Councilman Jason Blake resigns his position at Monday's G.H. meeting

At the conclusion of Monday's meeting of Garfield Heights City Council, Ward 5 Councilman Jason Blake submitted his resignation to Law Director Tim Riley and Council President Tom Vaughn.

In an emotional address to his colleagues, Mayor Matt Burke and his directors present, as well as those residents in the audience, Blake said his resignation was submitted due to accepting a new job which would conflict with being able to attend the necessary meetings.

"I have always taken pride in giving the residents 100% effort and being available to them and working for them," Blake said in a Neighborhood News interview. "Not being able to give that effort would be unacceptable to me, so I made the most difficult decision to step down."

Moving forward, he said he is asking residents to continue working with council and Mayor Burke to help the community reach its potential. "I really believe the city's best days are ahead of us," Blake said, and stressed what an honor it has been for him to serve the residents of Ward 5 and Garfield Heights.

Law Director Riley said that as per the city charter, council will have 30 days to appoint a new Ward 5 representative. Council President Vaughn said council intends to honor that commitment. In the event a successor is not named by council, it will be up to the mayor to fill the vacancy. Blake's term would have been up in November, 2023.

Those interested in the Ward 5 council seat must live in Ward 5 and be a registered voter. Letters of interest in the position should be sent to Lottie Overby, council clerk, 5407 Turney Rd., Garfield Heights, OH 44125.

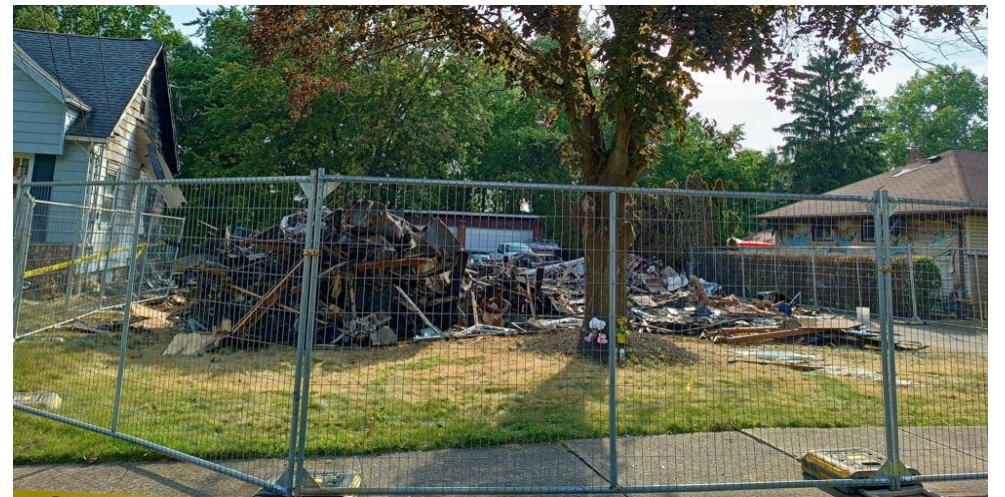
Three dead in Garfield Hts. home explosion; cause under investigation

Investigators with the State Fire Marshal's Fire and Explosion Investigation Bureau confirm three adults, two males and one female, were killed Saturday evening in a home explosion at 4930 E. 81 St. in Garfield Heights.

The Garfield Heights Fire Department was dispatched to the scene at 6:39 p.m. Saturday, June 11. When firefighters arrived, they found the home destroyed. The deceased were located with assistance from the East Technical Rescue Team.

The Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner has identified the victims as Cassandra Bateman, 37, Gerald "Jerry" Bateman, 57, and Donald Malinowski, 64, according to media reports.

Mutual aid was provided by fire departments from Maple Heights, Cuyahoga Heights, Valley View, Newburgh Heights and Broadview Heights. At one point over 50 firefighters were on scene.

Investigators with the Division of State Fire Marshal, Garfield Heights Fire and Police and Dominion Energy remained on scene.

Iron Ward Music Festival returns to S.V.

The Iron Ward Festival, which for many summers has been offering free, live music under the evening sky for the residents and friends of Cleveland's Slavic Village, returns to Dan Kane Park for its 18th season beginning Monday, June 20, at 7 p.m.

