New Garfield Hts. PD officers sworn in City leaders announce passing of former Bedford police chief, Oakwood mayor

At the meeting of Bedford Council Monday night, city leaders announced the passing of former Bedford Police Chief James Cooper, who died on Sept. 2. Chief Cooper served the citizens of Bedford until his retirement in 1988.

A Celebration of Life will be held for Chief Cooper on Saturday, Sept. 20, from noon to 4 p.m., at Sirna's Cafe in Bedford.

Council also announced the passing of Oakwood Village Mayor Gary Gottschalk on Friday, Sept. 12, commenting that he will be deeply missed.

Water, sewer rates going up

Bedford Council passed legislation at its meeting Monday night to raise water rates for residents and businesses in the city by 3.63% for 2026 because, said officials, the city of Cleveland is charging Bedford that much more for its water supply.

Council also passed an ordinance to increase sewer rates by 10% next year for residents and businesses in the city, and another ordinance to reduce water and sewer rates for Bedford's disabled and senior citizens by 30% if they meet the eligibility requirements.

Also passed

- Resolution accepting the amounts and rates determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the county fiscal officer.
- Resolution authorizing the city manager to contract with the city of South Bloomfield to purchase a used, fully-outfitted 2020 Ford Mustang for the Police Department at a cost of \$21,000. The legislation notes the vehicle has low mileage and will be used for traffic enforcement.

It was noted at the meeting that the vehicle has only about 20,000 miles and will save the city about \$40,000 by not purchasing a brand new police car.

- Ordinance authorizing the city manager to contract with Gable Elevator for necessary repairs to the Bedford Municipal Court elevator, at a cost of \$16,761.00, with the cost split between the city and municipal court.

Coming up

In his report to council, City Manager Mike Mallis announced the annual Children's Fall Fest will be held on Saturday, Oct. 4, at Bedford Commons. He also noted that a ribboncutting for the Bedford Commons Project should be set for early next month.

Sept. 9th Primary Election results in local races

Voters, but only a small percentage of those eligible, went to the polls in Cleveland, Cleveland Heights, East Cleveland, Garfield Heights and Maple Heights last Tuesday, Sept. 9, for the Primary Election in Cuyahoga County. The primary election narrowed the playing field down to two candidates in the races that had more than two running. The top two winners will face off in the Nov. 4, 2025 General Election.

Cleveland's Slavic Village

Local elections in The Neighborhood News readership area included voting for Cleveland City Council seats in two of the three wards that are now part of the reconfigured Slavic Village, Wards 3 and 5.

Unofficial election results as posted on the Cuyahoga County Board of Election website included the following:

In Cleveland's Ward 3, incumbent Deborah A. Gray,

with 72.99% of the primary vote, will face Erich V. Stubbs, who had 14.40% of the vote, in November.

In Cleveland's Ward 5, incumbent Richard A. Starr, with 69.44% of the primary vote, will face incumbent Rebecca Maurer, who garnered 25.36% of the vote.

Garfield Heights

A mayoral primary was held in Garfield Heights, with incumbent Mayor Matt Burke, with 63% of the primary vote, to face James S. Feeney in November. He gathered 27.44% of the vote.

Maple Heights

And in the Maple Heights Council District 7 race, incumbent Edwina K. Agee, with 65.20% of the primary vote, will face Travian M. Atkins in November. Atkins had 26.80% of the primary vote.

Theft of Motor Vehicle

On Sept. 5, at 12:45 p.m., an officer spoke to a man in the police station lobby concerning the theft of two vehicles. He said he had recently become the executor of the estate of a man living on E. 93 St., who had passed away in December 2024, and the mortgage company locked the property down with a padlock. Both of the decedent's BMWs were parked in his driveway and were

now missing. The complainant is not sure if the mortgage company removed the cars or if they were stolen. He said the BMWs were not operable and would have to have been towed away. Both vehicles will be entered into LEADS when paperwork is received.

