Volunteers install free smoke alarms

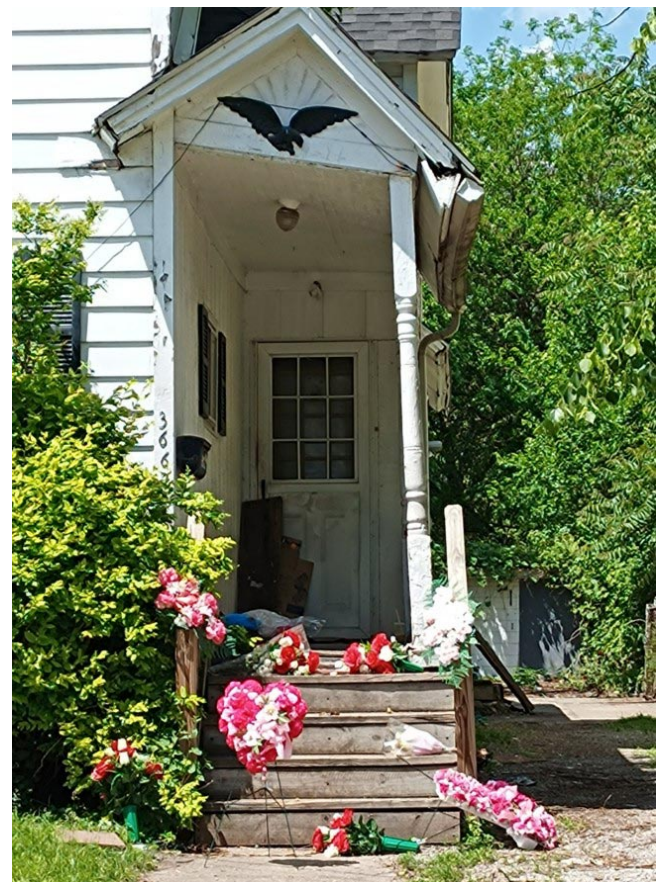
Missing woman found dead in vacant house in Slavic Village

A missing 25-year-old woman last seen in the Tower City Parking Garage on Saturday, May 21, was found dead four days later in a vacant home on E. 54 St., in Slavic Village.

On Wednesday, May 25, at approximately 3:52 p.m., officers responded to 3662 E. 54 St., in connection with a deceased female inside of an abandoned home. Officers arrived on scene and found the woman on a couch with lacerations, abrasions to the head, torso and extremities. EMS arrived and the victim, identified by media reports as 25-year-old Anastasia Hamilton of Cleveland, was pronounced deceased.

Members of the Homicide Unit responded and preliminary investigation reveals that Hamilton was reported missing on May 23, 2022. She was last seen in the Tower City parking garage on May 21, with a male who has been identified. She was located by witnesses who then contacted police. This matter remains under investigation.

Woman dead of apparent suicide after MHPD chase in armed robbery case

Maple Heights Police officers found a woman dead of an apparent suicide last Friday, behind the wheel of a car that had crashed on I-271 South after leading police on a pursuit that had originated in North Randall.

On Friday, May 27, officers from the Maple Heights Police Department were investigating an armed robbery that had occurred at a business earlier in the day. At approximately 1:50 p.m., Maple Heights detectives, who were investigating the incident, spotted the suspect's vehicle in North Randall. The detectives were able to follow the vehicle while waiting for uniformed officers to respond to the area. A marked MHPD patrol unit located the vehicle and made a traffic stop on it on Northfield Rd. near I-480, in Maple Heights.

The vehicle pulled over and came to a stop. The driver then pulled the vehicle back onto the roadway and fled from the area. It fled onto I-480 eastbound with officers in pursuit. The vehicle then headed south on I-271 with officers still in pursuit. As the car headed south on I-271,

the driver lost control of the vehicle and it struck the center guard rail, near the 23-mile marker. It then came to a rest in the left two southbound lanes.

When the officers approached the vehicle, they found the female driver unconscious. As they were attempting to render first aid to her, they discovered an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound in the left side of the female's head. Paramedics from the Bedford Fire Department responded to the scene. The female was pronounced dead at the scene.

Community Police reports

CLEVELAND

Stabbing

On May 23, at 7:34 p.m., a 35-year-old female was stabbed in the arm in the 3700 block of E. 53 St. She was transported to MetroHealth Medical Center by EMS.

