Former Newburgh Hts. mayor given 30 days in jail, fine, community service

Former Newburgh Heights Mayor Trevor Elkins, who pleaded guilty last April to attempted theft in office and attempted perjury in matters relating to elections, was sentenced on Tuesday, June 21, in the courtroom of Judge Joan Synenberg, to serve 30 days in jail.

The judge had originally sentenced him to serve 180 days in jail but suspended all but 30 days as a condition of probation. He was also sentenced to one year of community control/probation under supervision of the Adult Probation Department and 200 hours of court community work service and pay a fine of \$3,000.

As part of an earlier plea deal, Elkins was forced to step down as mayor of Newburgh Heights and not run for public office in the 2024 and 2028 election cycles. City Council President Gigi Traore was formally sworn in as the village's mayor on May 2, 2022.

On Wednesday, June 8, Silver & Gold, an organization that honors first responders in the Greater Cuyahoga County area, recently presented Third District Police Officer Jonathan Sanchez a Bravery Award in the Red Room of the mayor's office at Cleveland City Hall. Mayor Justin Bibb, who had offered the Red Room as the venue for the presentation, was in attendance as was Police Chief Dornat (Wayne) Drummond.

Officer Sanchez received the award for saving the life of a suicidal male who insisted on running out into traffic on the highway. Sanchez, observing the danger to himself and others, chose to go out into the fast-moving traffic anyway and guide the suicidal male to safety. He then took him to a facility for further care.

Silver & Gold also grants college scholarships to children of first responders who are entering their first year of college.

Fireworks prohibited in Newburgh Hts. ahead of Ohio's July 1 effective date

Despite the state legislature's passage of House Bill 172 legalizing the use of consumer grade fireworks, Newburgh Heights Mayor Gigi Traore has signed into law an ordinance passed by Village Council on Tuesday, June 7, 2022 prohibiting the operation of fireworks by residents and visitors.

Ordinance No. 2022-18 enacts regulations regarding the use of fireworks within the local municipality - banning the use of consumer grade fireworks. Residents are, however, permitted to operate small novelty or trick devices such as noise makers, sparklers and poppers. Violators are subject to a first-degree misdemeanor for discharging, igniting and/or operating illegal fireworks, but does not include simple possession.

Mayor Traore shared that, "The Village believes it's in the best interest of our residents' safety and maintenance of our community, therefore we have opted out of the new state law."

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY TO IMPROVE CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF BEDFORD, OHIO BY LIGHTING THE SAME AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Section 5. That the assessments herein provided for shall be collected before the improvement herein provided for shall be completed so that funds may be available for the payment of said improvement.


Section 6. The owner of any property assessed may, at this option, pay such assessment in cash within thirty (30) days after passage of the assessing ordinance.



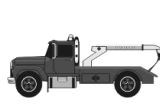
