Maple Heights police pursuit into Garfield Hts. leaves fleeing driver dead

A police pursuit turned deadly early last Friday morning as Maple Heights police were initially searching for the source of multiple gun shots they had heard in the area of Hollywood and Mapleboro aves., in their city.

Shortly after 3 a.m. on Friday, March 31, Maple Heights police on patrol in the area of Hollywood and Mapleboro aves., heard several gun shots, and as they further checked the area for the source of the shooting, they came upon a silver sedan occupied by multiple people. When an officer attempted to perform a traffic stop, two unidentified males ran from the car as it slowed down. The vehicle then ignored the signal to stop and fled the area.

Officers pursued the silver sedan through a few side streets until it got onto Libby Rd. heading westbound. The pursuit continued across the Libby Road bridge onto Granger Rd., in Garfield Heights. The driver of the silver sedan lost control of the vehicle around Milo Ave., according to a press release from MHPD. The sedan left the roadway, hit a tree, took out a handicap ramp attached to one home and stopped in the front yard of another home. The driver of the sedan was ejected during the crash and did not survive. His identification is being held pending notification of next of kin.

The Garfield Heights Police Department is handling the accident report with the help of the Southeast Area Law Enforcement Accident Investigation Unit. Maple Heights police are assisting as well.

Garfield Boulevard Trail Project receives \$500,000

State Rep. Darnell T. Brewer (D-Cleveland) released the following statement last week on the city of Garfield Heights, Garfield Boulevard Trail receiving \$500,000 from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources:

"We thank The Ohio Department of Natural Resources for its announcement of Clean Ohio Trail Fund grant recipients. The money for the city of Garfield Heights, Garfield Boulevard Trail will help to protect and improve an important habitat and provide a corridor for people and wildlife," said Rep. Brewer. "We know communities with trails that provide enjoyable and safe options help improve our air and water quality."

The trail will create a critical connection between the Towpath Trail and Metroparks' Garfield Park Reservation.

CPD investigating several robberies/impersonation of peace officer incidents, latest in Slavic Village

The Cleveland Division of Police is investigating multiple aggravated robbery/impersonation of peace officer incidents, the latest of which occurred on Sunday, April 2, at approximately 6:20 p.m., in the area of Broadway and Blanche aves., in Slavic Village.

Yesterday at about 9:20 a.m., police investigators saw a Dodge Durango fitting the description of a vehicle possibly related to the police impersonator incidents and followed it in an unmarked car to an address in the 6900 block of Worley Ave. The driver saw marked backup police vehicles and ran inside the residence, but was taken into custody by members of the USMS Task Force.

He was arrested initially for an outstanding felony drug warrant and tampering with evidence. Other charges are still being investigated.

In the incident on April 2, a male victim reported that while he was driving he was being followed by a vehicle which utilized police-type lights to attempt to pull him over. The victim further stated that the suspect brandished a firearm and was wearing a ballistic vest. The victim called 9-1-1 and remained on the line with dispatch as he drove to the Third District police station. While driving to the station, the suspect vehicle went another direction. Besides the Durango, a black Jeep Cherokee appeared to also be involved.

Police are advising members of the public to call 9-1-1 and confer with dispatchers if they are being pulled over by an unmarked vehicle and they are concerned as to whether or not they are truly being stopped by the police.

This matter remains under investigation. Anyone with information regarding any of these incidents is asked to call 9-1-1. Anonymous information can be provided by calling Crimestoppers at 216-25-CRIME.

Replacement garbage bins available in CLE

Cleveland Ward 12 Councilwoman Rebecca Maurer wants her constituents to know that the city of Cleveland is about to receive thousands of new garbage bins. It will make its way through the backlog of requests to replace broken cans in the next two months, Maurer reports.

She said there are currently 334 backlogged requests for replacement garbage bins in Ward 12. If you want to verify that you are on the replacement list, please call 311 between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., and ask to make sure that there is an open "cart concern" request at your address. Ask for your 6-digit reference number so you can follow up.

Or, you can simply email Maurer's office at rmaurer@clevelandcitycouncil.org with your address and her office will cross-check it against the replacement list.

Please remember, these new bins are to replace broken and unusable cans, not new ones for everybody, Maurer said.