Assist Other Department

On May 30, at approximately 4:17 a.m., members of the Cleveland Division of Police responded to E. 93 St. and Buckeye Rd. to assist Maple Heights Police who had been involved in an officer involved shooting. Cleveland Emergency Medical Service transported a male suspect with a gunshot wound to University Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

Members of the Cleveland Division of Police Use of Force team responded to the scene to investigate the shooting. Preliminary information indicates that Maple Heights Police officers were pursuing the suspect vehicle believed to have been involved in shooting into habitation incidents in the city of Maple Heights. No officers were injured. A firearm was recovered at the scene. This matter remains under investigation.

GARFIELD HEIGHTS

Felonious Assault

On May 18, shortly before 11 p.m., police were called to the 8100 block of Garfield Blvd. to assist the GHFD with a stabbing victim. As they arrived, a male was being

escorted into the squad for medical care. A woman on scene said that she and the male were walking back from the Venture Inn about 30 minutes prior and were assaulted by two or three males on the sidewalk on the south side of the street, somewhere between the Venture Inn and the 8100 block of Garfield Blvd. The woman's nose was bleeding and at some point during the scuffle the male victim was stabbed with an unknown object several times. The suspects left in an unknown direction. No property was taken during the assault. The male victim was intoxicated, police said, and his coat and pants were covered in blood. The victim had no description of the suspects and did not know who they were. He said he might have "said the wrong thing to someone at the bar," which could have caused the assault. He was transported to MetroHealth Medical Center. Staff at the Venture Inn said they did not observe any fights or arguments between patrons. Report forwarded to the Detective Bureau for review.

Criminal Mischief

On May 20, an officer spoke with the owner of the Shell station at 5095 Turney Rd., who said the night before her evening manager had to kick a male off the property for attempting to sell rap CDs there. Now the owner had been notified that all eight gas pumps had stickers placed on them promoting the same rap artist that was trying to sell CDs the night before. The owner said the stickers won't come off and the gas pumps had just been replaced with new ones costing \$60,000. She was given a report number and advised to follow up with the law department.

Traffic Offense – Fleeing

On May 20, at 12:33 a.m., police observed a car failing to stay within the marked lanes on Turney near Langton, the same car that had fled from Shaker Heights PD earlier in the evening, and also a GHPD officer at 12:21 a.m. Police now tried to stop the vehicle once again but it fled south on Turney toward Granger at speeds well over 100 mph, so the chase was terminated. A check found that the car was registered to an Oakview Blvd. address, and an officer found the car parked in the driveway there. When

another officer arrived he found the first officer holding a male against the side of the house and had two other males at gunpoint, giving them commands. The two at gunpoint continued to keep their hands out of sight and refused to obey orders. One of the males eventually approached police with his hands up and advised that he had a gun on his side. Police located a gun in his pants pocket with a round in the chamber and a loaded magazine. Backup arrived to the chaotic scene and all three men were placed into handcuffs and put in the back of separate police cruisers and taken to Garfield Heights Jail. While completing a tow inventory, a second loaded firearm was found in the car. It was noted that all three were extremely uncooperative, highly irate, would not listen to orders from the jail staff and had to be moved from their original holding cells to ones farther apart as they continued to kick the jail cell doors and yell at one another. Multiple citations were issued by GHPD and Shaker Hts. PD.

Robbery

On May 23, about 4:45 a.m., GHPD units were dispatched to Burger King, 4869 Turney Rd., for a report of an aggravated robbery/theft of a motor vehicle.

