Cleveland City Council passes bill to allow public comment at meetings

Cleveland Council members voted at their meeting Wednesday, Aug 18, to change their rules that will now allow public comment at regular council meetings, according to information posted on the Cleveland City Council website.

However, an amendment added to have council members vote on the procedures set up by the clerk of council delays the start of public comment. The clerk had been working to establish it to start when council returns to regular meetings on Sept. 20. It's unclear when council will vote on the procedures.

However, council members voted on two rule changes, the first changing language to say "...in accordance with rules and procedures established by the Clerk of Council, any person may be heard during that portion of a regular meeting set aside for public comment.

The second rule change is to add public comment into the order of business at council meetings. It will be the fifth item in the order of business.

'I'm pleased that as council president, I've brought public comment to the meetings after nearly 90 years and for the first time under the Mayor-Council form of government - so 207 years since the city was incorporated," said Council President Kevin Kelley.

Council Clerk Patricia Britt and her staff had been drafting the procedures for public comment. While not finalized, generally they allow anyone who registers to comment at council meetings, not limiting it to Cleveland residents or business owners.

The policy also allows speakers to talk on any topic, not limiting it to that night's council agenda.

All wishing to speak must register online, by paper form or by phone. The entire registration form must be completed, including stating the topic they are commenting on

Registration will open at noon on the Wednesday before a Monday council meeting and will close at 2 p.m. on the Monday of a regular 7 p.m. council meeting.

The first 10 registrations will get the opportunity to comment for up to three minutes. There will not be a rollover list of people who will be given speaking priority which includes construction of a new bridge between the at the next regular council meeting. A new registration is required each week.

For those who don't want to comment publicly, they can submit written comments that will be distributed to all council members. Cleveland City Council has reasonable accommodation policies for those with disabilities or need language assistance, according to its website, which Thursday, Sept. 2, between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. for will be available to all who request assistance for public

Since the pandemic, all council meetings have been available to watch live on TV20 or anytime on council's YouTube page. That will continue even as council goes comment portion of the meeting.

Independence Council update

Independence Council met in regular session on Tuesday, Aug. 10, and placed on first reading an ordinance relating to keeping chickens on residential property.

The way the proposed legislation is worded in its present form, a maximum of six chickens would be allowed per half-acre lot, with stipulations as to chicken coops, runs and fencing. Council is expected to vote on this ordinance at its September meeting, giving it time to make any changes it deems necessary.

The following legislation was passed at the Aug. 10 Independence Council meeting:

- Establishing the Home Improvement Assessment Public-Private Partnership Program for the purpose of assisting city residents to maintain and assure properties remain in compliance with the codified ordinances, including but not limited to stormwater management, creek maintenance and sewer maintenance;
- Authorizing an increase in the amount of funds allocated to the retention of Mazanec, Raskin & Ryder Co., LPA for professional legal services to represent Anthony Togliatti in his former official capacity, in an amount not to exceed \$5,300, and a total not to exceed \$108,339.47;
- •Accepting the proposal of CBIZ Insurance Services, Inc. for professional insurance broker services for the purchase of property, inland marine, crime and automobile insurance for the city for an additional one-year period beginning Aug. 20, 2021 and ending Aug. 20, 2022, at the same fee as originally contracted, in an amount not to exceed \$10,000;
- Accepting the material terms of the OneOhio Subdivision Settlement pursuant to the OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding consistent with the terms of the July 21, 2021 National Opiod Settlement and to sign the OneOhio

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 41 OF THE GARFIELD HEIGHTS CITY CHARTER TO PROVIDE THAT THE RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR MEMBERS OF THE POLICE AND FIRE DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY SHALL BE NO LESS THAN THE AVERAGE THAT IS PAID TO THE MEMBERS OF THE POLICE AND FIRE DIVISIONS IN SUBURBAN CITIES WITH A POPULATION OF TEN THOUSAND (10,000) OR MORE WHOSE BOUNDARY LINES ARE CONTIGUOUS TO THE CITY OF CLEVELAND AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF SAID AMENDMENT TO THE ELECTORATE OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO

WHEREAS, Section 52 of the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights permits this Council to submit proposed Charter amendments to the electors of the City upon a Council vote of two-thirds in favor of said change, and

WHEREAS, an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of Council members shall result in this amendment to be presented to the electors of the City on the November 2, 2021, General Election, and

WHEREAS, Section 41 currently provides that the rate of compensation for members of the police and fire division of the Department of Public Safety shall be no less than the average that is paid to the members of the police and fire divisions in suburban cities with a population of fifteen thousand (15,000) or more whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland, and

WHEREAS, Council wishes to amend said language to change the population requirement from 15,000 to 10,000 for the suburban cities

is to the City of Cleveland for the police and fire division rate of compensation calculation. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio that:

SECTION 1. Section 41 of the Garfield Heights Charter shall be amended to read as follows (removed language is indicated by strikethrough; additional language is indicated by bold):

The Department of Public Safety shall be in the charge of the Safety Director. There shall be in the Department of Public Safety a Police Division and a Fire Division. There shall be in the Department of Public Safety a Division of Building, Engineering and Inspection.

