Sewer District awards \$300,000 for Garfield Boulevard project

The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District's Board of Trustees yesterday announced the awarding of seven grants totaling \$1.5 million as part of its long-standing Green Infrastructure Grant Program. When these projects are complete, nearly 3 million additional gallons of stormwater runoff will be kept out of the combined sewer system.

One of the seven to receive grants is the Board of Park Commissioners of the Cleveland Metropolitan Park District for the "Garfield Boulevard Reconstruction, Trail and Green Infrastructure Project," in the amount of \$300,000. The project, slated to begin next year, will capture almost 1.2 million gallons of water runoff annually.

"The Sewer District recognizes the importance of green infrastructure such as bioretention, pervious pavement and other site-based stormwater management practices," said Frank Greenland, director of Watershed Programs.

"We are happy to support these organizations, in partnership with our member communities, to bring these projects to fruition and manage stormwater at its source in the combined sewer area."

Since the program's inception in 2014, NEORSD has funded 84 projects for more than \$14 million capturing and treating 38.2 million gallons of stormwater annually within the combined sewer system area of Northeast Ohio.

Bedford City Council holds final meeting of 2023

Two longtime Bedford City Council members attended their last council meeting Monday night, with two new members and one returning member set to be sworn in at council's next meeting on Tuesday, Jan. 2, at 8 p.m.

Councilman Donald Saunders, who has served Bedford's Ward 6 for 26 years, chose not to seek re-election in November. Anthony Longino-Thomas assumes his seat in January. Councilman Walter Genutis, who has served Ward 2 for the past 10 years, was unsuccessful in his re-election bid, with challenger Steve Salvi winning the seat.

Both outgoing council members expressed their thanks to those city officials and residents who supported and helped them over the years.

Saunders confirmed that the end of his last term on council will mark the beginning of his full retirement

from public service. "I'll still be around, though, and you can still call me," he added.

Genutis said he was happy knowing that he did a good and loyal job for the people of Bedford.

Mayor Stan Koci, City Manager Mike Mallis, Law Director John Montello, Finance Director Jennifer Howland, and fellow Councilmembers Sandy Spinks, Vic Fluharty, Frank Smith and Jeff Asbury all thanked Saunders and Genutis for their dedication to improving the city during their years of service.

County seeks public input on Rockside Rd. project

The Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works, the city of Independence, the Village of Valley View and the Ohio Department of Transportation invite the public to provide comments regarding the repair and replacement

of two bridges on Rockside Rd.

Bridge One is over the Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad tracks. The repair project will include wider piers, new superstructure and a new deck.

Bridge Two is over the Cuyahoga River. A replacement structure will be built in a similar alignment on Rockside Rd. The project will add a new 6-foot-wide sidewalk on the north side of Rockside Rd. connecting to Brecksville Rd.

Traffic on Rockside will be maintained during construction using part-width techniques and detours. Construction work is expected to begin in Spring 2025 and will last approximately 24 months.

Access to the Cuyahoga River for paddlers (canoes and kayaks) will be maintained during construction, except for four closures. There will be two 2-week closures to allow for removal of the existing beams and two 4-week closures for placement of the new steel girders and construction of the

bridge deck. Although the Lock 39 Trailhead upstream of the project area is a designated portage location for canoes/kayaks, there is no suitable portage location downstream.

Questions and comments must be submitted by Jan. 10, 2024, and may include the effect of the project on local residents, air quality, the local economy, floodplains, the proposed temporary trail closure/detour, and historic or cultural resources.

Reforesting Slavic Village

Thanks go out to the Western Reserve Land Conservancy from former Cleveland Councilman Tony Brancatelli for donating free paw paw trees that are now planted at the former Victory Theater location at 3990 E. 71 St., for the beginning of a tiny forest in the Slavic Village community.

"Cudos also to Sustainable Slavic Village and super volunteer Chuck Gliha for help in planting additional trees this weekend to help reforest our neighborhood," Brancatelli said. "Chuck has also salvaged the Victory building stone signage after it was demolished, which will be reinstalled as a landscape element this spring."

Bedford Council holds final meeting

ment in the Middle East earlier this year when he decided to apply to Bedford's force.

Police Chief Marty Stemple welcomed the two new officers and thanked the city's administration, council and the Civil Service Commission for making the hirings possible.

Donations to Meals on Wheels

Koci presented a check for \$1000 on behalf of Bedford city employees to Diane Astolos of the city's Meals on Wheels program, which was raised through "dress down days" on Fridays throughout the year.

The Bedford Firefighters also presented Astolos with a donation of \$500 to benefit Meals on Wheels.

New fire truck legislation okayed

Council passed an ordinance authorizing Mallis to enter into a contract with Atlantic Emergency Solutions to buy a new ladder truck for the fire department at a cost of \$2,398,917, with \$1 million of the cost to be paid through a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant, and the city paying the remaining \$1.4 million.

Other ordinances ap-

proved at the meeting included:

- Contract with Montrose Ford to purchase two 2023 Ford Explorers for the police department at a total cost of \$87,317.84.

- Contract with Flock Services Inc., for the continued utilization of 16 existing cameras in the city to read license plates at a cost of \$40,000 for each year of a five-year contract.

- Increase the compensation for the clerk of Bedford Municipal Court from \$126,458.75 for 2023 to \$128,672.15, effective Jan. 1, 2024. The 1.75 percent raise each year is mandated by Ohio Revised Code.

- Contract with Senior Transportation Connection to continue providing transportation services for residents, including to and from medical appointments, group shopping trips and other locations. This will extend the contract through 2024.

- Amended contract with GPD Group to continue providing engineering services to Bedford for next year.

- Contract with Atwell's Police and Fire Equipment for purchase of tactical ballistic vests and body armor for 25 members of the fire department at a cost of \$20,961.25.

- Three separate contracts:

between the city and patrolmen in the Bedford Police Department, between the city and the sergeants and lieutenants in the BPD, and between the city and Ohio Council 8 and Local 2007, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, representing Bedford's Service Department workers, to adopt the terms of each entity's respective agreements.

The agreements with the unions were reached after negotiations earlier this year regarding a number of issues, including yearly increases in employee insurance premiums over the next three years, as well as wage increases of 3% annually for 2024, 2025 and 2026.

Announcements

Howland announced that there was an open position on the Civil Service Commission beginning next year, and anyone interested could send a letter of interest and a resume to her office at City Hall, 165 Center Rd., Bedford, OH 44146.

Koci announced that Howland had received the "Auditor of State Award with Distinction" from the Ohio Auditor of State's Office.






NPS to close section of Towpath Trail for riverbank stabilization

Cuyahoga Valley National Park will close approximately 1.5 miles of the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail north of Station Road Bridge Trailhead in Brecksville from December 18, 2023 to May 3, 2024, 5 a.m. Mondays through 6 p.m. Fridays. The trail will be open on weekends.

The closure is necessary for public safety while a contractor completes riverbank stabilization. No detour is available. The work in the Station Rd. area will be completed in two phases. Phase 1 includes the area north of Station Road. Details of Phase 2, south of Station Rd., will be announced in 2024.




