## Maple Heights Police substation expected to open Tuesday, March 1

The new police substation in the Discount Drug Mart in Turney-Dunham Plaza is expected to open on Tuesday, March 1, Police Chief Todd Hansen announced at the Maple Heights Council meeting last week.

In late 2021, Mayor Annette Blackwell said that she and Hansen and other city officials had been working for some time to have a police substation located in the store at 6148 Dunham Rd., to better serve residents in the western half of the city. Maple Heights' current police station is located in the eastern part of Maple Heights, at 5373 Lee Rd.

After repeated inquiries to Drug Mart headquarters in Medina, Blackwell announced at a December council meeting that she had finally gotten a response from company representatives, and at no cost to the city the police substation would open early this year as a second location for officers to do reports and to increase access and communication in the community.

"It's not going to reduce crime, but it's a presence... and it gives a sense of security," Blackwell stated.

Hansen has previously stated that the police substation was "an exciting opportunity" for the city, initiated as a partnership between Drug Mart and the police station. Hansen explained that Drug Mart had worked with the property owner and was able to obtain a portion of the storefront in what was formerly a pizza place, and subsequently renovated the interior, made some needed repairs, and got it ready for the city's use, emphasizing that this was not costing the city any money.

### Grogan-Myers leaving

Economic Development Director Patrick Grogan-Myers was honored for his work by Blackwell and other city officials at last week's meeting, as he is stepping down to take a position with the city of Euclid, as director of Planning and Development.

Grogan-Myers, who has served the city of Maple Heights for the past two years, stated in his final report to council: "I am very thankful for my time here. We've accomplished a lot, and I think that is something we can all be proud of. It feels kind of fitting that my announcement tonight is that we have finalized our 2021 Annual Report in the Department of Building and Housing and Economic Development."

He noted that last year 1557 permits were issued in the city, a five-year high, and more than \$16.3 million invested in the city, which also represented a high.

"We've had a lot of investments going on in our city," Grogan-Myers said, adding that new homes had been built and more were under construction, and that about \$36,000 in income taxes were generated by a new business in the city, GOJO Industries, an Akron-based manufacturer of Purell sanitizing products.

## Shayla Davis appointed to 11th Ohio House District seat

State Rep. Shayla L. Davis (D-Cleveland), a Garfield Heights resident and former Ward 4 Garfield Heights Council member, was officially appointed and sworn in last Wednesday to fill the vacancy as state representative to the 11th Ohio House District.

The vacancy in the 11th Ohio House District became available last month when its then-representative, Stephanie D. Howse, was sworn in as Cleveland City Council member from Ward 7. Davis will fill the remainder of Howse's term which will expire on January 3, 2023.

"I couldn't be more excited to continue my public service as the Ohio House District 11 representative," Davis said. "I want to thank Leader Russo and the members of the House Democratic Caucus for this appointment. We have some of the most challenging issues plaguing District 11, but together we can confront them. I am a passionate, dedicated servant leader who will continue to fight for the diversity, equity and inclusion within District 11."

Rep. Davis outlined her top priorities Wednesday, which include:

- Preventing maternal, infant mortality and morbidity;
- Combating poverty;
- Ensuring fair and equitable opportunity for all within the judicial system;
- Creating quality education and workforce development;
- Investing in minority business to ensure access to resources;
- Protecting collective bargaining;
- Increasing public transportation funding.

Davis was elected to Garfield Heights Council in November 2019, and served in that capacity until April 2021, when she resigned after admitting she was working for the city of Cleveland while holding her council position, in violation of the Garfield Heights Charter. Last year she ran unsuccessfully to be mayor of Garfield Heights, a position won by incumbent Matt Burke.

Davis had previously worked for multiple government agencies throughout her career such as the Cuyahoga County Public Defender's Office, Cuyahoga County Board of Health and the City of Cleveland Municipal Court.

