Local schools among those sharing \$57.8 mil. in state safety grants

Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine announced Monday that the state will support the installation of security upgrades at more than 700 K-12 schools across Ohio.

Local schools to receive these security upgrades include:

- **Bedford City Schools** - \$450,000 total for Bedford High School, Carywood Intermediate, Central Primary, Columbus Intermediate, Glendale Primary and Heskett Middle School.

- **Cleveland Central Catholic High School**, Cleveland, \$100,000.

- **Independence Local Schools** - \$283,455 total for Independence High School, Independence Middle School and Independence Primary School.

- **St. Stanislaus School**, Cleveland, \$100,000.

- **Trinity High School**, Garfield Heights, \$100,000.

A total of 708 schools in 57 counties will receive \$57.8 million in grant funding to enhance student and staff safety. The state is awarding the funds as part of the K-12 School Safety Grant Program, which helps schools with physical security expenses, such as new security cameras, public address systems, automatic door locks, visitor badging systems and exterior lighting.

"We are being proactive in keeping our schools safe in Ohio. Student and staff safety is paramount," said Gov. DeWine. "These safety grants are helping schools create environments that are secure and welcoming for teachers and their students."

Monday's announcement represents the third round of grants awarded as part of the Ohio K-12 School Safety Grant Program. In the first round, \$5 million in state funding was awarded to 95 schools in 27 counties. Gov. DeWine then partnered with the Ohio General Assembly to increase funding for the program by an additional \$100 million. He announced the availability of the second round of funding in August, totaling \$42.2 million for 1,065 schools.

The remaining \$57.8 million in grants are being awarded through a competitive process to public school districts and chartered non-public schools, with a maximum award of \$100,000 per school. The grant program is administered by the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission in partnership with the Ohio School Safety Center.

Presidential memento given to Slavic Village Historical Society

A moving document related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, which happened 59 years ago this week, has been given to the Slavic Village Historical Society. It is a thank-you note from the president's widow sent soon after the tragedy to Immaculate Heart of Mary School on Lansing Ave.

Addressed to Sr. Mary Pius, the former fifth grade teacher, the printed correspondence bears the Kennedy family's ancestral crest and states that Mrs. Kennedy is "deeply appreciative of your sympathy and grateful for your thoughtfulness." The black-bordered envelope in which it arrived is stamped with the postal frank of Jacqueline Kennedy.

The artifact was donated to the society by parishioner Lawrence Baranowski, who attended the grade school in the 1960s. He said he found the valuable item while going through family papers.

Garfield Heights to become Power A Clean Future Ohio community

Garfield Heights Council met in regular session Monday night and passed a resolution authorizing the city to become a Power a Clean Future Ohio community.

According to its website, "Power a Clean Future Ohio is an expansive, diverse coalition engaging with cities and local governments across the state of Ohio to build a clean future for our communities. Power a Clean Future Ohio is empowering local leaders with tools and resources to create carbon reduction plans and implement them in ways that are achievable, measurable, equitable and economical.

"It is a nonpartisan coalition that works with local leaders to develop and implement proven climate solutions and is committed to reducing carbon emissions throughout Ohio in big and small ways that make sense for each local community. Ohio's economy, health and future depend on a new approach to clean energy and climate change."

Its policy priorities include: Clean Transportation, Renewable Energy, Energy Waste Reduction, Land Use and Federal Grant Assistance.

Janice Tubbs, project manager in the Garfield Heights Department of Economic Development, introduced a representative from the nonprofit organization at Monday night's meeting, who explained the program and that it will be implemented at absolutely no cost to the city.

The only other item on the council agenda was passage of an emergency ordinance authorizing an agreement with OHM Advisors to continue to provide engineering services to the city for 2023 and 2024.

The next regular meeting of council will be held on Monday, Dec. 12.

City of Cleveland beginning property survey

A city-wide, door-to-door property survey is beginning across Cleveland. All parcels in the city will be visually surveyed, photographed and assigned a letter grade based on its condition.

The survey will also assess vacancy, lead risk and other characteristics. The survey will also provide a unique opportunity to assess all parcels for lead risk with the hope of targeting repair resources to those properties. The last city-wide survey was conducted in 2015. In 2018, a survey was conducted only on the east side of Cleveland.

building conditions to make informed decisions regarding the use of limited resources for code enforcement, demolition and rehabilitation. Property inventories have become important tools for communities across the state.

Western Reserve Land Conservancy, which is conducting the survey with Cleveland staff, has now completed property inventories in Akron, Dayton, Elyria, Lorain, Oberlin and Sandusky.

Youth Opportunities Unlimited receives \$65,000 FEW grant to center workers and learners of color

Youth Opportunities Unlimited (Y.O.U.) is one of 15 workforce development organizations from across the country, and the only one in Ohio, to receive an inaugural grant from the Fund for Workforce Equity. FEW is a new pooled investment fund led by Workforce Matters that was created to implement initiatives that center workers and learners of color in designing or implementing workforce policies and programs.

Y.O.U. is a nonprofit workforce development organization based in Cleveland. For more than 40 years Y.O.U. has served teens and young adults ages 14-24 living in under-resourced areas in Northeast Ohio.

This grant will build upon Generation Work Cleveland | Cuyahoga County (GWCC), a collaboration supported by the Annie E. Casey Foundation that focuses on improving employment and earnings for young adults — particularly young adults of color.

Y.O.U. has partnered with GWCC since the initiative launched in 2014. With this grant, Y.O.U. will work with GWCC partners to gather and review data that centers the

voice of young adults of color in job quality conversations. The project will highlight what characteristics of a job or employer are of particular importance to young workers.

