GHPD gets \$1.3 million in state funds to fight crime

The Garfield Heights Police Department has been awarded \$1.3 million for advanced crime analysis and new technology to help identify repeat offenders and hotspots for crime.

Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine announced last Thursday the seventh round of law enforcement agencies in the state receiving grant funds totaling \$8.5 million as part of his Ohio Violent Crime Reduction Grant Program.

"Many law enforcement agencies across Ohio are facing an increase in resignations and a decrease in new applicants to fill those vacant positions, which has a direct impact on the safety of their communities," said DeWine. "I am committed to supporting agencies that need help filling their ranks so that they can effectively protect their citizens and themselves."

Garfield Heights Mayor Matt Burke thanked Police Chief Mark Kaye and Deputy Chief Dale Merchant and their team for their "hard work and dedication in applying for this important safety grant." Burke also extended his appreciation to Gov. DeWine "for awarding the \$1.3 million grant funding to help keep our community safe!"

PNC Bank to close Garfield Hts. branch

PNC Bank announced in a letter to its customers last Friday that the branch located at 4805 Turney Rd., Garfield Heights, will close on Nov. 18, 2022, and be combined with the branch in Cleveland at 7101 Broadway Ave., at E. 71 St.

The letter said the closure was made after a study of the effectiveness of the Garfield Heights location and other branches based on its physical capacity and the number of customers at that location.

"Our intent is that you will be able to continue banking at the Garfield Heights branch until 3 p.m. on Nov. 18, 2022, when the location is scheduled to permanently close," the letter from PNC Market Manager Drew R. Martin said.

It further noted that "uncertainty related to the COVID-19 pandemic could impact the planned process for this transition. We will do everything we can to communicate changes with you."

Special Maple Heights Council meeting set for tonight for vote on Road Repair Program resolution

A special Maple Heights Council meeting will be held tonight, Wednesday, Aug. 24, at 7 p.m., at the Maple Heights Senior Center, 15901 Libby Rd., as announced by Council President Ron Jackson yesterday, to reconsider legislation authorizing a contract for the 2022 Roadway Repair Program in the city.

The resolution, which failed to pass an emergency vote at council's Wednesday, Aug. 3, meeting was reintroduced to council under a different number and has already undergone first and second readings only, with no vote taken, at two special meetings held last week, Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella confirmed yesterday.

Earlier this month council failed to pass the resolution to authorize a contract for the repair work with Specialized Construction at a cost of \$988,270.

Mayor Annette Blackwell has expressed her strong support of completing the first phase of the three-year road repair program, estimated to cost about \$3 million over the years 2022, 2023 and 2024.

Tonight's special meeting will be open to the public. It will also be accessible via the ZOOM app, either by going to the ZOOM site on a computer, tablet or smartphone, and entering Meeting ID number 845 0116 7150, and Passcode number 321287; or by telephone by dialing 1-312-626-6799 and entering the same Meeting ID number and Passcode number, according to the announcement of the meeting.

NHPD responds to hit/skip

The Newburgh Heights Police Department responded to a report of a hit/skip crash on Harvard Ave., involving a stolen vehicle last Wed., Aug. 17, at about 10:19 a.m.

Officers began checking the area for the vehicle, which was reported to be a silver 2018 Kia Sportage that was reported stolen out of Lakewood. About 10:30 a.m., a Newburgh Heights officer spotted the stolen Kia Sportage driving on Fleet Ave., near E. 49 St.

The vehicle proceeded south on Independence Rd., a dead-end street, turned around and was observed by the NHPD officer as the suspect vehicle approached him. The officer attempted to stop the car and the driver complied. After the officer got out of the cruiser the suspect vehicle accelerated and tried to flee from the officer, who had to jump out of the way to avoid being hit.

The officer fired his service weapon at the vehicle, but by all known accounts did not strike it or the two occupants. When the vehicle fled, it also struck the police cruiser causing minor damage.

The Sportage fled onto Fleet Ave. The driver was later captured by Cleveland police, according to a post from 19 News. The officer was uninjured.

'State of Bedford' address

Fate of State Rep. Shayla Davis entering House District 18 race to be decided by secretary of state

State Rep. Shayla L. Davis has enough valid petition signatures to enter the race for State House District 18 on the Nov. 8 ballot, but whether she will qualify to run as a nonpartisan candidate has still not been decided.

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections certified her petitions earlier this month, but Shalira Taylor, a Republican write-in candidate for the House District 18 seat, submitted a protest on Aug. 9, to the Board of Elections against "a seating member of the Ohio House Democrat Caucus, Shayla Davis, being allowed to seek the state house seat an independent candidate."

