Man indicted for murder of Garfield Hts. woman while inside car on I-77

Cuyahoga County Prosecutor Michael C. O'Malley last week announced that a grand jury returned an indictment charging Ellis Wilson, 34, for the murder of a Garfield Heights woman, 33, near the Harvard Ave. exit ramp of

 $\hbox{``This barbaric individual executed the victim in front of}\\$ her children," said Prosecutor O'Malley. "Our hearts go out to her family as they grieve this tragic loss.

On Dec. 19, 2020, prosecutors said Wilson and Breyana Presley argued inside her vehicle as she was driving along I-77 with her two children, ages 12 years and 8 months old, in the backseat. Wilson allegedly shot the Presley multiple times before the vehicle came to a stop near the Harvard Ave. exit ramp and he ran out of the car.

Officers with the Newburgh Heights Police Department and the Cleveland Division of Police, along with Emergency Medical Services, responded to the scene. Presley was transported to a nearby hospital and was pronounced deceased shortly thereafter. Her children were not injured but were transported to the hospital for further evaluation. Wilson was found hiding nearby in the brush alongside the freeway and was arrested.

along with NHPD, conducted an investigation that allegedly connected Wilson to the crime.

He has been indicted on the following charges: one count of aggravated murder, one count of murder, one count of felonious assault, two counts of improperly handling firearms in a motor vehicle and one count of having weapons under disability.

Wilson is currently being held at the Cuyahoga County Jail on a \$1 million bond. He will be arraigned at a later date. If convicted, he faces a maximum term of life in

Bedford Councilwoman Heather Rhoades steps down due to illness; calls for removal of Councilman Saunders at Monday council meeting

In an impassioned statement at Monday night's teleconference council meeting, Bedford Councilwoman Heather Rhoades announced that she was stepping down from her position with the city due to illness, and also called for the removal of her fellow council member, Donald Saunders, for what she alleged were "racist and sexist comments" against residents and city employees, as well as other allegations.

 $\hbox{\it "To Bedford residents, it's with great sadness that I have}$ to announce that I will need to step down as your Ward 5 city council representative," Rhoades said at the meeting. She has served on council since January 2018.

She said she has been diagnosed with Stage 4 breast cancer, adding, "During these difficult times, I feel it is best to focus my energies on my family."

Immediately after announcing her resignation, Rhoades stated, "There is one matter I would like to clear up, that I could not legally do before this time, and that is my vote

to remove Councilman Donald Saunders from Bedford City Council.'

"It is a fact of the matter that Councilman Donald Saunders' actions over the past few decades have resulted in multiple lawsuits against the city of Bedford... The city of Bedford has had to pay out on those lawsuits," she

Rhoades also alleged in her comments, "It is also a fact that Councilman Don Saunders has been accused, on multiple occasions, of racist and sexist comments and actions, towards residents and employees of Bedford. Residents of Bedford, you deserve better than this.'

Mayor Stan Koci responded, "Heather, thank you and our prayers are with you... You have done a great job for your residents in Ward 5, and for the city, and I want to thank you for that right now, up front. Keep us posted, and let us know what's happening.

When contacted after the meeting by this reporter to give her the opportunity to clarify her allegations, Rhoades stated. "I do not have further comment.

Rhoades referenced a lawsuit against a city inspector and the city of Bedford, adding, "There are others, but that one is interesting.

Inquiries were made after the meeting to City Manager Mike Mallis, Mayor Koci and Law Director John Montello on the nature and resolution of the lawsuit mentioned by Rhoades, and also what the procedure was for filling an unexpired term on council.

Yesterday Mallis responded: "Unfortunately, I do not have any information to add and any communication regarding litigation would come from the law department.'

As for the council vacancy, Mallis said city council will appoint a resident within the ward to serve the remainder of the term, which is through 2021."

Saunders made no response to Rhoades' allegations during the meeting. He was contacted by this reporter after the meeting to give him the opportunity to make a statement, but no response was received as of press time.

As there was no legislation on Monday's agenda, the meeting consisted of reports from various city officials, who wished all Bedford residents a Happy New Year even as the city continues to deal with the effects of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

Officials also gave their condolences to the families of residents Ernie Walker and Iris Dawson, both very active community members who passed away recently.



Garfield Heights Council met in a special meeting on Tuesday, Dec. 22, and passed an amended ordinance to the collective bargaining agreement between the city and the Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc. regarding jailers and records clerks.

Maple Hts. Council passes \$31.7 million budget

At its last meeting of the year on Dec. 16, Maple Heights Council passed an ordinance to approve the city's budget, to make appropriations for current expenses and other expenses for the fiscal year ending Dec. 31, 2021, and to submit the legislation to the Cuyahoga County fiscal

The total figure for the 2021 budget is \$31,704,397.76, Finance Director Tinita Tillman had stated.

Also approved was an ordinance to amend the 2020 budget before the end of the year to include \$1700 in CARES Act funding for police and personnel.

Other legislation passed by council at its Dec.16 meeting included:

• An ordinance to adopt and enact a new section of the codified ordinances creating a special revenue fund entitled "Housing Reinvestment Grant Fund," after the city established the Maple Heights Home Ownership Program (MHHOP), a partnership with Slavic Village Development and the Cuyahoga County Land Reutilization Corporation to provide for affordable home ownership in the city.

The new grant will provide funding for maintenance, paint, repair or replacement of roofs, gutters, downpouts, siding, windows, doors and other items, as well as Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible ramps.

•A resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a contract with Medical Mutual of Ohio for health insurance coverage for full time employees of the city, effective Jan. 1, 2021 through Dec. 31, 2021. Increase in deductible amountswas from \$2800 to \$3500 for single coverage plans and from \$5600 to \$7000 for family coverage plans, with the same coverage and benefit levels currently in effect.

Blackwell, Tillman and Finance Director Frank Consolo have recommended that the city "continue to forgo collecting a monthly premium copay amount from the

employees and instead allow employees to contribute \$100per month for single plan coverage and \$200 per month for family plan coverage into their respective health savings accounts in order to partially fund their deductible, with the city contributing the remaining amount necessary to fully fund the deductible for each employee.'

• An ordinance waiving the 100 percent escrow requirement to correct violations resulting from point of sale inspections for the year 2021, a continuation of a waiver that has been in place for the past several years.





The waiver is intended to offer an incentive to individuals who purchase residential properties and occupy them and to encourage individuals to purchase and renovate residential properties.

• An ordinance amending and restating a section of the codified ordinances concerning the Architectural Review Board, "to establish the intent, membership, power and duties, organization and proceedings of the Architectural Review Board.'

The ARB was created to review applications to ensure that new development and redevelopment are compatible and harmonious with the existing overall character of the city. The ARB consists of three architects licensed to practice in the state of Ohio, and a fourth architect may be appointed at the mayor's discretion to serve as an

The ARB will serve as an advisory board to the Planning and Zoning Commission, with a compensation of \$60 apiece to each member, the ordinance states

•A resolution directing City Engineer Ed Hren to prepare and submit improvement plans and environmental and project development documents to the Ohio Department of Transportation for the Dunham Road Safe

city was awarded \$150,000 for the project.

The SRTS project "will enhance the sidewalks and crossing along the main routes to school, including curb ramps and sidewalks, high visibility signage and thermoplastic pavement markings and striping" along Dunham, from Turney to Rockside rds.


