Bedford schools official gives update on 'Pink Out Day' at council meeting

Bedford School District Communications Coordinator Jamie Cole gave an update at Monday night's council meeting on "Pink Out Day," proclaimed by the city in October to raise awareness of the school district's fundraising efforts for organizations helping breast cancer patients.

Cole said that thanks to the collaborative efforts of the city and the school district, \$1,356.10 was raised through the "Pink Out Day" fundraising efforts.

Two organizations that benefited from the donations were Minority Women With Breast Cancer United and The Gathering Place.

"Thank you for your support with this," Cole stated to Mayor Stan Koci and council at the meeting. "I am looking forward to making this day bigger and better and more lucrative next year."

My vote is 'no' on proposed ward redistricting map

I am honored to live in Slavic Village and serve Ward 12 on Cleveland City Council.

Cleveland City Council is in the middle of a once-in-a-decade redistricting process. Because of our charter and the decrease in population across the city, we must go from 17 council members to 15 council members. The new maps were released just a few days ago and it's expected that they will be voted on at the first council meeting after the holidays on Jan. 6, 2025.

I am joining many of my neighbors in saying that I'm concerned about the way the Slavic Village neighborhood is treated in these maps.

In the last round of redistricting in 2014, Slavic Village was cut up, slicing up edges of the neighborhood so that for the last 10 years we have been represented by a total of four different councilmembers - one of the only neighborhoods in the city treated this way. But even under those maps, the core center of the neighborhood remained in one ward.

The maps that were released last week paint a different picture. Now the neighborhood is cut down the middle. Fleet Ave. becomes the dividing line. North of Fleet is one ward and south of Fleet is another. Splitting the wards down our main commercial corridor - which we are fighting so hard to bring back - will only make our work harder.

There are other odd lines on the maps. The Forest City section of the neighborhood off of Independence Rd. is cut off entirely from Slavic Village and is drawn up into a completely separate third district that stretches from Central to downtown. Forest City is one of our oldest neighborhoods and has a long and storied history given their placement next to the steel mill. Separating Forest City from the rest of Slavic Village is needless.


Up in Hyacinth, there are careless choices, with homes on the perimeter of the neighborhood in one ward, and homes on the inside of the neighborhood in another. It feels like the people who drew these maps didn't know our neighborhood at all.

I have spoken with dozens of residents and everybody I spoke to is concerned about these maps. One of our block club leaders said something at a meeting last week that really stuck with me: "It feels like Slavic Village is always being forgotten and left behind. This is just another way we're being left out."

I have already spoken from the floor of council about my frustrations, including the idea that politicians are drawing these maps in the first place. We need fair maps, and fair maps should be drawn independently from elected officials. Perhaps if we focused on neighborhood first, these lines wouldn't look this way.

I will be voting "no" on these maps. However, my vote alone does not change the outcome. We need Slavic Village to have its voice heard at City Hall.

Council leadership is asking residents to submit feedback by phone and email: maps@clevelandcitycouncil.org, or by leaving a message at 216-714-300. I also know that residents have started a petition drive. They will be gathering signatures at the Holidazzle Event at

Lincoln Post at 6009 Fleet Ave., on Saturday, Dec. 21, from 6 to 10 p.m.

What happens with the maps changes the lines for the upcoming elections in 2025. I will still be the councilperson for Ward 12 through the end of 2025. But these lines determine our future.

And for last-minute holiday shoppers there will be a market showcasing local crafters and artisans. Throughout the evening, neighborhood activists will circulate petitions for a fair Slavic Village ward map. The issue became a hot topic among block clubs last week after Cleveland City Council released a tentative ward redistricting map that some say gerrymandered the neighborhood into several disconnected wards.

The Holidazzle is free and open to all residents and friends of Slavic Village. It's produced by the Slavic Village Stakeholders, with the support of Ward 12 Councilwoman Rebecca Maurer and Neighborhood Connections.

•Amending previous legislation to make additional appropriations for current expenses during Fiscal Year 2024. Finance Director Jennifer Howland said this was the last budget amendment for the year to appropriate grant funding received by the city, and also to ensure expenses were covered through the end of 2024.

•Authorizing City Manager Mike Mallis to enter into a contract with Berrington Pump and Systems to replace the Ferric Chloride tank at the city's Wastewater Treatment Plant, at a cost of \$37,214.

•Amending previous legislation authorizing Mallis to enter into a contract with GPD Group to modify the existing No Feasible Alternatives (NFA) Analysis, which addresses persistent overflows impacting the Wastewater Treatment Plant, to reduce flow and suggest potential upgrades at the plant. The amended contract reflects an

increase of \$30,010, as GPD has identified further services mandated by the EPA.

•Providing a 1.75% salary raise for Bedford Municipal Clerk of Courts Tom Day, as council approves every year. As mandated by the State of Ohio, the clerk's raise coincides with raises provided to the judges.

Day's annual pay will increase from \$128,672.15 to \$130,923.80, effective Jan. 1, 2025, with 60% to be paid by the city and 40% by Cuyahoga County.

Mallis said the police department is currently accepting applications for lateral transfers by Jan. 13, 2025. He also announced that work on the Greencroft Rd. culvert project is expected to begin in early January, with construction taking about 45 days.

Ward 5 Councilman Jeff Asbury announced that trash collection in the city will be one day late during the weeks of Christmas and New Year's. He also asked residents to clear snow away from fire hydrants to assist firefighters in the event of fires.

Rd. Attendees are asked to bring a gift-wrapped tree ornament for the holiday game and a side dish or goodies to share. All are welcome.

New ward redistricting unites Slavic Village

Cleveland City Council recently released their draft of the redistricting maps reducing council from 17 to 15 members as required by the City Charter. This version shows that the Broadway Slavic Village Statistical Planning Area (SPA), with a minor tweak, would be in only two councilmembers wards, down from being split up into four wards the past decade and five wards from when I first was eligible to vote in the 70's.

A few years ago the North and South Broadway SPA was merged to create the Broadway Slavic Village SPA which is also the service area of Slavic Village Development. The latest iteration of ward mapping shows that there will be one ward north of Fleet Ave., and one south of Fleet Ave., and no longer split up into four wards. The strength of our neighborhoods is its block clubs, civic and social institutions as well as the Community Development Corporation and businesses. We have had a tremendous impact on the development and resilience of our community with an incredible number of projects and initiatives that have been replicated not only citywide but also around the county and other parts of the state.

We are proud of the first ever urban "Rails to Trail" with the Morgana Run, and the reuse of a former landfill to become the First Tee/Washington Park golf course. The Mill Creek housing development on the former state land has created a new model of urbanism development while also engaging the Metroparks and the development of the Mill Creek waterfalls, Cuyahoga County's tallest waterfall. The most recent development by University Settlement, the 5115 Rising, not only brings an incredible reuse to the former St. Alexis Hospital site, it complements the Velodrome bike track along with numerous other new initiatives coming to our neighborhood. I applaud our

council president for recognizing the importance of uniting the Broadway/Slavic Village SPA into two wards and look forward to our community coming together to continue the amazing efforts that were accomplished previously.






