Primary election is this Tuesday in Cuyahoga County; mayoral primary in Garfield, council races in S.V., M.H.

Voters will go to the polls in Cleveland, Cleveland Heights, East Cleveland, Garfield Heights and Maple Heights next Tuesday, Sept. 9, for the Primary Election in Cuyahoga County. The primary election will narrow the playing field down to two candidates in each race, who will face off in the Nov. 4, 2025 General Election.

Local elections in The Neighborhood News readership area include voting for Cleveland City Council seats in two of the three wards that are now part of the reconfigured Slavic Village, Wards 3 and 5.

A mayoral primary is being held in Garfield Heights, and Maple Heights has a District 7 City Council contest.

Separate shootings in Garfield Hts., Maple Hts. leave two dead, four injured

In separate shootings in Garfield Heights last Friday, and in Maple Heights last Saturday, a juvenile male and a female were killed and four others injured as a result of gun violence over the Labor Day weekend.

Garfield Heights

On Friday, Aug. 29, at approximately 10 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 13000 block of Orme Rd. for a report of multiple individuals shot inside of a residence.

Upon arrival officers discovered a female victim who had sustained a gunshot wound and was pronounced deceased at the scene. Two additional victims were located inside the home and transported to the hospital for treatment. Both remain in stable condition.

During the course of the investigation, officers and detectives discovered that the suspect in the shootings had fled the residence but was subsequently located and taken into custody.

This appears to be an isolated incident and remains an active investigation, GHPD said on a Facebook posting.

Maple Heights

On Saturday, Aug. 30, around 10 p.m., officers from the Maple Heights Police Department responded to the 5200 block of Thomas St. for a report of gunshots and people wounded and found two male juveniles with gunshot wounds. These males were given medical aid and transported to MetroHealth Medical Center.

As the investigation proceeded, another gunshot victim was located on Cato St. This victim was a juvenile male who succumbed to his wounds at the scene.

Concordia Oaks construction site vandalized

Independence Mayor Greg Kurtz published a message in his Mayor's Weekly Update email last week from Police Chief Robert Butler calling attention to a series of vandalism incidents on the private property where Petros Homes is clearing land for Concordia Oaks off Brecksville Rd.

"The seriousness of these destructive acts cannot be overstated," the chief's message stated. "Construction equipment has been tampered with, including the cutting of fuel lines, which has resulted in an estimated \$50,000 in damage. The actions and misconduct posed an extreme risk to the lives of workers and nearby residents, with potentially devastating consequences."

The Independence Police Department is actively investigating these crimes and will prosecute anyone found responsible to the fullest extent of the law, Butler said, and pointed out that "No Trespassing" signs have been posted at the property as construction sites can be very dangerous.

astronomy programmer Justin Willard on how they were putting to use the state-of-the-art telescope the Kiwanis had recently donated.

A former member of the Kiwanis Club of Cleveland, William Albert Stinchcomb was the founder of the Cleveland Metroparks park system, serving as its director and chief engineer for nearly 60 years. A visionary self-taught engineer, he conceived and tirelessly worked to create the "Emerald Necklace," a system of parks and connecting parkways to provide access to nature and recreational spaces for the residents of Greater Cleveland, which was established in 1917, as related in an AI overview.

To honor their former member, the Cleveland Kiwanis each year donates to the Cleveland Metroparks, and this year the park system requested the Seestar Smart Telescope. As Willard noted to the Cleveland Kiwanians at the meeting, along with interclub members from the Kiwanis Club of South East Cleveland, the smart telescope has some pretty incredible features.

It is controlled by a cell phone or Ipad using Wifi and Bluetooth connections. The user just has to tell the telescope where to point in the night sky (i.e. "Show me the Milky Way") and it will show you the image on your device or project it on a large screen for all to see.

Joyce and Willard thanked the club for their generosity and said the telescope will be enjoyed by countless park visitors in the coming months and years.