Opening night will feature the sounds of longtime favorites Don Goodman and the Blue Groove Band playing a blend of jazz and pop. They'll be followed on June 27th by local artist Donny Jones and the Infinity Band. Concerts will continue on summer Mondays in July and August until Labor Day.

Time and location are the same: Mondays at 7 p.m., Dan Kane Park, E. 65 St., just south of Broadway Ave., and across Kenyon Ave. from the Morganic Community Garden. The venue always offers plenty of summer evening shade, but to further cool audiences off, organizers will offer free ice cream on days when temperatures reach 85 degrees. The Slavic Village "News of the Week" segment will again be featured at intermissions.

America's climate has been changing over the last decade, and this has become noticeable at the festival with more rain, leading to more rainouts than in seasons past (in 2021, three concerts were cancelled). With this new weather phenomenon in mind, and given Iron Ward's conviction that no neighborhood should go a week without live music, organizers have established a new rain-date policy: musicians will be invited to perform Tuesday evenings if Mondays are a washout.

The Iron Ward Festival endures because of the continued enthusiasm of Cleveland's musical artists, the efforts of local volunteers, the promotional services of The Neighborhood News, and the support of Slavic Village leadership.

Cleveland restarts recycling this week


Cleveland has restarted its recycling program this week with an easy signup option that allows residents to simply call 216-664-3030 to register or go online to clerecycles.com.

Any owner, landlord, tenant, friend or relative can call in to get someone registered for this new program and a packet of stickers and information will be sent to the home or apartment. The city will only pick up blue bins that have the appropriate recycling stickers on them; all other containers will be emptied and handled as waste. Note that after July 31, 2022, if you have not opted in and received your stickers, the blue recycling bins will be removed from your home or apartment.

Residents who have damaged carts can call 216-664-3711 to receive a replacement container. Materials that have been approved for recycling have expanded significantly and will be listed in the Welcome Booklet you receive or by going online to Sustainablecleveland.org.

GARFIELD HEIGHTS CITY COUNCIL VACANCY WARD 5

The City of Garfield Heights has begun its search for the next Ward 5 Councilmember. The vacancy occurred on June 13, 2022 when Councilman Jason Blake resigned. Garfield Heights City Charter requires that the six remaining members of Council appoint a replacement within thirty (30) days of the vacancy. Accordingly, the term of the appointed Ward 5 Councilmember will begin no later than July 13, 2022 and conclude on November 7, 2023.

At this time, Garfield Heights City Council is requesting that interested residents of Ward 5 please submit a letter of intent to Council Clerk Lottie Overby at loverby@garfieldht.org by no later than July 24, 2022 at 5:00 p.m.

Garfield Heights City Charter Section 9 lists the qualifications of prospective Councilmembers. A qualified applicant shall:

- have resided in the City continuously for a period of at least three (3) years immediately preceding this appointment;
- have resided in Ward 5 for at least one (1) year immediately preceding this appointment;
- not hold any other public office or public employment except as otherwise provided in the Charter, and that of Notary Public or member of the State Militia or the Reserve Corps of the United States, and shall not be interested in the profits or emoluments of any contract job, work or service of the City of Garfield Heights.

Several honored at Garfield Hts. Council meeting

Garfield Heights Council met Monday night and in a long meeting, which saw the resignation of Ward 5 Councilman Jason Blake (see story on Page 1), honored the memory of Richard G. France and GHPD K-9, Arlo. The top graduates of the 2022 Class of Garfield Heights High School were also given resolutions from the Ohio House of Representatives acknowledging their achievements by Ohio District 11 Congresswoman Shayla Davis, formerly a Garfield Heights councilwoman.

Richard France, a Garfield Heights resident since 1955, who passed away recently at the age of 93, was an Army veteran who served in the Korean War and volunteered at many veteran's hospitals throughout the years.

He was an active member of countless veterans' groups and was inducted into the State of Ohio Veteran's Hall of Fame in 1998. He was a tireless advocate for recognition of veterans and has been credited with the original campaign to erect a Memorial monument for all veterans of the city of Garfield Heights.

K-9 Arlo, who retired in February, 2022, and passed away recently, worked his successful career faithfully alongside his partner, Deputy Chief Merchant. Arlo was responsible for over 100 arrests from his deployments for tracking, building searches, narcotics detection and evidence recovery.

