American Nationalities Movement honors U.S. Sen. Rob Portman, Anthony Brancatelli

The American Nationalities Movement of Ohio held its annual Christmas Party Luncheon last Saturday at Holy Spirit Party Center in Parma, and, along with the United Ukrainian Organizations of Ohio, honored retiring U.S. Senator Rob Portman for his work for freedom for all people, most recently his efforts to see that Ukraine has the tools to defend itself in its fight for freedom.

American Nationalities President Ralph J. Perk, Jr., in introducing Portman, said that after decades of representing Ohio in national government, Sen. Portman will be truly missed, especially by the ethnic community.

In his remarks after presentation of an award to Sen. Portman by Marta Kelleher from the Ukrainian groups represented, Sen. Portman reiterated his support for "the unprovoked and brutal war in Ukraine," and freedom for all peoples from the tyranny of oppression.

The prestigious American Nationalities Movement's Freedom Award was given to former Ward 12 Councilman Anthony (Tony) Brancatelli for his untiring work in devoting his professional life to his community.

A lifelong resident of Slavic Village, Brancatelli was executive director of Slavic Village Development, a position he held for 17 years. There he strove to preserve and improve the ethnically diverse industrial community in southeast Cleveland. Under his watch, 500 new homes were built, 1000 homes rehabbed, and much-needed services were provided to residents, especially to those in need.

His Slavic Village Development service was followed by 17 years as Ward 12 representative in Cleveland City Council, where he advocated for the establishment of the Cuyahoga County Land Reutilization Corporation, more commonly referred to as the Land Bank, and served as a member since its inception and as chairman for 10 years.

Brancatelli has been a leader in the fight against urban blight brought on by the national foreclosure crisis, and as councilman led the effort to demolish ravaged vacant properties and rebuild neighborhoods. He continues to serve on the Cleveland Landmarks Commission as well as other citywide advocacy and policy committees.

and his city. Brancatelli thanked Judge Perk and the Nationalities Movement for honoring him with the Freedom Award and said his life of service has "truly been a blessing."

In 1990, the American Nationalities Movement awarded its first Freedom medals to its staunch supporters, including one to President George H.W. Bush.

Father of man killed in May police chase, family's attorney appear at Maple Heights Council meeting

For the second time in as many months, the father of a man killed by a Maple Heights police officer in a May police chase that ended up in southeast Cleveland appeared at last week's city council meeting, accompanied by the family's attorney and a life-size photo of his deceased son, seeking answers from city officials on the incident.

Datwuan Catchings, 22, of Cleveland, was shot in the back by the Maple Heights officer following a car chase from Maple Heights into the E. 93-Buckeye area of Cleveland in the early morning hours of Monday, May 30.

According to police reports and body camera video released to the public by Cleveland police, which initiated the investigation, Maple Heights police chased the vehicle Catchings was traveling in because he was suspected of being involved in a drive-by shooting on Fernway Dr., earlier in the morning of May 30.

When Maple Heights officers spotted the vehicle

Catchings was in, they gave chase at high speeds into Cleveland, until the suspect vehicle struck a deer at E. 93 St. and Buckeye Ave., and Catchings exited the disabled vehicle and started running through the streets of that neighborhood.

The body camera video of the officer who shot Catchings showed him running with what was described as a "right angle shaped object" in his left hand as the officer pursued him on foot, repeatedly ordering Catchings to put his hands up or he would be shot.

When Catchings got to a tall fence, the video showed him starting to climb over the fence with both hands, with the object still in his left hand. He was facing away from the officer as he climbed over the fence, when the officer fired a single shot, striking Catchings in the back. A firearm was recovered at the scene, and Catchings was taken to a nearby hospital, where he was pronounced dead shortly after arrival, according to police reports.

Investigation into the shooting is now being conducted by the Attorney General's Bureau of Criminal Investigation.

At last week's meeting, Attorney Stan Jackson, with the Cochran Firm in Cleveland, who is representing the Catchings family, got up to speak during the portion of the agenda devoted to citizen comments, along with Catchings' father, Dean Catchings. The two men brought a life-size photo cutout of Datwuan Catchings to the podium with them, standing it up and facing it towards Blackwell and council members as they spoke.

Jackson stated that his office had done extensive research into what took place in the incident and analyzed the video, and also pointed out that the officer had worked at other places before coming to Maple Heights.

Jackson noted that the officer had worked at the Kent State University and Brooklyn police departments, alleging, "He didn't do very well. Actually he was reprimanded repeatedly... He didn't make it through his probationary period, which in Brooklyn is two years. They extended it, but before he could even get to the end of it, they forced him to resign. All of this is noted in interviews and in our review, that the city of Maple Heights did for the hire, so they knew all of this."

