New tenant coming to Highland Park; Double homicide in Maple Heights city contracts to overhaul G.H. website

At the Monday night meeting of Garfield Heights Council, Mayor Matt Burke announced that a new tenant has signed a 10-year lease to take over the former AJ Wright and Dick's Sporting Goods buildings at the old CityView property, now known as Highland Park.

Burke said the company will bring a \$4 million payroll to Garfield Heights, adding to the city's tax base.

Residents who have been complaining about the city's website at recent council meetings will be glad to know that Monday night an ordinance was passed to contract with CivicPlus for the design, creation and continuing technical support for a new Garfield Heights city website.

The new and improved website will allow the city to send email and SMS messages to residents, provide an interactive calendar for residents to view all upcoming city events and create a document center where information such as agendas, minutes, and newsletters can be stored in one convenient, central location.

The total cost for the website and its technical support will not exceed \$50,000 over a four-year period and will be paid for entirely through funding from the American Rescue Plan Act provided to the city as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Also passed by council was an emergency ordinance to purchase a Caterpillar hydraulic excavator for the Service Department, at a cost not to exceed \$46,080.70. It will replace a 1997 piece of equipment.

Special meeting called

A special meeting of Garfield Heights Council will be held via Zoom or dial-in on Tuesday, May 18, at 6:30 p.m. to interview candidates for the position of council representative from Ward 4. The interviews will be conducted in a closed executive session, after which a candidate will be selected and voted upon.

Police are seeking help with their investigation into the shooting deaths last Saturday of two men who have not yet been identified.

On Saturday, May 8, at 1:13 p.m., the Maple Heights Police Department responded to the area of Gardenvue Dr. and Mayville Ave. for a report of two males that had been shot. Officers found the two men in a vehicle with multiple gunshot wounds to their bodies. One of the males was dead and the other was transported to Marymount Hospital, where he was pronounced dead. The identities of the males are unknown at this time.

The Bureau of Criminal Investigation responded to help process the scene. The Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office transported the victims to the coroner's office and took possession of the vehicle in which they were found.



The Maple Heights Police Department is looking to identify the parties in the photo. Police believe they may have witnessed the shooting. If someone can identify them or know who they are, they are asked to contact the Maple Heights Detective Bureau.

Cleveland Council votes to support request to reopen Tamir Rice case

Cleveland City Council held a virtual meeting electronically Monday and approved a resolution strongly supporting a request by four Ohio lawmakers to U.S. Attorney General Merrick Garland to reopen the investigation into the fatal police shooting of Tamir Rice in 2014.

Ohio Senator Sherrod Brown and House members Tim Ryan, Joyce Beatty and Marcy Kaptur recently asked Garland to reopen the investigation, which had been initially opened by the Justice Department under the Obama administration, but abruptly closed under the Trump administration.

The resolution reads in part: "This Council agrees strongly with Senator Brown and Representatives Ryan, Beatty and Kaptur that the only way justice will be done for the Tamir Rice family is for the Justice Department to reopen the investigation in order to completely and adequately investigate the police shooting of the boy."

Council also passed legislation to accept the first half of American Rescue Plan Act funds, which the city is expecting from the U.S. Treasury this week or next, as well as approved acceptance of a second disbursement the Treasury will send in about 12 months.

The total coming to the city of Cleveland is about \$541 million and must be spent by 2024. Council and the city is awaiting clear guidelines from the Treasury about its uses, though the federal government has told cities to use it for Covid-related revenue losses. About \$79 million will go to the city to recover losses from the pandemic in 2020.

Stella Walsh Rec Center in Slavic Village reopens

Cleveland Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli reports that the roof replacement at Stella Walsh Recreation Center, 7345 Broadway Ave., is complete and the rec center is opening back up in time for summer activities for residents.

This summer's programming includes meals for youth as well as the traditional activities such as pool aquatics, swimming, yoga, tee-ball and much more.

"Thank you to the Mayor's Office of Capital Projects for coordinating this million dollar investment in our neighborhood; we look forward to planning this year for additional renovations next year," the councilman said.



Walsh Rec Center Manager George Jackson said they are looking forward to a tee-ball season and promotions for that should begin by the end of this month. The center will open to children as early as 12 noon for open swim during the summer sessions and will end at 5 p.m., with adult swim to follow.

"We are working with additional program instructors to see when things like aerobics, aquacise and yoga are ready to resume," Jackson said.

Third Federal hosting Drive-Thru, Walk-Thru COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic

Third Federal opened its Corporate Campus parking lot to support a drive-thru/walk-thru COVID-19 vaccine clinic last Thursday, with additional clinics scheduled for Thursday, May 13, and Thursday, May 20.

Headquartered in Cleveland's Slavic Village neighborhood, the clinic is open to the public with pre-registration, and is directed toward those in the most vulnerable zip codes in the city of Cleveland.

Area code 44105, in the Slavic Village neighborhood, has the third lowest vaccination rate in the city, with adjacent area code, 44104, having the lowest rate.

