Fireworks laws in Garfield could remain in full force; council approves \$3.6 million in notes for road repairs

Nothing will be changing this 4th of July in Garfield Heights as far as rules regulating fireworks go if an ordinance introduced on first reading Monday night passes.

Garfield Heights Council Monday voted to pass for a second reading legislation that would opt out of the new state regulations in House Bill 172 which allows individuals to discharge consumer grade fireworks on their own property or that of others with permission on certain designated days.

The city seeks to keep in force its own longstanding law that bans the use of consumer grade fireworks, but does permit certain categories of toy or trick devices that contain minute levels of combustible materials.

Three ordinances providing for the issuance and sale of notes, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, were also given the green light by council Monday for improving streets and roads in the city, as well as sidewalks, catch basins, water lines, sanitary sewers, storms sewers and related drainage facilities.

The ordinances provide for a combined total of \$3.6 million in notes for the issuance of bonds to fund this extensive road repair project.

Other ordinances passed by council include:

- Preparing plans per the OHM Advisors proposal to go out for competitive bids for the Antenucci Sidewalk Phase Two Project, and authorizing payment of costs through funding by the Cuyahoga County Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$150,00 and the city of Garfield Heights in the approximate amount of \$65,000.

- Applying for a grant available by the Patrick Leahy Bulletproof Vest Partnership created by the Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Act of 1998 for the GHPD. The city is asking for a \$30,000 grant to purchase 30 bulletproof vests.

- Renewing an agreement on behalf of the city of Garfield Heights with Court Community Service. Due to inflation, the cost of the annual contract will be increased by 3%, or approximately \$1800.

Ward 1 Councilwoman Stacey Collier abstained from

voting on all the ordinances presented Monday night. She said she wanted to wait until council's Finance Committee meeting is held before she will approve any legislation regarding the city's finances.

Resolutions passed

- Honoring the memory of former Ward 7 Councilman Michael J. Abella, Sr., who also served a four-year term as council president, and extending condolences to his family.

- Accepting the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council sponsorship funding of \$3500 for community events for 2022.

- Applying for the 2022 Roger Sharrer "Grow Hockey" Program Grant, which provides for up to \$4000 to be spent for hockey and/or skating equipment.

The next regular meeting of Garfield Heights Council is scheduled for Monday, May 9.

Man shot at Marathon gas station in Garfield Hts.; G.H. credit union robbed

A 24-year-old male was shot multiple times Monday night inside a car outside the Marathon gas station at 5571 Turney Rd., Garfield Heights, according to Garfield Heights Police Lt. Robert Petrick.

The victim was in the car with a 19-year-old suspect in the shootings when a dispute arose. The victim was shot multiple times in the neck and chest. The suspect fled on foot from the scene and was captured by police in a backyard across from the gas station, Lt. Petrick said.

The victim reportedly drove himself to Marymount Hospital and was Lifeflighted from there.

"We're still trying to piece things together right now," Petrick said, "so we can't release any other details of the incident at the moment." No charges have as yet been filed in the shootings.

Credit Union robbed

GHPD was also kept busy earlier in the day Monday, Lt. Petrick said, when the St. Monica Credit Union, formally known as the Ohio Catholic Federal Credit Union, 13623 Rockside Rd., Garfield Heights, was robbed at 12 noon, the second robbery there in the past two months.

He said a female walked into the credit union and passed a note to the teller demanding money. She fled on foot but was picked up in a vehicle by a male accomplice. Police were given a description of the female suspect and she was located as a passenger in a car stopped at Broadway and Libby rds. in Maple Heights.

The suspect, age 22 of Garfield Heights, and her male accomplice, age 19, of Cleveland, have not as yet been charged.

Fitness equipment to be installed at Stafford Park

At a regular meeting held on Wednesday, April 20, Maple Heights Council approved legislation authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into a contract with Nerone and Sons, Inc., to install outdoor fitness equipment for the Stafford Park Outdoor Fitness Network Project at a cost of \$29,100.

It was noted in the legislation that Blackwell and Human Services Director Linda Vopat had sought funding from various county, state and federal agencies for setup, operation and management of the Stafford Park Pool Sprayground for the Summer 2020 and 2021 seasons, and

the city had subsequently received \$58,000 from the Ohio Development Services Agency in 2020 to open and operate the Sprayground.

However, due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the potential health risks to residents, the city elected not to open the Sprayground last year. So the funding was redirected towards the purchase of \$16,642 in outdoor fitness equipment for the park from Gopher Outdoor Sports.

Passage of last week's legislation means that Nerone, which submitted the lowest and best bid, can now go

forward with installing the equipment, the resolution states.

Also regarding recreation in the city, council passed another resolution authorizing Blackwell and City Engineer Ed Hren to apply to participate in the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) Recreational Trails Program and/or the Clean Ohio Trails Fund Program, for the Jackson Boulevard Recreational Trail Project in the Broadway-Libby neighborhood, near Maple Heights High School.

The multi-purpose trail designated for Jackson Boulevard would run from Clement Avenue to South Boulevard.

Towing legislation passed

Council also passed an ordinance at last week's meeting to amend and restate the city's ordinances concerning towing contracts and rates, and to eliminate bidding procedures at Police Chief Todd Hansen's recommendation. According to the legislation, the reason for this is "that the city no longer pays towing companies for their services, making a bidding requirement obsolete and time consuming."

The ordinance further states that the bidding procedures should be eliminated "because towing companies are heavily regulated by the Ohio Public Utilities Commission, which places greater restrictions and responsibilities on towing companies than the city's current version of (the ordinances)."

When the police department calls for tows (except in an emergency), they "shall only call towing contractors that have entered into contracts with the city," the legislation further states.

Also passed last week

- A resolution to buy a 2022 Ford F-350 work truck with

snow plow package for \$49,136 from Liberty Ford, Inc., for the city's fire department.

Council had approved legislation last year to buy a comparable truck from Tim Lally Chevrolet but that truck was no longer available, necessitating purchasing the truck from Liberty Ford.

- A resolution determining that an unimproved city-owned residential lot at 5258 Beech Ave. was no longer needed by the city, and to sell it to an adjacent property owner as a side yard.

- An ordinance to amend the city's 2022 budget for certain additional expenditures.

- A resolution to change the regular council meeting schedule for the summer months. Council meetings will be held at 7 p.m. on the following first Wednesdays of these months: June 1, July 6, and August 3. Unless otherwise specified, there will be no meetings held on the third Wednesday of these months. Council will resume its usual schedule in September.

- A resolution authorizing Chief Hansen to trade in \$47,795 worth of "outdated firearms" to Kiesler Police Supply for credit towards the purchase of \$45,869.20 worth of new replacement firearms, replacing similar legislation that was passed earlier.

An ordinance to amend the city's ordinances regarding the use of the pavilions at Stafford Park was moved to council's Finance Committee for further discussion.

This year the event will also include prayers for the Ukrainians suffering in the face of war and displacement and the people of Russia who stand peacefully protesting against this war.



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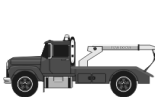
