Proposed income tax increase could be on March ballot in Maple Heights

Maple Heights Council placed a resolution on first reading at its meeting last week proposing a ballot issue for an increase in the municipal income tax rate from 2.5% to 3% for a 10-year period. The added revenue would go to increase salaries and wages for the city's police officers, firefighters and service department employees.

Council will hold a special meeting at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 19, at Maple Heights City Hall, 5353 Lee Rd., to vote again on the legislation and decide whether the issue will appear on the ballot for the Tuesday, March 19th election, which is also the Presidential Primary election in Ohio.

The resolution reads in part, "Despite 2021-2023 increases in the salaries and wages of full time employees of the department of service, and full time employees of the divisions of police and fire within the department of safety, which increases were the first pay increases in nearly 10 years, these full time employees remain significantly underpaid in relation to full time employees in surrounding Cuyahoga County municipalities, resulting in the city having difficulty retaining these employees and attracting new employees, thereby jeopardizing the health, welfare and safety of the residents of the city."

"In order to retain and attract employees in these departments, it is necessary to significantly increase their current salaries and wages, which the city cannot currently do without an increase in revenues," the resolution further states.



Theft

Criminal Damage-Residence

Proposed income tax increase could be on March ballot in Maple Heights

If council approves a separate ordinance that will actually put the issue on the ballot, and if residents subsequently vote for it, the income tax increase will begin on July 1, 2024, and end June 30, 2034, according to the legislation.

Mayor Annette Blackwell stated that the issue was brought to her attention by Finance Director Tinita Tillman and Law Director Frank Consolo, after negotiations among the city's various unions.

"I'm sure you've heard the challenges that we've had in recruiting safety officers," Blackwell said, adding that she was "pleased and proud" to be able to swear in two new police officers to the Maple Heights police department recently. She said that the two new hires brought the department's numbers to 30, when the size of the force should be 41 officers.

She added that the voters of Maple Heights would ultimately be the ones making the decision on the income tax increase.

"As we review all the needs of the city, I am doing my very, very best. But this is a hard decision to put this before the people," Blackwell said.

City positions also on Dec. 19th agenda

Also on the agenda for the Dec. 19th meeting is an ordinance amending previous salary legislation to add and delete certain job positions in the Finance and Human Services departments, and fixing the salary for these positions.

According to the legislation, which was placed on first reading, Tillman advised council's Finance Committee and the Committee of the Whole that she wants to eliminate the positions of Payroll Coordinator and Purchasing Agent from the salary ordinance, and add the position of Finance Specialist with a salary range of \$40,000 to \$65,873.60.

Also, Blackwell and the city's Human Resources Department "desire to eliminate the job position of Recreation Programs Coordinator, Human Services Coordinator, and Food Service Aide from the salary ordinance, and to add the position of Human Services Program Manager with a salary range of \$30,000 to \$65,873.60."


DONALD SUCKOW

G.H. Council passes 15 items at final meeting of 2023

The last Garfield Heights Council meeting of the year, barring a special meeting which could be called, was held Monday night and saw members passing a total of 15 ordinances and resolutions on its voluminous agenda.

The final meeting of the year was originally scheduled for Monday, Dec. 25, but was cancelled as city offices are closed for the Christmas holiday.

The following emergency ordinances and resolutions were passed at Monday's meeting:

- Making final appropriations for expenditures during the fiscal year ending Dec. 31, 2023.

- Making appropriations for current expenditures for the fiscal year ending Dec. 31, 2024.

- Authorizing the sale and disposal of various snow plow equipment no longer needed by the city.

- Amending and supplementing the city's plan of classification and compensation of nonunion pay positions, and providing a raise of 2.25% for all full-time and part-time non-union employees (excluding seasonal), to be effective the first pay period of the fiscal year 2024.

- Directing the mayor to execute Memorandums of Understanding between the city and the Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge 67, sergeants and above, regarding vacation days, sick days and longevity increases.

- Directing the mayor to execute Memorandums of Understanding between the city and the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (patrolmen), regarding vacation days, sick leave and longevity increases.

- Directing the mayor to execute Memorandums of Understanding between the city and Garfield Heights Firefighters, Local 340, International Association of Firefighters, regarding longevity increases and vacation time.

- Directing the mayor to execute Memorandums of Understanding between the city and AFSCME Local 729 and Ohio Council 8, AFL-CIO, regarding longevity increases, sick leave and vacation time.

- Directing the mayor to execute Memorandums of Understanding between the city and Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc. (safety dispatchers), regarding longevity increases, sick leave and vacation time.

- Directing the mayor to execute Memorandums of Understanding between the city and Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc. (jailers and jail commander), regarding longevity increases, vacation time and sick leave.

- Authorizing the mayor to apply for the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services Violent Crime Reduction Grant Program for 2024, for software and equipment and staffing at the Garfield Heights Police Department.

- Ratifying the appointment by the mayor of Pamela Wilkes, Frank Leone and Joyce Tubbs as members of the Zoning Board of Appeals through Dec. 2028.

- Ratifying the appointment by the mayor of Edward Stanzeski as a member of the city's Civil Service Commission through Dec. 31, 2029.




