Following almost five months of negotiating for a new contract with the Garfield Heights City Schools, the Garfield Heights Teachers' Association met Friday for an update from their negotiating team. With over 200 members in attendance, the meeting resulted in a unanimous vote authorizing the GHATA Negotiations Team to issue a 10-day strike notice when they deem it necessary.

"The GHATA negotiations team did not want our members to have to take this vote," said GHATA Vice President Tim Duhanich. "However, after five months of negotiations, the GHCS Board and administration has not left us with many options."

"After progress in bargaining slowed, the GHATA requested a federal mediator, who on September 15th sent dates for mediation. GHATA has accepted all the dates, but we are still waiting on management to respond after several requests for a response, and the first date on the list of available dates has already passed," he continued.

"Our membership is ready for management to address the needs of our students and staff. It is our genuine hope that the Board's team will commit to working with us in negotiating a contract that ensures safety, stability and success in Garfield Heights City Schools," Duhanich concluded.

Independence donates used police cars to MHPD

Maple Heights Police Chief Todd Hansen, at last week's city council meeting, thanked Maple Heights Mayor Annette Blackwell and Independence Mayor Gregory Kurtz for their efforts in having the city of Independence donate two of its former police vehicles to the Maple Heights Police Department.

He said Independence had two 2015 Ford Explorers they were transitioning out of to make way for newer models and donated them to Maple Heights, free of charge, he told council, noting they are "in pretty decent shape."

City seeking \$750K in ARPA funds

In her report to council, Blackwell said that she and City Engineer Ed Hren had appeared recently before a committee of Cuyahoga County Council "to defend our request for \$750,000 in ARPA funds."

ARPA (The American Rescue Plan Act) was passed by Congress last year to provide financial relief to state and local governments recovering from the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. County Council has received over 100 grant applications and has begun awarding grants to municipalities and nonprofits that provide critical public services.

Blackwell said that the city should hear in October if Maple Heights' request will be granted.

Update on ballot issues

Law Director Frank Consolo gave an update on the five-

year, 2.0-mill renewal levies for the city's police and fire departments which will be on the Tuesday, Nov. 8 ballot, and also distributed sample ballots to council members.

Known as Issues 61 and 62, according to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, Consolo emphasized that the two issues "are a renewal, not an increase, and it is a valuation rate of 20 cents per \$100 of valuation on properties."

Both levies, if passed, will continue to fund salaries of personnel, as well as fund maintenance and operations of equipment, buildings, vehicles and sites in the police and fire departments.

Fatal shooting at Showcase

Garfield Heights police have confirmed that 27-year-old Ronald Briggs was fatally shot on Sunday, Sept. 25, shortly after 1 a.m. in front of the Showcase Bar, 5015 Turney Rd.

A squad transported him to MetroHealth Medical Center. The official police report is unavailable at this time as GHPD said investigation into the homicide is ongoing.

Broadview Heights PD responded to the Showcase with a K9 officer for crowd control following the incident. Valley View and Independence police were also requested for mutual aid.

Letters to the Editor Supports Garfield teachers

Dear Editor:

As a resident of Garfield Heights and a 1988 graduate of Garfield Heights High School, I am writing this letter to show 100% support for our teachers in the district. Many know our teachers have been working without a contract. I question the members of the Central Office Administration and the Board of Education as to why the situation has deteriorated to the point that a strike may occur. It is clear the board and administration feel a fair proposal has been made, but I would ask them to consider if they would work under the same proposal.

Additionally, I must question the working environment of the district for our teachers. I have seen comments on social media using the term "toxic work environment" within the district. This seems credible as the district has lost 45 teachers this year alone for various reasons. I ask the school administration, including the board, could you work in the environment you oversee?

A very brief review of payments made and documented in the budget statements on the district's website identi-

fied what I feel are questionable expenditures:

- \$10,000 in November 2021 and \$5,000 each month in December 2021, March 2022 and April 2022 for public relation services.

- \$31,500 for a motivational/inspirational speaker in May 2022. Who was the speaker?

- Monthly payments to a company (Renhill) to provide substitute teaching services. Is this something that the district can do at a lower cost and more efficiently?

What could be found if one looks deeper into the budget statements? Has the central administration been given raises regularly? Are salaries in the central office commensurate with experience for the jobs of those filling them? What sacrifices can the administration make similar to those being asked of the teachers?

I would also like to ask how the district will address being ranked 598th out of 607 districts in the state? As we fall closer to the bottom, how will you fix this? In my opinion it starts with a fair working contract for our teachers. Give them an environment to help our students reach their potential that includes a safe learning environment.

Consolo recommended that council members "take an informational stance" in letting residents know that the levies are renewals and that if passed again in November will continue to raise just over \$500,000 apiece annually for each department over the course of the next five years.

Legislation passed

All of the legislation on last week's agenda passed, including a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a contract with TC Construction Co., Inc. for the 2022 Concrete Roadway Repair Program in the city, at a cost of \$103,680. The Cuyahoga County Department of Development will reimburse the city for up to \$101,000 in material costs expended on county routes included under a road repair program in the city, according to the legislation.

Hren stated in correspondence to council that the earliest start date given by TC Construction was Monday, Nov. 7, with the time of completion for the project indicated to be 25 days. Concrete pavement repairs will be made on Lee Rd. between Broadway and I-480, Hren said.

He also noted that the county has recently awarded the city up to \$250,000 under their 50-50 program which will pay for 50% of the construction costs to resurface Lee Rd. from Broadway to Libby. This work is expected to be performed in 2024, Hren said, adding that he was "actively seeking additional funds from other sources to further offset the city's share of the proposed project."

Also passed was a resolution authorizing a contract with Specialized Construction, Inc. for the Hansen-Watson-Raymond Road Resurfacing Project, to also include Prayner and Clampher, at a cost of \$822,902.50. The city has been awarded various funds over the past several years towards storm and sanitary sewer work in the project area, including from the Ohio Public Works Commission, the

Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District and the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works.

"The work is being performed now that all of the sewer repairs on these streets that require excavation have been completed," Hren said. The work is expected to start in October, and will be completed in Spring/Summer 2023.

Council passed a resolution adopting the Cuyahoga County 2022-2027 All Hazards Mitigation Plan mandated by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, requiring state and local governments to develop and submit for approval to the president a mitigation plan that outlines processes for identifying their respective natural hazards, risks and vulnerabilities.

And also passed was a resolution accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the county Budget Commission, and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the county fiscal officer. Council had previously adopted a tax budget for the fiscal year beginning Jan. 1, 2023, according to the legislation.

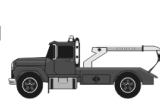