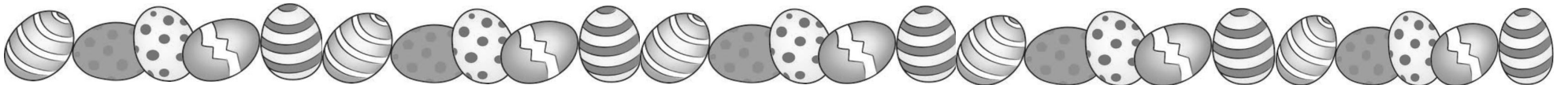

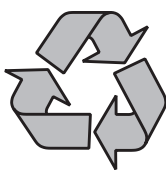

CLE Council passes bill to sponsor basketball program for kids across city

Cleveland City Council held its regular Monday night meeting and passed legislation to provide casino revenue funds for Impact Youth Incorporated to establish a City Youth Basketball Program across Cleveland.

Impact Youth will organize basketball activities, as well as include social-interactional development skills for Cleveland youth. Councilman Brian Kazy sponsored Impact Youth, a community-based mentoring organization, for a similar program last summer in Ward 16 at Jefferson Park. The cost is not to exceed \$40,000.

Also passed

Intelligent Traffic Signals: Council approved the city's SMART - Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation - grant proposal, in partnership with the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority and Cleveland State University, to hire consultants and other professional services to design, establish a prototype and then evaluate intelligent, cloud-based adaptive traffic signals.

These signals provide transit and emergency vehicle

priority at traffic signals. It could also incorporate optical sensor-based bicycle and pedestrian detection, eliminating the need to push a walk button. It may also be used for officials to identify near-crash occurrences and establish programs to eliminate this threat. The funding is through a \$1,820,500 SMART grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation. No local match is required.

Planning and Career Exploration (PACE): Council approved using \$2.1 million from the American Rescue Plan Act funding to expand PACE, a program embedded in the curriculum for 6th – 12th graders that provides them with knowledge, skills, experiences and confidence to uncover the occupations or careers they want to pursue.

The funding covers a three-year period and the students will receive a variety of quality in-school and out-of-school lessons and experiences to enable students to explore different opportunities. The aim is to have all Cleveland students graduating with a career pathway plan, whether it's something that requires a four-year college degree, a two-year associate's degree, a certification program, or apprenticeships in trades.

Two New Mini-pitch Soccer Fields: Council approved a donation from the U.S. Soccer Foundation for two mini-

pitch soccer fields with sponsor logos that will include lighting, fencing, goals, benches, ADA-compliant access and lockable storage at each location. Sponsors for the soccer fields include the U.S. Soccer Foundation, Black Players for Change, the Black Women's Player Collective, Mosco Lighting and Adidas.

The mini-pitch soccer fields will be installed at the Lonnie Burten Park in Ward 5, represented by Councilman Richard Starr, and at the Halloran Park in Ward 11, represented by Councilman Danny Kelly.

New Connection to Lakefront Bikeway: Council approved a real estate gift from The NRP Group LLC for property that will be used for planning, designing and constructing a trail to connect the Cleveland Lakefront Bikeway to Herman Park in Ward 15, represented by Councilmember Jenny Spencer. The county appraised value of the donation at \$21,300. Herman Park is on Herman Ave. between W. 65 St. and W. 58 St.

U.S. Bike Route: Council approved the Ohio Department of Transportation installation of signage on the United States Bike Route System. The Cleveland portion of the U.S. Bike Route is approximately 15 miles and follows a path along Lake Erie between W. 117 St. and Neff Rd./Lakeshore Blvd. Over 18,000 miles are currently established as U.S. Bike Routes in 34 states and Washington, DC. ODOT will supply and install the signage and the city will own and maintain it after installation.

Hydrant flushing in Garfield

On Tuesday, April 11, the Garfield Heights Fire Department will begin the annual flushing and inspection of the 1,300 fire hydrants in the city. The work will be performed Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., depending on the weather. It should take about eight weeks to complete.

The work will begin in Ward 1 and end in Ward 7. Should you have any questions, please call Sandy at the GHFD, 216-475-4053.

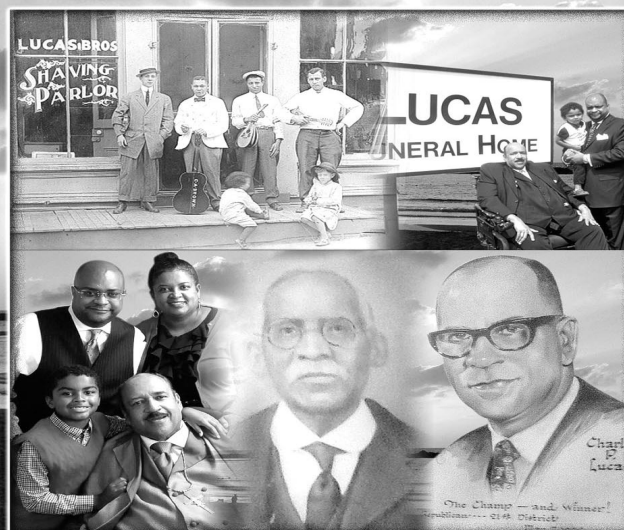

Infrastructure improvements continuing in Bedford

"We're going to have a lot of infrastructure work here in the next couple of years, which is a good thing," Councilman Donald Saunders said at the Bedford Council meeting Monday night, as he and City Manager Mike Mallis discussed upcoming road and bridge improvements scheduled to take place in the city.

