Area suburbs to receive thousands from state for body camera programs

Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine announced Friday that the state will award nearly \$4.9 million to law enforcement agencies across Ohio to help cover costs associated with body camera programs.

A total of 112 law enforcement agencies will receive grant funding as part of the Ohio Body-Worn Camera Grant Program. Of those agencies, 44 will use funding to create new body-worn camera programs and 68 agencies will dedicate funding toward expanding or upgrading existing technology.

In The Neighborhood News readership area, Garfield Heights will receive \$74,357; Independence \$59,107.20; Newburgh Heights \$41,334.85; Valley View \$4,521.

“Body cameras are an essential tool for policing, and the funds we’re awarding today will help agencies purchase around 1,660 new body cameras and associated technology,” said Gov. DeWine last Friday. “Body cameras are important not only for providing transparency to the public but also for adding an extra layer of protection for our officers.”

Friday’s grants represent the second round of funding awarded as part of the Ohio Body-Worn Camera Grant Program. The first round of grants, announced in January, provided funding to help 109 local law enforcement agencies purchase around 1,700 body cameras and related equipment.

Ohio’s Office of Criminal Justice Services, which is administering the grant program, received \$11.4 million worth of grant requests for this round of funding. All qualifying agencies that applied for grants to establish new body-worn camera programs received funding, and the remaining funds went to existing programs to upgrade aging cameras, add storage capacity or hire record-retainment personnel.

Bedford Council authorizes 2023 repair work on Northfield bridge, Broadway

With the cooperation of the Ohio Department of Transportation, long-awaited repairs on the Northfield Road bridge and the entire stretch of Broadway Ave. in the city of Bedford will begin next year, after council passed two ordinances authorizing the work at its meeting Monday night.

ODOT will pay 100% of the cost of the work on the Northfield bridge over the Metroparks and Tinkers Creek including repairs of sidewalks, railings, fences,

Joseph Kocab, leader in SE Cleveland’s Czech community, passes away



Joseph Kocab, age 90, co-founder of the Czech Voice of Cleveland radio program and manager of the former Karlin Hall, a Czech social club on Fleet Ave. for decades, passed away last Saturday, Dec. 17.

His passing was just five days after the death of his nephew, Joseph C. Kocab, a past police chief in Brooklyn Heights.

John Sabol, the “Voice” now in the Czech Voice of Cleveland, announced Joe’s passing to his listeners via email.

“Joe was a friend and mentor to many of us as well as a teacher and administrator in the Cleveland Public School System,” Sabol said. “His knowledge of the history and historic personalities of Cleveland’s Czech community was beyond encyclopedic, and he shared this knowledge on the radio program he founded with Vaclav Hynnar more than 50 years ago.”

Sabol said a tribute radio broadcast honoring Kocab, who hosted the weekly broadcasts for 48 years, is being planned for Jan. 1.

Joe was a graduate of Benedictine High School, where he served as class president, member of the cheerleading squad and school newspaper staff. He received his B.A. degree in Zoology and his master’s degree in educational administration from Ohio University.

He was a teacher and department head at John Adams High School in Cleveland from 1955-65, and served there as assistant principal in 1967. He was also assistant principal at Rawlings Junior High and South High schools from 1969-85.

Kocab was a past president of the Czech Catholic Union and continued to serve as a director on its national board until his death.

Funeral services for Mr. Kocab are being arranged by Bican Funeral Home, 5215 Fleet Ave., Cleveland. They will be announced when arrangements are completed.

expansion joints, drainage system and other items as stated in the ordinance authorizing that project, City Manager Mike Mallis confirmed. He said the estimated start date on the work is March 30, 2023.

As for the work on Broadway, which was originally scheduled to begin in 2027, ODOT will also begin that project next year. Mallis said the standard local contribution is 20% but the city was able to negotiate that down to 15%. He said Bedford will be responsible for roughly \$1.1 million of the cost of the project.

He stated that the city's portion of the project would be paid for through 2023 Road Program funds, American Rescue Plan Act funds, "and funds that we had available this year that we're carrying over that were earmarked for this project." The possibility exists for the city to also be eligible for a loan from the Ohio Public Works Commission, he added.

