State opening up vaccines even more beginning Fri.

Governor Mike DeWine announced yesterday that starting this Friday, March 19, anyone over 40 and those Ohioans with cancer, chronic kidney disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, heart disease and obesity can sign up for the COVID-19 vaccine.

On March 29, Ohioans ages 16 and up can also get the vaccine. To register, go to: <https://gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov/>

Staff at branches of the Cuyahoga County Public Library will also assist residents in signing up.

"I encourage all our residents to get their vaccine as soon as possible," said Cleveland Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli. "I got mine last week and it was quick, easy and painless. Let's stop the spread together!"

Here's two local opportunities for the vaccine:

Elizabeth Baptist Church

Free COVID-19 vaccinations are available on Saturday, March 20, at Elizabeth Baptist Church, 6114 Francis Ave., Cleveland, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., to those Cleveland residents age 50 and older and those who are eligible under Phase 1A, 1B, 1C and 1D as outlined by the Ohio Department of Health.

Those who work in the city of Cleveland in an occupation eligible for vaccine distribution are also qualified.

Please register in advance to reserve an appointment at: thecentersohio.org/vaccine. To register over the phone or for assistance, call the Elizabeth Baptist Church office at 216-815-0604 through Thursday, March 18, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. daily.

Individuals with appointments will receive the Pfizer vaccine and will automatically be scheduled for a second dose on Saturday, April 10.

Indy Clinic

The Cleveland Clinic has begun scheduling appointments for COVID-19 vaccinations at the soon-to-be-open clinic across the street from Independence City Hall, as noted in Mayor Gregory Kurtz's Weekly Update email last Friday.

Vaccinations will take place inside the Clinic's Business Operations Center at 6801 Brecksville Rd. Anyone who receives their first vaccine dose at this location will return there to get the second shot.

Three-year-old dies in Garfield Hts. apartment fire

A fire at 4605 E. 131st St. in Garfield Heights Sunday night claimed the life of a three-year-old child as flames engulfed an upper apartment in the building.

The Garfield Heights Dispatch Center received multiple calls of a structure fire at the E. 131 St. address at

about 11:26 p.m. Sunday, March 14. Firefighters with Garfield Heights Engine #2 reported heavy fire on the second floor and reports of a three-year-old in the apartment.

They made entry through the second story window and searched the bedroom. Af-

ter making a fire attack on the living room, the child was found deceased with the area engulfed in flames.

Cuyahoga Hts. rendered aid with a squad, Valley View with an air truck and Maple Heights with a squad. Maple Heights police also responded for crowd control.

Garfield Heights Command released the Maple Heights engine and Valley View air truck shortly after midnight, and the Garfield Heights service director was contacted for temporary shelter, if needed, for at least 20-30 people evacuated from the apartment building. The Red Cross was also notified.

The building was cleared by the fire department by 12:30 a.m. The Ohio Division of the State Fire Marshall's Office is conducting an ongoing investigation.

FBI seeks info in death of man in Cuy. Valley National Park

Agents from the Cleveland Division of the FBI's Violent Crime Task Force and agents from the National Park Service Investigative Service Branch are investigating the death of a man found Tuesday, March 9, at the Terra Vista Natural Study Area in the Cuyahoga Valley National Park in Valley View.

It is believed the death of Matthew John Dumire, 31, occurred a few days before the discovery of the body, according to FBI spokesperson Special Agent Vicki Anderson.

Law enforcement is asking anyone that may have information regarding Dumire or the circumstances surrounding his death to call the Cleveland Division of the FBI at 877-FBI-OHIO.

Cuyahoga Heights applies for tree canopy grant

The Village of Cuyahoga Heights has partnered with West Creek Conservancy and applied for a Cuyahoga County Healthy Urban Tree Canopy 2021 Grant, as announced at last Wednesday's meeting of the village council. If awarded, the \$36,530 grant will be used for the Canal Road Reforestation and Enhancement Project. The village's match would be \$1,830.

Also at the meeting, the following purchases were authorized:

- Change order for seasonal salt purchase not to exceed \$12,000
- Change order for snow plow repairs not to exceed \$7,500
- Guardrail replacement not to exceed \$6,000

Two resolutions were passed by council at the meeting,

a memorial resolution for village resident Linda M. Grabowski, 71, who passed away last month, and a resolution urging Gov. Mike DeWine and the Ohio Department of Public Health to include law enforcement officers in Tier 1B regarding the distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine and to increase the amount of vaccine sent to Cuyahoga County to accomplish this request.

The mayor was also authorized to execute any documents necessary for agreements pertaining to the Preventative Maintenance Funding Program.

MHPD seeks shooting suspect

Last Wednesday, March 10, shortly after midnight, Maple Heights police were called to Danny's Tavern,

15313 Broadway Ave., for a report of a man shot. They found the victim, age 25, had been shot in the lower abdomen, but was conscious and able to speak with officers. He was transported to an area hospital and is in stable condition, according to an MHPD press release.

Officers learned that a fight had occurred between two men inside the bar and continued outside where the suspect produced a handgun from his waistband.

The two men struggled for the weapon and the victim ultimately was shot in the stomach.

The suspect, described as a black male, about 5'11" tall with medium build, fled the scene.

Indy Council update

Independence Council met on Tuesday, March 9, in a virtual regular session and passed an extensive amount of ordinances and resolutions.

