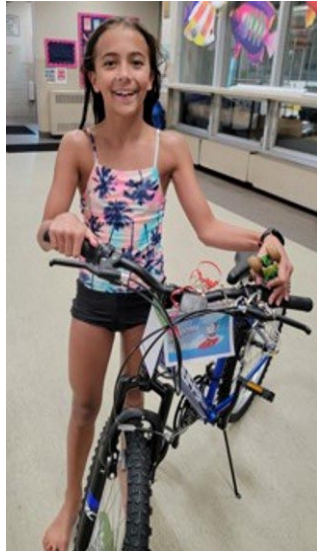

There will also be a Community Engagement meeting from 10 a.m. to noon, on Saturday, Aug. 19, at the Garfield Heights Civic Center, 5407 Turney Rd., at which residents will be provided information on the proposal and be given a chance to state their views.

• I-77 south to I-480 east will be closed on Wednesday, Aug. 2, at 9 p.m., through Thursday, August 3, at 5 a.m. for resurfacing. Detour will be I-480 west to Granger Rd. to I-480 east.

• I-77 north to I-480 east will be closed on Thursday, Aug. 3, at 9 p.m., through Friday, Aug. 4, at 5 a.m. for resurfacing. Detour will be I-480 west to Granger Rd. to I-480 east.

• I-480 east to I-77 north will be closed on Friday, August 4, at 9 p.m., through Saturday, August 5, at 5 a.m. for resurfacing. Detour will be I-480 eastbound to Transportation Blvd. to I-480 westbound.

• Rockside Rd. east entrance ramp to I-77 north in Independence will be closed nightly between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m., beginning Wednesday, Aug. 2, through Friday, Aug. 11, for bridge painting. Detour will be SR 21 to Pleasant Valley Rd. to I-77.

• SR 14 (Broadway Ave.) between Forbes Rd. and Rockside Rd. in Bedford will be reduced to southbound traffic only through mid-August for resurfacing. Northbound detour will be Forbes Rd. to SR 8 (Northfield Rd.) to Rockside Rd.

# Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Dept. to partner with Cleveland Police to enhance downtown safety efforts

Cuyahoga County Sheriff Harold Pretel and Cleveland Police Chief Wayne Drummond announced Monday that the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office and Cleveland Division of Police are collaborating on plans to enhance safety in the downtown neighborhood and entertainment districts.

The downtown area has seen an increase in violent crime and overall criminal activity in recent weeks, and safety forces said this partnership is a crucial component for crime deterrence.

"We are committed to making sure our residents feel safe in Cuyahoga County," said County Executive Chris Ronayne. "We value our partnership with the city of Cleveland, and our sheriff's deputies are ready to support the Cleveland Division of Police. There is an increased need for patrols and visibility to deter crime and make the downtown environment safer for residents, workers and visitors."

"I am extremely grateful for Sheriff Pretel and his entire department for their assistance as we collectively work to combat the heightened levels of violence in our city," Mayor Justin Bibb commented. "We are committed to using every tool available and will continue to leverage other regional partnerships to ensure that we are stopping at nothing to keep our community safe."

The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office will dedicate staff to assist the Cleveland Division of Police with patrol and traffic enforcement throughout the downtown area. Law enforcement officers will be strategically deployed to maximize resources and provide increased visibility – with the goal of deterring criminal behavior and improving security.

"I am assigning a team of eight deputies, one sergeant and additional resources to assist the Cleveland police patrolling the downtown core," said Sheriff Pretel. "This collaboration will put a much-needed focus on deterring crime and building trust."

"Safety is the number one priority of the Cleveland Division of Police," said Chief Drummond. "Adding sheriff's deputies to the patrol section will greatly amplify our ability to secure the downtown and entertainment districts. I am confident that this partnership with the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office will be a lasting and effective collaboration."

Residents are encouraged to report suspicious and illegal activity. Call 9-1-1 for emergencies; call 216-621-1234 for non-emergencies.

Anonymous information can be provided by calling CrimeStoppers of Cuyahoga County at 216-25-CRIME or by submitting a tip online.

Residents and businesses who own cameras can also help by registering or integrating them with SAFE SMART CLE – the city's camera sharing access program. Registration is free, takes less than 60 seconds, and is done through a secure online portal. By signing up, residents and businesses directly contribute to increasing safety in their neighborhoods.

