Mayor Stan Koci swore three new patrol officers into the Bedford Police Department during a presentation at the city council meeting Monday night. Taking the oath of office were Leonard Feckner, Joseph Hawthorne and Lucas Kozar.

Koci stated, "We're hiring some new people and bringing them in and getting the department up to strength. It's always a good thing, and it's good to see the other officers here to help support the new guys."

During the presentation, Feckner said, "I'm just excited for the opportunity, and I can't wait to start in the academy and get going." Hawthorne added, "I'm just grateful for the opportunity, and I'm really excited to be able to protect and serve the city of Bedford."

Kozar commented, "I'm very excited to be on board with everybody and for the opportunity you gave to me. I'm excited to get to the academy and start up in December."

Police Chief Marty Stemple congratulated and welcomed the three new officers, who will start next week at the academy, adding his thanks to the city administra-

Sen. Brown secures major funding for Cleveland Metroparks to make major improvements to Slavic Village trails

Last week U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) announced a new investment for Cleveland Metroparks, in partnership with the city of Cleveland, to begin construction on two major improvements to the pedestrian and bicycle trail network in Cleveland's Slavic Village.

The new investment will enable construction to begin on the second phase of the Slavic Village Downtown Connector and on the Morgana Run Trail, Booth Avenue Extension. These projects will fill key gaps in Cleveland's trail network by connecting existing trails, which allows safe and continuous access for bicyclists and pedestrians to downtown Cleveland and other destinations.

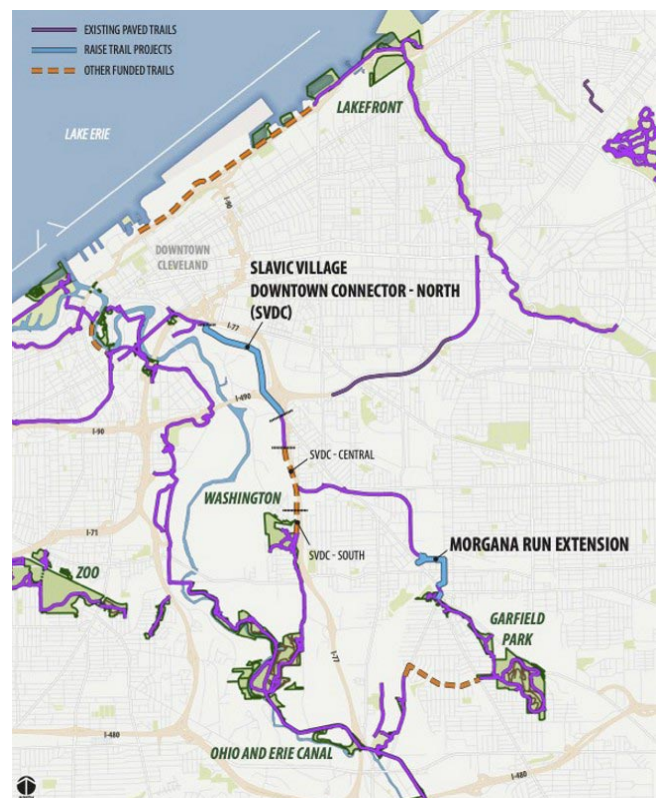
These investments increase safety and reduce the risk of fatalities and injuries from interactions between cars and non-motorized travelers, Brown said in a press release. There is a high incidence of documented bicycle and pedestrian accidents in the corridors of both projects, he said.

"We passed the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to invest in our communities and update and repair the roads, trails and transit Ohioans use every day," said Brown. "This investment is a continuation of our work and will make our roads and trails safer and improve our neighborhoods into the future."

The second phase of the Slavic Village Downtown Connector will improve Broadway Ave. and create approximately 1.7 miles of new trail that links downtown to the Slavic Village neighborhood, Cleveland Metroparks' Washington Reservation, and the Towpath Trail.

"Trails can spark new investment in older industrial neighborhoods," said Marlane Weslian, resident and Slavic Village Development Board Member. "Using the Morgana Run Trail as an example, the community saw millions of dollars in new investment: Public Art along the Trail, a new school, new businesses, new greenspace and new housing - Trailside Homes. We are excited that the Metroparks believes in community connections and is leading this new effort!"

The Morgana Run Trail, Booth Avenue Extension project will improve Booth Ave. and connect the southern terminus of the existing Morgana Run Trail at Jones Rd., with approximately 1 mile of new trail under the railway and along Booth Ave. to the Mill Creek Falls Area of Cleveland Metroparks' Garfield Park Reservation and its Mill Creek Trail.

tion, city council and the Civil Service Commission for their efforts and cooperation in getting the officers hired.

Summer sports camp

City Manager Mike Mallis announced that the Cleveland Guardians baseball team, in a partnership with the city of Bedford and presented by Union Home Mortgage, will be having a summer baseball and softball camp for Bedford children at Ellenwood Recreation Center, 124 Ellenwood Ave., from Monday, July 29, through Friday, August 2.

