Council approves \$300,000 sale of old Home Depot property at City View to Highland Park developers

At its regular meeting Monday night, Garfield Heights City Council passed an emergency resolution recommending Mayor Vic Collova enter into an agreement with Industrial Commercial Properties, dba Highland Park Transportation II, to sell the company two parcels of land located directly south of the old City View Center property on the site of the former Home Depot.

The approximately 20-acre parcel is currently owned by the Garfield Heights Land Reutilization Program. At the Land Bank Committee meeting held last November, the committee members authorized the sale of the property to Industrial Commercial Properties for \$300,000.

Also passed was a revamping of the city's codified ordinances regarding the makeup, qualifications, terms, purpose, duties and support of the city's Community Relations Committee.

The committee will now be comprised of seven members as follows: the mayor of Garfield Heights or his designee and six members to be chosen by the mayor and ratified by a vote of council. The committee will select from among its members a chairperson to run the meetings and present reports and findings to council when necessary.

Each member of the Community Relations Committee will serve a term of three years and must be a resident of the city throughout their term of office.

It is further stipulated in the legislation that "members of the committee shall be diverse and reflective of the diversity of community at the time of their appointment."

No member shall be an elected official from either the city or the Garfield Heights City Schools and positions on the committee are unpaid.

The purpose of the com-

mittee "shall be to foster, encourage and stimulate the improvement of community and intergroup relations among and between citizens of all races, colors, religions, sexes, gender identity, ages, ancestries, familial statuses, physical disabilities, mental disabilities, and national origins, and all economic and educational levels, so as to provide all individuals with an opportunity to grow, participate and share to the best of their ability in the economic, educational, political, social and judicial system."

Collova addresses rumors of his pending retirement

During the Comments by Citizens portion of Monday night's Garfield Heights Council meeting, Mayor Vic Collova was asked by a resident why his pending resignation after the first of the year had not been announced publicly.

She said it seemed to be common knowledge around town that Council President Matt Burke would be the next mayor when Collova steps down in the coming weeks.

The mayor said he has not officially resigned or retired, but should it be the case it will be announced in the newspaper.

"If I do leave, which is a very good possibility, then the president of council (Burke) is next in line to become mayor," Collova explained.

Should Burke not wish to take the position, he said, then the president pro tem of council, Ward 3 Councilman Mike Nenadovich, would assume the mayoral duties.

When Collova's term is up in November 2021, the voters of Garfield Heights will choose their next mayor from those candidates running for the office.

CLE City Council update

Cleveland City Council held a virtual meeting last Wednesday and adopted various ordinances and resolutions. It was the last legislative session of the year. Council's next meeting will be held on Wednesday, Jan. 6, 2021.

Meeting highlights

- Approved an ordinance that places a 15% limit on the commission that third-party food delivery services receive from restaurants on the price of a delivered order.

The ordinance applies only to restaurants in Cleveland. The ordinance also prohibits a reduction in compensation for delivery drivers as a result of this limit. The aim of this legislation is to help restaurants with their bottom lines during the Covid-19 crisis.

- Adopted legislation allowing the city to receive a

\$425,000 federal grant to hire personnel in the division of police. The one-year grant from the U.S. Department of Justice will allow the city to hire undercover surveillance officers and fingerprinting examiners. The city has been receiving Department of Justice grants every year since 2005, totaling \$1.428 million.

- Adopted legislation authorizing the city to sell parcels of city-owned land to be part of a proposed real estate development along E. 66 St. near League Park. Frontline Development Group is proposing a mixed-use development that would include 15 single-family units, 45 town-home units and 84 apartment units, plus retail space.

The city parcels, which are in the county land bank, will become part of Allen Estates multi-phase project.

- Approved legislation that will permit the Tamir Rice Foundation to encroach on city property for the purpose of building a street-scape in memory of Tamir Rice.