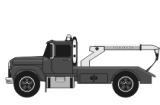

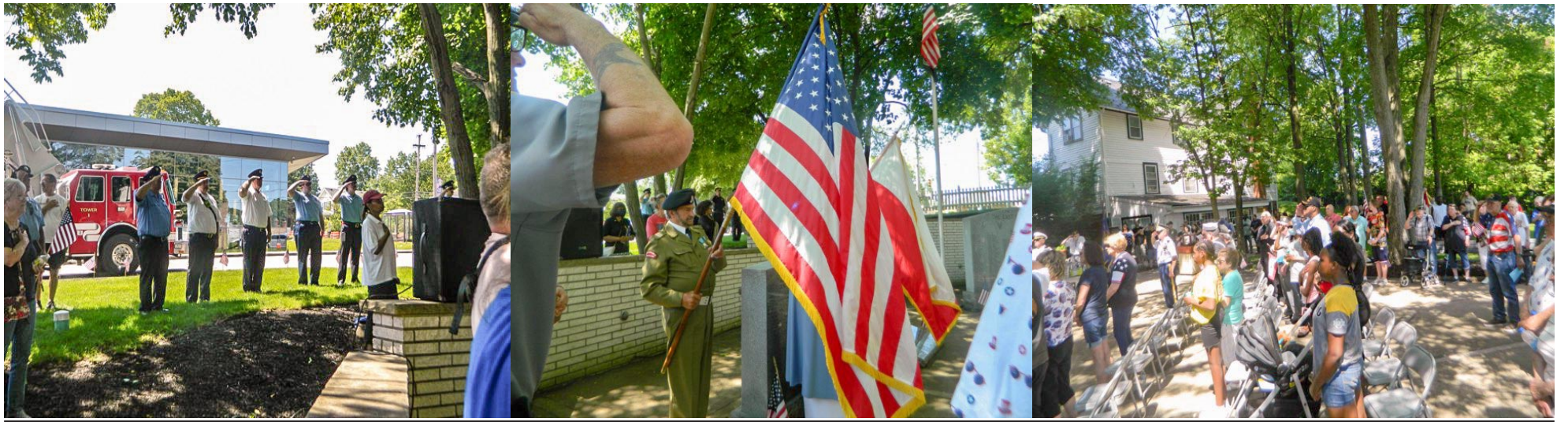

One officer spoke with the female victim while others searched for the stolen auto. The victim told officers she went to her car to get her coat while in the process of closing up the restaurant. After she got her coat and was walking back toward Burger King, a male standing at the corner pointed a gun directly at the woman and demanded money from the store. She got whatever money there was, no more than \$200, put it in a paper bag and gave it to the suspect, who was waiting outside. He then demanded her car keys and left traveling north on Turney Rd. Another employee, realizing something was wrong, followed the suspect north on Turney Rd., but by the time he reached Garfield Blvd. and Turney, the suspect was out of sight. Report forwarded to the Detective Bureau.

Theft of a Motor Vehicle

On May 24, a patrolman responded to the 12800 block of McCracken Rd., and spoke with a man who said he had awakened this morning and found his car missing from the driveway. He said he was awake until 1 a.m. the night before and heard nothing. He had left the car unlocked with the keys in the car's console. Police checked the Flock camera system and found the vehicle had traveled through the intersection of Granger Rd. and E. 141 St. eastbound in Maple Heights at 3:26 a.m. the same day. Vehicle entered into LEADS by dispatcher.

Menacing

On May 25, at about 11:48 a.m., three officers responded to Walgreens, 5090 Turney Rd., for a report of menacing. One of the employees had tried to stop a shoplifter who was pushing a cart of frozen goods out of the front doors of the business. Before fleeing the store he told the employee he would come back and shoot him. While speaking with police outside, the store manager pointed out that the suspect was walking northbound on Turney, saying, "There is the male right there." The suspect was placed under arrest for menacing.

Shots Fired

On May 26, about 3:29 a.m., several officers were dispatched to a home in the 9000 block of McCracken Rd. for a called in report of shots fired, where they located damage to a vehicle parked in the driveway of a home. The homeowner was also the caller and told police that while she was sitting in her living room, she heard about 5-6 gunshots coming from the street in front of her house. She immediately laid down on the floor and could not provide a description of the suspect or a vehicle that may have been involved. She said this was not the first time her car and residence had been shot at. About a year ago her car was shot once in the driver's side front fender, and about a month ago her house was shot once. She has no idea who has been targeting her house. While on scene, police observed damage to the rear window and rear driver's side window of the woman's car, and three bullet holes in the residence. No shell casings were found.

On May 30, at 7:27 p.m., officers were dispatched to the police station to comply with a request for an escort. The caller stated that about 6:15 p.m., while at her home in the 13000 block of Grannis Rd., she heard four to five shots fired. When she looked out the window she saw an unknown male driving a black Honda with heavy window tint leave the area at a high rate of speed. She said a short time later she left to get her daughter from work. She said she was afraid that the vehicle was still in the area. Officers found one spent shell casing in front of the porch. A neighbor confirmed she heard four shots fired but did not see anyone.