Burglary

On Sept. 5, at about 2:27 p.m., an officer arrived at a home in the 10400 block of Plymouth Ave., regarding a burglary. He talked to the homeowner, who said a man had entered his home while he was away and taken a PS5 and his Rolex watch. Video footage was provided by a neighbor which showed a blue Dodge Ram pull into the driveway at 1:05 p.m., and a heavyset, bald white male exited the vehicle and is seen standing at the side door of the home and appears to be reaching through the door. He then enters the house, stays about 15 minutes, then pulls out of the driveway about 1:20 p.m. While running the vehicle through LEADS, it registered to a female out of Barbarton. GHPD will follow up with Barbarton PD regarding the driver of the truck.

Robbery

On Sept. 5, at about 4:43 p.m., police arrived at Marc's, 12650 Rockside Rd., for a reported robbery. The security guard said a black female, in her 20's, had just assaulted an employee. The loss prevention officer told police he had seen the woman collecting reusable bags from the front of the store and placing items from her cart into a bag and a tote. She walked past the checkout line to leave the store when the loss prevention officer stopped her in the vestibule and asked her for a receipt. He grabbed the cart and asked her to come back inside. She responded by shouting racial slurs at him and slapping his phone from his hand when she saw him recording. She also hit him in the face several times causing his glasses to fall off. She then walked back into the store and screamed at the loss prevention officer that she had a gun and was going to kill him. She proceeded to grab one of the bags from the cart and left the store in a black Nissan Sentra. An itemized receipt came to \$610.42 for the items that were recovered on scene but did not include the items the suspect got away with. The report was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

Criminal Damage-Auto

On Sept. 6, at 9:31 p.m., police arrived at Jennings Center, 10204, Granger Rd., for a report that two black

males had broken the window of a white Hyundai Elantra and were trying to steal it. They located the vehicle and saw that the rear passenger side window had been broken out and the column peeled. The caller said the alarm to the car had started to go off and she saw the suspects inside it. They fled on foot toward St. Rita Apartments. They were seen running away heading north toward St. Therese Church when police arrived at Jennings. The owner of the car, an employee at Jennings, was able to start the car despite the damage. She was given a report number and advised to contact her insurance company.

On Sept. 10, at about 10:16 a.m., police responded to a home in the 4600 block of E. 93 St., to talk to a woman who said someone had poured chocolate syrup into the gas tank of her car. Dispatch advised officers that the woman had three active warrants: a felony robbery warrant through University Heights PD, theft warrant with Bath Township PD and a shoplifting warrant through Maple Heights PD. She was asked by police to provide her Social Security number to use on the potential criminal damaging report. She complied but did so while yelling at officers and accusing them of improperly obtaining her information despite the fact that she had called police to file a report. The woman's sister also began yelling at officers from a nearby stairwell. The officers told the woman with warrants that they were attempting to verify them through the police departments involved. The woman attempted to flee and an officer blocked the door and physically stopped her from fleeing. During the scuffle, an officer's right thumb was overextended, resulting in pain and soreness. They managed, with much difficulty, to get her into handcuffs and into the cruiser, where she began to yell, scream and use profanity and derogatory language toward officers on scene. The woman's sister continued her yelling and deliberately punched a glass door near an officer, shattering the glass door. Some of the glass struck an officer in the back. Because of the complainant's unsupported claim regarding the chocolate syrup in the gas tank of an unknown vehicle, by an unknown suspect at an unknown location, there was insufficient information to complete a report on the alleged offense. The complainant was charged with resisting arrest, obstructing official business and menacing.

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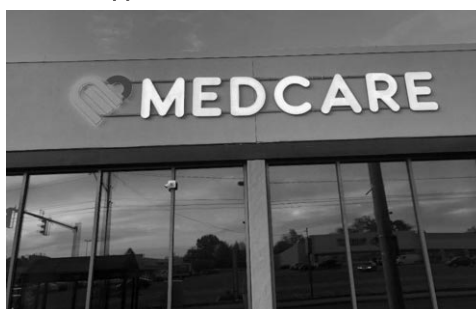
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Annual 'Taste of the Browns' fights hunger in Greater Cleveland area

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Engineering scholarships available

The Engineers Foundation of Ohio (EFO) is offering more than \$34,500 in college scholarships to qualifying engineering students for the 2026-2027 academic year.

