# **Discount Drug Mart to** house police substation in western Maple Heights

A substation of the Maple Heights Police Department will be located in the Discount Drug Mart at 6148 Dunham Rd., in the Turney-Dunham Plaza at no cost to the city, Mayor Annette Blackwell announced at council's Dec. 15 meeting last week.

In her report to council, Blackwell said that she had been trying for some time to get a substation located in the store to better serve residents in the western half of the city, as the police station's headquarters were located in the eastern half of Maple Heights, at 5373 Lee Rd.

Blackwell said she had repeatedly asked the company what the city could do to get the substation located in the drugstore, adding that she had written personally to the company's headquarters, and finally got a response.

"More than likely we will have the Dunham Road West Side Police Substation open in mid-to-late-January," she said, to the applause from council and the audience.

"It's not going to reduce crime," she said, "but it's a presence. And it gives our officers a place to do some reports, and it gives a sense of security.

Police Chief Todd Hansen stated that the Police Substation would be an exciting opportunity for a great boost for the west side of Maple Heights, which he said was initiated as a partnership between Drug Mart and the police department.

Hansen said the project actually started a few years ago, at the end of former Police Chief John Popielarczyk's term. He said Drug Mart worked with the property owner and got MHPD a portion of the storefront in what was formerly Fat Billy's Pizza, on the north end of the plaza. Drug Mart renovated the interior and got it ready for use, Hansen said.

# Bedford Council accepts J&J opioid settlement funds

At its last meeting of the year, Bedford Council approved a resolution authorizing the execution of a participation agreement to accept the terms of the Johnson & Johnson National Opioid Settlement, representing an \$808 million settlement reached between the state of Ohio and major drug distributors for their role in the opioid epidemic in the state.

Councilman Vic Fluharty, in his position as vice mayor, ran the meeting in the absence of Mayor Stan Koci and City Manager Mike Mallis.

Council also passed a final ordinance to amend the 2021 city budget, which was required before the end of the year, ment, at a cost of \$10,745. Finance Director Frank Gambosi explained.

Council okayed two pieces of legislation for equipment at the city's Wastewater Treatment Plant to comply with Environmental Protection Agency standards - one for a contract with Thomas Scientific for the purchase of a laboratory dishwasher at a cost of \$16,671.52; the other have to sign a lease, Kelly said. for a contract with National Pump and Process for replacement of pumps for the sand filtration system at the treatment plant, at a cost of \$25,752.



# Cuy. Hts. Council OKs new deputy police chief

Cuyahoga Heights Council met in regular session on Wednesday, Dec. 8, and passed an ordinance confirming the promotion of Kenneth Schoeffler to the position of deputy chief of police in the Cuyahoga Heights Police Department.

Other legislation passed included:

- Authorizing the village to enter into a Delinquent Debt Collection Agreement with the Ohio Attorney
- Entering into a Municipal Lease-To-Own Financing Agreement with First Capital Equipment Leasing Corp. for four new 2022 Ford Police Interceptor utility vehicles with law enforcement upfits and equipment for the police
- •Amending the appropriations for the expenses and other expenditures of the village during the period Jan. 1, 2021 through Dec. 31, 2021;
- •Approving the submission of the village budget for fiscal year 2022 and asking appropriations for the expenses and other expenditures starting Jan. 1, 2022 and ending Dec. 31, 2022;

• Applying to participate in Cuyahoga County's 2022 Supplemental Grant Program;

- Applying to participate in the 2022 Cuyahoga County Municipal Grant Program;
- Authorizing the expenditure of funds to study potential upgrades and modifications to the Municipal Pool, not to exceed \$30,000;
- Authorizing a change order and change of scope to the Nicky Boulevard Storm Sewer Extension and Slope Stabilization Improvements Project;

Finance approval was given to repairs on a snowplow and truck not to exceed \$9,500, and for Nicky Boulevard ground water monitoring, compliance and hydrological not to exceed \$25,000.

Also at the meeting, Mayor Jack Bacci presented Councilwoman Cheryl Harris a proclamation for her 12 years of service as a public servant. Harris did not seek re-election this past November and chose to retire.





# Maple Heights Council update

At a previous meeting Dec. 1, Maple Heights Council approved legislation authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to accept funds on behalf of the city from the One Ohio Subdivision Settlement, which represents a \$808 million settlement reached between the state of Ohio and major drug distributors for their role in the opioid epidemic in the

#### Other legislation passed

Council passed a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a contract with Fabrizi Trucking and Paving Co., Inc., which bid \$231,632 for Phase 3 of the Maple Heights Northeast Quadrant Sewer Repairs. It includes storm and sanitary sewer improvements on the streets of Hansen, Watson, Franklin. Raymond, Hillgrove, Clare and Gardenview in the city.

In correspondence to council regarding the project, City Engineer Ed Hren stated that the earliest start date for the project would be Feb. 1, 2022, and 70 days would be the time of completion.

The project is being funded in part by a grant received from the Ohio Public Works ment of Public Works utilizerty tax bills.

Newburgh Heights Village Council met on Tuesday, Dec. 7, and passed the following legislation:

- Consolidating the pay and benefits provisions for all police department personnel, and amending or repealing all ordinances and provisions that are inconsistent with the pay and benefits noted in this new ordinance;
- Passed for a second reading was an ordinance authorizing payment to the Newburgh Heights Community Improvement Corporation (CIC) of \$30,000 for purchase and demolition of certain real estate pursuant to a purchase offer and agreement between the CIC and Jeanne M. Uher to purchase the property located at 4411 Gamma Ave., Newburgh Heights;
- Passed for a second reading was an ordinance authorizing payment to the CIC of \$225,000 for purchase of real estate located at 4429 Harvard Ave. and 4505 Harvard Ave., from John Barr pending acceptance of the purchase offer and agreement;

- Newburgh Hts. Council news Division of Recovery Resources, for providing behavioral services to village employees;
  - Making appropriations for current expenses and other village expenditures through Dec. 31, 2021;
  - •Authorizing the fiscal officer to advance \$300,000 from the General Fund to the Grants/CDBG Fund;
  - Providing that all village employees will not forfeit their 2021 earned but unused vacation days and will be paid for the vacation time in lieu of forfeiture;
  - Filing and application with the Cuyahoga County Department of Development for a Community Development Block Grant;
  - •Accepting the terms of the One Ohio Subdivision Settlement pursuant to the One Ohio Memorandum of Understanding and consistent with the terms of the July 21, National Opioid Settlement Agreement.

Purchases and approvals included 2022 renewal of Software Solutions accounting software at a cost not to exceed \$21,500; annual worker's compensation insurance • Making temporary appropriations for current expenses and other expenses of the village through March 31, 2022; permanent part-time assistant fire chief; appointment of not to exceed \$27,895; approval of Mike Wasielewski to

• Entering into an agreement with Assist Now, the EAP Matthew Perkins as full-time patrol officer for NHPD; appointment of Steven Schorpp, Sr. to full-time service department laborer, pending drug testing and vaccination requirements; purchase of five portable radios from Chagrin Valley Dispatch at a cost not to exceed \$14,655.