Included in legislation passed are the following:

- Committing the city to increase its tree canopy between 2021 and 2030 to improve air and water quality, absorption of carbon dioxide, reducing stormwater runoff and improving the aesthetics of the community.
- Payment of \$22,500 to the Southwest Council of Governments for annual membership dues.
- Authorizing the purchase and installation of the Enterprise Asset Management, Tyler 311, and MyCivic modules from Tyler Technologies in an amount not to exceed \$250,000.
- Renewing the contract with Bob Sumerel Tire & Service in Seville, Ohio, for the purchase and supply of tires and related products and services for city vehicles at the same or lower prices as originally bid, in a total amount not over \$50,000.
- Funding the ongoing and likely future road and right-of-way repair work necessitated by numerous water main breaks, leaks and/or water valve and/or hydrant repairs to total not over \$100,000.
- Four separate ordinances authorizing the retention of ACM Construction Management LLC, The Mannik & Smith Group, Inc., Environmental Design Group and GPD Group to provide general construction engineering and inspection services to the engineering department for various city projects, with each of the four companies to receive \$50,000.
- Authorizing temporary and permanent right-of-way acquisitions from each property owner in connection with the Old Rockside Road Bridge No. 00.42 Replacement Project in an amount not to exceed appraised value and for a total amount not to exceed \$120,000.
- Increasing the amount of funds allocated to the retention of Attorney McLandrich and the law firm of Mazanec, Raskin & Ryder Co., LPA to represent former Independence Mayor Anthony Togliatti in an amount not to exceed \$3,000, and for a total amount not to exceed \$90,000.
- Purchase and delivery of a camera truck for the service department, a Ford F-550 from Valley Ford Truck in Valley View, in an amount not to exceed \$61,363, and to be equipped with an Envirosight ROVER X System Inspection Crawler from Best Equipment Co., Inc. in Indianapolis, Indiana, in an amount not to exceed \$190,357, less a trade-in credit for the city's 2013 Lateral Launch Crawler of \$20,000 for a total amount not over \$231,720.
- Purchase and delivery of three 2020 Freightliner trucks for the service department in an amount not to exceed \$491,626, and a SwapLoader Hoist and Henderson Snow & Ice Control System for each new vehicle in an amount not to exceed \$730,475 for a total amount not over \$1,222,100.

• Approving the preliminary plan for CSA America Testing & Certification LLC, located at 8801 East Pleasant Valley Rd.

• Accepting the bid of Specialized Construction, Inc. of Cuyahoga Heights, for the city's 2021 Crack Seal Program contract not to exceed \$181,223.70.

• Authorizing John Butler to retain possession of his fire department helmet and duty badge upon retirement Council update

Memorial bench to honor V.V.'s Dave Wingenfeld

Maria Eder of Longspur Ct., Valley View, was introduced at the March 2nd meeting of the village council as spokesperson for a group of residents seeking to have a memorial bench be placed in Valley View Woods to honor former Councilman Dave Wingenfeld, who passed away in December.

Eder said her group was not asking for public funding, only that council acknowledge and approve suitable

placement of the privately funded bench.

A motion was passed by council at the meeting to support placement of a bench in memory of Wingenfeld in Valley View Woods.

Legislation approved by council at the March 2nd meeting included:

- Accepting a bid for a 2022 32-yard rear loading refuse truck for use in the service department.
- Lot and plat split, consolidation and dedication of two parcels of land for the widening of the north side of Schreiber Rd.
- Appointment of Don Harter as service director following the retirement of former service director Ladd Soldat. Harter was the service division foreman before his promotion to service director.

Mayor Jerry Piasecki said Harter has a long history for addressing daily issues promptly, adding he knows the position and how to get things done.

"Congratulations go out to Don for a well deserved promotion," the mayor said.

- Authorizing Police Chief Niro to renew the village's annual membership in the Southwest Enforcement Bureau for 2021 at a cost of \$12,500.
- Authorizing Fire Chief Papesh to renew the village's annual membership in the Southwest Emergency Response Team for 2021 at a cost of \$10,000.
- Authorizing Engineer Sciano to prepare plans and specifications and advertise for bids for the Winik Field Outfield Storm Sewer Replacement Project.

Upon arrival, police observed a suspicious vehicle traveling slowly north on E. 110 St., running a stop sign and making a right turn onto Langton and rapidly accelerating. The officer activated his overhead lights but the vehicle did not stop. A pursuit ensued, and when the suspect vehicle reached E. 114 St. south of McCracken it collided with another car and sped away, with police still in pursuit. As it increased speed and reached the intersection of E. 115 St.

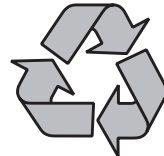
and Granger Rd., the suspect vehicle nearly struck a police cruiser which had been in the area south of the vehicle.

Maple Heights PD was advised of the pursuit and other GHPD units were notified that there were at least two occupants in the vehicle. The suspect vehicle traveled south on E. 134 St. nearly losing control, continued east on Bangor Ave., and

drove onto a tree lawn of the residences at that intersection, slowed down and continued east on Bangor Ave., struck the curb at the E. 135 St. and Bangor intersection and finally came to a stop in the 5400 block of E. 135 St. When police approached the vehicle there was no one in the car. The suspects had apparently fled on foot in an unknown direction.

Bedford PD responded to a request for a K-9. In the car police found a .22 AR-15 style rifle in the front passenger floor board loaded with a magazine containing 22 rounds of ammunition. They also found a handgun holster and a baggie containing 29 loose rounds of live 9mm ammunition. No subjects were located during the K-9 search.
