Smart camera project in Indy aims to reduce crime

The city of Independence has replaced an existing surveillance camera on the roof of the Crown Centre building on Rockside Rd. with a new, long-range security camera. *It is not a speed camera.* It is a sophisticated, remote-controlled technology that allows dispatchers to monitor the entire Rockside Road/I-77/I-480 area and identify a vehicle's make, type, color and license plate with high-resolution precision.



During a Safety Committee hearing last week, Police Chief Michael Kilbane discussed a plan to blanket the Rockside Rd. and Granger Rd. areas with similar smart-cameras. The software identifies license plates in a matter of seconds, saving officers' valuable time.

The city works closely with neighboring departments and has mutual aid agreements with surrounding law enforcement agencies and the National Park Service. Working together, the city is able to coordinate responses to major incidents, share intelligence and investigative resources.

Many communities, including Mentor, Willoughby, Eastlake and Hunting Valley, are installing these cameras. After Houston, Texas installed cameras last year, they reported a significant decrease in crime and increased arrest of car thieves, robbery suspects and parole violators.

Legislation to fund the smart-camera project was introduced at the City Council meeting yesterday.

Canal Road section closed

Canal Rd. under the I-480/Valley View Bridge is being closed for overhead construction from Tuesday, Nov. 10, through Thursday, Nov. 12, at 6 p.m., as deck replacement work continues on the bridge above.

Maple Hts. could be out of fiscal emergency next week

After almost six years, the city of Maple Heights is expected to be released from fiscal emergency next week, Mayor Annette Blackwell and Finance Director Tinita Tillman announced at council's teleconference meeting last week.

In early 2015, then-State Auditor Dave Yost placed Maple Heights in a state of fiscal emergency after the city was found to have a deficit of more than \$2.7 million, and a five-year financial recovery initiative was implemented.

After former Mayor Jeffrey Lansky chose not to seek reelection, Blackwell was elected to her first term as mayor in November 2015. Since that time, Blackwell and other officials have worked under the supervision of the state auditor's office to bring the city out of its deficit through a variety of measures, including reducing expenses and generating revenue by bringing many new businesses to the city.

State Auditor Keith Faber's office has recommended that the city be released from financial emergency during a virtual meeting, to be held on Wednesday, Nov. 18, at 1 p.m.

"This just kind of culminates things that we've been working on for a very, very long time. This is exciting and excellent news we're receiving tonight," Blackwell said.

Land sale approved

An ordinance authorizing Blackwell, on behalf of the Maple Heights Land Reutilization Program (land bank), to sell almost seven acres of city-owned land in the Warrensville Center-Libby Rd. area to PIRHL Acquisi-

tions, LLC, for a senior living facility to be known as "Hazelwood Court" was passed at last week's meeting.

As stated in the ordinance, PIRHL, a Cleveland-based full-service investor, developer, general contractor and owner of single-family and multifamily housing, has proposed "to develop and construct in the city a 50-unit senior living facility, including a 44-unit three-story building and six one-unit cottages that will provide a quality housing option for seniors ages 55 or older."

According to a presentation given by PIRHL at a recent council committee meeting, the proposal is for 32 one-bedroom apartment units, 12 two-bedroom apartment units and 6 one-bedroom cottage units in the complex.

PIRHL will purchase 39 separate but adjoining parcels of land, consisting of approximately 6.89 acres, located west of Thomas Street between Waterbury and Dalewood aves. in the Broadway-Lee neighborhood "at a fair market value of \$470,900... less the amount of public improvement costs, currently estimated to be \$201,605," the legislation states.

PIRHL will buy the land from the city "with a contingency period to allow PIRHL to submit an application to the Ohio Housing Finance Agency for an allocation of Housing Tax Credits, so that it may attempt to secure the financing necessary to facilitate the new construction."

Economic Development Director Patrick Grogan-Myers said PIRHL, a company behind numerous housing developments in the Greater Cleveland area and throughout Ohio and other states, had a "stellar reputation" for its work in redeveloping properties.

"This partnership will bring affordable housing to the city, and ensure we can keep our senior residents in the community they know and love," he added.

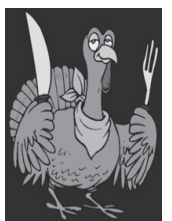
Council also passed an ordinance authorizing the Maple Heights land bank to accept the title to four vacant parcels of land in the city, owned by the Cuyahoga County land bank. The parcels are located at 5627 South Blvd., 18209 McCracken Ave., 5171 Cato St., and 15217 Rockside Rd.

