Garfield council creates city's first ever grant program for home repairs

Garfield Heights Council met Monday evening, April 28, and passed a resolution to create the Home Repair Assistance Grant Program in the city and to award funding to eligible applicants paid for from a CDSG supplemental grant of \$50,000 and an additional \$150,000 of ARPA funds to support this program.

The city of Garfield Heights will offer an Exterior Maintenance Grant to cover transformative projects to the outside of owner-occupied one- to three-family residential properties. These projects must be visible from the street and may include, but are not limited to: gutters, roofs, painting, windows, doors, and driveways/service walkways/sidewalks.

Senior Safety Grant funds will also be available to address immediate health and safety improvements. Projects can include grab bars, hand rails, safety lighting/switches and grounding electrical outlets with ground fault circuit interceptors. Homeowner must be receiving the State of Ohio's Homestead Exemption for their primary residence in the city of Garfield Heights to apply for the one-time use only Senior Safety Grant funds.

Additionally, 10 roof replacements for a total cost not to exceed \$50,000, will be funded by this program. Applicants must meet Housing and Urban Development's Extremely Low Income Limits to apply for the one-time use only of roof replacement project funds. The goal is to replace one roof in each of the city's seven wards, assuming at least one applicant from each ward applies and meets the funding guidelines. An additional three roof replacements will take place citywide.

Bedford Council sets up fund for redeveloping old UH hospital property

Bedford Council met Monday night and passed legislation establishing a new fund for the city to be known as the Blaine Avenue Campus Redevelopment Fund.

The fund will receive \$2.1 million from University Hospitals due to settled litigation regarding the old University Hospitals property located at 44 Blaine Ave., and possible grant funds, which will be used toward the improvement of the site, including professional services necessary to maintain, market or manage the property for economic development or sale, including but not limited to costs for legal, engineering and demolition.

Any funds received will be used within a 10-year period.

Council also passed the following legislation at its Monday meeting:

- Approving the Board of Zoning Appeals' decision to deny Roz Patrick of Patrick's Enterprises permission to build a new home at P.P.N. 813-14-038 which sought four variances.
- Making additional appropriations for current expenditures for the city during the year 2025.

County Council District 8 Forum in G.H.

G.H. council creates city grants for home repairs

The city will fund a percentage of selected projects' costs up to \$2,500 for the exterior repair program, costs up to \$1,000 to address immediate health and safety improvements and 10 total roof replacements for residents eligible. Funding will be available on a first-come, first-served basis until depleted.

The following legislation was also passed by council at Monday night's meeting:

- Entering into a purchase agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation for the purchase of 4500 tons of sodium chloride (rock salt) for the 2025-26 season.

- Revising certain provisions within the Codified Ordinance to conform with current State law as required by the Ohio Constitution.

- Participating in the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District program to secure funding at a cost not to exceed \$200,000 for the purchase of a medium duty truck to be used by the service department for stormwater management, leaf pickup, catch basin repairs and other similar work.

- Entering into an agreement with Thendesign Architecture for planning services for the Garfield Heights Police Station. Thendesign will analyze the current needs of the police department, refine a previously developed program of requirements and evaluate conditions of

potential relocation sites in the city for a fee not to exceed \$20,000.

- Approving a Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge 67, (for sergeants and above). The City Charter requires the city to compile a wage survey of cities that have a population of 10,000 or more and whose boundary lines are contiguous to the city of Cleveland, to determine average pay for police and fire employees. For the duration of this collective bargaining agreement, such average pay computation will be applied to salaries for police and fire employees of the city of Garfield Heights. They will then receive that wage increase retroactive to January 1 of the applicable year.

- Entering into an agreement with CXT, Inc. to purchase and install a new Cortez precast concrete restroom building to replace the current structure at the Frank J. Debelak Recreation area at a total cost not to exceed \$93,000. The legislation stipulates that the current restroom facilities located at that facility are in disrepair and no longer fit for public use.

- Honoring and congratulating Matthew Thompson for winning the "Stop the Hate" Teacher of the Year Award. Thompson, an educator at Garfield Heights Middle School, has been honored with this award by the Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage for his commitment to anti-bias education and fostering an environment of inclusivity and empathy, according to the resolution.

Summer programming includes activities like fishing, outdoor excursions, equestrian therapy, nutrition education, work experience and field days and a free daily meal.

Motor Vehicle Accident

On April 18, about noon, police were dispatched to the area of Turney and Rockside rds. for a vehicle hitting a telephone pole. An Arby's employee told officers that a black male wearing a black sweatshirt, white t-shirt underneath and white shoes had gotten out of the car and left walking north on Turney Rd. Dispatch told police that city cameras had captured the accident and showed a black Mazda going north on Turney in the turning lane to head west onto Rockside. As the light changed to red the driver went left of center around a vehicle through the intersection, then made a left, lost control, drove over the curb and hit the utility pole on a tree lawn. The Mazda then came to rest facing north, blocking both westbound lanes of Rockside. During the pre-tow inventory of the car, officers found a bag with suspected crack cocaine and prescription insulin medications which belonged to a man with a Cleveland Heights address. He was also found to have a suspended driver's license and an active felony warrant for strangulation with the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office. Paperwork completed for hit-skip, traffic citations. Possible charges pending for drug possession.



Hydrant flushing in M.H.

The Maple Heights Fire Department began flushing fire hydrants throughout the city on Monday, May 5, and will continue until all hydrants have been completed.

The schedule will be Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., and from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m., weather permitting.

Officials ask residents to check to see if water is rusty before drinking it, beginning food preparation or laundry. If it is, Cleveland Water recommends that you do not flow any water including flushing toilets for one hour. After that hour, start at the lowest level of the home and

turn on cold water until water runs clear. At that point you can turn off the water and proceed to your next level and follow same steps until each level flows clear.



Vandalism

Shots Fired
