Newburgh Hts. awarded grant by county council

On Tuesday, Feb. 27, the Village of Newburgh Heights was awarded \$400,000 from the District 8 ARPA Community Grant Fund by Cuyahoga County Council at its regularly scheduled meeting.

Police Chief John Majoy represented the Village on behalf of Mayor Trevor Elkins, who was celebrating his daughter's 10th birthday, according to a post on the Village's Facebook page. Councilwoman Michelle Graora and Councilman Bill Dunman also attended the county council meeting at which the grant was passed.

The Newburgh Heights Village Council had unanimously adopted resolutions to use \$200,000 for an enhanced home maintenance grant program and \$100,000 each for the police and fire departments.

Meeting held Feb. 19th

Officials praise response of safety forces to recent incidents in Bedford

At the Bedford Council meeting Feb. 19, city officials praised the response of police officers and firefighters to two separate recent incidents in the city - a Feb. 12 felonious assault with a weapon at the Bedford High School campus and the subsequent arrest of a suspect; and a large fire at a business in the Historic District on Sunday, Feb. 18.

The suspect in the assault case, Laquan Evans, 19, turned himself in to police on Monday, Feb. 19, according to a statement on the Bedford Police Department Facebook page. Evans, a former student at Bedford High, was arraigned in Bedford Municipal Court on charges of felonious assault and conveyance of a deadly weapon on school grounds on Tuesday, Feb. 20, and his bond was set at \$225,000, according to police and court officials.

A Bedford police report that was also publicly released on the department's Facebook page stated that police and firefighters were called to the high school stadium on Northfield Rd., for an injured student at 2:48 p.m. on Monday, Feb. 12.

The student told officers that he was struck by Evans on the back of his head with a gun and that Evans fled in a dark colored SUV. No shots were fired. The rescue squad responded to treat the student. School personnel notified parents of the incident and no other injuries were reported, police stated.

The Kiwanis Club of South East Cleveland last month presented Darl Schaaff, owner of the Darl Center for the Arts at 5437 Broadway Ave., Cleveland, with a donation from the club to further the work of bringing the arts into the lives of inner city youth.

Schaaff, a former resident of Alaska who has since moved to the Cleveland area, has transformed the once-dilapidated Carnegie Library building near E. 55 St. and Broadway Ave., into a gallery to showcase his extensive collection of sculptures, paintings, prints, antiques and curios from around the world. The Land reports the 119-year-old building was the first library Dale Carnegie donated to Cleveland for \$237,000, and changed hands several times over the years.

The donation from Kiwanis will be used by Schaaff for youth outreach and educational programs focused on the arts featuring tours of his extensive facility containing exhibits from Africa, Asia and Alaska.

Ward 5 Councilman Jeff Asbury praised the work of the city's police and the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force for their efforts.

Ward 2 Councilman Steve Salvi said that he would be meeting with Bedford Schools Superintendent Dr. Cassandra Johnson in the coming weeks. Since taking his council seat in January, Salvi has been working to address incidents between students and residents of the neighborhood around the high school.

Fire at Always Towing

Ward 1 Councilwoman Sandy Spinks praised firefighters from Bedford, Maple Heights and other neighboring fire departments for their response to a large commercial fire

at Always Towing on W. Interstate St., at 5:30 a.m., on Sunday, Feb. 18.

Firefighters were on the scene of the three-alarm fire for more than six hours in subfreezing temperatures, and no injuries were reported. However, the building, which was unoccupied, was heavily damaged, according to fire department officials, who also stated that the State Fire Marshall's Office is investigating the incident.

Turney project, other items on agenda

• Council passed an ordinance at the meeting authorizing the approval of a \$63,500 engineering fee to GPD Group, for services regarding engineering design and construction administrative costs associated with the Turney Road Resurfacing Project, including repair and resurfacing of Turney from Lee Rd. to West Grace.

The project, which includes new asphalt, pavement and curb repair, ADA-compliant curb ramps, reconstruction of catch basins and manholes and restriping of streets, will be primarily funded by a Cuyahoga County grant with a maximum amount of \$250,000, with the city being responsible for the remainder, according to the legislation.

• Council passed an ordinance to renew a three-year contract in the amount of \$85,200 annually for the city to continue using Solon's jail facilities for Bedford prisoners. The Bedford jail will continue to operate as a six-hour facility to ensure efficient operations, the legislation states.

Mallis said that using Solon's jail was a beneficial financial decision that saved Bedford money, and also allowed Bedford's police officers to continue patrolling the streets and perform other duties instead of being called into the jail to supervise prisoners in the event a regular staffer was unable to come into work.

• Also passed was a motion to okay the Planning Commission's decision to allow Roselynn Horton to open a Lash Salon at 639 Broadway Ave.

Former mayor remembered

Mayor Stan Koci remembered and honored former Bedford Mayor Andrew Romito, who passed away recently at age 96. Romito was known for his decades of public service to the city, Koci said. Besides serving as Bedford mayor for several years, Romito also served on Bedford and Twinsburg city councils.

