision to follow the recommendation of the Cuyahoga County Board of Health issued on July 30, 2020, regarding plans for the upcoming school year.

Therefore, the 2020-21 school year will initially operate remotely due to the elevated health risk in-person learning brings and extracurriculars such as sports, band, theater, choir and other activities during the remote learning period will be discontinued.

"We recognize and acknowledge this decision brings sadness and disappointment," said school officials. "There will be missed social interaction and extracurricular activities. It is hard to imagine starting the school year without the positive community spirit that fills our halls."

School Calendar

The first day of remote online learning will begin Tuesday, Sept. 8, 2020. This is to ensure quality professional development is completed to prepare for nine weeks of online learning. The first nine weeks of online learning will take place Sept. 8 – Nov. 6.

Extracurricular activities

All extracurricular activities and athletics on campus or off campus are suspended through Nov. 6, 2020.

Chromebooks

To support online learning each student will be issued a Chromebook for their use. Chromebooks will be distributed on assigned days the week of August 31. begin school year remotely

Independence passes legislation to 'secure its financial future'

Two ordinances were passed by Independence Council at its regular meeting on Aug. 11, one to renew existing notes that mature in early December for up to 12 months, and the other to convert the short-term notes into long-term bonds.

Referring to these two ordinances in his report to council, Mayor Gregory Kurtz said they were being presented to council to "secure our financial future."

"These measures provide the city the financial flexibility essential to provide emergency pandemic spending, manage investments to support economic growth and fund the programs and services residents expect," the mayor continued. "I know that being able to borrow money for less than 2% for 15 years is an unbeatable deal and the common sense decision to make.

Also passed by council were the following pieces of legislation:

- To continue the appointment of Gregory J. O'Brien as the city's law director and Taft Stettinius & Hollister LLP as the city's law department;
- To extend the duration of the contract of VanCuren Services, Inc. for general city tree trimming, removal, disposal and related labor and equipment for city property;
- •To authorize an increase in the amount of funds allocated to the retention of Mazanec, Raskin & Ryder Co., LPA for professional legal services. This is for representation for former Mayor Anthony Togliatti in the pending litigation from Leonard Mazzola;
- To fund road and right-of-way repairs necessitated by numerous water main breaks, leaks, and/or water valve and/or hydrant repairs 2020;
- •To execute an agreement with Kimble Companies, Inc. for recycling processing services;
- To retain Travelers Property Casualty Company of America for insurance underwriting services for the purchase of property, automobile, inland marine/equipment and crime/cyber insurance 2020-2021;
- To authorize the retention of Dimit Architects, LLC for professional architectural and planning design services in connection with central downtown parcels located on the east and west side of Brecksville Rd. owned by the city and St. Michael's Church;
- •To grant a U-3 special condition use permit to Fortuna Funeral Home, Inc. and granting an easement for property located at 7064 Brecksville Rd.;
- To approve the 2020 annual appropriations ordinance;
- To accept the proposal of Euthenics, Inc. for professional services for the Hillside Road Sidewalk Improvements Project (Hawthorn Trace to S. Great Oaks Parkway).

Trinity High School students to start classes, In-Person or Simultaneous learning, Aug. 31

Through the tireless efforts of Trinity High School administrators, staff, students and their families, a plan for the first half-term of the 2020-2021 school year has been formulated. School officials will continue to revise the plan, policies and procedures based upon guidance from the Diocese of Cleveland, the governor, the CDC and the Ohio Department of Health when it is deemed necessary.

Each student will receive a Chromebook for his or her use while enrolled as a Trinity High School student. Based upon availability, the plan is to hand them out to each student on their class orientation day during the week of Aug. 24.

After reviewing all of the submissions, 42% of Trinity families chose the simultaneous learning option. This, along with other factors, allowed officials to make the necessary modifications to the beginning of the school year, and allow families to feel safe.

The first modification was pushing back the start dates for staff and students. Staff will now report the week of August 17 for professional development while students will

Laws of the Land in Garfield Heights

Do you live in Garfield Heights and have a question about its ordinances - what may or may not be legal in any given circumstance? This column will answer your questions with the help of members of Garfield Heights City Council.

Question – What are the laws regarding professional lawn service operators? **Answer** – **1337.05 CLEAN-UP**; **PARKING**, **LICENSE**.

(a) Professional lawn service operators shall be responsible for cleaning up all cuttings, trimmings, soil and similar debris that accumulates on sidewalks, driveways and streets of the area in which the work was performed.

(b) When parking on the street, professional lawn service operators shall park any and all vehicles in the proper direction without blocking any driveways or sidewalks other

report the week of August 24, only for one day, with their class. Dates can be changed based on guidance from the Ohio Department of Health and Gov. Mike DeWine.

Every student needs to report for this orientation day whether he or she chose In-Person or Simultaneous learning. Every student needs to wear a mask or shield from home.

Week 1 schedule will look like this:

Monday, Aug. 24: Class of 2021, 9 a.m.-noon

Tuesday, Aug. 25: Class of 2022, 9 a.m.-noon

Wednesday, Aug. 26: Class of 2023, 9 a.m.-noon

Thursday, Aug. 27: Class of 2024, 9:00 a.m.-noon

Friday, Aug. 28: Students Off, Teacher Development

Monday, Aug. 31: School In Session, All Classes

Covid Screening

With all Covid-19 related policies, procedures and guidelines, Trinity High School is following CDC and Cuyahoga County guidelines. Trinity administration maintains contact with Cuyahoga County health officials to advise on how to best operate now and as the situation

Each student will enter through his or her designated class door to have his or her temperature taken before entering the building. If a student tests above 100 degrees, they will be sent home. Once a student has tested below 100 degrees, they may enter the school with their mask or shield on and head directly to their first period

Any student or staff member must remain home if they are known to have had close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 14 days or are experiencing any symptoms.

Athletics and Co-Curricular Activities

No co-curricular activities and clubs, outside of athletics, will be allowed during the first half-term. Trinity athletics will comply with the State of Ohio, the Ohio High School Athletic Association and the Chagrin Valley Conference guidelines and regulations regarding practices, scrimmages and athletic contests. Students who have elected Simultaneous Learning are eligible to participate in athletics as long as attendance requirements


