Maple Hts. Council OKs next phase of Dunham Road sewer repair project

A resolution authorizing City Engineer Ed Hren to advertise for bids for the Southwest Sewer District Sewer Repairs, Phase 2 of the Dunham Road Project, was approved by Maple Heights Council at its meeting last week.

Hren informed Mayor Annette Blackwell and other city officials that he and his engineering firm, Chagrin Valley Engineering (CVE), have conducted an investigation and completed engineering reports and "have identified sanitary sewer defects on Dunham Rd. between Rockside and Turney Rd."

It was noted that the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works will begin the reconstruction and resurfacing of Dunham Rd. from Turney to Granger rds. next spring, and Hren has advised that the repairs to the sanitary defects on Dunham "should be completed prior to the reconstruction and resurfacing of Dunham Rd."

Maple Heights has received funding and support from the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District, the Ohio Public Works Commission and Cuyahoga County in the ongoing project, the legislation states.

Placed on first reading at the meeting was a resolution authorizing Blackwell to execute easement documents for public sanitary sewer facilities over private properties on Schreiber Rd., as part of Phase 1 of the Southwest Quadrant Sewer Repairs Project.

Hren has advised that the city will have to purchase sewer easements from a number of private property owners on the south side of Schreiber for the project to go forward. The project is expected to be advertised for bids later this year with an early 2023 construction start.

Slavic Village featured in foreclosure crisis documentary at Chagrin Documentary Film Fest

The national housing foreclosure crisis of 2007-10, of which Slavic Village was the epicenter, caused tens of thousands of people in this country to lose their homes and housing values to plummet. The crisis in Slavic Village was once again center stage Sunday in Chagrin Falls at the premier of "The House Next Door" at the Chagrin Documentary Film Fest.

The documentary features Slavic Village in the midst of the mortgage crisis, then-Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli dealing with it, homeowner turned civic activist Barbara Anderson struggling to keep her home, and Blaine Murphy, who had been convicted of illegally flipping homes in Slavic Village and elsewhere from his luxurious home in Naples, FL, sentenced to 3,000 hours of community service while living in the Forest City neighborhood of Slavic Village in a derelict home he had "flipped."

Vote Yes on Issue 51

Issue 51 is a Charter Amendment on the November ballot. If passed it will allow the use of traffic cameras in the city of Garfield Heights.

With I-480 being expanded, this will improve police officer and driver safety. Officers will no longer have to pull cars over on the side of the highway.

Issue 51 would repeal Section 59 of the city charter which prohibits the use of photo-monitoring traffic devices.

The city already uses safety monitoring cameras throughout our community to help fight crime. These cameras would be in addition to the existing cameras.

Twelve years ago traffic camera use was banned in Garfield Heights. Since then the Ohio Supreme Court ruled that stationary and officer held traffic cameras are permitted by law.

This issue is very different than 12 years ago. If Issue 51 passes, only Garfield Heights Municipal Court can hear the cases – not administrative hearing officers. Citizens will now have the right to a fair trial and the same constitutional rights as in other civil cases before the court.

Also, if someone else is driving your vehicle and you receive a traffic camera notice in the mail, you simply file a written statement with Garfield Heights Municipal Court giving the name and address of the driver and the ticket will be dismissed at no cost to you.

Before voting on Issue 51, please understand the difference between now and 12 years ago - know the facts not the myths.

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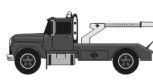

The officer grabbed a male by the shirt who was near the head of the person being attacked and the person grabbed him back and a struggle ensued, moving into the street as cars were driving by. The suspect was pushing, shoving and trying to break free of the officer when his shirt ripped and he was able to get away. The officer chased the suspect down the middle of Turney Rd., deployed his Taser and incapacitated the suspect. Another officer quickly ran over and placed the suspect in handcuffs.

The first officer looked over at the sidewalk where the fight had originally erupted and saw another officer fighting with a male subject. He was kicking the officer and trying to escape. The first officer ran over to assist and the suspect began to fight him. The officer punched the suspect in the face but the suspect continued to fight, even after police Tased him. They were eventu-

ally able to secure both males in the back of the cruisers. The suspect involved in the first struggle with officers had priors for resisting arrest and was wearing an ankle monitor. He was charged with resisting arrest and disorderly conduct.

A witness observed a dark-colored 4-door sedan leaving the area traveling north towards E. 139 St. A large amount of shell casings were found in the area. A plate in the driveway of the home had damage from gunfire and one rifle bullet was found in the second floor bedroom. A vehicle parked in the driveway of the home was also struck by gunfire. Police went to Metro to speak to the involved parties. No other information was given on the report.

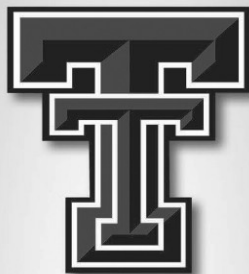