Mallis also mentioned that renovation work on the Pool House at the city's municipal pool will start in the coming weeks, and the city had met with the contractor who was awarded the bid for the project. Work is expected to start on Monday, Jan. 9, and will continue throughout the winter months, with a projected completion date by the end of May, in time for the pool season, he said.

Mallis also stated that \$700,000 in grant funding for the Bedford Commons project had come through, to be used for expansion and improvements to the Commons area in the city's Historic Downtown district.

Legislation

Ordinances and resolutions passed at Monday night's meeting included:

- Ratifying a contract with Powerful Signal for the purchase of a cellphone booster signal for the Bedford Municipal Court, at a cost of \$22,084.

- As mandated by Ohio law, raising the yearly salary of the Bedford Clerk of Courts, who is also the Court Administrator, by 1.75%, from \$124,283.40, to \$126,458.75, beginning Jan. 1, 2023. The city will pay 60% of that amount, with Cuyahoga County paying the remaining 40%, Mallis said.

- A contract with Paladin for a new card reader access system for the Bedford Municipal Complex, at a cost of \$43,788.47.

- Amending previous legislation authorizing a contract with GPD Group for engineering services within the city.

- A contract with National Pump and Process for emergency removal and diagnostics of a sand filter pump at the city's Wastewater Treatment Plant, at a cost of \$12,969.

- Contract with Bain Enterprise to purchase LED stop signs, LED traffic signs and flashing LED pedestrian signs to enhance safety in the city, at a cost of \$20,020.

Announcements

Mayor Stan Koci presented Dinah Mouat of the South-

east Clergy Meals on Wheels Program with a check from the city's employees for \$1000. The city's Firefighters Local 1683 also presented Mouat with a check for \$500 at the meeting.

Mouat said that the Meals on Wheels program had also received grant funding to help seniors take care of their pets by providing them with dog and cat food and other pet supplies. Also, Meals on Wheels has a partnership with a local veterinary clinic to help defray the cost of pet medical services for the program participants.

Mallis thanked the Bedford Police Department and Detective Bureau, who with the assistance of outside agencies were able to identify the suspect who made online threats to the Bedford City Schools recently.

Bedford Council votes to join Regional Income Tax Agency at special meeting

In an action that Bedford officials say is intended to save the city money by not replacing two former employees in the city's Tax Department, Bedford Council passed a resolution at a special Dec. 12 meeting to contract with the Regional Income Tax Agency (RITA) for its municipal income tax services.

The resolution specifically authorizes City Manager Mike Mallis "to execute an agreement with the Regional Income Tax Agency to participate in the Regional Council of Governments, for the purpose of administration and collection of municipal income tax in the city."

The legislation passed by a 4-3 vote with Mayor Stan Koci, Ward 1 Councilwoman Sandy Spinks, Ward 3

Councilman Vic Fluharty and Ward 4 Councilman Frank Smith voting to approve it, and Ward 2 Councilman Walter Genutis, Ward 5 Councilman Jeff Asbury and Ward 6 Councilman Donald Saunders voting against it.

The special meeting was called in order to meet a deadline to enter into the contract with RITA, Koci stated. He reassured residents that city officials had done their due diligence in considering the move to RITA, and clarified that Bedford would continue its longstanding practice of assisting residents with their tax issues, with RITA being able to provide additional assistance.

There was also a provision in the contract that Bedford could choose to end the agreement with six months notice in the event city officials did not think RITA's services were satisfactory, Koci added.

One resident was concerned that the city had not chosen to put the legislation on the ballot for voters to decide on it.

Koci stated, "This is not an item that we would put on the ballot because this is the work of the council to make these decisions, along with the administration, and to pay \$30,000 or more to do an election just to ask this question would not be due diligence for us... It would cost us way too much money."

In response to questions on whether there would be any

additional charges to residents for the city to retain RITA, Koci and Mallis both stated there would be no additional charge to residents, a statement that was confirmed by RITA Government Liaison Matthew Mau, who also attended the meeting as a representative of the agency.

Another citizen asked for an analysis of what the cost benefit would be to the city, and Finance Director Jennifer Howland stated that the projected cost of filling the two Tax Department positions for 2023 would be "about \$439,000... but after going with RITA, our costs will be down to \$226,000."

