Woman killed in Bedford car crash Garfield Hts. Mayor Vic Collova announces his retirement; Matt Burke becomes mayor February 1



A Cleveland woman was killed late Saturday night when she lost control of her car while speeding in the area of Broadway Ave. and Rockside Rd. in Bedford. The Bedford police report notes that officers observed the 2008 Audi traveling at a high rate of speed and go off the roadway, striking several cars parked at the Bedford Nissan dealership. The woman was pronounced dead at MetroHealth Medical Center. Police notified Bedford Nissan of the incident and they were to conduct an inventory on their damaged vehicles by Monday. The Cuyahoga County medical examiner and Bedford accident investigators are continuing to get more information on the incident. Garfield Heights Mayor Vic Collova ended months of speculation Monday night when he announced at the regular meeting of city council that he would retire from his job heading the city effective Feb. 1, 2021, a position he has held since 2009.

He said after talking with his wife and family, he made the decision to retire before the end of his term this November.

"And I want to assure everyone I am not sick. My reason for retiring is that I started working at the age of 16, and I'm 73 now and I think it's time for a break," Collova said.

President of Council Matt Burke is next in line of succession to take over as interim mayor until the November election. Burke indicated he will accept the position.

Collova thanked all the council members he has worked with during his tenure as mayor and previously when he served on city council.

"I also extend my sincere gratitude to my administrative staff and every city employee for their hard work, support and loyalty. I could not have done my job without their dedication to serve the people living and working in our community," he said.

The mayor also expressed his gratitude to the residents of Garfield Heights for their support and patience during some difficult times. He wished everyone in Garfield Heights the best in the years ahead and urged them to work together for the good of the community.

Members of council were lavish in their praise of Collova, with personal stories of his support and guidance over the years, and the hard work and perseverance it took to get the city out of the fiscal emergency he inherited upon taking office.

During the council meeting Monday, Burke also expressed his appreciation to Mayor Collova for his "lifelong dedication to Garfield Heights." He said after serving 11 years as mayor, Collova had rebuilt a solid foundation for the future of the city.

Burke said he will work hard in his new position as mayor. "My dedication to my hometown will never wither," Burke said. "As many of our good neighbors, I too take a lot of pride in being a resident of Garfield Heights. This is our home and together we will move it forward."

The Ward 6 council seat presently occupied by Burke will be filled by a majority vote of all remaining members of council, per the city charter. If council fails to fill the vacancy within 30 days, the mayor would fill it by appointment, as noted by Law Director Tim Riley.

Maple Heights non-bargaining city workers granted first raise in 10 years

Maple Heights Council, at its teleconferencing meeting Jan. 6, passed an ordinance to authorize a 3% pay raise for full- and part-time non-bargaining unit city employees, including fire and police chiefs, department directors, building inspectors, office staff, auxiliary police officers, maintenance workers and other employees for 2021.

Maple Heights Mayor Annette Blackwell said that approval of the legislation represented the first raises for city employees "in almost 10 years... I don't think anyone could go that long without a cost of living increase."

She praised the employees for their patience, and Council President Ron Jackson also attributed the approval of the raises to the work of

Newburgh Heights Village Council update

The Village of Newburgh Heights Council met last Tuesday, Jan. 5, in a short session with a limited agenda. Councilwoman Gigi Traore was unanimously elected to serve as council pro tempore for 2021, and the passing of longtime resident Frances Holocek was noted.

Council gave its approval to the purchase of two police cruisers from Lebanon Ford at state bid pricing of

\$32,266 each, for a total of \$64,532. Also okayed was 2021 management fees for the Heritage Home Program at a cost not to exceed \$1,080.

The sale of a Swenson salt spreader on the GovDeals auction website was passed, along with a quote from Eversafe Security Solutions for security laminate on certain windows and doors at a cost not to exceed \$11,811.

Heights out of fiscal emergency in late 2020 as well as getting new businesses in the city.

Council passed several other pieces of legislation on the agenda regarding increases in wages and other items for certain city employees for the time period of Jan. 1, 2021 through Dec. 31, 2023, including a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a collective bargaining agreement (CBA) with the Teamsters Local 507 representing the city's full- and part-time truck drivers and laborers.

