Maple Heights Hardware renovating, expanding

After over 100 years in business in Maple Heights, Maple Heights Hardware, 16460 Broadway Ave., is getting a much needed facelift. The project has begun and we are now in the process of removing the old fixtures and merchandise to make room for the new while remaining open to serve our customers.

The project will include all new interior and exterior signage, new shelving fixtures, and new service and cash register counters. We will also be expanding the retail area by about 2,000 square feet and adding about 10,000 new items to compliment our already extensive inventory.

Suppliers are also being changed from True Value to Do It Best, which is the second largest hardware distributor in the world with annual sales of over \$5 billion.

We promise not to ever lose that "old school" hardware store feeling, and will always carry the "oddball items" needed for houses in a community like ours. With the same great staff and same great service, our customer satisfaction and customer service will always remain our number one priority.

Renovations are expected to be completed in the beginning of March, and we are planning to hold a grand reopening sometime in April.

I was hired at the store in 1976, at the age of 15. I soon found out that I was one of about six young men that were hired as "grunts" to help move the store from Maple Town to its new location at Broadway Ave. and Lee Rd.

I remained an employee for over 21 years and in 1996

Mayor Burke notes historic first for Garfield Heights

Blame it on global warming or just one of those crazy things, but Garfield Heights Mayor Matt Burke, during his mayor's message at the council meeting Monday night, said his city made history last week as it was the first time ever that the service department's street sweeper was out in February.

He also noted that the city is now taking applications for grass cutters and lifeguards for the pool at the rec center and is in danger of being forced to cut pool openings to only four days a week this summer if lifeguard positions are not filled.

The following legislation was among items + passed at Monday's council meeting:

- Ohio Department of Transportation preliminary legislation regarding rebuilding the traffic signals at the intersection of Broadway Ave. and I-480 in Garfield Heights.

- Entering into an agreement with Tesco Transportation, LLC for a 5-year lease of two 2025 Startrans Senator II buses for the Garfield Heights Senior Center at a total cost not to exceed \$245,000.

- Authorizing the preparations and necessary plans and specifications, per the OHM Advisors proposal, and to go out for competitive bids for the South Parkway Drive Sewer Separation Project and authorizing payment of costs through funding provided by the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District MCIP. The purpose of this project is to eliminate residential basement flooding and property damage, reduce flows from the currently combined sewer system and improve water quality in area waterways and reduce and eliminate property damage to private property and public infrastructure.

- Applying for the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District 2024 Community Recycling Awareness Grant of up to \$5,000 to promote and educate residents about recycling and provide funding for shredding events.

- Ratifying the appointment of Tylon Hilt to serve as building commissioner for the city.

Family history can offer insight to heart health.

Your family history is important. It's interesting to learn about your lineage and where your family came from. It's also important to know what health risks may have been passed down through your family tree – especially issues like heart disease.

Heart disease begins when plaque builds up in the arteries that feed blood to your heart. As your arteries narrow, blood has a harder time passing through. This can lead to heart attacks or strokes.

Wael Khoury, MD, Director of Cardiology at Cleveland Clinic Marymount Hospital, says that family history of heart disease is of concern, in addition to other problems like hypertension, diabetes and high cholesterol.

When should I see a cardiologist?

Your primary care provider (PCP) should assess your cardiovascular risk annually through health screenings (like blood pressure checks and blood tests for cholesterol and blood sugar). If inconsistent results arise or if a specific unusual heart disease runs in your family, they may refer you to a cardiologist for more advanced assessment.

Dr. Khoury recommends the following for long-term heart health:

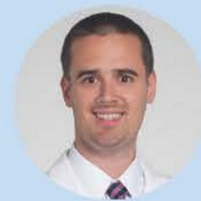
- **Follow heart-healthy dietary recommendations.** The Mediterranean diet is a great place to start.

- **Participate in routine cardiovascular/aerobic exercise** – 20 to 30 minutes a day, five to six days a week.
- **Schedule regular checkups with your healthcare teams.** Start with your PCP.

While it's not possible to change your family history, you can take steps to manage factors to improve your heart health. This is even more important if you've already been diagnosed with heart disease.