Also passed was a resolution authorizing Blackwell to apply to the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) for a potential grant for the funding of a 2021 capital infrastructure improvement project, specifically the Dunham Road Resurfacing Project, from Turney to Libby rds.

The city was informed that it could receive \$500,000 in grant funding, in addition to \$250,000 in grant funding recently received, City Engineer Ed Hren stated. The goal was to supplement that total of \$750,000 with additional grant funding over the next two years to further reduce the city's costs, Hren said.

Updates

Fire Chief Vito Kavaliunas reported that the fire department had responded to a house fire in a basement on Oct. 24, and a fire at Clifton Steel on Rockside Rd. on Nov. 4 that caused "substantial damage" to a compressor room. No injuries were reported in either incident, he said.

The used squad purchased last month to replace a badly deteriorated vehicle was now in service and "much better suited to our operations," Kavaliunas said, adding that the department expected to take delivery of another, brand new vehicle in 2021.

Police Chief Todd Hansen stated that year-to-date the police department had responded to about 25,000 calls for service amounting to about 90 calls per day, averaging about six reports per day, and about three to four arrests per day. In October, the MHPD took 15 guns off the street, confiscated more than \$21,000 in drug money and 550 grams of drugs.

He briefly touched on a chase and accident that started in the city and ended up in Bedford Heights on Oct. 28, stating that officers involved in the incident were "all doing well and will be back to work soon."

Human Services Director Linda Vopat thanked the Bedford F.O.E. for a \$1,000 donation to the Maple Heights Food Pantry, and gave her thanks to the Giant Eagle Foundation for a \$3,000 donation to the same organization.

Garfield Hts. Council news

Garfield Heights Council met in regular session Monday night and passed two ordinances, one of which authorizes a collective bargaining agreement with Garfield Heights Firefighters Local 340 of the International Association of Firefighters.

The agreement which it replaces had expired in 2018, but all parties had consented to let it continue. The new agreement takes effect Jan. 1, 2020 through Dec. 31, 2023.

The other ordinance passed titled "Honorary Street Names" allows for honorary street names but does not replace the regular street names. The ordinance also lists the rules and regulations under which honorary street names will be accepted.

Mayor Vic Collova announced that because of the increasing number of COVID cases throughout the region, the Garfield Heights Civic Center has again been closed to the public. Residents with business with the Building Department can utilize the drop box outside.

Maple Hts. continues its economic recovery

GOJO Industries and Sherwood Food Distributors in Maple Heights are hiring, and other businesses have opened as the city continues its economic recovery, even in the midst of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Mayor Annette Blackwell and Economic Development Director Patrick Grogan-Myers said last week.

"As the United States works to contain COVID-19 and its impacts on the economy, the city of Maple Heights is seeing signs that the local economy is stable and positioning for growth in 2021," Blackwell stated.

GOJO and Sherwood Foods are both located in the Rockside-Dunham area of the city. GOJO, an Akron-based manufacturer of Purell sanitizing surface spray, came to the city in June 2020, and has invested \$25 million in the former Blue Coral facility at 5700 Lee Rd. South, north of Rockside Road.

GOJO plans to bring over 200 good paying jobs to Maple Heights in the next three years, Blackwell stated.

And Sherwood Foods, a food products supplier and a prominent figure in the Maple Heights business community for decades, is located at 16625 Granite Rd., just off Lee Rd. South, south of Rockside. It has invested in its

facility and expanded operations over the past five years.

Blackwell stated that Maple Heights income tax collections indicate a stabilized local economy. According to information released by the city, in year-to-date September 2020, income tax collections in Maple Heights were up 3.3%, compared to the same period in year-to-date 2018, and 2.2% higher than other comparable municipalities.

"Maple Heights businesses employ Maple Heights residents, so the health and strength of our business community directly relates to the health and strength of our residents and the community as a whole," Grogan-Myers said.

The city of Maple Heights regularly posts economic updates and information about job fairs and job openings on its website, citymapleheights.com, and the social media sites of Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn, and encourages residents to check these sites for more information.

