## Back to bargaining table

The Garfield Heights Teachers Association bargaining team and Central Office Administration team representing the Garfield Heights City School District have agreed on a date to continue contract negotiations. The two groups will meet on Tuesday, Oct. 11, with a federal mediator present.

The teachers have been working without a contract for the past three months.

## Cuyahoga Valley National Park receives \$14 million for towpath trail, railroad

The Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP) has received approximately \$14 million through the Great American Outdoors Act (GAOA) to assure continued access to recreational experiences in CVNP.

The project will stabilize the riverbank at sites along the Cuyahoga River where erosion threatens the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail and the tracks for Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad. Work is expected to begin this month and continue through early 2025. Updates, including any necessary short-term closures, will be posted on the park website.

The eight locations include two priority sections of Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad and six locations along the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail.

A design-build contract has been awarded to an Akron construction company that also successfully completed an emergency stabilization project earlier this year at another site in the park.

Once the design is complete, work will include clearing the riverbank, placing rip rap and live stakes (branches placed directly into the soil that will root and grow) and regrading and planting native vegetation to stabilize the soil. Each site will have a unique design based on individual site characteristics. After the stabilization methods are implemented, the contractor will remediate the construction site and equipment access routes.

## G.H. Middle School placed on lockdown after loaded handgun magazine found in trash can

On Monday morning security from Garfield Heights Middle School was notified that a bus driver had found a bullet underneath one of the bus seats after the student had left the bus, according to a Facebook post from the Garfield Heights Police Department. The bus driver also noticed the student who was sitting in the seat go to a trash can outside the school and appeared to put something in it, the Facebook post went on.

School security checked and found a handgun magazine loaded with four rounds inside the garbage can. The school was immediately placed in lockdown and the students involved were identified and detained.

No firearm was ever seen or found, GHPD posted. The on-scene investigation was concluded and will be forwarded to the GHPD Juvenile Detective Bureau for review of charges. Middle School students were then dismissed for the day.

# Bedford Council votes to construct new pool house; water, sewer rates set for 2023

At its meeting Monday night, Bedford City Council approved several pieces of legislation associated with constructing a new pool house at the city's Municipal Pool, and also approved water and sewer rates for residents for next year.

The current pool house dates back to 1964, and is in need of repairs, according to the legislation passed by council. The city recently received \$150,000 in grant funding through Cuyahoga County towards the new pool house. The cost of materials, equipment and services will be reimbursed through the grant, City Manager Mike Mallis stated.

Among the items approved were a contract with Ferguson to purchase plumbing and related materials at a cost of \$39,223.06; a contract with Graybar Powersmart to purchase plumbing and electrical construction materials at a cost of \$35,578.63; a contract with Rep Source, LLC for additional construction materials at a cost of \$15,491.40; and an ordinance amending previous legislation for a contract with GPD Group for services regarding design, bidding and construction administration costs associated with the project, at a total cost of \$77,050.

Mallis explained that the items will be purchased through the State of Ohio bid pricing program, and the city will in turn submit those purchases to the county for reimbursement. As for the work to be done on the project, all of that is eligible to be reimbursed by the county as well, he said.

Council also passed ordinances to set water and sewer

rates for 2023, and to provide a 30% discount in water and sewer rates for senior citizens and disabled residents with a combined household income of less than \$35,734 annually.

Water rates will actually be going down by 3% next year, Mayor Stan Koci stated, while Finance Director Jennifer Howland said sewer rates will go up by 4%.

Also passed was an ordinance authorizing Mallis to enter into a contract with GPD Group at a cost of \$227,900, to further conduct a No Feasible Alternatives analysis, as mandated by the Environmental Protection Agency, to address persistent overflows impacting the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

Council passed an ordinance for a two-year contract with the Ohio State Auditor, Specific Local Government Services, for preparation assistance with the 2022 and 2023 city of Bedford audits, at a cost of \$22,500 annually.

Also passed was legislation allowing city employees to make insurance plan premium contributions on a pretax basis for 2023 through Health Equity Wage Works, so the employees will not have to include compensation used to

pay insurance premiums as taxable income.

After council passed a motion approving her appointment, Koci swore Denise Lachowski in to a three-year term of office with the Civil Service Commission.

## Former councilwoman donates \$20K, threatens lawsuit

Former Ward 5 Councilwoman Heather Rhoades, who stepped down from council last year, spoke during the Hearing from Citizens portion of the meeting to announce her donation of a total of \$20,000 to various city departments, and also threatened a lawsuit against the city because of alleged remarks her former colleague, Ward 6 Councilman Donald Saunders, made against her family.

Rhoades said she had made a commitment that her company would donate \$10,000 a year to the city "provided I was informed as to what the city needed in terms of money. It's been two years and I have yet to be informed of what the city needed, despite several requests to both my councilman and requests to the city manager."

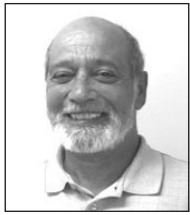

She clarified that "I'm not angry, I am just a little disappointed" in the city's response to her and her company's offer. "We don't even want a public thank you... But my company and I would like a short meeting once a year, in my office, which is a half block away from here, so that someone can discuss with me how that money can be used."

Rhoades presented Mallis and Koci with four separate checks for \$5,000 apiece, to go to the city's police department for protective equipment and other items; to the fire department for their use; to the Parks and Recreation Department for safety improvements to the city's playgrounds; and for the purchase of new or replacement holiday decorations for the downtown area.

Mallis said that the city was grateful for Rhoades' generous donations and will ensure they go towards the requested purposes.

Koci thanked Rhoades for her donations, adding, "You will get a report on where the money is being spent."

Also in her comments, Rhoades requested that Saunders "cease to imply to residents in town and around Bedford that the only reason I adopted my two youngest children is for the stipend that by Ohio state law I must receive for adopting them in order to

cover their special needs. That money is put into a fund, and I have heard from more than one person that Don Saunders has said such things in this city."

Rhoades said that the alleged comments were "vulgar and unbecoming of a councilperson, and if they persist, Councilman Saunders and the city will be subject to yet another lawsuit because of what he said."

Saunders, who did not answer Rhoades' allegations at the meeting, was contacted afterwards for comment but did not respond as of press time.

## Announcements

Councilman Jeff Asbury announced that Bedford Fire Lt. Brian Harding and other members of Ohio Task Force One were currently in Florida, offering assistance in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian.

Mallis announced that Norfolk Southern Railroad had notified Bedford officials of upcoming improvements at the West Grace crossing, necessitating its closure for two weeks. He said the city would notify residents through its website and social media when a date for the beginning of work was confirmed.