- Approved three partially forgivable loans of \$250,000 in total with Metro West Community Development Organization to rehabilitate at least three vacant single family homes on scattered sites within the Clark-Fulton neighborhood, and other associated costs necessary to redevelop the property.

- Approved leasing space located at the Earle B. Turner Recreation Center in Ward 2 to JumpStart Inc. for the purpose of developing a community innovation learning center in connection with their Digital Learning Community Center Initiative for a term of four years.

- Approved various fund transfers in the General Fund including adding an additional \$5 million for demolitions, \$5 million for the city's Department of Economic Development to help businesses during the pandemic and \$5 million to the city's Department of Community Development to help residents during the pandemic.

Free COVID-19 testing

Free COVID-19 testing began earlier this month at Elizabeth Baptist Church, 6114 Francis Ave., Cleveland. The testing has now expanded to Lee Memorial AME, 861 E. 105 St., Cleveland, and Lee Road Baptist Church, 3970 Lee Rd., Cleveland.

There is no preregistration and no limitations on testing. ID or insurance are not necessary.

Testing at all locations will likely go until the end of December and is on the following timetable: Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., Tuesdays and Thursdays, 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturdays, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The goal is to administer 100 tests per site each day until a total of 6,000 tests are performed. Each individual who takes a test will also receive a food box.

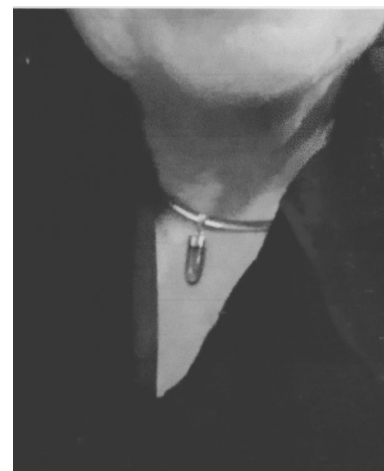

Council approves sale

Duties of the members include advising city council and officials in fields of community and diversity, promoting communication and understanding between institutions, citizens and citizen groups in the community, improving equity of opportunity in government, education, employment and housing in the community, and conducting research and studies in the fields of community and diversity in an effort to lessen prejudice and discrimination.

The city is mandated to provide in-house staff and related services in support of the committee with the approval of the mayor. Additional expenses related to the operation of the committee must be included in the city's annual budget as approved by council.

Those interested in applying for a committee position are asked to send a letter to the mayor's office at the civic center indicating their interest and qualifications. More information will be available on the city's website.

Also passed at Monday night's meeting was an ordinance to enter into an environmental covenant with the state fire marshal in regard to property which formerly was the site of the Garfield Heights Service Garage on E. 131 St.

A portion of the land (approximately 1.6 acres of the 8.5 acres) at that location has been deemed contaminated and is currently subjected to regular testing through Bureau of Underground Storage Tank Regulations.

The city has been advised that the 1.6 acres will never be "clean" property due to petroleum products in the groundwater and that the city should enter into an environmental covenant with the state fire marshal agreeing that the city and all subsequent owners of the property will not be permitted to construct a building that requires a basement on the 1.6 acres.

The next regular meeting of council would have been Monday, Dec. 28, but council voted to take it off the schedule.

Cuy. Hts. Council update

The Village of Cuyahoga Heights Council met last Wednesday, Dec. 9, in a lengthy meeting and passed several pieces of legislation having to do with demolition of the former Benjamin Moore properties.

Resolutions were passed for Site Demolition and Redevelopment Project Agreements with Geis Construction, LLC for Benjamin Moore Buildings One, Two and Three.

Also passed were resolutions authorizing change orders and a change of scope for the Benjamin Moore demolition and redevelopment for Buildings One, Two and Three.