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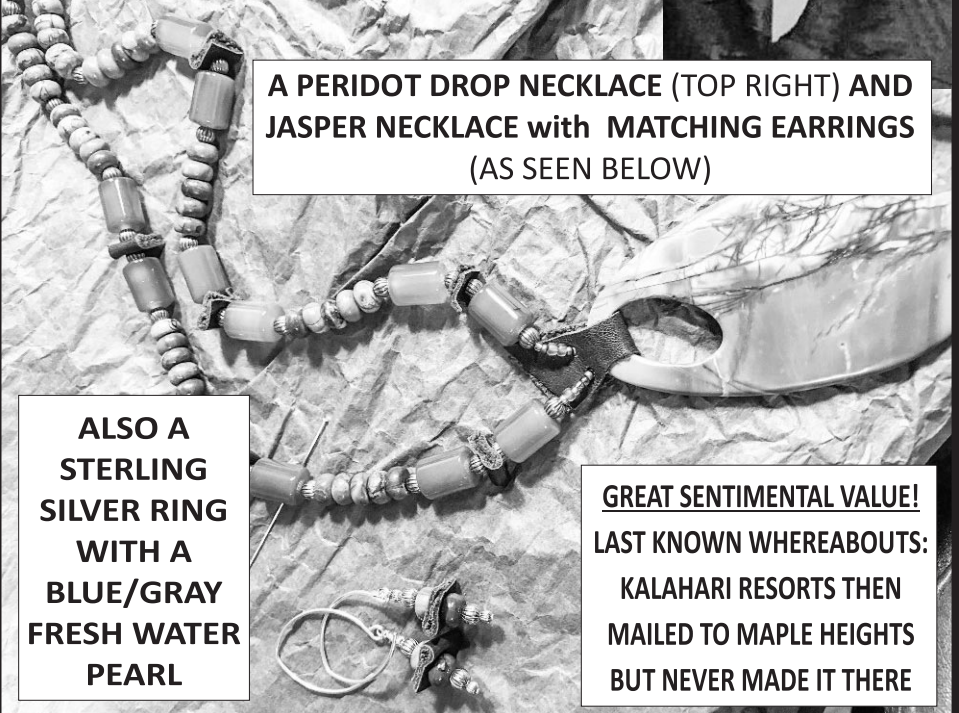

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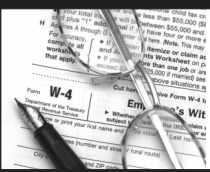

Child Endangering

The officer noted the girl looked and checked out to be okay and was nicely dressed. She told the GHPD officer her mother was working at Amazon on Northfield Rd., but attempts by police to contact the mother or aunt were unsuccessful. Another officer arrived on scene and assisted in locating the mother's contact information and with the help of the North Randall Police Department was advised she was at work at Amazon and was notified her daughter was at the GHPD station and should be retrieved. The little girl had

said she was hungry since she hadn't eaten all day and one of the GHPD officers took her to McDonald's. Meanwhile the Marc's security officer called in to tell police the aunt was back in the store looking for her niece, over an hour since she had left the girl alone. When a GHPD officer arrived back to Marc's they arrested the aunt and asked her why she had left the girl alone. She replied that she had to get her car and thought the four-year-old would be safe until she got back. She was taken to the station and booked with child endangering. While booking the aunt, the girl's mother came to the station to get her daughter. Both were transported to Marc's to retrieve the vehicle.

Recovered Stolen Auto

On Aug. 25, at about 6:45 p.m., GHPD called in that they had a visual on a silver Kia, occupied and confirmed stolen out of Cleveland. It was parked in the area of the 13000 block of Littleton Rd. Two officers approached the vehicle and the driver got out and fled on foot east toward E. 135 St. Both officers observed that during the pursuit the suspect repeatedly reached toward his waistband, which made police suspect he was carrying a firearm on his person. Officers caught up to the suspect in the 13400 block of Littleton Rd. Because he was suspected of carrying a firearm, the suspect was Tased, then brought to the ground and placed in handcuffs. When questioned why he kept grabbing his waistband, he said to police, "I'm sorry. I was grabbing my phone." Officers found the suspect's phone in a front yard in the area.

Criminal Damage

On Aug. 26, at about 4 p.m., officers responded to the Garfield branch library, for a juvenile who had trespassed

and returned. When they arrived they found four black juveniles running east through the parking lot and was told one of them had thrown a rock at a parked car. They stopped two of the suspects and the other two continued running into the wooded area toward the basketball courts. The two juveniles they had in custody were ordered to stand by one of the officers until they could review the video to find out who threw the rocks. One of the juveniles started to walk away and was told to stop and stand with the other juvenile. He refused and walked toward the parking lot, picked up a rock and threw it, hitting a sign next to the officer. The officer tried to walk him to his cruiser but the boy again began to pull away, yell and curse at the officer and resist, while police tried to calm him down, but had no luck. He was eventually detained and placed in the rear of a police car and began yelling and kicking the doors. He was taken to city jail and as his handcuffs were being removed to place him in a cell he became more irate and continued to resist and was taken to the ground where his shoes, backpack and handcuffs were removed. He was placed in the cell where he continued to yell and hit the door. It was later discovered the juvenile lives in a group home in Cleveland and checked clear through the Juvenile Detention Center. Charges pending through the Juvenile Bureau for obstructing official business, resisting arrest and menacing. He was released to his caretaker.
