# Boddie Recording Co. on Union Ave. designated as Cleveland landmark

Cleveland City Council held its monthly summer meeting on August 16, and returns to its regular schedule starting with the next meeting on Monday, Sept. 18. Highlights from last week's meeting include passage of the following legislation.

**A New Cleveland Landmark:** The Boddie Recording Company on Union Ave. was designated as a Cleveland Landmark. Run by Thomas and Louise Boddie, it was Cleveland's first African-American owned and operated recording studio, serving a clientele ranging from gospel, soul and rhythm & blues groups, to rock, bluegrass and country musicians from as far away as Detroit and West Virginia.

**Home Repairs Revolving Loans and Small and Minority Business Revolving Loans:** Council approved the city entering into agreements with various private nonprofit organizations to address vacant or abandoned properties and to provide financing for home repairs and to small businesses economically impacted by COVID-19. The organizations are: CHN Housing Partners-\$4 million, Cleveland Restoration Society-\$3 million, Greater Cleveland Habitat for Humanity-\$1.5 million, LISC Cleveland/Local Initiatives Support Corporation-\$1.5 million, Cleveland Development Advisory Community Reinvestment Fund, Inc.-\$2.5 million and Village Capital Corp.-\$2.5 million.

**Electric Vehicle Charging Stations:** Council approved entering into contract(s) with Volta Charging, LLC for a publicly accessible electric charging station network in the public right-of-way and on city-owned property.

**Fair Wage Increasing:** Council amended and increased the minimum wage in its Fair Employment Wage ordinance established in 1976 and last amended in 2006. While the city of Cleveland pays its employees over \$15 per hour, the Fair Employment Wage rate, that also applies to employees of covered employers contracting with or receiving financial assistance from the city, remains at \$10 by codified ordinance and is now below Ohio's \$10.10 per hour minimum wage. Council approved increasing the minimum wage to \$15.33. The legislation also ties it to annual inflation with adjustments every October according to the Consumer Price Index for Northeast Ohio.

**Revitalizing Cleveland's Commercial Corridors and Middle Neighborhoods:** Council approved legislation for the city to enter into a grant agreement with Cleveland Neighborhood Progress to partially finance costs to acquire, hold, implement and manage renovation of housing in city neighborhoods. Also included is a grant agreement with Cleveland Neighborhood Progress to provide economic development assistance to partially finance costs associated with acquisition, stabilization and holding commercial properties, and to provide economic development assistance for associated projects that will revitalize commercial corridors in the city and create jobs.

The grant is estimated at \$7.3 million and comes from the revenue recovery funds the city received. The funding is divided into \$3.3 million for the commercial corridors and \$4 for housing projects.

**Longtime Council Researcher Honored:** Council passed a resolution recognizing John James' more than 30 years of service to Cleveland City Council and naming the small conference room in City Council offices as the John James Conference Room.

## Legislation introduced

**Parental Responsibility and Curfew Laws:** Councilman Mike Polensek is sponsoring legislation to amend a codified ordinance relating to parental responsibility ensuring their minor children's curfew. Under Section 605.14, a parent/legal guardian of a minor has a duty to supervise the minor so that the minor does not violate curfew laws.

The ordinance introduced amends the penalty for failure of a parent or legal guardian to fulfill that duty by:

- taking it from a minor misdemeanor for the first offense to a 4th degree misdemeanor (up to \$250 fine; up to 30 days in jail);
- taking it from a 4th degree misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense to a 3rd degree misdemeanor (up to \$500 fine; up to 60 days in jail).

The parent/guardian may also be required to perform community service. The value of such service is increased from not to exceed \$100 to not to exceed \$250.

This legislation goes to the Directors of Public Safety, Finance and Law before it comes back to Council Committees Safety and Finance Diversity Equity and Inclusion before it goes to the full council.