# Community police reports

## Garfield Heights

### Assist Other Departments

On July 24, at about 12:30 a.m., police were dispatched to the area of Edgepark Dr. and E. 109 St. for multiple reports of shots fired. When they arrived on scene officers saw the headlights of several vehicles in the Metroparks near the Ohio Birch Picnic Area. They were all leaving the park as police drove over to this area. None of the parties appeared to be in any kind of distress and denied hearing any shots fired. After the area cleared police canvassed the area and found several pistol and rifle shell casings near the restroom of the park area. They did not locate any property damage or victims. Dispatch advised that someone had suffered a gunshot wound in the Metroparks and had been dropped off at Marymount Hospital. Several Metroparks PD units arrived on scene and took control of the area.

### Felonious Assault

On July 24, at about 6 a.m., police were dispatched to a home in the 4600 block of Burleigh Rd., for a report of a female who had been shot. While en route dispatch advised that another person was driving the victim to the hospital. As police were on Garfield Blvd. at Burleigh Rd., a vehicle with the victim inside pulled up to the cruiser. Officers called the rescue squad to that location. A woman in the front passenger seat was bleeding heavily from a cut on the right side of her neck. The others in the vehicle told police the woman had been stabbed in the neck with scissors by a male. An officer applied first aid to the victim, who said she did not know the man who had stabbed her and that she had not been harmed anywhere else

but her neck. At this time GHFD squad arrived and took her to MetroHealth Medical Center for treatment. The victim's daughter told police she had been at the Burleigh Rd. address with her mother earlier when a black male in a black coat and pants approached her on the back porch of their residence. He was angry, said the victim's daughter, and took out a pair of scissors that he had concealed on his person and stabbed her mother in the neck, then fled the scene. Police began an area canvass on Burleigh for surveillance footage that may have captured the incident.

### Shots Fired

•On July 24, at 7:42 p.m., an officer arrived at the police station lobby to confer with a witness to a shots fired incident at the Marathon station at 5571 Turney Rd. It was reported that a group of two black males and four black females were on the northeast corner of the interesection of Oakpark and Turney when they began to argue. Three of the females left the area. The males headed to the Marathon station near the fuel pumps and a witness saw one of the males turn and fire several shots. Then a gray vehicle sped away northbound on Turney. The witness could provide no description of any of the involved parties other than that the shooter was wearing a black ski mask.

•On July 30, at 2:42 a.m., police were dispatched to Bonkers, 5147 Turney Rd., for several gunshots heard in the area. They found 17 9mm shell casings in the rear parking lot for Bonkers and Del's Wings N Things. No structures were found damaged by the bullets and no gunshot victims had visited Marymount Hospital or MetroHealth Medical Center. At the time of the report no victims or witnesses could be located.

### Fires Other

On July 27, at about 6 a.m., an officer discovered a city vehicle fully engulfed in flames, a Ford Crown Victoria, parked in the northwest corner of the Garfield Heights Civic Center parking lot. GHFD responded and advised after investigating that it was not arson related. Dispatch advised after reviewing surveillance footage that at 5:12 a.m., the car's

headlights turned on but no one could be seen walking towards or away from the vehicle. Another city-owned Crown Victoria was also damaged due to the fire.

### Traffic Offense-Fleeing

On July 27, at about 8:39 p.m., an officer was on patrol in the area of Turney Rd. and Russell Ave., when a white male on a blue and white dirt bike was observed going east on Russell at a high rate of speed and driving recklessly on a residential street. The vehicle took off when the officer attempted to initiate a traffic stop, fleeing on several city streets and at one point driving on the wrong side of the road into oncoming traffic on Turney and almost was struck by a vehicle head on. The dirt bike eventually pulled into a parking lot on Richland Ave., and the driver got off the dirt bike and began walking toward his house. The officer drew out a Taser and ordered the suspect to the ground several times but he did not comply. The officer took him to the ground and placed him in handcuffs without further incident. The suspect was placed under arrest for fleeing and eluding and taken to city jail. He was also issued a traffic citation for reckless operation and operating a dirt bike on city streets.

### Resisting Arrest

On July 27, at about 11:22 p.m., police were dispatched to a home in the 12500 block of Maplerow Ave., for a report of a male jumping up and down on the porch, playing music and causing a disturbance. Dispatch advised that the male had several active warrants including a felony warrant out of Cuyahoga County. The suspect fled on foot from police and during the pursuit, officers tripped and fell from some rocks but they continued to track the suspect down. Through woods, mud and a small ravine, the suspect was eventually captured in a swampy area between Service Ct. and S. Parkway. He was taken to city jail and placed on holder for his warrant with the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office. He was also charged with resisting arrest and obstructing official business.
