Funding OKd for elevator repair at M.H. Senior Center

At a special meeting held last week, Maple Heights Council approved legislation authorizing Mayor Annette Blackwell to enter into an amended service agreement to accept an additional \$43,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for the completion of elevator repairs at the Maple Heights Senior Center.

This added money for elevator repairs will bring the total amount of ARPA-provided funding to \$108,780 for the project.

County Board of Elections visiting local libraries to promote Mar. 19 primary

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections will visit 10 local library branches in February to increase awareness of the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election and to assist voters.

The libraries scheduled for the Board's visit include the Fleet Branch Library, 7224 Broadway Ave., Cleveland, on Thursday, Feb. 8, from 12:30 to 3:30 p.m., and the Independence Branch Library, 6361 Selig Dr., Independence, on Friday, Feb. 9, from 12:30-3:30 p.m.

The public is invited to drop by to take advantage of the services offered by the Board of Elections. Staff will register voters and update voter registrations, provide and accept Vote-by-Mail ballot applications, offer employment information and Voter Guides.

The March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election will decide the issues and the candidates who will advance to the General Election in November. There are federal, state and county offices on the ballot, including voting for President, U.S. Senators and members of the House of Representatives. State, county and judicial seats will also be decided by voters as well as a county issue, school and local issues.

Grant deadlines due in S.V.

Citizen engagement is the lifeblood of a community. Cleveland's Slavic Village has gained a reputation over the last few decades of being a place where residents step up, identify a need, get organized and solve problems.

But in order to make it happen, they generally need money. Grantwriting is often the way they get it. Slavic Village activists have found two programs especially helpful:

NeighborUp, a 20-year-old program of the Cleveland Foundation's Neighborhood Connections, offers awards of up to \$500 in spring and fall. Projects must serve a public need and be run by Cleveland residents. Current deadline is Feb. 12, 2024.

Friends of Slavic Village, generously funded by the Third Federal Foundation, offers up to \$500, four times a year. Current deadline is March 30, 2024.

ODOT seeks public input on noise barrier replacement along I-480 in Garfield, Maple Hts.

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is proposing to replace sections of noise barriers in the cities of Garfield Heights and Maple Heights.

The project will replace deteriorating noise barrier panels along I-480 eastbound at two locations, along the Granger Rd. exit ramp and the Lee Rd. entrance ramp. Work will include removing the deteriorating panels and replacing them.

The project also includes replacing the chain-link fence behind the barrier at the Garfield Heights William Foster Elementary School. This project is estimated to begin construction in June 2025, and is estimated to be completed in October 2025. Detailed project schedule information will be released in sum-

mer 2025. There will be various lane and shoulder restrictions during off peak hours. Estimated construction cost is \$1.36 million.

CLE Council highlights

Cleveland City Council held its regular meeting Monday night and approved the city hiring professional consultants or vendors for the purpose of providing emergency medical billing services, coding, reimbursement and compliance services.

The legislation, requested by the administration, states that "passage of this legislation will help increase revenue for Emergency Medical Services billing." Council members were concerned about the current city employees who are in these medical-billing positions now, and were assured by the administration that those staff members will be offered other jobs with at least equal pay to their current positions.

Council also approved the offer from the National Forum For Black Public Administrators, through its AmeriCorps Vista program, to place an intern, at no cost to the city, to assist implementation of Cleveland's broadband initiative, for a period of one year.

Legislation introduced at the Jan. 29 meeting included entering into an agreement with Crime Stoppers; providing city support for an indoor pickleball facility; providing easement rights no longer needed in the Flats East Bank Development area; repairing, maintaining and installing concrete on runways, taxiways, and roadways.

After introduction, most legislation will go to city departments for review before returning to council for committee hearings.

The new computer virus in disguise

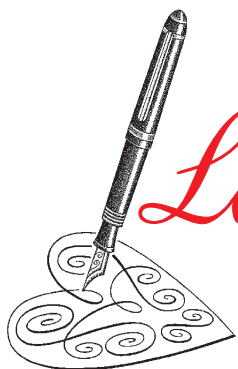

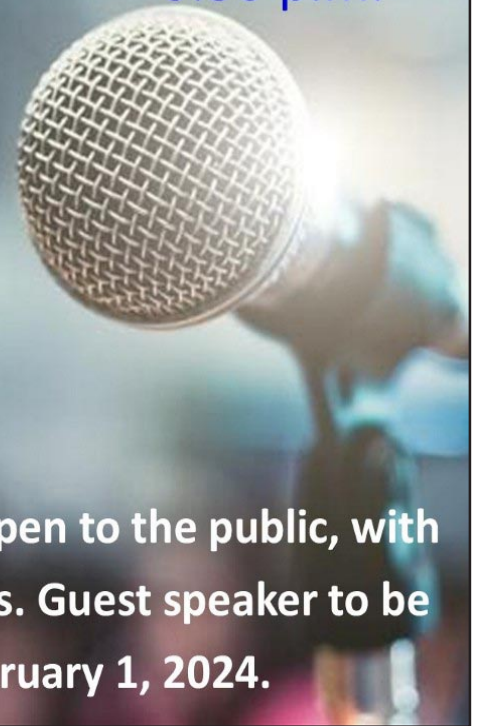
