## Councilwoman Madden honored in Maple Heights for her years of service

Maple Heights Council met in regular session last Wednesday, Dec. 3, and presented a Resolution of Appreciation to retiring District 5 Councilwoman Tanglyn Madden for her decade of service to the city and her dedication in advocating for its residents.

Retiring Council President Ron Jackson, who has served in this position for the last eight years, stated in his report to council the gratitude he felt to all who have helped him over the years, including Mayor Annette Blackwell, the city directors, members of council and retired Senior Services Director Linda Vopat.

### Legislation passed

The following legislation was passed by council at last Wednesday's meeting:

- Ordinance authorizing the mayor to enter into a professional services Municipal Engineering Consulting Contract with engineer Matthew M. Jones, P.E., assistant engineers Edward J. Hren, P.E. and James T. Shea, P.E., and their engineering firm, Chagrin Valley Engineering, LTD, effective Jan. 1, 2026.

- Ordinance authorizing the mayor to enter into a subscription order form and one-year service agreement for 2026 with Online Solutions LLC (Citizenserve) for 11 users to access and use Citizenserve software in the building department, including setup, training, implementation and data migration, at a total cost of \$27,299.98, with annual service fees of \$19,800 thereafter, and to accept a grant from the First Suburbs Consortium of \$27,299.98 to cover the cost of the first year of the service agreement.

- An ordinance providing a high deductible health insurance plan with a Healthcare Savings Account (HSA) and establishing contribution amounts to the HSA accounts for non-bargaining unit city employees for the year 2026.

- An ordinance amending a section of the city's Fire Prevention Code concerning adoption of the 2025 edition, and future editions of the Ohio Fire Code. Fire Chief Daniel Syden said this legislation is just a formality to insure that the city's fire codes align with those of the State of Ohio.

## Maurer releases Ward 12 Transfer Memo with achievements, recommendations

At the final Cleveland City Council meeting of the term on Monday night, Dec. 1, Councilwoman Rebecca Maurer released her Ward 12 Transfer Memo, summarizing four years of accomplishments, calling for action on key issues like Tanisha's Law, and calling for reforms in operations and oversight of council.

"It has been the honor of my life to serve Ward 12," Councilwoman Maurer said. "While I won't be on council come January, I still firmly believe that Clevelanders deserve a government that is accountable, transparent and actually shows up for people. I released this Transfer Memo as part of my continued commitment to Cleveland."

Maurer emphasized the need for practical, resident-focused work and rebuilding trust with residents. "Council needs to rebuild trust with residents. That means showing up for residents on day-to-day issues and changing the systems at council so that it can be a successful, strong legislative body."

The report is split into three sections. Some key highlights are below:

### I. Wins

Resolved more than 4,600 constituent issues, from street lights to housing emergencies — always rooted in the dignity of every resident.

Cut garbage-bin wait times from 100 days to 10 after exposing service delays in the 2022 Constituent Services Report.

Secured millions for parks, delivering major improvements at Calgary Park, Forest City Park and Stella Walsh, with dollars allocated for Harmody and Warsaw next.

Rebuilt neighborhood infrastructure, including 81 home demolitions, dozens of repaved streets, and a new Commercial Corridor Program that filled vacant storefronts.

### II. Transfers

Lead-safe housing reforms will need to be considered in 2026, including stronger enforcement, faster spending and possible legislative changes.

Political will is what's missing in finalizing Tanisha's Law, creating a citywide crisis-response program that sends help — not handcuffs — to residents in mental health crisis.

Harvard Landfill needs transparency and remediation, after funding was unexpectedly pulled from the project to bring a solar farm to the landfill

### III. Lessons & Structural Recommendations

Strengthen council's internal capacity by adding a Chief of Staff, research staff, and an ombudsperson for resident-facing oversight.

Create independent ward maps to restore public trust and remove political influence from redistricting.

Implement campaign-finance and lobbying clarity to reduce pay-to-play concerns and increase transparency.

Establish an Office of Inspector General for council, ensuring fair, impartial oversight of councilmember conduct.

Councilwoman Maurer closed by reaffirming her commitment to the city. "My title is changing, but my commitment to Cleveland is not. I will continue fighting for a city where residents can see and feel their government working for them."

- Resolution authorizing the mayor to enter into an agreement with Carpenter Marty Transportation to provide professional surveying and engineering services to prepare and file the plat of land owned by the city through its Land Reutilization Program to be dedicated for use as public right of way (two parcels on McCracken Rd.) and a parcel of land on Greenhurst Dr. for the Greenhurst Drive Bridge Demolition Project.

- Resolution authorizing the mayor to enter into a contract with Senior Transportation Connection to conduct the Day-to-Day Call Center, scheduling and dispatch operations of the city's Senior Transit operations for the year 2026 in the amount of \$3,333.33 per month.