Addressing concerns about customer service, Mallis said that RITA could provide online services "that we cannot currently do. Individuals can continue to drop their tax documents off here and we will ensure that they're filed."

Law Director John Montello stated that the ultimate control of the municipal income taxes would remain with Bedford. Mau stated that RITA representatives would be in constant contact with Howland and other city officials to maintain the same level of services to residents.

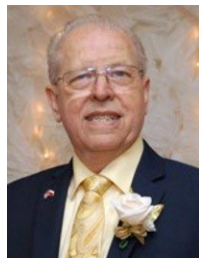

Cleveland City Council passes bill to keep Lake Erie healthy and develop area around E. 55 St. Marina

Cleveland City Council held its final Monday council meeting of the year on Dec. 5, and approved \$150,000 in funding and more in-kind services to join a collaborative group led by the Cleveland Metroparks.

The effort, Cleveland Harbor Eastern Embayment Resilience Study (CHEERS), focuses on the health of Lake Erie and lakefront development in the area surrounding the East 55th Street Marina. The partners and organizations involved in the potential transformation include: Cleveland City Council, the City of Cleveland, Cleveland Metroparks, Cleveland-Cuyahoga Port Authority, Black Environmental Leaders Association, Ohio Department of Natural Resources and Ohio Department of Transportation.

The local partners commit to contributing \$985,000 in support and resources to the project in exchange for a \$985,000 match from state partners and a \$1.9 million grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation. It enhances local access to the lakefront and prepares Cleveland for the future. Partners suggest work at the East 55th Street marina could begin as soon as 2024.

Paid Safe Leave Available

Council approved legislation offering non-union city employees (or their children/guardians) experiencing domestic violence, stalking and/or sexual assault 60 hours of paid leave (for full time employees) to receive medical care, take care of legal matters, seek safe shelter and attend to other needs that ensure their physical and mental well-being. The Paid Safe Leave time taken will not be deducted from other forms of leave.

Composting pilot program

Rust Belt Riders Composting will design and conduct a composting pilot program for wasted food generated by vendors at the West Side Market. The \$60,000 pilot program is being financed by Cleveland Neighborhood Progress, granted from a larger grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

New housing in Ward 5

Council approved the addition of property located at

2024 E. 70 St., to the Northeast Ohio Advanced Energy District. The approval allows a plan from the property owner to move forward with a special energy improvement project that will consist of 64 new market-rate multifamily residential apartments.

Cleveland Community Police Commission seated

Council passed a resolution to seat the 13-member body.

Lakefront development, improvement plans

Council authorized the administration to move forward with hiring a consultant(s) to produce a North Coast Lakefront Master Plan and perform community engagement activities. Estimated cost for both is \$900,000.

Transfers ARPA funding to General Fund

Council approved moving \$215 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding the city received into the General Fund. Based on federal government calculations, the city of Cleveland lost more than \$300 million in revenue during the COVID-19 pandemic. Federal guidelines allow the city to use a portion of the nearly \$512 million for revenue recovery.

The next regular council meeting will be Monday, Jan. 9, 2023.

