Garfield Heights Council places moratorium on new alcohol-related businesses; raises age to buy tobacco products from 18 to 21

Garfield Heights Council met Monday night and passed legislation to prohibit new bars, taverns or similar alcohol-oriented establishments from obtaining permits, licenses and certificates to do business in the city for a period of 180 days from the effective date of this ordinance, unless extended or terminated earlier by ordinance of council.

This moratorium shall apply to any such business not already holding a valid occupancy permit or business license as of the effective date of this ordinance.

According to the ordinance, the city has recently experienced an increase in public safety concerns related to late night disturbances, incidents of violence and strain on police resources associated with establishments serving alcohol.

During the moratorium, the city wishes to review its zoning code, licensing practices and public safety strategies in relation to alcohol-serving establishments and study and potentially amend relevant codes and regulations to ensure that such businesses are consistent with the health, safety and welfare of the community.

Council also updated Chapter 765 of the city's Codified Ordinances to raise the age at which a person is permitted to purchase tobacco, cigarettes or vaping products from 18 years to 21 years. Council found it necessary to revise Chapter 765 to reflect changes in state law, expand licensing oversight and further restrict youth access to tobacco products.

No N.N. issue July 30th

The Neighborhood News will take its annual summer vacation this month and will not publish a July 30th issue. This advance notice is being given so anyone with news items or advertising can plan accordingly for our July 23rd issue next week. Our next issue after next week's will be on Wednesday, Aug. 6, with normal deadlines.

Before selling or otherwise distributing any tobacco product to another person, the legislation also states, the person selling or distributing the tobacco product must verify the age of any person who appears to be under 30 years of age with a valid ID.

The ordinance also spells out strict guidelines for obtaining a permit to sell tobacco products in the city and penalties for those found in violation of the regulations required to operate as a tobacco vendor.

A separate ordinance was passed by council to amend and update Chapter 531 of the city's Codified Ordinances regarding the distribution and sale of cigarettes, cigar and tobacco from vending machines and reflecting the new age restriction from 18 to 21.

Speed bumps coming

In his report to council, Mayor Matt Burke said the city has purchased 20 speed bumps from Innoplast on Transportation Blvd., in Garfield Heights, and brought a sample of a speed bump and an Innoplast representative who explained the technology behind the device.

Burke said the idea is to slow down speeders, and if it works the city will be ordering more of the speed bumps once the pilot program is assessed. The mayor said Police Chief Mark Kaye submitted a list of streets that need the most attention and those will be the streets where the speed bumps will be installed.

Other legislation passed

• Updating the salaries of the Garfield Heights Police Department for 2025 in accordance with the city charter which provides that the rate of compensation for members of the police and fire division of the Department of Public Safety shall be no less than the average that is paid to the members of the police and fire divisions in suburban cities with a population of 10,000 or more whose boundary lines are contiguous to the city of Cleveland.





Garfield Heights Council places moratorium on new alcohol-related businesses

(Continued from Page 1)

- Extending the current moratorium on licenses, permits and certificates that would enable the cultivation, processing, distribution or sale of adult use cannabis in the city for a period not to exceed six months.

- Doing all things necessary to participate in the Ohio Public Works Commission State Capital Improvement and/or local transportation improvement programs to secure funding for the I-480 Sanitary Sewer Crossing Project.

- Directing the city engineer to provide engineering construction services, in an amount not to exceed \$145,000, for the Multi-Street Reconstruction Phase 9-Part A, and authorizing payment for this project, to be funded through the city of Garfield Heights, Cleveland Water Department and an Ohio Public Works Commission Funding Program.

- Directing the city engineer to provide engineering construction services, in an amount not to exceed \$99,000, for the Multi-Street Reconstruction Phase 9-Part B, and authorizing payment for this project, funded through the city of Garfield Heights, Cleveland Water Department and an Ohio Public Works Commission Funding Program.

- Directing the city engineer to provide engineering construction services, in an amount not to exceed \$53,000, for the McCracken Road Repairs Phase 2 Project, and authorizing payment of costs through funding by the Cuyahoga County 50/50 Grant and the city of Garfield Heights.

- Doing all things necessary to participate in the Ohio Public Works Commission State Capital Improvement and/or local transportation improvement program to secure funding for the Maplerow and E. 126 St. Sewer Separation Project.

- Adopting the most current edition of the Residential Code of Ohio to ensure that all residential construction in the city meets modern safety, design and energy-efficiency standards.

- Adopting the International Property Maintenance Code to aid in the enforcement of nuisance abatement, tenant habitability and neighborhood stabilization efforts.

- Authorizing the sale and disposal of municipally owned property no longer needed for municipal purposes, including vehicles and equipment from the police, fire and service departments.