Felonious Assault

On May 28, at about 9:11 p.m., an officer was dispatched to MetroHealth Medical Center for an eight-year-old girl, living on Rexwood Ave., being treated for a possible nail puncture. A Metro social services worker told police that a CT scan had revealed there was a bullet embedded on top of the girl's head. The girl's aunt told police she and a friend were helping her sister, the girl's mother, clean out her car which was parked in the driveway of her home in the 12600 block of Rexwood Ave. The little girl was standing near the rear left door of the car when she was struck by an object between 5 and 6:30 p.m. The Metro medical staff advised that the girl had a fractured skull and what they believed to be a bullet lodged into the skin on her head. The report will be forwarded to the Garfield Heights Detective Bureau for further follow-up and possible surveillance footage.

The Neighborhood News tours Justice Center in Garfield Heights; confirms it is ‘deplorable’

After citing the “deplorable” conditions inside the Justice Center in Garfield Heights and the need for something to be done about it, Mayor Matt Burke issued an invitation at the May 23rd council meeting for anyone who wanted to see the ravaged building first hand to stop by for a tour last Thursday.

The Neighborhood News publisher and photographer, Elena Psenicka, took him up on his offer and went through the building escorted by GHPD Deputy Chief Dale Merchant. The photos she took are in the collage below.

They show corroded pipes which break off when repairs are attempted, several sewer leaks, water running down the walls, black mold in the utility room and standing water, among the building’s many major problems.

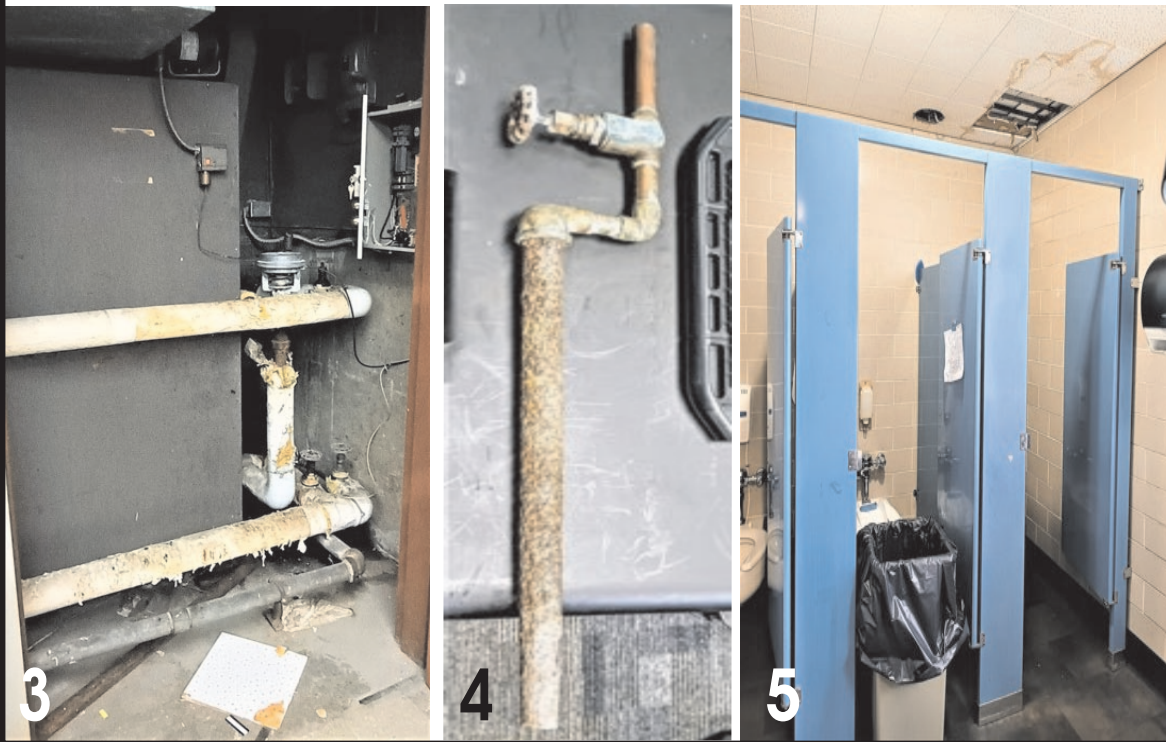
Deputy Chief Merchant said the Justice Center was built in 1958, making it over 65 years old, and has only had cosmetic repairs, never any major work. The building houses the Garfield Heights Police Department and Garfield Heights Municipal Court.