The 11th House District includes all or parts of Cleveland, Garfield Heights and Newburgh Heights.

## Maple Hts. wrestlers win Lake Erie League title

The Maple Heights High School wrestling team captured its 11th consecutive Lake Erie League championship on Saturday, Feb. 12, at home in the historic Wylie Athletic Complex.

The Mustangs tallied 203.5 points to outdistance runner-up Cleveland Heights with 178 points. Shaker Heights finished third with 159 points followed by Lorain with 147, Bedford with 91, Garfield Heights with 78 and Shaw with 67.

The win was Maple's 48th championship in both the old Greater Cleveland Conference (1954-1998) and the Lake Erie League (1999-present).

Winning individual titles for the Mustangs were: Jayshawn Eggleton (106 pounds), Jhaleal Rasheed (120 pounds), Daniel Eggleton (138 pounds) and Christian Edge (165 pounds). Rasheed, Edge and Daniel Eggleton, all se-

niors, each achieved the noteworthy feat of becoming three-time Lake Erie League champions. Jayshawn Eggleton, a junior, won his second consecutive individual title.

Khaleal Rasheed (126 pounds), Vontez Tyus (132 pounds), Terry Murphy (144 pounds) and Kaden Pulley (175 pounds) each finished as runners-up in their respective weight classes. Other Mustang place winners were Derek Palmer (3rd at 150 pounds), Anthony Brooks (5th at 157 pounds), Tre'Voughn Jackson (3rd at 190 pounds), Steven Gardner (5th at 215 pounds) and Sam Holland (5th at 285 pounds).

Coach Jamie Milkovich's Mustangs wrestled their dual final match of the season at Garfield Heights on Tuesday, Feb. 22, before starting post-season tournament action at the St. Edward Sectional on Saturday, Feb. 26. The Mustangs are currently 19-0 in dual meets.

Blackwell praised Grogan-Myers' efforts in retaining and bringing businesses to Maple Heights, and consequently keeping the city's economic recovery moving forward.

"You have been a joy to work with," Blackwell said to Grogan-Myers, "and thank you for helping Maple Heights with your vision."

## Audit agreement approved

Council approved a resolution at the meeting authorizing Blackwell to enter into an agreement with Ohio Auditor of State Keith Faber, for an audit of the city's financial statements for 2021, at a cost of \$27,470.

Faber issued an engagement letter and agreement dated Feb. 10, 2022, to Finance Director Tinita Tillman in-

dicating it will audit the city's basic financial statements as of Dec. 31, 2021, to express its opinion concerning whether the statements and related disclosures present fairly, in all material aspects, the city's financial position. The report is expected to be delivered on or about Sept. 30, 2022.

Also passed at last week's meeting was an ordinance to amend and restate a chapter of the codified ordinances concerning land reutilization.

The legislation will improve the process of selling vacant lots as side yards to adjacent property owners. Also, the economic development director "shall compile and maintain a written inventory of all properties acquired under the land reutilization program, establish and maintain records and accounts reflecting all transactions, expenditures and revenues relating to the land reutilization program."

Also passed was a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a revised and restated professional services agreement with Consolo Law Firm Co., LPA, to provide assistant prosecutor and law director services to the city from Jan. 1, 2022-Dec. 31, 2023.

## Laws of Garfield Heights

### 351.15 ALL NIGHT PARKING

(a) No person shall park a vehicle on any street between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. of any day, except physicians, priests, ministers and rabbis on emergency calls or other persons who have obtained a parking permit from the Police Department.

(b) Upon application of any person to the Police Department, a parking permit may be issued if in the opinion of the Police Department, the issuance of such permit would be reasonably necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the applicant and the community as a whole. Such permit shall be available at a cost of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per tag and shall expire annually on September 1. A thirty day grace period shall be given for renewals each September, wherein application shall be reevaluated under existing regulations. The parking permit authorized herein shall be firmly affixed to and prominently displayed in the lower corner of the windshield on the driver's side of the vehicle so authorized.