Mallis said the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) work is expected to begin on the Northfield Road bridge this year in July with a completion date of November 2024.

Saunders added that travel in the city in the coming months was going to be "a headache," especially considering ODOT is also going to be undertaking the resurfacing of Broadway Avenue throughout Bedford at approximately the same time this year.

He said that the Northfield Bridge Project could possibly run into the planned Union Street Viaduct construction, "depending on what they decide to do - that one's up in the air."

Departments receive grants

In his report to council, Mallis stated that the Bedford Fire Department recently received a \$5,000 grant that will cover expenses towards the new turnout gear.

He said that the Parks and Recreation Department had also recently received a \$15,000 grant through the Cuyahoga County Department of Developmental Disabilities, which was used to create a special event at Ellenwood Recreation Center featuring movies, dances and arts and crafts for disabled residents.

Mallis also mentioned that the Civil Service Commission met recently and certified a lateral transfer list for the police department. "So we are going to be working towards

filling the current vacancy that we have. We hope to have that done as quickly as possible and bring us back to being fully staffed," he said.

NOPEC news going out

Mallis said that letters will be going out to all residents on informational meetings that will be hosted by the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council (NOPEC) regarding possible upcoming changes to electric utility rates.

"NOPEC sent out information last year that they would be turning accounts back over to First Energy for the benefit of the consumer," Mallis said. "They're actually looking into some lower rates again."

Mayor Stan Koci said Bedford's electricity customers were in the NOPEC plan unless they wanted to opt out. More information will be provided on the city's social media sites as it becomes available, Mallis said.

Legislation

Council passed an ordinance authorizing a contract with Simplex-IT for replacement of the existing Sophos Firewall at City Hall in order to increase cyber security, at a cost of \$14,424.60.

"The existing firewall is nearing the end of its life," Mallis said, "and that does cover all of the City Hall operations as well as the fire department."

Also passed was an ordinance providing for the adoption of updates in the city's codified ordinances and to repeal ordinances in conflict with existing legislation, or otherwise deemed obsolete.

Two pieces of legislation on Monday night's agenda that were tabled are intended to create two Community Reinvestment Areas (CRAs) for Cleveland Tank and Supply of Cleveland, and for Lake Shore Electric Corporation of

Willis St. in Bedford, as both businesses are seeking to relocate to the Tinkers Creek Commerce Park in the Egbert Road area of the city.

If the CRAs are approved, Cleveland Tank and Supply and Lake Shore Electric will build new facilities and expand their workforces, while receiving 70% property tax exemptions for the next 10 years.

Both ordinances will be discussed by council before possible passage at a future meeting.

Announcements

Fallen trees and broken limbs from the recent severe storms continue to be handled by the city's chipper service, which is scheduled through this first week of April and every first week of the month through October, Mallis said. He asked that residents call the city to schedule the service before placing storm debris on their tree lawns.

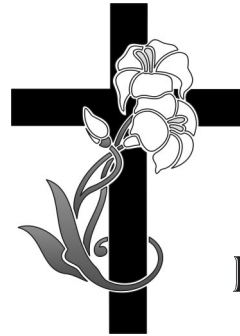

Dear Editor:

As the Safety Director for the city of Maple Heights, I have recently been engaged in a review of our pursuit policy with the police department. The recent unfortunate pursuit and crash only highlighted the need for the review we had been conducting. Pursuant to our review, we are revising the police pursuit policy. Effective immediately, the city of Maple Heights will not pursue any fleeing vehicle beyond its city borders, absent extreme circumstances involving felony crimes of violence.

We respect the value of human life and recognize that pursuits are inherently dangerous. Offenders who initiate the pursuits and officers who pledge to detain offenders agree to the heightened danger level, but there are many others that often become involved without agreeing.

While it is the goal of our officers to apprehend all offenders and stop crime, we must weigh those efforts against the safety of all persons and vehicles on the roadways, respecting personal and public property.