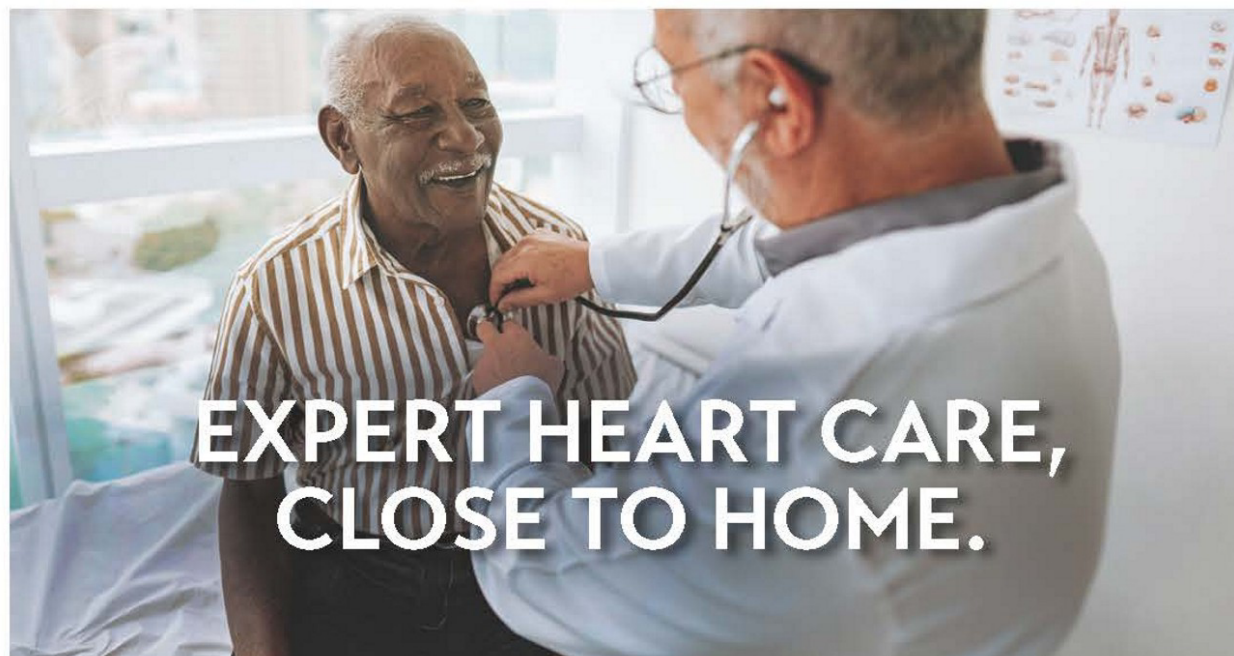
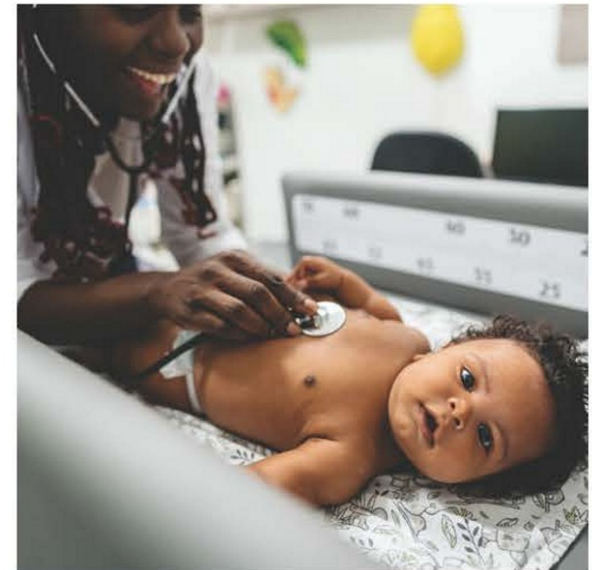

Community police reports

Theft of Motor Vehicle

On Jan. 30, at about 8 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the 6000 block of Andover Blvd., for a report of the theft of a 2008 silver Kia sedan that had been stolen several minutes prior by an unknown person. Other officers in the area of E. 131 St. and Broadway Ave. were advised by dispatch that the Kia had gone through a Flock license plate reader at the Garfield Heights border near the officers' location. Sec-

onds later they saw the Kia and eventually observed it pull into the driveway of a home in the 4200 block of E. 128 St., and initiated a traffic stop. The car stopped in the apron of the driveway and officers had their firearms at the low ready. There were five occupants, one adult male, two male juveniles and two female juveniles, one of which was the driver of the car. They were all patted down for weapons and secured in separate cruisers. The driver told police there were no weapons in the car but a loaded firearm

was found underneath the front passenger seat. A small amount of suspected marijuana was also found in a plastic bag. All juveniles were turned over to their mothers.