The goal of the clinic is to provide a large-scale opportunity in the center of the neighborhood and on accessible bus lines to get as many residents vaccinated as possible. Hundreds of vaccines can be delivered at each

of the clinic dates to bring vaccines to as many residents as possible.

"We are committed to the communities we serve, especially our own neighborhood of Slavic Village," said Chairman and CEO Marc A. Stefanski. "Knowing the health disparities in Slavic Village, and especially with the COVID-19 vaccine, made it even more important that we partner with MetroHealth and host these clinics for the community."

MetroHealth staff will be administering the Pfizer vaccine from noon to 7 p.m. to those ages 16+. Ages 16 and 17 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

"It is one of the key Morgana Run Trail connectors which is being planned for this year."

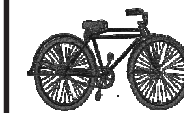

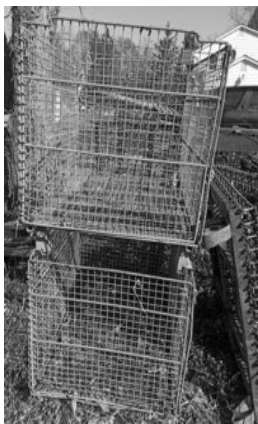

Council gives green light for new homes on city-owned lots in Maple Heights

At its teleconference meeting last week, Maple Heights Council approved legislation to sell four city-owned vacant lots in the Dunham Rd. area to Amato Homes I, LLC, of Copley, to build four new houses, with the potential for hundreds of thousands of dollars realized in the new home construction.

The resolution authorizes Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into an agreement with Amato to sell the four vacant parcels located at 6000 Dunham Rd., 6101 Dunham Rd., 6105 Dunham Rd., and 16112 Woodbrook Rd., for construction and sale of single family, Colonial-style, owner-occupied homes on each property.

As the developer, Amato will buy the parcels from the city's Land Bank at a fair market value of \$500 apiece, and is required to build the homes within 360 days. The homes will feature a full basement and attached garage, and must have at least 1500 square feet, 4 bedrooms and 2.5 baths, according to the resolution.

Maple Heights Economic Development Director Patrick Grogan-Myers said Amato Homes currently has houses for sale, under construction and in development in numerous inner ring suburbs in the Greater Cleveland area, including Parma, Euclid and Brook Park.

Grogan-Myers said the four homes will be constructed using a phased approach, with the sale price for the first home starting at about \$205,000, and the other three incrementally increasing to approximately \$230,000. As noted in the development agreement, the homes must be sold to owner-occupants.

Legislation passed

Council passed a resolution authorizing a change order for Metis Construction Services, to increase the contract by \$6,930 for the City Hall New Vestibule and Elevator Addition Project. Authorizing the change order will provide for the additional costs of the staging area as recommended by City Engineer Ed Hren.

Council also passed a resolution to submit an application to the Ohio Association of Regional Councils, through the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency, for Federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funding for the Citywide Signal Safety and Efficiency Upgrades Project in the city.

The citywide signal safety and efficiency upgrades that include the removal of unwarranted signals and the replacement of outdated signals and poles to allow for upgrades to signal timing, interconnect systems and accompanying upgrade controllers and technology in the city are a transportation activity eligible to receive federal CMAQ funding, according to the legislation.

The total project cost is estimated at \$4.2 million, and if Maple Heights is awarded the funding, the city will pay at least 20%, or an estimated \$855,000 towards the capital infrastructure improvement project, the resolution states.

Also passed was a resolution in support of submitting an application for similar CMAQ funding for the publicly owned Alternate Fuel Vehicles Program in the city in order to purchase alternate fuel vehicles for use by city employees.

Total project cost is estimated at \$247,000, and if the city is awarded the funding, it will pay 21% of the cost, or an estimated \$51,870 towards the project.

Council also passed a resolution designating the third Saturday in May annually as "Maple Heights Clean Up Day" to promote residents into displaying greater responsibility for their local environment by creating cleaner parks, streetscapes and public spaces through litter removal and elimination.

This coming Saturday, May 15, will be the Clean Up Day for 2021 in Maple Heights.

After removing it from the Finance Committee, council passed an ordinance enacting a chapter, "Audit Committee," to provide independent review and oversight of the city's financial reporting processes, internal controls and the independent auditor comments. This is upon the advise of the Ohio State Auditor that the committee must be organized.

The committee, to be comprised of Maple Heights Finance Committee members, two Maple Heights residents appointed by Council President Ron Jackson, and four Maple Heights residents appointed by Mayor Blackwell, must have current or previous finance industry employment experience, or serve in a finance capacity, preferably within government finance, and/or must be a recognized expert of the finance industry, the ordinance states.

Effective June 15, 2021, the Maple Heights Audit Committee will commence its duties.

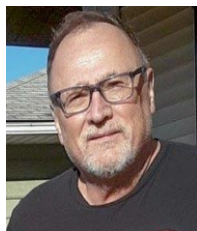