(c) The Police Department is hereby authorized and directed to compile and maintain a record of permits issued and to compile regulations to act as a guide in the issuance of permits.

(Ord. 14-1995. Passed 2-27-95.)

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (a) to (c) hereof, no person shall stand or park a vehicle on any street, road or thoroughfare in the City continuously for a period exceeding twenty-four hours. Any vehicle found so parked in violation of this subsection shall be towed to a City auto storage pound.

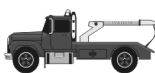

# Third Federal adds its voice to those opposing Slavic Village for jail site

The following is a letter sent to Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish from Third Federal Savings & Loan CEO Marc Stefanski and other Third Federal officials opposing a site between Fleet and Pershing aves. in Slavic Village which is under serious consideration for the new Cuyahoga County jail. The letter is dated Feb. 16, 2022.

Dear County Executive Budish,

Our commitment to Slavic village does not allow us to sit idly by as residents and non-profit leaders fight to have their voices heard after learning that the neighborhood is under serious consideration as a site for the new county jail.

We oppose the North Broadway property in Slavic Village as a potential site for the jail. Furthermore, we oppose any proposal suggesting the new jail be built in a residential neighborhood when there are alternative industrial sites to consider.

Targeting the North Broadway site for this facility does nothing to improve the standing of the neighborhood. In fact, it does the opposite. It has an enormous impact on those who work in Slavic Village and the 20,000 residents who call it home.

Slavic Village has been our home for nearly 85 years.

When we expanded our headquarters in the 1990s, we

chose to stay in Slavic Village, committing to be a responsible corporate anchor for the neighborhood. Today, we are living up to this commitment by providing ongoing opportunities for those who live, learn and work in the neighborhood.

As the developer for Trailside Slavic Village, a once brownfield site has now been turned into viable, new, single-family homes. Additional phases are in development and expected to break ground in 2022.

Our Foundation works tirelessly to support both small and large projects that make a positive impact on this community, investing nearly \$2MM annually in direct support to schools and housing initiatives in Slavic Village alone. We have also made a significant investment in 5115 The Rising, which is bringing hope and momentum to the North Broadway neighborhood—momentum that can easily be curtailed if the county continues to pursue a site for the new jail only blocks away.

It is clear that the residents of Slavic Village oppose this proposal, and we support this community and add our voice to the opposition. Do not sacrifice the progress that has been made, and the potential for what this neighborhood could be, for a facility that will not serve as a beacon of hope, but as a reminder of hopelessness.

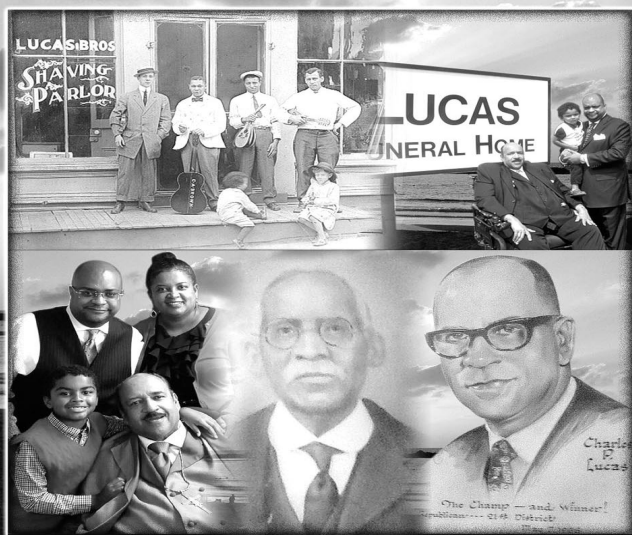

### Shots Fired

### Aggravated Robbery

with aggravated robbery and having a weapon under disability. The female suspect was charged with aggravated robbery. Evidence collected and given to Detective Bureau.
