Five hurt in Alice Ave. fire

A house fire last Wednesday, April 6, in the 7200 block of Alice Ave., off E. 71 St., in the Slavic Village area of Cleveland, sent several children and adults to MetroHealth Medical Center with injuries from the fire.

According to Cleveland police, taken to the hospital were a 43-year-old female seriously hurt with burns, a 6-year-old girl, 13-year-old girl, 7-year-old boy and 36-year-old man with nonlife threatening injuries.

The Cleveland Division of Police said that it is suspected that a methamphetamine lab was in the basement, which may have caused the fire, according to various media reports. Arson investigators and the bomb squad responded to the scene.

Garfield Hts. Council OK's mayor's request for changes in city staffing, pay rates

Garfield Heights Council met Monday night and passed an ordinance requested by Mayor Matt Burke to create staffing positions and make pay rate changes for some city non-union employees.

The legislation passed:

- Creates the position of Senior MIS Manager in the executive department;
- Increases the number of Finance Administrative Clerks from one to two and increases their pay from Level 3 to 4;
- Increases the number of foremen from three to four in the service department and includes the ability to have one foreman in the recreation department;
- Increases the pay of the Payroll Clerk in the human resources department from Level 3 to 4;
- Creates the position of Manager in the economic development department;
- Changes the pay for the Senior Center Manager in the social services department from Level 8 to 7.

Other legislation passed

The fire department will gain a new Road Rescue Squad with the approval of an ordinance to purchase the vehicle through Road Rescue, Burgess Hearse and Ambulance, Inc., for a purchase price of \$276,358.

A deteriorated waterline will be replaced and rerouted through property owned by Tinker's Creek Apartments with legislation passed directing the city of Garfield Heights to enter into an Easement Agreement with the property's owners and the city of Cleveland for future construction and maintenance of the waterline at no cost to the city.

A resolution was also passed by council Monday night to apply for a grant from the Ohio Department of Public Safety to provide funding to pay officers to work additional shifts on specific days throughout the year (Super Bowl Sunday, Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's, Independence Day, etc.) when there is traditionally an increase in alcohol-related driving offenses.

Cuyahoga County grants \$1.5 million to communities for tree planting, maintenance

Healthy Urban Tree Canopy Grants this year went to 39 Cuyahoga County communities which submitted applications and competed for a total of \$1,518,037.02 in funding for tree-planting and maintenance projects. Based on the evaluations, the top 27 ranked projects were awarded funding, and approximately 3,463 new trees will be planted.

This competitive grant program is coordinated by the Cuyahoga County Department of Sustainability, the Cuyahoga County Planning Commission and the Cuyahoga Soil & Water Conservation District, with assistance from the Cuyahoga County Board of Health.

The following local communities received grants:

City of Bedford

2022 Tree Replacement Program

The city of Bedford will continue to replant in residential areas where Emerald Ash Borer affected tree lawn trees. In 2014, Davey Tree identified nearly 600 ash trees, and since then approximately 85% have been removed but less than 150 have been replaced. Of those, 100 were

awarded in the first Healthy Urban Tree Canopy Program. Without grant funding there is no city funding to replace the affected trees or add new trees that are much needed in numerous Bedford-owned parks and play areas.

Bedford has been awarded \$50,000 and will plant 139 trees.

City of Maple Heights

Northeast Quadrant Tree Planting Project

The Northeast Quadrant Tree Planting Project will include planting new trees on Hansen Rd., Watson Rd. and Raymond St. between Warrensville Center Rd. and Northfield Rd.

Maple Heights has partnered with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District and the Ohio Public Works Commission to rehabilitate the sewers and roadways on these streets which requires many of the remaining trees to be removed with the sewer repair work.

Maple Heights has been awarded \$44,932.50 and will plant 107 trees.

Slavic Village Development

Reforest Slavic Village Part III

The existing tree canopy in Broadway Slavic Village (BSV) is 18.4%, and according to the 2015 City of Cleveland Tree Plan was a high priority location to increase tree canopy equity. This project focuses on planting trees on lots around AB Hart School and taking inventory and maintaining trees planted on vacant lots around the school. In addition, the construction of a new pocket park at the corner of Worley and Spafford Rd., in collaboration with residents, is being pursued. Slavic Village Development has been awarded \$21,385.87 and will plant 20 trees.

