Both Garfield Heights and Newburgh Heights agree to support relocation of Municipal Court to Newburgh

At its Monday night meeting, Garfield Heights Council passed a resolution in support of the relocation of the Garfield Heights Municipal Court to the Village of Newburgh Heights "due to the outdated structure that currently houses the municipal court," according to the legislation.

At its meeting last Tuesday, the Newburgh Heights Village Council unanimously passed similar legislation in support of the court's move to Newburgh Heights.

The Garfield Heights Municipal Court currently serves the communities of Brecksville, Cuyahoga Heights, Garfield Heights, Independence, Maple Heights, the Metroparks, Newburgh Heights, Valley View and Walton Hills.

Newburgh Heights currently has the largest annual caseload of all the communities in the court's jurisdiction, having recently surpassed Garfield Heights, which is traditionally a hallmark of the community who houses the municipal court, according to the Garfield Heights resolution.

It goes on to say that "having reviewed all potential options and the costs associated with each, the city believes it is in the best interest to work in conjunction with the Village of Newburgh Heights to explore the possibility of relocating the municipal court to the village."

Newburgh Heights Mayor Trevor Elkins said the location for the relocated courthouse has not been confirmed yet but there are three locations on Harvard Ave. that would meet the court's needs for building size and parking.

Elkins said village officials were approached by the GHMC, as were all of the communities in the jurisdiction, as to whether Newburgh Heights would be willing to become the host community as a result of constraints around the current courthouse condition.

After research, internal meetings and numerous conversations, it was agreed that Newburgh Heights would work toward hosting the Court only if the city of Garfield

Cleveland man found dead in car on Northfield Road

Bedford Police found a man shot to death in a car last Friday at approximately 5:50 p.m., when they responded to shots fired on Northfield Rd., near Rockside Rd.

When police arrived at the location they discovered the victim, Clarence Houston, age 31, of Cleveland, seated in the driver's seat of a black Ford Explorer, according to a Bedford Police news release. The victim had no signs of life. He was transported to MetroHealth Medical Center where he was officially pronounced deceased.

Bedford detectives have been following up on leads since the incident. Any witnesses are asked to call the Bedford Detective Bureau at 440-232-3408.

Heights had no objection and it was a partnership in the relocation process, Elkins said.

The Village of Newburgh Heights would be responsible for construction and maintenance of a new courthouse in its community, he said.

"It would likely be near this time next year before ground would be broken," Elkins said, "and then roughly 6-8 months after that before the court was open for operation. So if all goes well it would be middle to end of 2026."

Other legislation passed by G.H. Council

- Entering into an agreement with OHM Advisors to provide public sector engineering review and construction services to the city beginning March 1, 2025, and ending Dec. 31, 2026, at a cost not to exceed \$40,000.

- Selling and disposing of municipally owned property which is no longer needed by the city, including a fire engine and various equipment from the Fire Department.

- Accepting the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District 2025 Community Recycling Awareness Grant of \$4,267.

- Ratifying the mayor's appointment of Stephen Settle to the city's Recreation Board to complete the unexpired term of former member Kurt Mariola.

- Authorizing application for the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services Violent Crime Reduction Grant Program for 2025.

- Updating the Public Records Policy to place any cannabis funds distributed by the Host Community Cannabis Fund into the General Fund, per the recommendation of the Ohio Auditor of State.

The next meeting of Garfield Heights Council is scheduled for Monday, March 24, at 7 p.m.

One injured in M.H. shooting

On Monday, March 10, at 4:38 p.m., officers from the Maple Heights Police Department responded to an apartment complex at 15400 Maple Park Dr., for a report of shots fired and a male with a gun walking around outside. Officers arrived and found evidence of a disturbance and gunfire.

There were reports that the male with the gun had left the area in a white vehicle. While Maple Heights police were investigating the Maple Park Dr. scene reports came into the Garfield Heights Police Department that several males were in the area of York Blvd. and a male appeared to be injured. GHPD arrived on scene on York and found a male had been shot, presumably from the Maple Park Dr. incident. That male was transported to MetroHealth Medical Center with non-life-threatening injuries. The other men who had been with the gunshot victim were taken into custody for questioning.

Later on scene at Maple Park Dr., police located a male in a white vehicle matching the description of the male with a gun who was seen earlier walking around the area. He was taken into custody for questioning.

Shots Fired

On March 9, at about 1:37 a.m., police were dispatched to a home in the 4600 block of Turney Rd., in regard to shots fired. Officers toured the area attempting to locate a casing and immediately noticed a single bullet hole in a window of the upstairs apartment of the residence. The tenant told police that about five minutes before she called 911, she heard a single gunshot followed by a vehicle driving off in an unknown direction. Officers observed a bullet hole in the window of the living room and it appeared the bullet was lodged somewhere in the wall. Police will follow up with possible surveillance video.