City still in court with UH on hospital closure

Koci addressed a resident who asked about a rumor that the former University Hospitals Bedford facility on Blaine Ave., which was abruptly closed by UH officials in July 2022, was being reorganized as a wellness center.

"The wellness center part is what UH is calling the medical building," Koci said, adding that the hospital building itself was not involved in the reorganization and remains closed.

Since the closure the city has been contesting UH's decision in Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court on the grounds that the action negatively affected Bedford residents who no longer have local emergency care in the city, and were facing longer travel times to other nearby hospital emergency rooms, or were unable to easily access other medical facilities.

Announcements

Mallis said additional security cameras were being installed in the downtown Historic District and the Commons areas, thanks to a 100% donation from the Bedford Automobile Association for the additional cameras. The downtown system will mirror the camera system already set up along Broadway and Rockside rds., Mallis said, adding that the project is slated for completion by the summer.

Asbury announced that the Bedford Downtown Alliance's "Mitten Fence" was still up on Broadway, and anyone in need of new or gently used hats, gloves, mittens and scarves was welcome to take what they needed. He also thanked the Bedford Senior Group for their recent donation of handmade items.

Community Police reports

Breaking & Entering

On Feb. 27, an officer responded to the lobby of the police station for a report of a breaking and entering. The complainant told police that on Feb. 25, he noticed some things looked out of place around his business, the Showcase Bar & Grill, 5015 Turney Rd. He checked his cameras around the business and found that an unknown male had kicked in the back door of the house behind Unkut Lounge, 5011 Turney Rd., and found a pressure washer and some scrap metal missing from the rear area. He estimates his losses at around \$200. Report forwarded to the Detective Bureau.

Burglary

On Feb. 26, at 7:22 a.m., an officer was dispatched to a home in the 4800 block of E. 84 St., regarding the theft of a motor vehicle. The complainant said his house had been broken into overnight and his Ford Escape was stolen. The side door to his home was forced open causing damage to the frame and door locks. His car keys and \$150 were taken from the kitchen table. He told the

officer he believes he knows who was responsible but his current address is unknown. The suspect also tried to force entry by means of a window at the back of the house and left fingerprints on the window. Detective Bureau to follow-up.

Felonious Assault

On March 1, at 5:46 a.m., an officer responded to Marymount Hospital for a man who was stabbed in the chest. The victim told the officer that he had been at the MGM Casino on Northfield Rd., and was later dropped off at the corner of E. 131 St. and Thornhurst Ave., by his ex-girlfriend. Upon walking up the driveway to his girlfriend's house in the 13300 block of Thornhurst, the victim said someone came from behind him and stabbed him in the upper chest with a screwdriver. The puncture wound began to bleed and his girlfriend gave him a ride to the hospital, where he called police for a report. He said he didn't know who stabbed him. No suspects at this time.

Assault

On March 1, at 2:30 p.m., police were dispatched to mile marker 22.8 on I-480 eastbound for an assault report, where two men in separate vehicles were parked on the south shoulder east of the Granger Rd. exit. Officers learned they had been involved in a road rage incident, one driving a Toyota truck and the other a Ford Escape. The incident began with tailgating on the eastbound lanes of the Valley View bridge and intensified near the merger of the express and local lanes. The road rage culminated with a vehicle assault near mile post 22.8. The Toyota driver said he was traveling in the inside lane

when the Ford driver attempted to pass him on the shoulder and purposely struck the left side of his truck in a "Pitt Maneuver." The Toyota rotated counterclockwise and went off the road, striking a guardrail and separating the left front tire. The Ford driver's version of the story was that he was traveling in the inside lane when the Toyota passed him and swerved in front of him attempting to cut him off. The Ford was struck as the other vehicle lost control and hit the guardrail. Both vehicles had sustained damage. ODOT was provided information for any video surveillance of the incident. Reports forwarded to the Detective Bureau/prosecutor.

Suspicious Activity

On March 2, shortly before 5 p.m., police were dispatched to the Garfield Heights branch library on a report that a male in the library was printing out nude pictures of juveniles. Two female juveniles told police they were getting a copy of a photo from the printer at the library and found someone had printed out a picture of a partially nude female juvenile with an unknown address on it. They also said they saw a white older male looking at photos and addresses on the computer. He took the photo the girls had seen and quickly left the library. Police advised the library manager to unplug the computer the male was using and put it out of service until a subpoena could be issued for any evidence. A subpoena is also needed to get a photo of the male from the library's camera system. The male was described as white, in his forties with gray hair and a beard, wearing a black shirt and blue jeans. Information forwarded to the Detective Bureau.

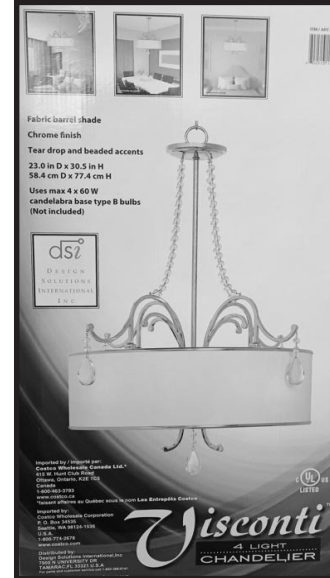