41-A Annual rate of pay to be paid members of the police division. The annual rate of compensation for the members of the police division,

Department of Public Safety, shall be no less than the average that is paid to members of police divisions in the suburban cities with a population of fifteen thousand (15,000) ten thousand (10,000) or more whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland.

On or about the first day of April of each year, the Council shall cause a survey to be made as to the rate of compensation paid to members of the police divisions of suburban cities whose population is fifteen thousand (15,000) ten thousand (10,000) or more, whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland, based upon the latest federal decennial census. Not later than the first day of June of each year, Council shall enact legislation providing for the payment of a rate of compensation for the members of the police division not less than the average compensation paid to the aforementioned suburban cities, which such rate of compensation shall become effective on and shall be paid from the first day of June of that year.

The expression "rate of compensation" or pay, as used in this section, shall apply only to a basic amount of wages and does not include such benefits as might be set up by any city by way of holidays, vacations, other permitted absences, overtime, longevity, night or split shifts, pay for specialized service within a classification or rank, or other premium pay differentials or any type whatsoever. The foregoing enumeration is not exclusive; it is the intent of this section that nothing other than a basic amount of wages, with included range scales, be included within the meaning of "rate of compensation" or pay.

Upon passage of this Charter Amendment, a special survey shall be made in accordance with the hereinbefore stated provisions, and the new rate shall be paid beginning January 1, 1973.

For the purpose of this section, the pay ranges of 1971 shall be considered as a base. Such additional funds as shall be required by the

operation of this Section in addition to the 1971 base, shall be generated by an increase in the limitation on the rate of taxation as provided in Section 21 of this Charter.

Council is hereby authorized to increase the limitation on the rate of taxation by such millage as shall be needed to realize the funds

41-B Annual rate of pay to be paid members of the fire division. The annual rate of compensation for members of the fire division, Department of Public Safety, shall be no less than the average that is paid to members of the fire divisions in the suburban cities with a population of fifteen thousand (15,000) ten thousand (10,000) or more whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland.

On or about the first day of April of each year, the Council shall cause a survey to be made as to the rate of compensation paid to members of

the fire divisions of suburban cities whose population is fifteen thousand (15,000) ten thousand (10,000) or more, whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland, based upon the latest Federal decennial census. Not later than the first day of June of each year, Council shall enact legislation providing for the payment of a rate of compensation for the members of the fire department not less than the average compensation paid to the aforementioned suburban cities, which such rate of compensation shall become effective on and shall be paid from the first day of June of that year.

The expression "rate of compensation" or pay, as used in this section, shall apply only to a basic amount of wages and does not include such benefits as might be set up by any city by way of holidays, vacations, other permitted absences, overtime, longevity, night or split shifts, pay for specialized service within a classification or rank, or other premium pay differentials or any type whatsoever. The foregoing enumeration is not exclusive; it is the intent of this section that nothing other than a basic amount of wages, with included range scales, be included within the

meaning of "rate of compensation" or pay.

Upon passage of this Charter Amendment, a special survey shall be made in accordance with the hereinbefore stated provisions, and the new rate shall be paid beginning January 1, 1973.

SECTION 2. The question of amendment of Section 41 of the City of Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held November 2, 2021 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where

a majority affirmative vote is required for passage.

SECTION 3. The Law Director is hereby directed to transmit by mail or email a certified copy of this Ordinance and the following ballot language to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, c/o the Director's Office, located at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44115 and/or to hand-deliver the same to the Issues Department located on the Third Floor of the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections and obtain a written and dated receipt therefore and he is further directed to make the necessary arrangements with the Board of Elections, Cuyahoga County, for giving notice of the proposed amendment of the municipal Charter and for compliance with other regulations including but not limited to appropriate ballot language in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code:

PROPOSED BALLOT LANGUAGE
SHALL SECTION 41 OF THE GARFIELD HEIGHTS CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT THE RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR MEMBERS OF THE POLICE AND FIRE DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY SHALL BE NO LESS THAN THE AVERAGE THAT IS PAID TO THE MEMBERS OF THE POLICE AND FIRE DIVISIONS IN SUBURBAN CITIES WITH A POPULATION OF TEN THOUSAND (10,000) OR MORE WHOSE BOUNDARY LINES ARE CONTIGUOUS TO THE CITY OF CLEVELAND?

SECTION 4. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure for the best interest of the citizens of Garfield Heights and for the further reason that

publication requirements of Ohio law pertaining to Charter amendments necessitates passage without undue delay, therefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by this Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.