This information will then be used to inform and advise employers looking to hire and retain young adult talent — specifically black and brown young adult workers — and programs supporting young talent.

"Since Y.O.U. released the \$44,000 Question report, we have been asking 'what will it take to engage young workers and get them into, or back into, work,'" says Y.O.U. President & CEO Craig Dorn. "Support from the Fund for Workforce Equity allows us to take what we have learned from GWCC and dig into the data involving young workers. Peer interviews, sector specific questions and data disaggregated by race will inform hiring managers and other decision makers."

The Fund for Workforce Equity is an initiative of Workforce Matters that has pooled funding from 22 grantmaking organizations. The Fund's advisory committee is comprised of philanthropic and workforce field leaders committed to interrupting the systemic racism embedded within the field's practices, policies, programs and the labor markets of communities they serve.

Local supporters of the Fund for Workforce Equity are Cuyahoga County Workforce Funders Group, Deaconess Foundation, and Fund for Our Economic Future.



The Maple Heights High School wrestling team returns six District qualifiers for the upcoming 2022-23 season. The Mustangs will be looking to capture their 12th consecutive Lake Erie League championship and 48th overall since 1954, in both the old Greater Cleveland Conference and the Lake Erie League.

Returning District qualifiers include Jayshawn Eggleton, Derek Palmer, Vontez Tyus, Terry Murphy, Kaden Pulley and Steven Gardner.

Other returning lettermen include Kendall Mathews-Callum, Markese Moss, Anthony Brooks, Ian Adams, Devin Jones and Sam Holland.

Jamie Milkovich, the winningest coach in the history of Ohio wrestling with 563 dual meet victories, begins his 42nd season as head coach of the Mustangs. He will once again be assisted by a pair of outstanding coaches in Rick LaScala and Andrew Wolf.

Maple Heights will travel to the Brush Duals (Dec. 3), Chagrin Falls (Dec. 8), Painesville Harvey Quad (Dec. 10), Hudson Holiday Tournament (Dec. 16 & 17), Westlake Duals (Jan. 14), Akron Kenmore/Garfield Duals (Jan. 21), Willoughby South (Jan. 26), North Royalton (Feb. 4), Sectional Tournament (Feb. 25), District Tournament (Mar. 3 & 4) and The Ohio State Tournament (Mar. 10-12).

The Mustangs will host the 7th annual Maple Heights Holiday Tournament (Dec. 30), the 13th annual Maroon & White Duals (Jan. 7), Garfield Heights (Jan. 27), and the Lake Erie League Tournament (Feb. 11).

Theft-Shoplifting

On Nov. 17, at 7:27 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Giant Eagle on Transportation Blvd., for a male loading a cart with random items which employees believed he would probably not pay for. They asked police to stand by. Sure enough, the man attempted to exit the store without paying and a store employee yelled at him to stop. The suspect then left the cart loaded with \$1,095.88 worth of goods next to the exit door and walked out. Police had positioned their patrol car in front of the suspect as he exited the store. They commanded the suspect to walk towards them and place his hands behind his back to which he did without incident. He was handcuffed and

placed in the back of the cruiser. Dispatch ran the suspect through LEADS and he showed multiple misdemeanor and felony warrants with multiple agencies. Most of the warrants were for theft. He was later booked and housed at Garfield Heights Jail on felony theft. Holders were placed on him for his several misdemeanor and felony warrants.

The suspect vehicle, a red Ford Escape, failed to stop and continued to drive as if nothing had happened, passing through several red lights and stop signs, and striking a tree, several curbs and another vehicle. The officer pursued the car through Cleveland, Shaker Heights and back to Garfield Heights, where the driver, a younger black female, entered an apartment complex driveway, where police were able to block her in and at gunpoint get her out of the car and onto the ground, handcuffing her. While speaking with the suspect, officers noticed a strong smell of alcohol coming from her, along with slurred speech and bloodshot eyes. She submitted to a breathalyzer test and blew 0.205. She began to have a panic attack and was taken to Marymount Hospital. She was charged with hit-skip, reckless operation, OVI and fleeing and eluding.



Cleveland City Council votes added funds for neighborhood resource, recreation centers

Cleveland City Council held its regular meeting on Monday, Nov. 21, both in person in Council Chambers and through live streaming. Some of the highlights included:

Expanding Programs at Neighborhood Recreation Centers: Council approved increasing funding by \$806,183 to support additional programs in the city's Neighborhood Resource and Recreation Centers. These additional funds will be used to increase the number of programs that are being provided to youth and families. These expanded programs are aimed at providing youth and the community access to resources, programs and activities that address the root causes of violence; promote healing, wellness, resiliency and self-efficacy; and support residents in developing the skills and knowledge required to thrive and live quality lives. Council had

previously approved \$1,883,317 and the increased amount is now \$2,689,500.

Community-Based Violence Prevention: The city's Prevention Initiative—Cleveland Project Thrive program will accept, per council approval, about \$1,994,908 from the Department of Justice and \$76,000 from the Cleveland Foundation. The grant will support city-led collaborative community violence intervention planning and strategies. This award, funded in part through the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, is part of a \$100 million investment in community violence intervention programs from the Department of Justice.

New Business: The Mayor's Appointments Committee will meet on Thursday, Dec. 1, to interview the administration's 10 nominees for the new Cleveland Police Commission.

"This should include understanding plan benefits, out-of-pocket costs, covered prescription drugs, in-network physicians, and premiums."

Medicare experts from the department's Ohio Senior Health Insurance Information Program can help. As the state's official Medicare assistance program, OSIIIP provides free and unbiased Medicare insight, plan comparison, financial assistance identification and enrollment facilitation.