Mallis stated that the camp was "a tremendous opportunity" for the city's youth. He said the participation fee was normally \$425 per child but the city was able to get a donation of \$405 for each participant, so it will be just \$20 for each child in Bedford to participate.

Some spots are still available, Mallis said. Those interested can contact the Bedford Parks and Recreation Department at 440-735-6570. "That sponsorship for the Bedford children is being made through Union Home Mortgage, and again, it is a tremendous opportunity," he stated.

All legislation passed

Council passed all legislation on Monday night's agenda, including the following:

- Resolution approving and accepting the proposed 2024 Tax Budget for the year 2025. Finance Director Jennifer Howland said, "This allows the county auditor to set the property tax rate for next year, which is 21.7 mills,

and has been the same since 2009. It also allows the city to receive undivided local government revenue, and allows the county auditor to provide the city the certificate of estimated resources."

- Ordinance amending the city's 2024 budget to make additional appropriations for current expenditures. "This amends our current budget, with more expenditures of approved items, including projects and grants the city is receiving," Howland said.

- Ordinance for Bedford to give consent to the Ohio Director of Transportation to replace the Union Street Bridge over Tinkers Creek, located south of Broadway Ave. The state will pay 100% of the cost of the improvements, the legislation notes.

- Ordinance authorizing Mallis to enter into an agreement with the Cuyahoga County Land Bank regarding a city-owned vacant lot at 65 Talbot Ave. The Land Bank is looking to construct a new home on the site of roughly 1500 to 1600 square feet, Mallis said.

- Ordinance authorizing Mallis to enter into a contract with Traffic Logix Corporation to purchase six speed tables for the Bedford Police Department, at a cost of \$30,510. In an effort to reduce the increasing issue of speeding motorists in the city, the police will place a speed table on each of the following streets: Grand Blvd. in Ward 1; Archer Rd. in Ward 2; Paul St. in Ward 3; Turney Rd. in Ward 4; West Glendale Ave. in Ward 4; and Willard Ave. in Ward 6.

According to the U.S. Department of Transportation, a speed table is a raised area placed across the roadway designed to physically limit the speed at which a vehicle can traverse it. Like a speed hump, it extends across the travelway. Unlike a speed hump, a speed table has a long enough flat top (typically, 10 feet) to accommodate the entire wheelbase of most passenger cars. The longer longitudinal depth in the direction of travel enables

comfortable and safe vehicle operating speeds that are faster than for a speed hump.

- Ordinance authorizing a contract with Campo Roofing for a new roof over the gymnasium of the Ellenwood Recreation Center, at a cost of \$68,500. The city has been awarded a \$150,000 grant from Cuyahoga County, part of which will be used to replace the roof.

- Ordinance authorizing a contract with Business Network Team to install security cameras, also at Ellenwood Recreation Center, at a cost of \$70,346.10, which will also be paid from the \$150,000 county grant.

- Ordinance to amend previous legislation designating the city's members to the Housing Council and Tax Incentive Review Commission for tax incentive programs for the city. Reappointed to new four-year terms were Mayor Koci and Keith Laffin, who is a Bedford resident as well as an employee of the city's tax department, Mallis said.

- A motion to reappoint James Judd to the Assessment Equalization Board was unanimously approved by council.

Announcements

Mallis stated that the contractor for the Turney Road Resurfacing Project has been given permission to proceed with the project, which will begin on Monday, July 8. The roadway will be one-way only westbound to Lee Road South, while the other lane will be redirected down Lee Rd. to Rockside. Mallis said the project should be completed in between 60 and 90 days.

The Parks and Recreation Department will be having a Movie on the Commons the evening of Friday, July 12. Ward 5 Councilman Jeff Asbury stated the movie will be "Trolls Band Together" and will start at about 8:30 p.m., with fun activities planned beforehand.

Asbury also commented that the Summer Concert Series will continue in the Historic Downtown District at 7 p.m. on Wednesdays, July 10 and July 24.

Howland announced that the Bedford Rotary will hold its annual Ribfest in Bedford's Public Square July 19-21.



"This is a testament to the tenacity of our community and resilience of our neighborhood as we continue to plan for our future," said former councilman and Ward 12 resident Tony Brancatelli. "Parks space, recreation and these trails add value to Slavic Village financially but also to the quality of life by providing outdoor amenities and connecting us to downtown."

"Having been part of the initial planning team for these trail projects at Slavic Village Development, I am thrilled to see this \$19.5 million investment in connecting the Morgana Run Trail," said Jacob VanSickle, executive director of Bike Cleveland. "This funding will significantly enhance connectivity and promote active living on the east side of Cleveland."

The Department of Transportation has awarded the \$19.5 million investment through the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Transportation Discretionary Grant Program. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, which Brown helped write and pass, more than doubled annual investment in the RAISE program.

BEDFORD, BEDFORD HEIGHTS

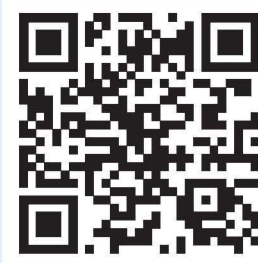