Maple Heights 'Sprayground' to open in June

The Maple Heights Aquatic Center and "Sprayground" at Stafford Park will open this summer, hopefully on Sunday, June 5, Mayor Annette Blackwell announced at the city council meeting last week.

For the past several years the pool in Stafford Park has been closed, due to financial concerns. The city did purchase equipment to open the new Sprayground adjacent to the pool area a few years ago, but had to scrap plans to open it due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

As COVID restrictions have eased in recent months, the area adjacent to the pool, featuring waterpark-style equipment, will open as a residents-only facility this summer. The pool itself is not scheduled to open this year, Blackwell stated.

In her report to council at last week's meeting, Human Services Director Linda Vopat confirmed that the Maple Heights Aquatic Center at the Mayville Ave. park will open this summer and "additional amenities are going to be put into the Sprayground."

Also regarding the preparations to open the Sprayground in June, council passed a resolution at last week's meeting

authorizing Blackwell to enter into a contract with Jadco Construction Services for the Stafford Park Pool Locker Room Rehabilitation Project, at a cost not to exceed \$49,400.

City directors have determined that various components of the Sprayground and pool house at Stafford Park are presently inoperable or otherwise in a state of disrepair and would require improvements to be made before it opens this summer.

Also concerning Stafford Park, placed on first reading was a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a contract with Nerone and Sons, Inc., to install outdoor fitness equipment at the park, at a cost of \$29,100.

The city received \$58,000 in grant funding from the Ohio Development Services Agency in 2020 for costs associated with opening and operating the sprayground, but the city decided not to open the sprayground last year due to the pandemic.

Other agenda items

Council passed a resolution approving a contract with Fabrizi Trucking and Paving Co., Inc. for the first phase of the Southwest Sewer Repairs Project, at a cost not to exceed \$864,114.

The project will encompass storm and sanitary sewer improvements on Mendota, Corkhill, Woodbrook, Florence Drive and Ladd Lane and the recently completed sewer repairs on Dunham Rd. between Schreiber and Turney rds.

The city has already been awarded \$1,135,180 by the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORS) for the project, and the Ohio Department of Public Works (ODPW) has committed to 70% of the labor and material costs, up to \$420,412. The Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works has also committed to use Maple Heights Sewer District 9 funds to supplement funding from the

NEORS, Ohio Public Works Commission and local sewer funds for the project.

Also passed were two ordinances, one to amend definitions of the city's zoning code, the other to amend the codified ordinances concerning the BCO Broadway Corridor Overlay Zoning District.

Council also okayed a resolution to enter into a purchasing participation agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation for the purchase of rock salt for contracts awarded in 2022.

Approved was a motion to accept the March 14, 2022 recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission and okayed the preliminary plat submitted by PIRHL Acquisitions LLC, contingent upon ownership of the 18 parcels being purchased by PIRHL as part of its Hazelwood Court Development Project, a senior citizen housing project being built in the Broadway-Waterbury area of the city.

The parcels will be transferred from the Maple Heights Land Reutilization Program to PIRHL before the final plat is submitted, according to the motion approved at last week's meeting.

Also approved was a motion to appoint Parrish Mines and Laketia Gaston to the Community Reinvestment Areas Housing Council, after nominations and voting were conducted by council at the meeting.

An ordinance to amend and restate the city's ordinances on towing contracts and rates was placed on first reading, as was a resolution authorizing Blackwell and Hren to submit an application to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trails Program and/or Clean Ohio Trails Fund Program, for possible financial assistance for the Jackson Boulevard Recreational Trail Project in the city.

An ordinance amending the city's ordinances regarding the use of the pavilions at Stafford Park will be on third reading, according to Council President Ron Jackson, after a motion to suspend the rules and pass the legislation on second reading failed. The ordinance is expected to be on the agenda at a future meeting.

Council voted not to overrule a decision by the Planning and Zoning Commission to deny the application of Jason Young for a variance to build a 10-foot by 16-foot deck on the front of his house at 16901 Raymond St.