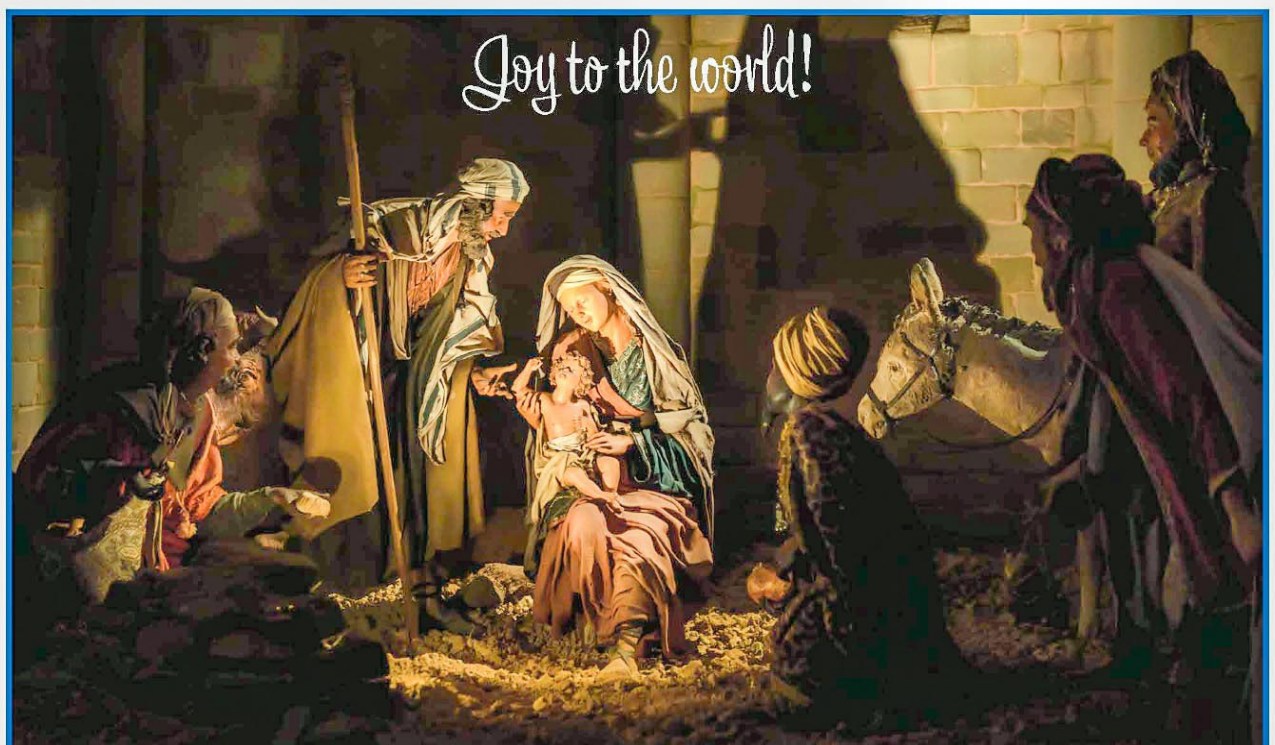

Help with winter heating bills available

Step Forward wants to remind Cuyahoga County residents that its Home Energy Assistance Program is available for people who need help paying their utilities this winter.

The agency's Winter Crisis Program is accepting applications through March 31. The program provides eligible Greater Cleveland residents specifically with heating assistance.

Households that have been disconnected, threatened with disconnection, or have less than 25% supply of bulk fuel in their tank to maintain service, are eligible for this one-time benefit to be used in an emergency situation. Residents can receive up to \$175 if they are a client of a regulated utility or \$800 if they are a client of unregulated utilities such as electric cooperatives and municipal utilities. To qualify for assistance, residents must have a gross income at or below 175% of the federal poverty guidelines. Assistance funds will be applied to an applicant's utility bill or heating system repair costs.

To apply for the Winter Crisis Program, clients must schedule an appointment by calling 216-350-8008 or online at stepforward.itfrontdesk.com. Appointments are available Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. Walk-ins are not accepted.

Step Forward also offers the Winter Non-Emergency Program, which is aimed at helping those who have not been disconnected from their services. The Percentage of Income Payment Plan pays a percentage of the household income each month and works to eliminate outstanding energy bills. A Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program is also available.

Residents are welcome to visit any of Step Forward's four Neighborhood Opportunity Centers, located in downtown Cleveland, Euclid, Middleburgh Heights and Warrensville Heights, to ask questions. Case Managers and Family Development Specialists are available to connect people with the agency's programs and other resources.

"Our message to Cuyahoga County is that we are here to help. And if for some reason we cannot help you, Step Forward has a great referral network where we can connect people with the right resources," Billups said.

Those with scheduled HEAP appointments should submit their documentation at least three days in advance of their appointment to receive assistance at the time of appointment. Documentation can be submitted to the Step Forward drop box at 2203 Superior Ave., through the online scheduler linked above, emailed to Heapdocuments@stepforwardtoday.org, or submitted online at energyhelp.ohio.gov.

- Clients need to bring copies of the following documents to their appointment:
- Copies of most recent energy bills; utility bills (gas and/or electric), regardless of account status
 - A list of all household members and proof of income for the last 30 days or 12 months for each member
 - Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members
 - Proof of disability (if applicable)
 - Birth Dates and Social Security Numbers for all household members