Among other legislation passed last week was the following:

- To hire Pest Management Inc. for pest control services;
- To execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District and the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District for the Public Involvement and Public Education program;

Maple Heights Council asks for CARES Act funding to expand police station

As part of its continued response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, including the need for social distancing in facilities used by police officers, Maple Heights Council passed a resolution at the Dec. 2 teleconference meeting seeking \$85,000 in CARES Act funding for a locker room expansion project at the police station on Lee Rd.

The legislation authorizes Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into agreements with Caves Road Construction of Chagrin Falls, and the Calvin Singleton & Associates architectural firm in Cleveland Heights, for the Maple Heights Police Department Locker Room Expansion Project, contingent upon, and in an amount not to exceed the amount of unused CARES Act funds distributed to the city by Cuyahoga County. It is required that the unused funds be spent by Dec. 31, 2020.

Blackwell, Police Chief Todd Hansen, City Engineer Ed Hren and architect Calvin Singleton of Calvin Singleton and Associates, in an effort to comply with state mandated social distancing requirements in the workplace due to the COVID-19 pandemic, requested the county distribute to the city \$85,000 in unused CARES Act funds for Phase

I of a multi-phase construction project, converting underutilized detention space in the police department into a new larger locker room/restroom space, and converting the previous locker/restroom space into a larger breakroom space.

Because of the exceptionally short time frame imposed by the deadline at the end of this month to spend the unused funds, council approved waiving the public bidding requirement. A motion to amend the language of the legislation to remove any reference of “rough-in construction” was approved before passage on emergency.

Law Director Frank Consolo said that the project will not move forward unless the funding is obtained from the county.

Before the resolution’s passage, there was some discussion of the fact that council had approved Blackwell’s appointment of Singleton to the city’s Architectural Review Board at a recent meeting, prior to his being named in the legislation to oversee the expansion project. Blackwell and Consolo explained that Singleton chose to step down from the board to avoid any question of ethics issues or any conflict of interest.

Other legislation on second reading

All of the other legislation at the Dec. 2 meeting was placed on second reading, including an ordinance to add a new section to the city’s codified ordinances creating a special revenue fund entitled “Housing Reinvestment Grant Fund.”

The city had established the Maple Heights Home Ownership Program (MHHOP) as a partnership with Slavic Village Development and the Cuyahoga County Land Reutilization Program (land bank) “to provide for affordable home ownership in the city... and receive proceeds from the sale of properties through MHHOP.”

Maple Heights has received \$33,918.69 in proceeds from the sale of properties through MHHOP in calendar year 2020, and also applies for funding requests to encourage investment in the city’s housing stock. So the city desires to create a special revenue fund, the Housing Reinvestment Grant Fund, to provide property maintenance grants to residents who own and occupy homes in the city and who have limited incomes.

The grant fund would provide money for maintenance, paint, repair or replacement of roofs, gutters, downspouts, siding, windows, doors, porches, garages, foundations, driveways, ADA accessible ramps and other items and projects if the legislation is ultimately passed.

Another bill placed on second reading was for a contract with Medical Mutual of Ohio to provide health care insurance coverage to full time city employees for next year, and an ordinance for the city’s 2021 budget.

Human Services Director Linda Vopat reported that the city had applied for coronavirus relief funding from the Ohio Department of Aging for senior centers. “There was \$25,000 that we were awarded to help us buy air purifiers and thermometers,” she said.

WHEREAS, this recommended rezoning will result in using this land in a way that will promote the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of this City, and will enable both the City and the owners of these parcels to place their property in its highest and best use.

MAPLE HEIGHTS Shooting

On Monday, Dec. 14, about 9 p.m., the Maple Heights Police Department responded to a call of gun shots fired near the intersection of Clamper and Raymond sts. Police located a vehicle driven by a 48-year-old female who was struck by gunfire in the head. The victim was transported to MetroHealth Medical Center by Maple Heights Fire/EMS staff for treatment. A bullet fragment was removed from the victim at the hospital. She was released yesterday.

The Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation and Maple Heights Detective Bureau were called out to collect evidence and interview witnesses.