Police firearms trade-in approved

Information was released this week on a special meeting held by council on March 30, during which council approved a resolution authorizing Police Chief Todd Hansen to trade in \$54,430 worth of firearms that are no

Cleveland donates to rescue efforts in Ukraine

Cleveland City Council held its regular meeting Monday night and passed legislation authorizing the city's Department of Public Safety to donate 200 ballistic vests and various non-controlled medications for humanitarian and rescue efforts in Ukraine. Councilman Mike Polensek had asked the city to look for surplus items that could be donated.

The vests and medications, no longer needed here, will be donated through the Ohio National Guard. The vests are from the police department. The medications are from EMS.

Council also adopted legislation authorizing the city to loan a public-private partnership up to \$12 million to help it acquire and redevelop the Shaker Square Shopping Center, which has fallen on hard times.

The shopping center, the oldest shopping district in Ohio and the second oldest in the nation, is a longtime economic engine, vital to the southeast side of Cleveland, say sponsors of the bill, especially the Buckeye-Woodland corridor, one of the poorest areas of the city.

The center, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places, is anchored by a grocery store, drug store and movie theater.

Refinancing proposed by the owner for March 2020 fell through when the COVID-19 crisis hit. The square at that time was appraised at about \$14 million. The owner, the Coral Company, let the square fall into default and receivership. The center is currently in bank foreclosure

and is managed by a court appointed receiver. The square is suffering from accumulating deferred maintenance.

Two non-profits, Cleveland Neighborhood Progress and Burten Bell Carr Development, have partnered with New Village Corporation to acquire and stabilize Shaker Square with two loans from the city. The two loans are \$6 million each, one to be repaid in five years and the other a ten-year loan that is forgivable under certain conditions.

About \$4 million is being raised from foundations and other organizations to pay for the deferred maintenance, including roof and window leaks. The organizations also plans to recruit new tenants in the small number of vacancies at the square.

Once stabilized, the non-profits plan to market the property to an experienced local developer to purchase the square.

It's the Law in Garfield Hts.

535.02 NOISE DISTURBANCES

PROHIBITED

(a) No person shall make, cause, permit or allow any of the following noise disturbances:

(1) Owning, possessing or harboring an animal or bird that howls, barks, meows, squawks or makes any noise that annoys or disturbs a person of reasonable sensibilities.

(2) Operating or permitting the operation of any sound device for purposes of entertainment that exposes customers to a sound level greater than 95 DBA unless a conspicuous sign is posted near each entrance stating the warning, "Sound levels within may cause hearing loss or impairment."

(3) The repairing or testing of any motor or engine in a manner that annoys or disturbs a person of reasonable sensibilities, or at all between the hours of 9 p.m. and 8 a.m.

(4) Operating an internal combustion engine at any time without a muffler or, in the case of motorcycles, baffle plates, in good repair other than to make reasonable

repairs.

(5) Operating a motor vehicle or auxiliary equipment attached to a motor vehicle while parked for more than five minutes in any one hour period between the hours of 9 p.m. and 8 a.m.

(6) Loading, unloading or handling of boxes, crates, building materials, garbage cans or similar objects between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m., Monday through Saturday, and before 10 a.m. or after 9 p.m. on Sundays. This section applies to all refuse collection.

(7) The operation of commercial tools or equipment for construction or demolition purposes between 9 p.m. and 7:30 a.m., Monday through Saturday, and before 10 a.m. or after 9 p.m. on Sundays.

(8) The sounding of any emergency signaling device for a period of time lasting longer than two minutes for emergencies or for testing, or the sounding of an emergency signaling device for any duration for a purpose other than an emergency for testing. Testing may not be conducted between 9 p.m. and 8 a.m.

(9) The operation of domestic power tools between 9 p.m. and 8 a.m. Monday through Saturday and before 10 a.m. or after 9 p.m. on Sundays.

(10) The use of a loudspeaker or public address system between 9 p.m. and 8 a.m. Monday through Saturday and before 10 a.m. on Sundays.

(11) The operating, playing or permitting the playing of any radio, television, musical instrument, sound amplifier or similar device or the sound of human communication, at any time, at a volume that disturbs a person of reasonable sensibilities.

(12) The playing of music or similar sounds from a motor vehicle that is plainly audible to a person not an occupant of the motor vehicle.

recorded it on their cell phones. After school students told the victim that the other girl had said she was going to bring a knife to school. Officers observed three cuts to the girl's face. Shots Fired
