March 19th Presidential Primary deadlines loom as Election Day nears

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections is reminding voters to return their voted ballots for the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election. Vote-by-Mail ballots must be postmarked on or before March 18, 2024.

The deadline to hand-deliver Vote-by-Mail ballots to the Board of Elections is 7:30 p.m. on Election Day.

Vote-by-Mail ballots will not be accepted at polling locations on Election Day. A secure ballot drop box is available 24 hours a day in the rear parking lot of the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections located at 2925 Euclid Ave., Cleveland, Ohio 44115.

Audio detection system helps police locate gunshot calls, police chief reports at M.H. Council meeting

A new audio detection system is in place in Maple Heights which will help police in responding to reports of shots fired, Police Chief Todd Hansen said in his report to council at its meeting last week.

The Raven Gunshot Detection System from Flock Safety, "detects gunshots, locates the source, alerts law enforcement to the scene and delivers the objective evidence officers need to respond to gunshots quickly and preserve critical evidence," according to the company's website.

Hansen stated that the system, which went up online the day before last week's council meeting, covers about two square miles of the city, most in the central corridor.

He added, "Just a quick explanation of what they do, they just listen to noise. They're trained to hear gunshots."

Sentenced for stealing from disabled at G.H. group home

A supervisor for a group home near Granger Rd. and E. 98 St., in Garfield Heights, pleaded guilty on Feb. 5, 2024, to one count of theft, one count of tampering with records and two counts of forgery, according to the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office.

Candance Rouse, 33, was responsible for the personal spending of six disabled persons at the home. From July 19, 2020, to September 12, 2022, Rouse misappropriated \$8,712.20 of the victims' money for her own personal use, according to court records.

Additionally, Rouse forged signatures of multiple other coworkers at the group home to accomplish some of the misappropriation.

She was sentenced on Tuesday, Feb. 27, in the courtroom of Judge Maureen Clancy, to 30 days in jail, 120 days of house arrest and four years of community control which includes weekly drug and alcohol testing. She also has to pay \$8,712.20 in restitution.

Garfield Council hears pitch for basketball courts by Coach Sonny Johnson

Fresh off the Garfield Heights Bulldogs boys varsity basketball Division 1 finals win over St. Vincent/St. Mary High School on Saturday, GHHS Head Basketball Coach Sonny Johnson attended the Monday night meeting of Garfield Heights Council to make a pitch for basketball courts being built outside the Rec Center.

Mayor Matt Burke introduced Johnson after throwing his support behind the project and calling for a meeting of residents to get their input on the idea. He said recreational surveys completed by residents showed that basketball courts, pickleball courts and a splash pad by the city pool are the top three items on their Wish List.

Coach Johnson said there's plenty of room by the tennis courts to install two basketball courts and it probably wouldn't cost that much to accomplish.

"We have so much we could do there and the basketball courts would just be a start," Johnson said. "It's time to give our kids a shot and give them something to do, with supervision."

With a short agenda, council passed two resolutions at the meeting. The first recognizes March as National Women's History Month and March 8th as International Women's Day in Garfield Heights.

The other resolution provides for just one council meeting to be held on the second Monday during the months of May, June, July and August. Special meetings can be called when necessary.

The next scheduled council meeting is set for Monday, March 25.

Also passed was a resolution authorizing Blackwell to enter into a contract with Cummins Sales and Service to purchase an emergency generator for installation at the Maple Heights Senior Center at a cost of \$35,680, which will be paid for through an ARPA grant from the county.

A controversial ordinance to create a "Government Affairs" committee, introduced by District 7 Councilwoman Edwina Agee, was defeated on third reading by a 4 yes-2 no vote of council members. The legislation required five affirmative votes to pass.

Prior to council's vote, Blackwell reiterated her concerns about the ordinance, stating that having the additional committee was "redundant" and "unnecessary," as council members were already performing the actions described in the proposed "Government Affairs" committee as part of their regular duties.

Appeal to decline appointment upheld

Stafford-Marbury had a formal motion on last week's agenda to appeal Jackson's

decision not to let her decline an appointment to council's Community Life and Education Committee.

After a contentious round of exchanges between council members, Jackson's decision was overruled by a 4-2 vote, with Shenett, Madden, Stafford-Marbury and Agee voting to let Stafford-Marbury refuse the appointment.

After what Jackson described as a "chaotic" meeting, he said, "I want to put everybody on notice; this ends tonight... We'll find some type of way to work together. It will be for the betterment of the city, and for the residents who come to these meetings."

Fire Chief Dan Sypen announced that members of the Maple Heights Fire Department/Local 1184 raised \$3,000 for the American Lung Association's "Fight For Air Climb" fundraiser, in which firefighters climbed all 52 stories of the Key Tower in downtown Cleveland in full gear. He thanked them for an "amazing job" and noted they raised the second highest amount among all those who entered the event.

• On March 2, at about 12:40 p.m., officers responded to a one car accident in the area of the Ohio Savings Bank, 6016 Turney Rd. They found an unre-

sponsive white male in the driver's seat of a car which had crashed into a pole. Due to signs of a possible drug overdose, police administered three nasal Narcan doses and noticed the man had a handgun in his waistband, which was

fiscated. It appeared the suspect vehicle had struck one utility pole and a fire hydrant, then struck a second utility pole. While the male was being treated in an ambulance dispatch notified police that the suspect had a felony domestic violence warrant with GHPD.

He awoke from the doses of Narcan police had given him and was transported to Marymount Hospital where he was treated and released. He was then taken to GHPD jail, where charges were pending for having weap-

ons under disability, OVI and failure to control. Report forwarded to the Detective Bureau for charges.

• On March 10, about 12:15 a.m., an officer told dispatch he heard several shots fired in the area of E. 88 St., from his location on N. Granger Rd. At about the same time a caller on E. 84 St., advised dispatch that they had heard shots fired from a driveway in the 4900 block of E. 84 St. The caller said a white male was shooting the rounds and afterwards walked up the driveway. Another caller said they heard shots coming from their garage in the 4900 block of E. 85 St., which would place the shots near the address in the 4900 block of E. 84 St. After checking further on E. 84 St., police went to the home where one of the callers had said the white male was observed shooting rounds and found a car in the driveway at the back of the home with a white male sitting in the driver's seat. He was taken into custody and trans-

ported to GHPD. Officers found a rifle laying in the passenger floorboard of the suspect's car with the magazine removed and the chamber empty. They also found a partially loaded magazine laying on the passenger seat with one live round. Several open Twisted Tea alcoholic beverage cans were observed in the center console and passenger compartment. Police found nine spent casings on the ground near the driver's side of the vehicle. The suspect was charged with using weapons while intoxicated and discharging a weapon within city limits. Report forwarded to the Prosecutor's Office for review.

• On March 10, at about 11:21 p.m., an officer observed a vehicle going north on Turney Rd., switching lanes without signalling. A traffic stop was initiated on Turney near Russell Ave. The female driver of the car told police there were no weapons inside the vehicle. She was found to have multiple warrants for her arrest from several different agen-

cies. The female passenger in the vehicle had a warrant with the Cleveland Metroparks Police. She and the driver were detained without incident. The passenger told the officer that the driver had given her a firearm to put in her bag and said it should be inside a black bag on the front passenger seat. Police confiscated a Taurus 9mm with a magazine loaded with 15 live rounds. Driver cited for driving under suspension, lanes of travel and turn signal. Charges for failure to disclose pending.