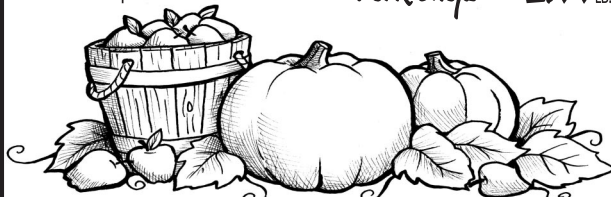

Valley View Council OKs lease/purchase of new Pierce fire engine truck

Pair missing Financial relief available for residents impacted by COVID-19 pandemic

The Village of Valley View Council met in regular session on Tuesday, Nov. 3, and authorized Fire Chief Kenneth Papesh to lease/purchase a new Pierce fire engine truck through state contract at a cost of \$742,000 for a five-year contract.

Chief Papesh noted that the current front line Engine 32 is 20-years-old, and the lead time for a new engine is 10-13 months. Mayor Jerry Piasecki said the life expectancy for an engine is 20 years.

- Other items approved by council included:
- Transferring funds from the General Fund to the Capital Projects Canal Road Fund and declaring an emergency;
 - Providing for animal control service;
 - Entering into an agreement with Precision Metal Products to provide for an incentive grant from the village;
 - Replacing existing physical servers with a virtual server thru TTX Teletronics at a cost of \$13,189.76, with the cost coming from COVID funds the village received in October;
 - Entering into a Disaster Recovery Program with TTX Teletronics for all departments except police for a period of three years at a cost of \$24,214.08;
 - Authorizing Recreation Director Von Ville to produce the 2021 recreation brochure three times from Master Printing at a cost of \$5,103;
 - Hiring Specialized Construction to do crack sealing on various streets at a cost not to exceed \$49,500. The project must be completed by Dec. 15, 2020 as part of the Cuyahoga County Preventative Maintenance Reimbursement Program.

Cuyahoga County announced yesterday a new program to help eligible residents with utility payments. A grant agreement put forth by County Executive Armond Budish requesting approval to use \$2 million of CARES Act funding to provide utility assistance to residents who have been affected by the coronavirus pandemic was approved by County Council. CHN Housing Partners, the organization administering the Cuyahoga County Rent Relief Fund, will also administer the utility assistance program funded by the county.

"We are continuing to do everything we can to assist residents in need during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic," said Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish. "During this pandemic, the need for rent and utility aid has never been greater. CHN Housing Partners reported that 66% of applicants seeking rental assistance are also seeking utility assistance. This program will support eligible residents in need of assistance paying sewer, water, wastewater, electric and gas utilities."

"Besides rent, paying utility bills is one of the biggest struggles for working families during this pandemic," said Kevin J. Nowak, executive director of CHN Housing Partners. "We are grateful to Executive Budish and County Council for allocating precious dollars to help county residents stay safely housed during this crisis."

Applicants must meet the eligibility criteria of being at or below 120% of Median Household Income (MHI) and have been impacted by COVID-19, such as through the loss of income, childcare needs or illness.

The program is expected to run from Nov. 11, 2020 through Dec. 31, 2020, but could go longer if an extension for CARES funding is approved by Congress that would allow for the program to extend beyond December 2020.

CPD 'HORSES' AROUND Indy schools return to remote learning this week as COVID cases force quarantines

Independence Schools Superintendent Ben Hegedish, in a COVID-19 update email to the district's parents, said Monday school officials were notified that a member of their maintenance team and a 10th-grade student tested positive for COVID-19.

The member of the maintenance team was not around students, he said, however, two other staff members must begin the quarantine process.

The 10th-grade student has been determined to have had close contact with 16 students and one staff member. These individuals have already left school and begun the quarantine period, Hegedish noted.

"When we opened on Sept. 2, we did so with confidence that we could provide the services and environment that made for a successful year amidst the pandemic," the superintendent said. "With our current amount of infections, staff members and classes in quarantine, correlat-

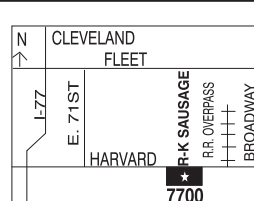
ing staffing shortages specifically in the transportation and custodial/cleaning departments, and pending test results of students and staff, I do not believe we can provide that environment for the short-term time being."

With all of these factors considered, he said, starting tomorrow, Tuesday, Nov. 10, and for the remainder of the week, Independence schools will be placed in a remote setting. This remote designation will very likely continue into next week, Hegedish said.

"By the end of this week, I will have more information and know the target date for returning to in-person learning," he continued.

"We are awaiting the return of a number of quarantined staff members along with staff members who have pending test results."

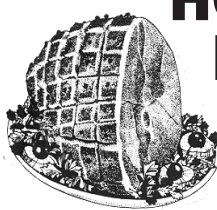