Jackson said that when the officer was asked in his pre-hire questionnaire where he felt he needed the most help, he

answered, "I need more shoot, don't shoot scenarios." Jackson said that "if you review the video, you can see that this young man is actually climbing the fence and had both his hands on the fence when he was shot," Jackson said.

He added, "Now in most other communities, if an officer is under investigation, which he is, and shortly within the next 60 to 90 days the attorney general will make a determination about bringing that case to a grand jury, normally those officers (under investigation) are on desk duty. This officer is back on the street, interacting with the public... I just want you to take the time to review this information and get involved in this process.... This family, and your community, deserves better."

Dean Catchings was the next to speak. He said the dash cam video from the police car involved in the incident needed to be examined for more information.

"Somebody needs to do something, because I'm speaking from my personal knowledge, with the council people, I see them working with the public... They've got their concerns, and now I see a little bit different looks on your faces. You all look like you're really concerned, and I appreciate it," he said.

Blackwell explained that she was limited in what she could say because of the ongoing investigation, however, "Very clearly, I have a job to do here. I have to make decisions on all of the facts, from up to what happened that night to where we are today."

She said that as for any potential charges, "I can't speak truly to that," because of the investigation. "I do appreciate your coming back, and I will be happy to meet with you and see you again, in a separate meeting," she added.

Blackwell concluded, "With the holidays coming up, I can only imagine the pain you possess today, as well as the siblings and all of those that loved your son, and I mean that sincerely."

Legislation

Council had a large amount of legislation on the agenda at last week's meeting, and passed the following four pieces among them, with Blackwell crediting the Cuyahoga County Council and District 8 County Councilman Pernel Jones, Jr. for awarding the city a total of \$750,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funds to assist with financing the following:

- Maple Heights Senior Center Emergency Generator Project, at a cost of \$140,000.
- Maple Heights Fire Station No. 1 Roof Repair Project, at a cost of \$480,000.
- Maple Heights Fire Station No. 2 Roof Repair Project, at a cost of \$80,000.

- The Maple Heights Police Department Locker Room Expansion Project, at a cost of \$50,000.

Other legislation passed included:

- Authorizing Amendment No. 2 to the Maple Heights Local Public Agency Agreement with ODOT for the Safe Routes To School project, to enhance sidewalks and crossings along the main roads to city schools along Dunham Rd. from Turney to Rockside rds., increasing the eligible funding from \$150,000 to \$200,000.

- Executing an agreement with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District for \$319,525 in Community Cost Share program funds for the Southwest Sewer District Sewer Repairs, Dunham Rd. Project.

- Two separate resolutions to enter into Member Community Infrastructure Program Grant Program agreements with NEORS, for the Southwest Sewer District Sewer Improvement projects, Phase 1A (\$1,431,750), and Phase 3 (\$182,700), respectively.

- Entering into an amended contract with Senior Transportation Connection to conduct the day-to-day call center and scheduling operations of the city's Senior Transit operations for 2023, in the amount of \$1,157 per month, or \$13,888 annually.

Announcements

Law Director Frank Consolo announced that the Ohio Supreme Court had voted down Maple Heights' lawsuit that claimed that video service providers Netflix and Hulu owed 5% of their annual revenues to the city. The court ruled that Netflix and Hulu "were not cable service providers, which is what we expected," Consolo said. "We are awaiting a report from the law firm and we will get with

the mayor on options we may have."

Police Chief Todd Hansen said police had a good line on a suspect in the Saturday, Dec. 3, homicide of a man on Raymond St. Reassuring concerned residents, he stated, "It was an isolated incident, a one-time incident."

Assault charges will be reviewed by the prosecutor's office.

Three men shot on Ramage St. in M.H. Auxiliary police officer to serve as sgt.-at-arms at G.H. Council meetings

Three men were sent to the hospital with gunshot wounds Sunday, when a fight broke out on Ramage St., in Maple Heights.

On Sunday, Dec. 11, at approximately 2:20 a.m., Maple Heights police responded to the 15900 block of Ramage St., regarding a disturbance where multiple people were fighting and shots were fired.

Officers arrived in the area and found three males with gunshot wounds. The victims were immediately given first aid and transported to area hospitals. Three homes were also found to have been struck with gunfire; no one in those homes was injured, police said.

Officers located four people in the area involved in the disturbance that were initially taken into custody and transported to the Maple Heights Police Department. After an initial investigation the detained parties were released later that morning pending further investigation.

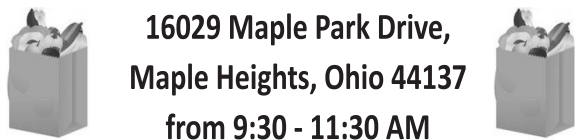