- Resolution to purchase Motorola portable radios for the city's fire department in the amount of \$180,042.48, to be paid for through a FEMA grant previously awarded the city.



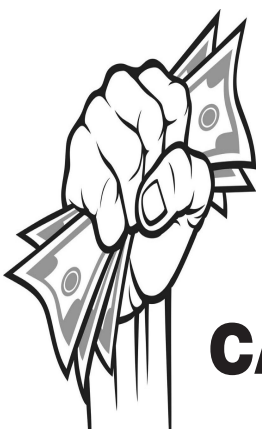

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## Bibb announces 30-day extension of moratorium on utility disconnections

As families continue to face financial strain following the end of the federal government shutdown alongside increased holiday season expenses, Cleveland Mayor Justin M. Bibb and the Department of Public Utilities last week announced a 30-day extension of the moratorium on utility disconnections for nonpayment.

Effective Friday, Nov. 7, 2025, and now extended through Jan. 6, 2026, customers of Cleveland Water and Cleveland Public Power will not face service interruptions due to unpaid bills during this period. Account balances will continue to accrue, but the city is taking this step to ensure residents maintain access to essential services.

"Families are still trying to catch up on bills, juggling holiday expenses, and trying to stay afloat," Mayor Bibb said. This extension is intended to alleviate some of that pressure."

Residents are strongly encouraged to contact the Department of Public Utilities to enroll in a payment arrangement or take advantage of available assistance programs. For more information, please call or visit:

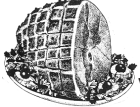

## Garfield Heights Mayor Burke notes anniversary of police officers killed in line of duty December 8, 1994

Mayor Matt Burke, in his report to Garfield Heights Council at Monday night's meeting, remembered the anniversary of the passing of Garfield Heights Patrolmen Michael W. Brown and Robert A. Stefanov, who were killed in the line of duty Dec. 8, 1994, during a vehicle crash during a high-speed pursuit.

"Their memory continues to guide and inspire us," he said. He also mentioned the day was made more poignant for him as he swore in new Patrolman Alejandro Rosa that morning to the city's police force, noting the commitment and sacrifice it takes to serve and how proud he of Garfield's finest.

On a happier note, the mayor welcomed 8th grade members of the government leadership council at Garfield Heights Middle School who attended the meeting as a civics lesson and sat with Burke and members of council at the meeting.

Council President Avery Johnson commented on the two major fires that had happened recently in his Ward 4, and urged residents to call the Garfield Heights Fire Department for free smoke detectors which firemen will also install.

### Legislation passed

- Amended a section of the codified ordinances to adopt the update to the Ohio Fire Code. The city wishes to adopt the most recent edition of the Ohio Fire Code as adopted by the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of State Fire Marshal, and to automatically incorporate future revisions unless otherwise amended by Council.
- Approved a Memorandum of Understanding between the city and the Garfield Heights City School District for school resource officers, fostering a positive police presence in Garfield Heights schools. The agreement is to hire two school resource officers, with the school district paying 50% of all SRO costs.
- Made final appropriations for current expenditures of the city for fiscal year ending Dec. 31, 2025.
- Made appropriations for current expenditures of the city for fiscal year ending Dec. 31, 2026.
- Adopted an updated City of Garfield Heights Employee Handbook and established its effective date. The city maintains an Employee Handbook to provide policies, procedures and standards for all city employees. The current Employee Handbook has not been comprehensively updated since 2004. Therefore council finds it necessary to adopt an updated Handbook to ensure that city policies comply with applicable law and reflect best practices in municipal administration.
- Declared the improvement to certain parcels of real property on Turney Rd., within the city to be a public purpose and exempt from taxation.
- Entered into a contract with Zupka & Associates to provide the city with basic general purpose external financial statements for the year 2025, at an estimated cost of \$22,220.00. The city requires the preparation of these annual financial statements for budgeting, reporting and fiscal management purposes.
- Authorized the mayor to apply for grant funding for its senior services program through the Western Reserve Area Agency on Aging for congregate and home-delivered meals for the years 2026 and 2027.
- Applied for the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services, Violent Crime Reduction Grant Program for 2026. The city will apply for the grant funds for purchase of software and equipment, as well as staffing needs for the Garfield Heights Police Department.

The next regular meeting of council will be held Monday, Dec. 22.

# Community police reports

## Garfield Heights

### Fleeing & Eluding

On Nov. 26, at 8:07 a.m., an officer saw a 2000 blue Honda going east on I480 traveling at a high rate of speed, actually passing the officer's marked cruiser. The car was weaving in and out of traffic with no signaling the lane changes. A traffic stop was attempted near the overpass in Maple Heights, and the car briefly pulled over on the right shoulder, but then continued east on I480 reaching speeds of 100 mph. The officer was able to catch up to the suspect vehicle enough to get the plate information, but never observed the car's driver. The vehicle passed slower traffic on the right berm approaching the Warrensville exit on I480 and the pursuit was self-terminated. The Brook Park PD dispatch was contacted for any valid phone numbers for the registered owner with negative results. The report was forwarded to records to be entered as a felony vehicle. During the investigation, GHPD was contacted by a civilian who had been traveling near the pursuit. The civilian saw the driver of the fleeing vehicle throw an unknown object out of the window, striking the passenger side of the car and causing damage. Report forwarded to the Traffic Enforcement Unit.