On Monday morning the Board of Elections met to consider the merits of Taylor's protest and voted along party lines, 2 for and 2 against letting Davis run as an independent. Board of Election spokesman Mike West said the final decision will be made by Secretary of State Frank LaRose.

Davis was appointed to her current House District 11 seat in Feb. 2022. The newly constructed District 18 includes Garfield Heights, Maple Heights, all of Cleveland Wards 2 and 4, and portions of Cleveland Wards 1, 5, 6 and 12. She is a former councilwoman for the city of Garfield Heights.

Hearing stayed; parties ordered to mediation in Bedford's fight to keep local UH hospital open

The city of Bedford and University Hospitals will continue meeting about the future of the University Hospitals' Bedford facility, according to a news release last week from Lesic and Camper Communications, a public relations firm based in Cleveland and Columbus.

Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Judge Steven E. Gall met with attorneys from both parties for more than an hour Aug. 16. He then told those in the courtroom that the hearing has been stayed until Sept. 20, at 1:30 p.m., noting, "This is an important issue. We have had some preliminary discussions and it is our hope that the parties can come to an amicable solution."

Judge Gall said he will be available to mediate the discussion as needed, with mediation to occur at the courthouse.

To address the staffing shortages and optimize limited resources, UH announced on July 14, it would move its inpatient, surgical and emergency services at UH Bedford and UH Richmond medical centers, effective Aug 12, to its facilities at UH Ahuja, Geauga, Lake West, TriPoint, Beachwood, Geneva and Conneaut medical centers. However, local physician services provided at the campuses would continue.

Emergency Department services would shift from UH Bedford and UH Richmond campuses to nearby facilities at UH Ahuja (6.2 miles) and UH Lake West (6.1 miles), respectively. Inpatient services would be available at UH Ahuja, UH Lake West, UH TriPoint and UH Geauga medical centers.

"We're very pleased with today's outcome and look forward to having genuine, substantive discussions with University Hospitals' leadership about providing necessary medical services to the residents of Bedford and our neighboring communities," said Bedford City Manager Mike Mallis. "Judge Gall understands it is a very important issue. We are grateful he scheduled this hearing so quickly and for his desire to help us find resolution."

The hearing came as a result of a complaint for money damages and a motion for a temporary restraining order the city of Bedford filed against University Hospitals on Aug. 11. City leaders said UH's decision, issued with just 30-days notice, is creating a medical desert in communities where the majority of residents are African-American, economically disadvantaged, elderly and on Medicaid.

Earlier, Bedford Mayor Stan Koci indicated that UH had put the residents of Bedford, Bedford Heights, Oakwood Village, Walton Hills, Maple Heights and others in immediate and serious danger by closing Bedford Hospital's emergency room.

City Manager Mallis has pointed out that UH's closure of Bedford Hospital has increased ambulance times, resulting in the potential of exacerbated injuries and increased morbidity and mortality rates for its residents.

In addition to the temporary restraining order, city leaders have also filed a formal complaint with several federal offices alleging "redlining, racial discrimination and breach of the civil rights of the city of Bedford's citizens."

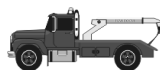

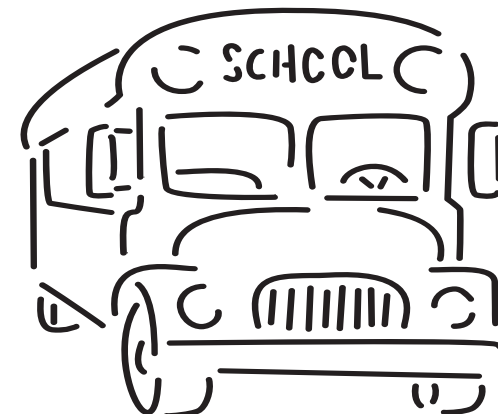

Cleveland Council mandates videos be released in 7 days in police use of deadly force

Cleveland City Council held the second of its two summer meetings earlier this month during summer recess. Regular council meetings will resume Monday, Sept. 12.

Body and Dash Camera Release Required in 7 Days: Council passed legislation sponsored by chair Councilman Mike Polensek that requires the Director of Public Safety to release within seven days video taken by bodycams or dash cams of incidents involving a police officer's use of deadly force. That includes videos from incidents where the force caused serious physical harm.

The footage is released by making it publicly available on the City website. Any additional remaining footage of the incident, redacted as consistent with applicable state and federal laws, shall be released within 30 days.

The Director of Public Safety, Chief of Police, and Director of Law are not required to release footage of an incident if prohibited by a court order or any legal prohibition.