The following legislation was all passed unanimously at Monday's meeting:

- Amending the zoning code to provide for the revision of the Building Zone Map by changing the zoning for two parcels of land at Rockside and Turney rds. from U-1 Single Family Residential to U-4 Retail/Commercial to make way for the building of a new Sunoco station at that location. The Garfield Heights City Charter requires that this ordinance be submitted to the electorate for the regular municipal election on November 8, 2022.

- Amending the contract with Kimble Recycling & Disposal and to update from 11,240 homes to 11,340 homes the actual number of households receiving its services.

- Supplementing and amending an ordinance concerning the classification and compensation for nonunion pay positions. It is the mayor's desire to do the following: 1) Create the position of Administrative Assistant for the Finance Department; 2) Change the title of Personnel Administrator/Payroll to Assistant Finance Director; 3)

Create the position of Administrative Assistant for the Fire Department; 4) Create the position of Assistant Economic Development Director at pay range 7; 5) Increase the amount of Economic Development managers from 1 to 2 and increase their pay range from 5 to 7; 6) Authorize pay increases of 3% plus a one-time \$500 bonus for all full-time and permanent part-time active non-union employees, effective January 1, 2022, and 7) Authorize a pay increase of 3% for all part-time active non-union employees (excluding seasonal), effective January 1, 2022.

- Entering into an agreement with OHM Advisors to develop a Master Plan for all Garfield Heights community parks. The city of Garfield Heights would like to develop a parks and active transportation master plan for the purposes of better utilizing the community parks and ensuring the city's amenities meet the needs of its residents, according to the legislation.

- Entering into an agreement with Roberts Mechanical Equipment Co. to purchase a new HVAC unit for the Garfield Heights Parks and Recreation Department's ice rink at a total purchase price of \$70,475.

- Contracting with Mechanical Piping Systems for the modification and installation of the HVAC unit for the ice rink in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

- Appointing Debra Sarnowski to serve as the secretary of the Garfield Heights Civil Service Commission.

- Honoring the life and memory of Richard G. France on his passing. Extreme heat in the forecast; Cuyahoga County shares heat-related safety tips for older adults, residents

Temperatures in Cuyahoga County are expected to reach the mid-90s this week, with “feels like” temperatures in the triple digits, according to the National Weather Service.

The Cuyahoga County Office of Emergency Management (OEM), which provides information and resources to residents about extreme weather, stresses the danger of high temperatures and the chances for developing heat related illnesses.

Knowing the difference between heat cramps, heat exhaustion and heat stroke can save lives.

Heat cramps are muscular pains and spasms due to heavy exertion. Heat cramps are non-life threatening.

Heat exhaustion occurs when people overexert themselves in hot and humid conditions. If untreated, heat exhaustion may cause a victim to suffer a heat stroke.

Heat stroke, also known as sun stroke, damages the body’s temperature control system, which regulates perspiration. A victim experiencing heat stroke can suffer brain damage or death if they do not receive proper medical care.

Residents can use the helpful Beat the **H.E.A.T.** acronym to stay cool during high temperatures.

Hydrate. Whether you feel thirsty or not, drink plenty of water to avoid becoming dehydrated. Drink 4-6 ounces of liquid every 15-20 minutes of activity.

Educate yourself. Know your local weather, temperature, and heat index forecasts.

Act quickly when a heat illness is suspected. Seek medical attention immediately for any of these warning signs: cramping, rapid pulse, heavy sweating, hot red skin, dizziness, confusion, nausea, vomiting.

Take it easy. Anyone working or exercising outdoors should avoid overexertion and take hourly breaks in the shade or in air conditioning.

As temperatures rise, the Cuyahoga County Division of Senior and Adult Services (DSAS) reminds older persons that they are at a higher risk of falling ill during the summer months.

There are several precautions older adults can take to be safe this summer. Check cooling systems to ensure they are working properly. If utilities are a concern, the county can connect residents with resources that can assist with summer energy bills, so no one is left to make the difficult decision whether to pay cooling bills or purchase food. For information on how the county can help, call 216-420-6700.

health care provider, fire department, or other similar emergency agency or entity;

(2) A person using an electronic wireless communications device whose motor vehicle is in a stationary position and the motor vehicle is outside a lane of travel;

(3) A person using a navigation device in a voice-operated or hands-free manner who does not manipulate the device while driving.