Weapon Offense

• On Jan. 31, at about 11:43 p.m., seven officers responded to the Valley Lane Apartments in the 12300 block of Valley Lane Dr., for a report of a male getting shot at in the parking lot near the victim's vehicle. Dispatch advised the suspect had fled towards the rear of the apartment buildings on foot. Officers talked to the reporting person, who said that at about 11:40 p.m., he was approaching his vehicle holding his baby and saw an unknown black male digging through the trunk of his car. The victim hit his

car remote and ascertained it was indeed his vehicle being pillaged. After he pressed the remote the suspect backed away from the car towards the apartment building. The victim went towards the male to see if he had stolen anything from his car and then heard one gunshot. The victim then ran back into his apartment building for safety. He told police he didn't know if the man had shot in the air or at him.

A Bedford PD K-9 arrived on scene and conducted a track with a patrolman but the track was lost in the area of Linda and Havana rds. An officer found two 9mm shell casings in the area where the subject male was described as standing.

Shots Fired

On Feb. 10, at 1:26 a.m., officers responded to an apartment in the 4600 block of E. 131 St., for a report of shots fired. A security sweep of the building did not turn up a suspect, injured people or property damaged by the shooting. Police searched the outside and found 8 spent casings in a grassy area near the apartment building.

Police were told a witness saw an unknown black male attempting to tear down the security cameras in the hallway, then left out the back door when confronted, after which the gunshots were heard. No suspects at this time.

Maple Heights to receive \$141K from county for road improvements in city

Maple Heights Mayor Annette Blackwell announced at last week's council meeting that the city will receive more than \$141,000 in reimbursements from the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works for material costs for work on several main roads.

County Executive Chris Ronayne, who with his team went on a tour of Maple Heights recently with Blackwell and other city officials, informed Blackwell last week that the following roads had been approved for the 2024 County Road Preventative Maintenance Reimbursement Program, with a description of the work and material costs to be covered:

- Dunham Road from southern corporation limit to Granger Rd.; crack sealing, pavement striping (\$5,400).

- Granger Rd. from Dunham Rd. to Libby Rd.; crack sealing (\$1,500).

- Lee Rd. from Broadway to northern corporation limit; crack sealing, pavement striping, base and joint repair (\$39,000).

- Rockside Rd., western corporation limit to eastern corporation limit; crack sealing, pavement striping and base repair (\$24,000).

- Turney Rd., western corporation limit to eastern corporation limit; crack sealing, pavement resurfacing

and striping, base repair, rebuild utility, catch basins/manholes (\$60,000).

Warrensville Center Rd., Broadway to northern corporation limit; crack sealing, base repair (\$11,700).

"That is \$141,600 that we don't have to take out of our budget to fix these roads," Blackwell said. "That money can then go to fixing individual streets."

She said that legislation on residential street repair would be coming up soon, possibly in March, and residents would be kept informed on those locations and the process.

Council approved a resolution at last week's meeting authorizing Blackwell to enter into an Aquatic Facility Management Agreement

Maple Heights to get \$141K for roads

with Hastings Water Works, Inc., of Brecksville, for management of the city's Sprayground and concession stand for the summer season from May 30 through August 18, 2024, at a cost of \$24,490.

Human Services Director Linda Vopat said of Hastings, "They will do everything from opening the Sprayground, taking care of all that needs to be done, and then managing it all summer long. And there will be a supervisor all summer on-site. This is different from a lot of communities that have spraygrounds that are unmanned. Ours is. There's always someone there."

Legislation approved

Council passed an ordinance at last week's meeting to change the street name of Hazelwood Court to Beacon Court, in honor of the new senior living facility named Beacon Grove on the street.

Hazelwood Court, LLC, an assignee of PIRHL Acquisitions, LLC, purchased 39 separate parcels on Edinboro, Jackson and Hazelwood from the city several years ago, and have constructed the 50-unit facility as a "quality housing option" for seniors aged 55 and older.

Hazelwood Court LLC decided to rename the senior living facility Beacon Grove, and to avoid confusion requested that council approve the name change.

Council also passed an ordinance authorizing the city to formally accept a \$2,000 Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council 2024 Energized Community Grant which will

fund the Music in the Park Series this summer.

Also approved was an ordinance to provide a high deductible health insurance plan with a Healthcare Savings Account (HSA) and establishing contribution amounts to the HSA accounts for Maple Heights' non-bargaining unit city employees, effective Jan. 1, 2024.

An ordinance to fix the salaries and wage schedules for non-bargaining unit city employees giving them 3.5% raises, effective from January 1, 2024, was placed on first reading.

And an ordinance introduced by District 7 Councilwoman Edwina Agee to add a standing committee entitled "Government Affairs," which would review action plans of the Planning and Economic Development, Law, Human

Fire Chief Daniel Syden announced that two new hires will be sworn in to the fire department this week, and Police Chief Todd Hansen said a new police officer will also be sworn in to the police department this week.