Also passed was a resolution approving a CBA with Machinists, Aerospace Workers, Auto Mechanics Local 1363, representing the city's full- and part-time mechanics and park technicians, and two separate resolutions for CBAs with the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association for the city's full-time and part-time corrections officers, respectively.

City officials praised Law Director Frank Consolo for his work on negotiating the CBAs, which were formerly handled by outside counsel before his hiring. The savings to the city by having Consolo negotiate the agreements in-house amounted to more than \$600,000, Blackwell confirmed.

An ordinance to set the salary of the city's safety director at \$10,000, beginning Jan. 1, 2021, was placed in Finance Committee for further discussion. Per the city's charter, the mayor also serves as the safety director

Council last week also approved a resolution to observe the birthday of civil rights pioneer Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., on Monday, Jan. 18, noting in the legislation, "Dr. King changed our nation forever through his leadership, service and clarity of vision... he devoted his life to strengthening the content of the American character and called on our nation to live up to its founding principles of life, liberty and pursuit of happiness for all its citizens."

Economic update

Economic Development Director Patrick Grogan-Myers gave a report at the meeting, summarizing Building Department permits and fees collected in 2020. "It was an impressive year for investment in the city, and, based on several projects underway, 2021 stands to be just as impressive," Grogan-Myers said.

He added that effective Jan. 1, "The Building Department implemented the new Rental Registration Program, which requires annual registration of rental units. We have mailed out almost 2,000 notices to make sure property owners are aware of the program changes, set up a webpage on the city's website dedicated to the new program, created new, fillable PDF applications, and fielded numerous calls and e-mails guiding property owners and agents in charge through the new registration process."

Garfield Council approves grant application to partner with Cleveland Metroparks on Wargo Farm trail plan

Garfield Heights Council Monday night approved an emergency resolution to apply for a Community Development Supplemental Grant to develop a trail plan at Wargo Farm in partnership with the Cleveland Metroparks.

Several public hearings have been held to get community input on what to do with the property in the Hathaway Rd. area of the city, officials said, and those living nearby would like to see green space there rather

than a residential development.

The city is eligible to receive \$50,000 if approved for the grant, and the Cleveland Metroparks would contribute labor "in kind" to construct the trails.

The legislation notes that Wargo Farm will be linked to property that the Cleveland Metroparks is acquiring in Valley View, along the city's municipal boundary on Hathaway Rd.

Also passed was a resolution honoring the memory of Vince Liotta and extending condolences to his family. Liotta passed away on Dec. 31.

He served as a council member from Ward 3 for 10 years, and held positions as a bailiff in the Garfield Heights Municipal Court, Community Service manager for the city, working with the Family Resource Center until his death, was in charge of the Juvenile Diversion Program from 2012 to 2015, and remained a liaison to the Court Community Service Program.

The following ordinances were passed unanimously Monday night:

- To advertise for proposals for various materials, services and supplies for the year ending Dec. 31, 2021;
- To renew an agreement with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District to participate in the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Program;
- To enter into a contract with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District and Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District for public involvement and public education regarding soil and water conservation;
- To amend the codified ordinance of the city regarding "Posting Places" to add the city's website to the list of places where physical copies of all legislation are posted prior to regularly scheduled city council meetings.



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Mayor's office accepting applications for Garfield Hts. Public Relations Committee

The mayor's office of the city of Garfield Heights is now accepting letters of interest and resumes from residents for its newly revamped Public Relations Committee.

The committee is comprised of seven members as follows: the mayor of Garfield Heights or his designee and six members to be chosen by the mayor and ratified by a vote of council. The committee will select from among its members a chairperson to run the meetings and present reports and findings to council when necessary.

Each member of the Community Relations Committee will serve a term of three years and must be a resident of the city throughout their term of office.

It is stipulated in the city charter that "members of the committee shall be diverse and reflective of the diversity of community at the time of their appointment."

No member can be an elected official from either the city or the Garfield Heights City Schools and positions on the committee are unpaid.