(c) (1) Except as provided in subsection (c)(2) of this section, whoever violates subsection (a) of this section shall be fined one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00). In addition, the court shall impose a class seven suspension of the offender’s driver’s license or permit for a definite period of sixty days.

(2) If the person previously has been adjudicated a delinquent child or a juvenile traffic offender for a violation of this section, whoever violates this section shall be fined three hundred dollars (\$300.00). In addition, the court shall impose a class seven suspension of the person’s driver’s license or permit for a definite period of one year.

(d) The filing of a sworn complaint against a person for a violation of Ohio R.C. 4511.205 does not preclude the filing of a sworn complaint for a violation of a substantially equivalent municipal ordinance for the same conduct. However, if a person is adjudicated a delinquent child or a juvenile traffic offender for a violation of Ohio R.C. 4511.205 and is also adjudicated a delinquent child or a juvenile traffic offender for a violation of a substantially equivalent municipal ordinance for the same conduct, the two offenses are allied offenses of similar import under Ohio R.C. 2941.25.

(e) As used in this section, “electronic wireless communications device” includes any of the following:

- (1) A wireless telephone;

(a) No holder of a temporary instruction permit who has not attained the age of eighteen years and no holder of a probationary driver’s license shall drive a motor vehicle on any street, highway, or property used by the public for purposes of vehicular traffic or parking while using in any manner an electronic wireless communications device.

(b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to either of the following:

(1) A person using an electronic wireless communications device for emergency purposes, including an emergency contact with a law enforcement agency, hospital or

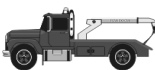

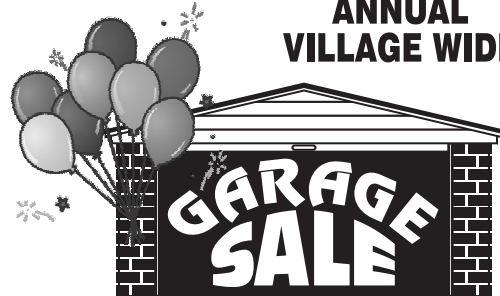

Traffic Offense

On June 12, at 10:43 p.m., an officer was assisting other GHPD officers on I-480 west near Transportation Blvd. Two police cruisers, one EMS vehicle and one tow truck were present with overhead emergency lights on. While assisting at a motor vehicle crash, the officer saw a dark-colored Kia Sorento traveling at an estimated 85-mph in a 60-mph zone. The Kia was in the slow lane and struck Garfield Heights Fire Engine #2 in the left rear bumper while it was parked in the right berm of the freeway. The car nearly struck a tow truck driver, officers and fire personnel in the roadway. The Kia, with heavy damage, continued west on I-480 in a closed off construction zone and attempted to flee the scene.

The officer ran back to his patrol car and caught up with the Kia near the I-77 north split, where it came to a complete stop just before the split in an unsafe area of the highway. With his gun drawn, the officer exited his patrol car and commanded the driver to step out of the vehicle, which he did not. He again ordered the man from the car but the suspect accelerated and attempted to flee again, but his severely damaged Kia was not operable. The officer holstered his gun and opened the driver's side

door, grabbed the suspect's left arm and assisted him from the vehicle. A strong odor of alcohol was detected coming from the suspect, who had bloodshot eyes and difficulty holding himself up, the officer noted in the report. He was unable to walk and would not cooperate. He was placed in handcuffs and put in the back of a squad car without further incident. He refused to provide a breath sample and while in jail had a hard time answering questions, could not keep his head up and didn't know where he was. He was placed in a holding cell and issued a citation for failure to control, hit/skip and OVI.

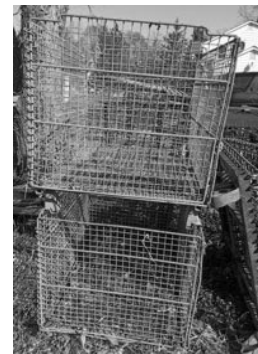
