Garfield Heights Council approves sewer rate increase to start next year

At its regular Monday night meeting, Garfield Heights Council passed on emergency ordinance to increase the sanitary sewer rate in the city from \$2.20 to \$2.70 per lineal front foot, to take effect Jan. 1, 2024.

Jeff Jerome, chief of staff for Mayor Matt Burke, said the 50-cent increase was necessary to pay for preventive maintenance of the sanitary sewer system to prevent more costly repairs later.

Also approved at Monday night's council meeting were the following:

- Entering into an agreement with the Hunger Network of Greater Cleveland to allow the Garfield Heights Senior Center to receive and distribute pantry foods as part of the food bank.

- Directing the mayor to enter into an agreement with OHM Advisors to provide illicit discharge investigation services to the city in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District conducted an illicit discharge, detection and elimination investigation of a culverted stream located south of Bangor Ave. and north of Wolf Ave., Garfield Heights. Based on its investigation, NEORSRD recommends the city dye test homes on Havana Rd., Littleton Rd., Oakview Blvd. and Fairlawn Blvd., to determine which homes may be improperly connected to the storm sewer. Other area investigations may be warranted within the city, the legislation states. OHM Advisors will perform dye testing to determine which homes within the identified area are improperly connected to the storm sewer.

- Authorizing the purchase of 15 Motorola portable radios from Motorola Solutions for the Garfield Heights Police Department, in an amount not to exceed \$76,000.

- Participating in the NEORSRD program(s) for the South Parkway Drive Reconstruction Project, including all applications, agreements and/or contracts that may be required by the NEORSRD in order to secure the grant funds requested.

- Authorizing preliminary legislation between the city and the Ohio Department of Transportation for the repair and resurfacing of Antenucci Blvd. from Transportation Blvd. to Turney Rd., in Garfield Heights, and includes pedestrian safety improvements at Carol Jean Blvd., Andover Blvd., and the corner of Transportation Blvd.

- Authorizing the sale and disposal of municipally-owned property which is no longer needed by the city.

Remains of woman found at Valley View landfill in debris collected on W. 25th

Cleveland police officers were called to Boyas Excavating in Valley View on Monday afternoon, March 27, when a body was discovered in debris the excavating company had transported from 1545 W. 25 St., in Cleveland.

On arrival officers conferred with members of the excavating crew who had made several dump trips to the Boyas landfill in Valley View from the W. 25 St. site. Preliminary information indicates that the building on W. 25 St., was demolished sometime last week and the excavating company was collecting debris. When the crew arrived at the dump, a human arm was seen in the debris.

The victim's remains, which were reported to be those of a female, were transported by the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office for further investigation and identification. This matter remains under investigation.

Three injured in Maple Hts. police-involved accident

Three people were taken to area hospitals with minor injuries last Thursday after a Maple Heights police-involved accident at the Rally's on Lee Rd., in Cleveland.

During the early morning hours of Thursday, March 23, Maple Heights police were pursuing a gray Jeep Cherokee that had been driving recklessly, had no visible registration and with other violations. The pursuit started near the intersection of Broadway Ave. and Libby Rd., in Maple Hts., and continued on Libby to Lee Rd., then left Maple Heights into Cleveland. The pursuit was terminated in the area of Harvard Ave. and Lee Rd.

As the pursuit neared Judson Dr. on Lee Rd., the Jeep and a MHPD cruiser went around an uninvolved vehicle traveling north on Lee Rd., which was waiting to turn into the Rally's restaurant there. After they passed around the motorist, a second MHPD cruiser, slightly further behind in the pursuit, approached the same area with its lights and siren activated. The motorist turned to enter Rally's

in front of the second cruiser. The officer attempted to swerve around the motorist but struck the front end of the vehicle.

The cruiser veered into the Rally's lot and struck the front end of another vehicle in the lot before continuing toward the tree lawn of the property where it rolled onto its side. The drivers of the three vehicles involved in the crash were all taken to area hospitals for minor injuries.

The MHPD is looking for information on the driver of the gray Jeep Cherokee with heavy tint and a loud exhaust. It is believed this vehicle had been involved in other illegal activity in Garfield Heights and Cleveland prior to this pursuit.

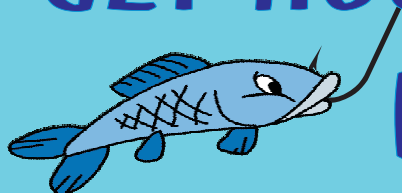

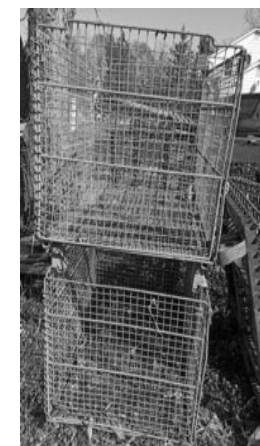

Attempted Burglary