The purpose of the committee "shall be to foster, encourage and stimulate the improvement of community and intergroup relations among and between citizens of all races, colors, religions, sexes, gender identity, ages, ancestries, familial statuses, physical disabilities, mental disabilities, and national origins, and all economic and educational levels, so as to provide all individuals with an opportunity to grow, participate and share to the best of their ability in the economic, educational, political, social and judicial system."

Duties of the members include advising city council and officials in fields of community and diversity, promoting communication and understanding between institutions, citizens and citizen groups in the community, improving equity of opportunity in government, education, employment and housing in the community, and conducting research and studies in the fields of community and diversity in an effort to lessen prejudice and discrimination.

Sewer improvement project to impact traffic in Slavic Village areas

The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District is beginning construction of the Morgana & Burke System Improvements Sewer Project this week. Nerone & Sons, Inc. is the prime contractor responsible for the construction of the project, primarily located in Cleveland with a small portion in Newburgh Heights.

Work will take place at several locations within the project limits which stretch from Ackley Rd. to the north, as far south as Harvard Ave., and from Washington Park Blvd. on the western limit to E. 93 St. to the east.

The Morgana Run Culvert and Burke Brook Culvert discharge combined sewer overflows during wet weather and this project will make repairs and improve flow conveyance, eventually reducing combined sewer overflows that impact the environment in the Slavic Village neighborhood.

"There is going to be over a million dollars of additional infrastructure improvements to our sewer systems," said Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli, "and in Slavic Village this will require some temporary detours and road closures. While this will cause a temporary disruption of traffic, the long term investment in our infrastructure is very welcome."

Work on the underground culvert rehabilitation on E. 64 St. between CVS at 6301 Harvard Ave., and Save A Lot at 6501 Harvard Ave., Cleveland, was expected to begin this week and be completed by the fall 2021.

This work requires a portion of E. 64 St. be closed near Harvard Ave. Work area detour routes will be clearly posted.

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

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ODOT seeking public input on upcoming bridge work on Broadway Ave. near Garfield Metropark

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) proposes to replace the SR 14 (Broadway Avenue) bridge, also known as Whitehouse Crossing in Garfield Heights, over the Norfolk Southern and Wheeling & Lake Erie railroad lines, at the Metroparks Garfield Park Reservation and Chaincraft Rd.

The proposed project will include the replacement of the existing bridge with one new bridge over the railroad lines and Chaincraft Rd. The new structure will include sidewalk on the north side of Broadway and a multi-use path on the south side of Broadway.

Temporary and permanent right-of-way will be required for construction. Traffic will be maintained during construction along SR 14 (Broadway Avenue) by working on one side of the structure and then the other side, keeping at least one lane open in each direction. The Henry St. and Broadway Ave. intersection will be closed during construction.

The project will have permanent right-of-way impacts to Garfield Park Reservation. The proposal is to build the new bridge slightly to the north of the existing bridge to help maintain traffic and reduce the curve on the bridge. The land required for the new bridge will be exchanged for the land no longer needed for the old bridge to the south. The net impact is under 0.1 acres. Cleveland

Metroparks requested construction of vegetated slopes for the new SR 14 road through the park in lieu of traditional mechanically stabilized earth walls.

Other minor environmental impacts are anticipated due to this project including endangered bat habitat and potential contaminated soils, ODOT officials noted.

ODOT is seeking public input regarding this proposed project and its impacts. To comply with Governor Mike DeWine's guidelines regarding limiting social gatherings in response to COVID-19, no in-person public meeting will be held.

ODOT asks that the public take some time to review the project information, potential impacts and submit your question or comments.

The comment period is now through Feb. 15, 2021.

ODOT is seeking comments regarding environmental or social issues related to this project, including, but not limited to, the effect of the project on local residents, cultural resources (archaeological and history/architectural), ecological resources (streams, wetlands, etc.), and regulated materials (dump sites, underground and above

ground storage tanks, etc.).

Detailed environmental impacts are unknown at this time but could include historical impacts, floodplain impacts, ecological impacts, and could require waterway permits. Additionally, ODOT would appreciate any information you may have on the existence of these features in the project area.
