Woman shot to death in Garfield Hts.

A 20-year-old woman was killed last Tuesday, Oct. 13, in the parking lot of an apartment complex on Valley Lane Dr. in Garfield Heights. Her boyfriend, Shavarri Dixon, 22, has been charged in the incident.

After receiving a call about a female who had been shot, police found the victim, Xenaundriyah Piskac, laying in the front passenger seat of a Chevy Impala parked at a home in the 13200 block of Littleton Rd., with her frantic boyfriend beside her.

Police extracted Piskac from the vehicle and administered CPR. GHFD arrived on scene and took over care, ultimately taking her to Marymount Hospital, where she was pronounced deceased at 9:35 p.m.

Dixon told police that earlier in the evening he had been taking a male friend back to his apartment on Valley Lane Dr., when his friend told him someone was following them. He and his friend got to the apartment complex parking lot and saw the car that had been following them parked at an angle facing Dixon's Impala. He told police he and his friend began to open fire, shooting at the vehicle in question.

Dixon told police he believes the occupants of the vehicle in question began to shoot back at his car. He said during the exchange of shots that Piskac got out of her car and was shot. He said he didn't know if she was shot by the occupants of the unknown vehicle or by he and his friend.

An anonymous witness on Valley Lane Dr. had called police earlier to report that he had heard gunshots and had seen a blue sedan flee the area, followed by a man carrying a female into a silver sedan who had presumably been shot.

The address on Littleton Rd. where police found the victim in the Impala was later determined to be the Dixon's mother's residence. They found a handgun under the basement stairs.

Dixon was transported to the Garfield Heights jail on two felony warrants out of Cleveland, and for investigation of this incident.

Laws of the Land in Garfield Heights

Do you live in Garfield Heights and have a question about its ordinances - what may or may not be legal in any given circumstance? This column will answer your questions with the help of members of Garfield Heights City Council.

Question – What are the city's laws regarding trespassing?

Answer – **541.05 CRIMINAL TRESPASS**

(a) No person, without privilege to do so, shall do any of the following:

- (1) Knowingly enter or remain on the land or premises of another;
- (2) Knowingly enter or remain on the land or premises of another, the use of which is lawfully restricted to certain persons, purposes, modes or hours, when the offender knows the offender is in violation of any such restriction or is reckless in that regard;
- (3) Recklessly enter or remain on the land or premises of another, as to which notice against unauthorized access or presence is given by actual communication to the offender, or in a manner prescribed by law, or by posting in a manner reasonably calculated to come to the attention of potential intruders, or by fencing or other

enclosure manifestly designed to restrict access;

(4) Being on the land or premises of another, negligently fail or refuse to leave upon being notified by signage posted in a conspicuous place or otherwise being notified to do so by the owner or occupant, or the agent or servant of either.

(b) It is no defense to a charge under this section that the land or premises involved was owned, controlled or in custody of a public agency.

(c) It is no defense to a charge under this section that the offender was authorized to enter or remain on the land or premises involved when such authorization was secured by deception.

(d) (1) Whoever violates this section is guilty of criminal trespass, a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. (2) Notwithstanding Section 501.99, if the person, in committing the violation of this section, used a snowmobile, off-highway motorcycle, or all-purpose vehicle, the court shall impose a fine of two times the usual amount imposed for the violation. (3) If an offender previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to two or more violations of this section or a substantially equivalent municipal ordinance, or state law, and the offender, in committing each violation, used a snowmobile, off-highway motorcycle, or all-purpose vehicle, the court, in addition to or independent of all other penalties imposed for the violation, may impound the certificate of registration of that snowmobile or off-highway motorcycle or the certificate of registration and license plate of that all-purpose vehicle for not less than sixty days. In such a case, Ohio R.C. 4519.47 applies.

(e) As used in this section:

(1) "All-purpose vehicle," "off-highway motorcycle" and "snowmobile" have the same meaning as in Section 375.01 of the Traffic Code.

(2) "Land or premises" includes any land, building, structure, or place belonging to, controlled by, or in custody of another, and any separate enclosure or room, or portion thereof. (ORC 2911.21)

He said there were four people in the car and the rear driver's side passenger was the shooter.

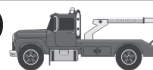

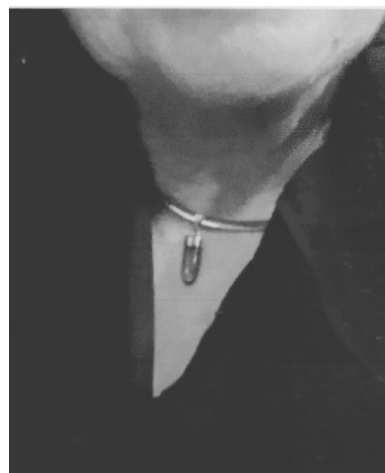