To qualify for most EFO scholarships, applicants must be U.S. citizens, permanent residents of the state of Ohio, and be graduating high school seniors admitted to an engineering program approved by the Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology at an Ohio engineering college or Notre Dame. In addition, candidates must meet the minimum academic standards of a SAT score of 600 in math and 500 in reading or composition (or an ACT score of 29 in math and 25 in English), and a 3.0 grade point average on the four-point scale.

Additional criteria apply to some scholarships. For instance, the Lloyd A. Chacey, PE, Memorial Scholarship provides \$2,000 in annual grants to college juniors and seniors who must apply in their sophomore years.

EFO's scholarship brochure, which details the specific criteria for the scholarships offered this year, may be obtained from <https://ohioengineer.com/Scholarship%20Brochure.pdf>. The application may be downloaded from <https://ohioengineer.com/Scholarship%20Application.pdf>.

Arts Reaching Kids program honored by Garfield Heights Council

At last week's Monday meeting of Garfield Heights Council, a resolution was passed to honor and recognize Arts Reaching Kids (ARK), founded by Regina Foster, and expressing gratitude to Freedom Ministries and to Fr. David Domanski of Holy Spirit Church, for bringing this program to the Garfield Heights community.

As stated in the resolution, the mission of ARK is to develop artistic skills through weekly exposure to a variety of classes in visual and performing arts, encourage participation in stimulating and educational arts experiences, teach self-discipline, teamwork, leadership, goal-setting and responsibility, build self-esteem and social skills while providing productive and positive use of out-of-school time, and offer educational and personal support to help students live responsible, informed and productive lives.

ARK first began its classes on June 29, 2021, at Freedom Ministries, starting with bucket drumming and drumline, serving 15 students, and steadily expanded over the following years to include dance, sewing, hair braiding, jewelry making and fragrance arts.

Freedom Ministries served as the original home of ARK and last year transitioned to Holy Spirit Church, where the program continues to flourish and grow.

Ward 1 Councilwoman Stacey Collier, sponsor of the resolution, recognized founder Regina Foster's steadfast commitment to the children she serves at ARK and to the city of Garfield Heights.

The following legislation was also passed by Garfield Heights Council at last week's meeting:

- To revise the codified ordinances of the city by adopting current replacement pages to conform with current state law as mandated by the Ohio Constitution.
- To purchase one 2025 Chevy Tahoe from Preston Chevrolet Kia for use in the Garfield Heights Police Department vehicle fleet at a total cost not to exceed \$55,000.
- To prepare the necessary plans and specifications, per the OHM Advisors proposal, and go out for competitive bids for the Maplerow & E. 126 St. Sewer Separation Project, and authorizing payment of costs through funding by the NEORSD Member Community Infrastructure Program.

The purpose of this project is to eliminate residential basement flooding and property damage, reduce flows to the District's infrastructure for treatment of removing storm water from the currently combined sewer system and improve water quality in area

waterways, and reduce and eliminate property damage to both public infrastructure and private property.

The work will be done in three phases for a total cost of \$274,000, when completed.

- To prepare the necessary plans and specifications and go out for competitive bids for the I-480 Sanitary Sewer Crossing Project and authorizing payment of costs through the NEORSD Member Community Infrastructure Program. The project will be done in three phases for a total cost of \$226,400, when completed.
- To enter into a contract with the Cuyahoga County General Health District to provide health services to the city for the years 2026-2027. The per capita rate for health services is established at \$8.96 for 2026 and \$10.04 for 2027.
- To enter into a contract with Addo Data Services, LTD for technology services for the city at a monthly rate not to exceed \$6,250.00.
- A resolution recognizing September as Suicide Prevention Month and September 10th as World Suicide Prevention Day in the city of Garfield Heights.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Monday, Sept. 22, at 7 p.m.