**Follow-up:** On Dec. 1, GHPD officers responded to a business on Richmond Rd. in Bedford Heights, to follow up regarding the fleeing and eluding incident. Detectives had been monitoring the license-plate reader and located a hit on the blue Honda in the area. Officers had prior knowledge that the owner of the Honda worked at the Richmond Rd. business. Detectives saw the blue Honda CR-V parked on the side of the building with the engine running and headlights on, although the car was unoccupied. A short time later the owner came out of the building and said the car belonged to him.

When asked about the Nov. 26 incident, he told police he had been speeding alongside another vehicle and believed a police car was behind him, so he fled. He gave permission for his vehicle to be searched, and police found several bags of marijuana but not other contraband. Due to his cooperation it was determined he would be released on scene and his car would not be towed. He was released from custody and was told he would be contacted if a warrant was issued for his arrest. Charges for fleeing and eluding forwarded to prosecutor.

### Shots Fired

On Nov. 26, at 8:33 p.m., officers responded to the 10600 block of S. Highland Ave. for shots fired. Officers located two spent casings in the roadway in front of the driveways of two S. Highland homes. A married couple who are renters there had flagged police down when they arrived. They said they were in the kitchen cooking dinner for Thanksgiving when they heard at least four shots being fired outside near their driveway. When the firing stopped they went outside and found their front porch windows damaged with bullet holes. No one inside was hurt and the couple had no idea who would have done this. All evidence gathered will be forwarded to the Detective Bureau.

### Animal Cruelty

On Nov. 28, at 12:27 p.m., police were dispatched to the 13600 block of Silver Rd., for a report of the sound of barking dogs coming from a U-Haul truck. Two callers said they had heard the barking for several days. Police saw the commercial U-Haul truck with Arizona plates parked on the road. It was turned off and no one was inside the cab. After speaking with an area resident the officer returned to the U-Haul and heard barking coming from it. The officer's cruiser thermostat read 27 degrees and there was heavy snowfall and wind. The officer found three dogs inside the truck, two in one cage and the third in another. There was no heating element in the truck and no food or water inside the cages. The animal warden was called to take possession of the dogs as their owner could not be located. A resident in the area told the officer they had seen the truck parked in the same spot since Monday, heard barking and saw a middle-aged female come out of a home on Silver Rd. from time to time and go into the back of the U-Haul. As the animal warden arrived on scene, he and the officer began taking the dogs from the U-Haul and into the dog warden's vehicle. At that time a man and woman came out of a Silver Rd. residence and asked what they were doing with their dogs. The officer explained they were seizing the dogs due to them being neglected. The man said he had been evicted from his last residence and was in the process of moving. The dogs were taken to the Garfield Heights animal shelter where they were provided food and shelter. The male suspect was given a citation for parking a commercial vehicle on the roadway. The report will be forwarded to the Garfield Heights prosecutor for a ruling of charges against the couple.

### Felonious Assault

On Dec. 4, at 10:34 a.m., police responded to Marymount Hospital for a male with a gunshot wound. GHPD officers met with Cleveland Clinic police officers who said the man had been dropped off in a red Nissan which immediately left the scene. They were able to give them the plate number. Police met with the victim, who was being treated by emergency room staff for a gunshot wound to his left thigh. He was read his Miranda rights and told officers he did not wish to discuss the incident. He only said the incident occurred on Broadway Ave., near Wendy's, possibly in the area of Union Ave. in Cleveland. He said a friend had picked him up and dropped him off at Marymount. Cleveland police were advised of the incident. Due to the victim's lack of cooperation, officers do not have enough information to investigate further.

## Winter heating assistance

The Ohio Department of Development and the Cuyahoga County Division of Senior and Adult Services want to remind older Ohioans that assistance is available to help with their home energy bills.

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps Ohioans at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a household of up to eight members and 60% of

State Median Income for a household of nine or more members to pay their heating bills.

Applied directly to the customer's utility or bulk fuel bill, the benefit can help manage heating costs. Older Ohioans may go to their local Area Agency on Aging office for help with assembling the required documents and completing their HEAP application. They may also visit [www.energyhelp.ohio.gov](http://www.energyhelp.ohio.gov) to apply online or to download a copy of the application.

HEAP benefits are applied to an individual's energy bill after Jan. 1. Applications for the HEAP program must be received by May 31, 2026.
