Gun-wielding man makes threats at Sunoco station

At 2:55 a.m., last Wednesday, June 30, Garfield Heights Police responded to the Sunoco station at 6009 Turney Rd., for a report of shots fired. Upon arrival they learned that a male had entered the gas station brandishing a firearm and started making derogatory statements about Palestinians. The male began making threats to the three employees stating he was going to kill them. One of the employees offered him a cup of coffee and told him to calm down and put the gun away. The suspect then exited the store and fired one round into the air while walking eastbound on Rockside Rd. from the gas station.

He was tracked to a home in the 12900 block of Rockside Rd. Officers were able to make contact with the suspect's family there and safely had them exit the home, according to a GHPD media release. The male involved would not respond to attempts to contact him. SWAT and CIT teams were called to the scene and negotiations continued.

At 8:15 a.m., the suspect surrendered to the SWAT team and was taken into custody without incident. The firearm used was also recovered. He was transported to the Garfield Heights City Jail and charged with having weapons under disability, discharge of a firearm within the city limits and aggravated menacing.

One dead in Maple Heights homicide

On Monday, July 5, at 8:38 p.m., Maple Heights Police Department responded to the 5500 block of Clement St., for a report of gunshots and a vehicle into a residence.

When officers arrived, they found a black Ford SUV that had struck the porch of a home. The driver of the vehicle, 22-year-old Tyler West, was taken to Marymount Hospital where he died from a single bullet wound to his back. Two male passengers were not injured.

According to police, a suspect in the homicide had followed West's car and then opened fire on him. The suspect vehicle is described as a silver SUV or truck with a sunroof.

Homes will be recognized for being well-maintained, having healthy lawns, attractive landscaping, beautiful, colorful bushes and flowers, or other outstanding features. There are 200 homes in the city that will be recognized throughout the summer.

Fatal crash in Maple Hts. claims two lives Block club to

Last Wednesday, June 30, around 10:55 a.m., the Maple Heights Police Department received a call of a motor vehicle accident on Broadway Ave. near Lee Rd. with three people inside the car. The caller reported that the vehicle had struck a pole.

When police arrived they located the three still trapped inside who needed to be mechanically extracted from the car by the Maple Heights Fire Department, with help from surrounding agencies.

One victim, age 17, was transported to MetroHealth Medical Center by Life Flight helicopter and is still being treated for his injuries. The other two victims, Devin Glenn, 18, and Arnez King, 18, both of Maple Heights, were pronounced dead on scene.

The cause of the crash is under investigation by the Southeast Area Law Enforcement Accident Investigation Unit and the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office. Speed was definitely a factor in the accident, said Police Chief Todd Hansen. He said the car did appear to be racing other vehicles just before the crash, according to witnesses.

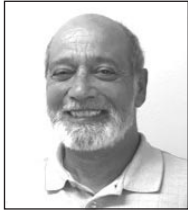

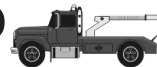

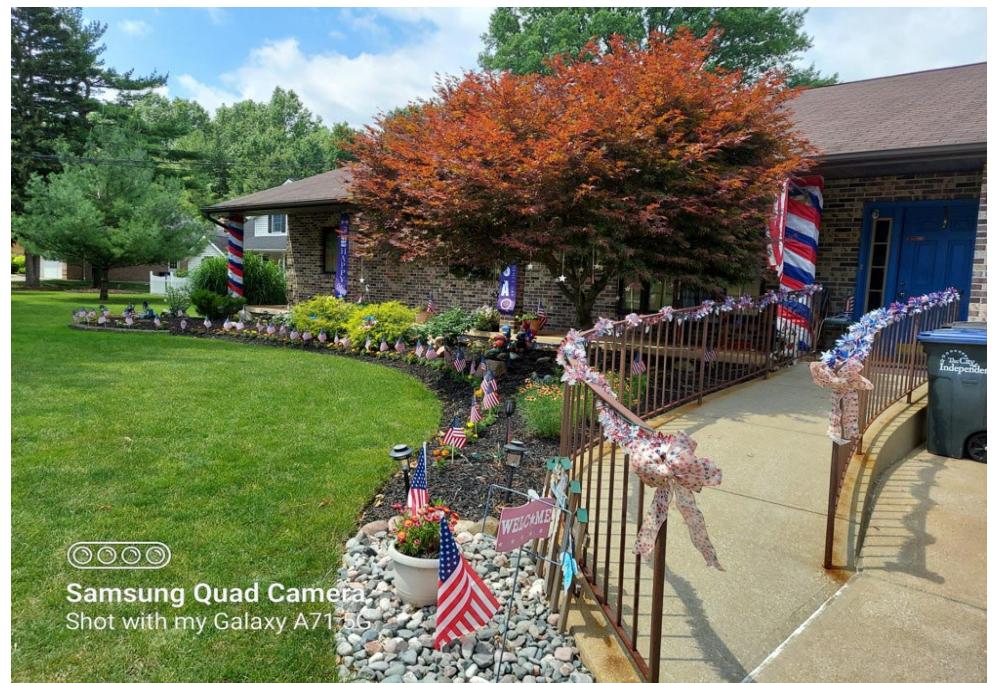
City of Independence names winners of first Spirit of Patriotism Home Decorating Contest

Ohio's Home Energy Assistance Program now accepting applications for help with summer utility bills

Cuyahoga County is once again participating in a statewide program to assist older adults and adults with disabilities with their summer utility bills. Ohio's 2021 Home Energy Assistance Program's (HEAP) Summer Crisis Program will provide eligible households with a one-time benefit to assist with electric utility bills, central air conditioning repairs and air conditioning unit and/or fan purchases.

"We want older residents to know there is help as we move into the warmer months," said County Executive Armond Budish. "No one should suffer through high summer temperatures without utilities to keep them cool and safe. This program helps keep the air on."

The county's Division of Senior and Adult Services (DSAS) partners with the Western Reserve Area Agency on Aging as one of its Aging and Disability Resource Centers. Through this partnership, DSAS receives funding to provide residents ages 60 and over (or 18 to 59 with a disability) with assistance on HEAP and a variety of other programs to keep them safe and supported at home.

Last summer, DSAS helped over 200 older adults with utility assistance. The maximum benefit amounts for the 2021 program are \$500 for customers of regulated utilities and \$800 for customers of unregulated utilities (municipal utilities or cooperatives). Household income must be at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines and households must have at least one additional eligibility criteria listed below:

A household member who is age 60 or older.

A household member who has a documented medical condition verified by a licensed medical professional who is qualified under Ohio law to write prescriptions.

A household member that was diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 12 months may provide a written statement as proof of medical diagnosis.

A household's electric utility has a disconnect notice, has been shut off or new electric service is being established for the household.

As an additional benefit, households may also receive an air conditioning unit and/or fan or central air conditioning repairs if the household can maintain electric service for 30 days. Households may receive the maximum utility assistance benefit towards their electric bill and still receive the additional benefit (central air conditioner repair, air conditioner unit and/or fan). Air conditioning units and fans will only be provided to eligible customers who have not received one in the last three years.