- Urging the Ohio General Assembly to release cannabis excise tax funds to municipalities that host adult-use cannabis dispensaries, of which the city of Garfield Heights is one.

- Opposing House Bill 335 and urging the Ohio General Assembly to reject legislation that eliminates inside millage and transfers local budgetary authority to county budget commissions.

- Directing the mayor to apply for and accept Community Development Block Grant funds and enter into an agreement with the Cuyahoga County Department of Development to continue infrastructure improvement projects and implement the Parks Master Plan. CDBG funding is administered through the Cuyahoga County Department of Development and the city is eligible to apply for up to \$150,000.

- Adopting the budget for the city of Garfield Heights for the fiscal year beginning Jan. 1, 2026, and submitting it to the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission.

Medicaid providers indicted on fraud charges

In indictments filed last week by the office of Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost, nine Medicaid providers, two from Maple Heights, are accused of stealing a combined \$1.2 million from the government health-care program for the needy.

Eight home-health aides and one mental-health specialist face varying felony charges of Medicaid fraud and theft for allegedly billing Medicaid for services they did not provide. Two of the defendants alone account for more than \$1 million of the alleged fraud.

The Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, an arm of Yost's office, investigated the cases and secured the indictments in Franklin County Common Pleas Court.

"Medicaid fraud is both a crime and a moral offense," Yost said. "It steals from the vulnerable and undermines our values as a society."

Maple Heights residents indicted:

Achana Brown, 47, of Maple Heights, allegedly billed for in-home services when the recipient was hospitalized or incarcerated, causing a \$4,735 loss for Medicaid.

In providing care to a relative, Desiree Reid, 53, of Maple Heights, billed Medicaid for an average of 20 hours of services per day between January 2019 and March 2025. Surveillance footage spanning 18 days showed Reid approach the service recipient's residence only twice—and never went inside. Using flight records, investigators also determined that Reid billed for 93 days that she was traveling in Florida, Missouri, Nevada, Pennsylvania, South Carolina and the Dominican Republic. The loss to Medicaid totaled \$366,950.

Ohio's Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, which operates within the Health Care Fraud Section, collaborates with federal, state and local partners to root out Medicaid fraud and protect vulnerable adults from harm. The unit investigates and prosecutes health-care providers who defraud the state Medicaid program and enforces the state's Patient Abuse and Neglect Law.

Indictments are criminal allegations. Defendants are presumed innocent unless proved guilty in a court of law.

Animal Cruelty

On July 5, at 6:20 p.m., officers were dispatched to Giant Eagle on Transportation Blvd., for a report of a dog locked in a vehicle with windows up. Officers located the vehicle with a small Yorkie-type dog inside. The window of the car was cracked less than half an inch with absolutely no air flow or circulation, with the outside temperature 90 degrees. The dog was visibly distressed from the hot conditions, and was panting nonstop and trying to reach the crack in the window but couldn't reach it due to its size. Police decided for the dog's safety to break out one of the car's windows, grabbed the dog and put it in the police cruiser in the air conditioning. After several minutes the dog's condition improved. One Giant Eagle patron told officers he had seen the dog in the car when he went into the store and again when he came out about 45 minutes later. Officers located the dog's owner inside Giant Eagle with a full shopping cart. She told police she had only been in the store for 10 minutes. If that was true the temperature inside her car would be at least 110 degrees. If it was longer as witnesses stated, the inside of the car would have been over 130 degrees. She was given a citation for animal cruelty and given her dog back.

Suspicious Person

On July 4, at 7:09 p.m., a police officer responded to McDonald's, 5240 Turney Rd., for a suspicious person report. The complainant was the night manager, who around 7 p.m. observed a black female and a black male dressed in black, wearing black masks walk in and start walking around the restaurant looking for a specific employee. After searching the bathroom, the front counter and other areas in the store the female got on her cell phone and started talking to someone about that employee not being at work. While they were walking around the night manager observed the male subject holding a gun inside of his waistband on the right-hand side of his pants. He didn't pull it out nor didn't make threats with the gun. The unknown subjects didn't say anything to anyone and finally walked out the front door. The

manager called the police and locked the restaurant down. He was advised to call police back if the unknown subjects returned looking for the employee. The suspects were not located by police.

Theft-Shoplifting

Store security had detained a female who was seen hiding merchandise in her purse and trying to leave the store. The meat in the backpack was not recovered. Police found the male suspect walking along a path in a field north of Giant Eagle near the I-480 overpass. He was taken into custody without incident and did not have any Giant Eagle merchandise on him. The

female suspect told officers the male suspect had driven her to Giant Eagle in her son's car. Due to her level of cooperation she was issued a summons for theft in lieu of arrest and released on scene. She was forbidden to enter Giant Eagle forever. The male suspect was held in custody for theft.


