Joe Kocab has worn a lot of hats during his long career in Cleveland - teacher, administrator, Czech radio host and Czech Catholic Union president, just to name a few. And so he's made a lot of friends over the years, many of whom were in attendance to celebrate Joe's 90th birthday last Saturday at Bohemian National Hall in the North Broadway neighborhood.

Fr. Michael Brunovsky and Fr. Gerard Gonba, on the faculty at Benedictine High School, were there to congratulate Joe and wish him well. He was a student at Benedictine High in the late 1940's, served as class president, member of the cheerleading squad and was on the school newspaper staff.

After graduating from BHS, Joe received his B.A. degree in zoology and his master's degree in educational administration from Ohio University.

He served as a teacher and department head at John Adams High School in Cleveland from 1955-65 and again in 1967 as assistant principal. He was also assistant principal at Rawlings Junior High and South High schools from 1969 until 1985.

For 48 years he hosted the weekly "Czech Voice of Cleveland" radio show, most recently on WHKW AM 1220, and was "Mr. Karlin Hall," a Czech social club on Fleet Ave., until it closed many years ago.

Joe is a past president of the Czech Catholic Union and continues to serve as a director on its national board.

MHPD investigates shooting

Last Wednesday, March 2, at 8:05 a.m., Maple Heights police responded to an apartment building at 5201 Warrensville Center Rd., for a report of shots fired and a male with a gunshot wound in his chest.

Upon arrival officers located the victim laying in the first-floor hallway. The victim had at least one gunshot wound to his upper chest but was conscious and breathing. He was transported to MetroHealth Medical Center by paramedics from the Maple Heights Fire Department. The suspected gunman, who was still on scene, surrendered himself to officers without incident. He was transported to the MHPD.

House fire on Jeffries Ave. takes lives of two small children

According to the Cleveland Fire Department, a one-year-old boy and one-month-old baby girl died in a house fire yesterday morning at 7609 Jeffries Ave., close to Warner Rd. in Cleveland, near the Garfield Heights border. Three other children escaped from the house, while another who lives at the house was at school during the time of the fire, according to various local media sources.

Sources said multiple departments responded to the Jeffries Ave. home just before 10 a.m. Tuesday for the working fire. Heavy smoke and flames were seen coming from the home when fire crews arrived.

All six of the children living at the house are reported to be under the age of 14. The three children who escaped from the fire were transported to Marymount Hospital along with their mother.

At press time the cause of the fire remains under investigation.

Bedford begins process to fill Ward 4 seat

Bedford officials are beginning the process of finding a candidate to fill the vacancy in the Ward 4 Council seat after longtime Councilwoman Paula Mizzsak passed away last month, Mayor Stan Koci said at council's meeting Monday night.

Mizzsak, who served as Ward 4's council representative for more than 26 years, passed away on Friday, Feb. 18. According to the city's charter, council must find someone to fill out her unexpired term until November, when the General Election will be held.

Explaining the process, Koci said, "We will be sending out postcards to everybody in the Ward 4 area. If they're interested, they can send us a letter or a resume. Also, we will put it online.... and we'll have some deadline dates in there. It's going to be about four weeks after we mail the cards when all the responses will have to be in."

Koci said that there will be some minor background checks done on the people that are interested in the Ward 4 seat. He said they won't be as extensive as they do for police and fire because it's an appointment, not an election.

"So watch for that card in the mail if you're interested in serving," Koci said.

He also said the appointment only runs until this November when candidates will be running for an additional year of Mizzsak's unexpired term.

Home repair grant program approved in Maple Hts.

At last week's meeting of Maple Heights Council, a resolution was passed approving the 2022 Exterior Home Repair Grant Program, and authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to award funding to eligible applicants.

Blackwell and the Maple Heights Economic Development Department have proposed the grant program to provide owners who occupy their homes with financial assistance to maintain the exterior of their homes.

The resolution authorizes Finance Director Tinita Tillman to fund the program by appropriating up to \$100,000, with \$50,000 of that amount to come city funds. The additional \$50,000 will be from funds provided to the city from private entities, the county or state, which are specifically designated for the 2022 Exterior Home Repair Grant Program.

According to the guidelines of the program, the city will offer the home repair grant to cover transformative projects to the outside of owner-occupied one-, two- or three-family residential properties. These projects must be visible from the street and may include, but are not limited to, landscaping, roofs, painting, windows and doors, and concrete.

If the property has any city violations, the grant must be used to repair those violations, the guidelines state. Projects that have started before the grant application was received are not eligible. The city will fund a percentage of selected project costs, depending on household income, up to \$3,000.

Projects will be approved in May and June with subsequent rounds as funds are available. The city may be contacted for more information at 216-662-6000.

Other legislation passed

Council also passed a resolution authorizing Blackwell and City Engineer Ed Hren to submit an application for the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program, to seek federal funding for the project, estimated to cost \$394,432. This project is intended to alleviate traffic congestion around schools in the city.