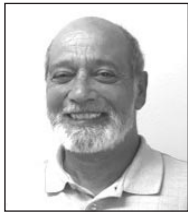

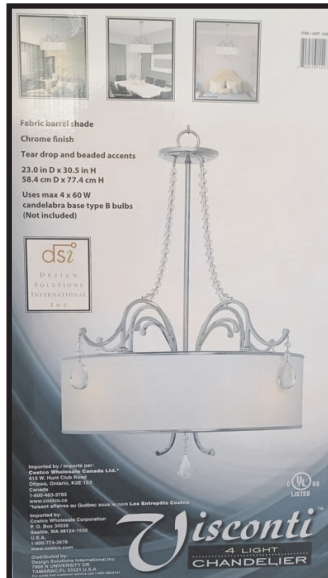

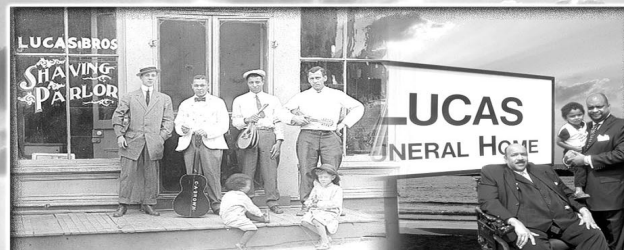

# Community police reports

## Garfield Heights

### Assault

## Ronayne, Burke address concerns of Garfield Hts. residents at Civic Center meeting on jail site proposal

Concerned residents packed the dining room at the Garfield Heights Civic Center Saturday morning to hear Cuyahoga County Executive Chris Ronayne and staff, along with Garfield Heights Mayor Matt Burke, discuss plans for what is being called the proposed Cuyahoga County Central Services Campus which would include a new county jail.

Also on hand was County Council President Pernel Jones, several members of county council, State Representative Darnell Brewer, members of the county Sheriff's Department, all of Garfield Heights Council, Law Director Tim Riley, Chief of Staff Jeff Jerome, the city's police and fire chiefs, and former mayors Vic Collova and Tom Longo.

The general consensus among the Garfield Heights officials there and Ronayne and his staff was that 72 acres of the former Bridgeview site on Transportation Blvd., in Garfield Heights, was a perfect place to build a campus to house a new jail, Sheriff's Department and still have room to offer social services and the potential to share an opportunity with the city of Garfield Heights. Mayor Burke has long advocated for locating the Garfield Heights Police Department on site as part of the proposal.

Ronayne stressed they want to build a new jail facility that is "healthy and humane" and delivers a better system of justice to county inmates. It would be a 1904-bed facility, he said, with the focus on funding next year, with the facility likely not being opened until 2027-28.

Nicole English of the county's Public Works Department offered a slide presentation on what the proposal would entail and why officials want to build it at the Garfield Heights site.

She pointed out that the property is centrally located right off the highway on Transportation Blvd., which has already been improved

in anticipation of some sort of development there. Other pros include the fact that Craig Realty Group, which owns the land, is a willing seller, the land has been environmentally prepped and is ready for construction, and there is enough land to build a low level structure and get away from needing to take an elevator everywhere the inmates and those who work there have to go within the building, which is the case for the existing jail.

Ronayne said the proposed building would look nothing like a jail - no barbed wire - more like a modern medical building or office complex. He said residents would get a chance to tell officials what the building should look like before plans are finalized. And the traffic impact should be minimal, he said, and also noted that the average stay for inmates of the jail is only 30 days.

Ronayne said that another plus for the city would be that between the Sheriff's Department workers and those at the jail, the tax base of Garfield Heights would be gaining about 850 workers with good paying jobs, plus an opportunity for county employees to bring new housing to the city by those wanting to live close to where they work. He said the tax advantage to Garfield Heights would be about \$1.5 million annually.

Then it was time for those in the audience to have their say. One resident said she thought the jail site should go to a vote of the people, but Law Director Riley explained to her why that couldn't happen.

"There's nothing to put on the ballot," he said. "Because we don't own the property." And Ronayne pointed out that county zoning rules would supercede those of Garfield Heights, so that wouldn't go to the ballot either.

In support of the jail, Ward 3 Councilman Jason Seither said it would mean continued growth for the city, and former Councilman Mike Nenadovich said the jail would bring in added tax revenue.

"The kids are running through Garfield Heights like it's the Wild West. Maybe a jail here would be a deterrent," one resident stated.

Another said a jail with all those employees would make the city congested. Ronayne assured him it would not be the case as there are three shifts of workers each day, so employees would not be coming in all at the same time.

Others were worried their property values would go down.

Mayor Burke said he had done some research and found that property values near new county jails built in Ravenna, Akron, Chardon, Medina and Elyria all had increased in every single community.

The fear that a new jail in Garfield Heights would bring added crime to an already beleaguered community was on a lot of people's minds at the meeting. One worried that it was too close to schools, another the impact on the community of an inmate escaping, and what of those with mental health issues.

In answer to those concerns, one resident commented, "I think it's a great idea. No one commits crimes around a jail."

Another noted dryly, "I guarantee you that jail will be safer than some of those bars on Turney Rd."

Ronayne said the jail site issue will be addressed again at the next meeting of County Council on Tuesday, Sept. 12.