Bedford Heights Council passes two measures, discusses city's summer camp, community projects

Bedford Heights City Council held its first meeting of the month on Tuesday, Mar. 4, where members passed two pieces of legislation and discussed multiple ongoing community projects.

The first item approved appointed resident Melissa Bracey to the city's Planning Commission.

Council also passed an ordinance authorizing the mayor to enter into an agreement for the sale of vacant city-owned property located at 5711 Columbia Dr..

Summer Camp applications opening

During his committee report, Community Life Chairman Paul Bounds announced that applications for the city's summer camp would soon be available at the Bedford Heights Community Center. The city will also begin accepting staff applications for the summer camp program in the coming weeks.

Chairman Bounds also highlighted several ongoing capital improvement projects in the city, including the replacement of boilers at the indoor pool and updates to the Wi-Fi at the outdoor pool.

Roadway improvements

Cold patching has begun in Bedford Heights for the 2025 season. Cold patches are a temporary fix for potholes and roadway cracks until hot patches, a more permanent solution, can be applied when temperatures rise.

Public Service Committee Chairman Michael Willis announced that the repaving of Rockside Rd. is slated to begin in early spring. This project will repave the stretch of Rockside between I-271 and Aurora Rd. This project will coincide with repairs to the welcome sign located on

Rockside Road, for which the city is currently procuring bids.



"These are women with exemplary service," Blackwell continued. "They are mentors, they are role models in their churches and all of their organizations in their communities. And I stand with the members of the Community Life and Education Committee to say, 'Congratulations!' And thank you for what you're doing."

City receives \$208K towards sewers

Blackwell announced that late last month the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) had notified the city that the Southwest Sewer District Phase 3 Construction Project had been selected for \$208,000 in a forgivable loan, through the 2025 Water Pollution Control Loan Fund Principal Forgiveness Program.

"These are for areas on the west side of Maple Heights," Blackwell said, citing the streets of Ramage, Dunbury, Evening Star, Morning Star, Steinway, Walvern, Lee Road South, Longvale and Dunham as being included in the project.

The \$208,000 in funding will go towards upgrading the sewer system in these areas, Blackwell said, adding that the work would begin this summer.

In a release from the city, it was stated that the WPCLF funds will be used to pay the city's 25% local match for the sanitary sewer repair project.

Sherwood Foods closing impact discussed

In his report to council, Planning and Development Director Geoff Englebrecht spoke on the impending closing of Sherwood Foods at 16625 Granite Rd., and the impact it will have on the city.

Sherwood Foods, headquartered in Detroit, announced in February that the company was closing down all operations nationwide by Monday, April 21, resulting in 1,500 workers losing their jobs in 13 states, among them 273 at the Maple Heights location.

"It's a huge hit for the city," Englebrecht said, also stating property taxes at the Sherwood Foods location in Maple Heights were about \$561,000 annually.

"The hope is that the building does not stay vacant for long once it does close," he said.

He explained that Blackwell had been in touch with the local union which wants to make sure the workers there are able to find employment at other plants locally.

Resolutions passed:

Authorizing Blackwell to enter into an agreement with Chagrin Valley Dispatch Council to purchase 50 Motorola portable radios and related equipment for the police department, at a total cost of \$209,529.45. Police Chief Todd Hansen said the new radios and related equipment are required to continue use of the communications network.

- Authorizing Blackwell to enter into a purchase agreement with Axon Enterprise, Inc., to buy 40 tasers and related equipment, including cartridges and battery packs and training, at a cost of \$213,184. Chief Hansen said his department would like to add tasers to its tool belt to handle situations with non-lethal force. He said the MHPD has not used tasers before.

- Authorizing Blackwell to enter into an agreement with Stephen Hovancsek and Associates, Inc., to provide engineering services as the owner's representative for the Southgate Park Boulevard Reconstruction Project. The Ohio Department of Transportation advised city officials that, due to conflict-of-interest regulations, the city must secure the services of a qualified third party consultant to serve as the owner's representative.

- A similar resolution to enter into an agreement with the Hovancsek firm was also passed to provide engineering services as the owner's representative for the Greenhurst Drive Bridge Demolition Project.

Lobbyist legislation fails

A resolution failed to pass that would have authorized Blackwell to enter into a professional services contract with Strategic Health Care Company to provide lobbyist services to lobby for funding from the State of Ohio at a cost of \$5,000 per month through the end of this year.

The legislation stated that Blackwell and Englebrecht had recommended the city retain Strategic Health Care to lobby for funding from the state which, if funding had been secured, would have been used for community projects including playgrounds, addressing infant mortality in the city, senior care housing, and affordable housing and home repairs.