If the application for the funding is approved, Blackwell will be authorized to enter into a contract with ODOT, necessary to complete the project.

Also approved was a resolution authorizing a contract between the city and Fabrizi Trucking and Paving Company, Inc., for the Mendota Avenue Watermain Project, at a cost not to exceed \$1,195,804. Fabrizi had the lowest and best bid, officials determined.

Hren said that the Cleveland Water Department and the Ohio Public Works Commission would provide grant funding, with additional funding provided through the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works.

Another resolution passed at last week's meeting was to accept a Software Licensing Agreement and quotes with Software Solutions Inc., for a license for the Finance Department to "use and operate certain proprietary com-

District 6 Councilman Richard Trojanski gave an update on infrastructure projects taking place in his district, including construction slated to take place soon on Hansen, Watson and Raymond between Warrensville Center and Northfield rds., and also on upper Gardenview Dr.

He said the actual resurfacing of the streets will take place around August or September and added that only Hansen, Watson and Raymond between Warrensville and Northfield rds. will get resurfaced.

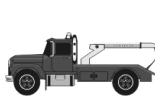

City of Independence Council update

Independence Council met in regular session via Zoom on Tuesday, Feb. 8, and passed the following legislation:

- Amending an ordinance in order to raise the compensation of exempt personnel.

- Amending an ordinance declaring improvements to certain parcels of real estate to be a public purpose, described the public infrastructure improvements made to benefit those parcels, required the making of service payments in lieu of taxes, authorized an agreement with respect to those service payments and established a municipal Public Improvement Tax Increments Equivalent Fund, to remove a parcel from the list of those on which improvements are declared to be a public purpose pursuant to Ordinance No. 2002-54, and declaring an emergency. (Two other related ordinances regarding TIFs were also introduced and passed.)
- Authorizing payment to the Southwest Council of Governments of \$22,500 for annual membership dues.
- Purchasing three new 2022 Ford SUV Interceptors for the police department at a total cost not to exceed \$112,302.00.
- Purchasing a 2022 Ford SUV Explorer for the engineering department at a cost not to exceed \$40,304.00.
- Retaining Guide Studio, Inc. for professional services to assist the economic development and communication departments with updating the city's branding, Phase 2, not to exceed \$22,500.00.
- Entering into an agreement with and making final payment to Quasar Energy Group, LLC relative to the Job Retention and Creation Grant Agreement. Councilman Anthony Togliatti commented that "based on the discussion this evening, and the determination that this company has defaulted in the fifth year of their incentive agreement with the city of Independence, the public perception of this settlement is terrible for the city of Independence, and for that reason I cannot vote for this."
- Authorizing the mayor to enter into a change order to the General Construction Engineering and Inspection Services Contract with Quality Control Inspection, Inc.,

9500 Midwest Ave., Garfield Heights, for additional professional general construction engineering and inspection services in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00, and for a total amount not to exceed \$85,000.00.

- Authorizing the mayor to enter into a change order and final to the Creek, Utility and Infrastructure Maintenance and Repairs Contract with Geotech Services, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$23,338.92, and for a total contract amount not to exceed \$655,410.92.
- Entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Cuyahoga Soil & Water Conservation District, for assistance with compliance of its N.P.D.E.S. Phase 2 Storm Water Requirements, for a total cost not to exceed \$32,000.00.
- Retaining South Shore Utility Locating, Inc. for protective services relative to the city's underground conduit system.
- Authorizing an increase in the amount of funds allocated to retain Attorney McLandrich, and the law firm of Mazanec, Raskin & Ryder Co., LPA, to represent Anthony Togliatti, in his former official capacity, in accordance with their proposal relative to the lawsuit, in an amount not to exceed \$4,139.07, and for a total amount not to exceed \$112,478.54.
- Accepting the bid of Vancuren Services, Inc. for general tree trimming and removal service for city property beginning March 1, 2022, and ending Dec. 31, 2023, in an annual amount not to exceed \$65,000.00.

913.04 GARBAGE AND RUBBISH CONTAINERS

(a) Waste containers and waste or refuse not placed in containers shall not be placed in front of any house or other building by the owner, agent, lessee or occupant of that building for collection prior to the time listed on the corresponding chart on the evening immediately preceding the day for refuse collection. Time of Placement: April 1 - October 31, 6 p.m. November 1 - March 31, 4 p.m.

(Ord. 79-2010. Passed 11-22-10.)

(b) Empty waste containers shall not be permitted to remain in the front of any house or other building by the owner, agent, lessee or occupant of that building for a period in excess of 12 hours from the time of collection by the city.

(Ord. 59-2006. Passed 9-25-06.)

PENALTY: Whoever violates any provision of Section 913.04 is guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00). The above listed minor misdemeanor may be enforced by the issuance of a citation.
