Cleveland Public Library celebrates groundbreaking for reimagined Fleet branch in Slavic Village

Cleveland Public Library marked a major milestone in the future of its Fleet Campus with a groundbreaking ceremony last Friday morning, officially launching construction on the reimagined neighborhood library in Cleveland's Slavic Village community.

More than 100 community members, elected officials, project partners and excited library supporters attended the event to celebrate the beginning of a transformative project that will create a modern, welcoming community hub for residents of all ages.

"Cleveland is a city that loves its libraries, and our residents deserve spaces that match that passion," said Felton Thomas, Jr., director and CEO of Cleveland Public Library. "The reimagined Fleet Campus fulfills our promise to invest in state-of-the-art neighborhood libraries that serve as centers of learning, innovation and community. We are excited to begin this next chapter and create a campus that will serve generations to come."

Cuyahoga County Central Committee member Tony Brancatelli also participated in the groundbreaking ceremonies and said, "This is an amazing investment in our community and will be an asset for our neighborhood for the next 50 years."

About Fleet Campus reimagined

Made possible through generous support from the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Foundation, the reimagined Fleet Campus will provide enhanced spaces designed to meet the evolving needs of the community. Planned features include a state-of-the-art digital innovation computer lab with job coaching sessions and workforce development resources, expanded meeting and gathering spaces, an interactive children's area for ages 0-12, and flexible community-focused spaces for learning, collaboration and programming.

The renovation is being led by Bialosky and is part of Cleveland Public Library's Facilities Master Plan, a 10-year initiative to build and renovate neighborhood libraries across the city to improve access, services and the overall visitor experience.

During the renovation, patrons can access library materials and services at the library's South Campus, 3096 Scranton Rd., Cleveland, OH 44113. Additional project updates will be shared at cpl.org as construction progresses.

All are invited to the Juneteenth celebration on Friday, June 19, at Stafford Park in Maple Heights, from 3 to 7 p.m., which will feature African drumming and dancing, live music and entertainment, fun activities for the kids, and free hot dogs, chips and water, while supplies last.

State Rep. Darnell Brewer has announced the passage of Senate Bill 450, which includes funding for Cleveland area projects, and includes a park improvement project for Garfield Heights.

Mayor Matt Burke expressed gratitude to State Rep. Darnell Brewer and State Senator Kent Smith for their continued support of the city's efforts to improve park spaces.

"Two years ago, we finalized our Parks Master Plan and began implementing the priorities identified by our residents through numerous public engagement meetings," Burke said. "Thanks to the efforts of these two legislators, who represent our city in the State House, Garfield Heights will receive \$150,000 in funding for a Parks and Recreation project. I thank them for their diligence and unwavering support of the voices of Garfield Heights residents."

The state bill allocates nearly \$4 billion in funding for the maintenance, renovation and construction of state-owned infrastructure including colleges, universities, school districts and other community projects throughout Ohio. Rep. Brewer thanked the many organizations that worked with his office to bring state funding back to Northeast Ohio.

"These investments will contribute to real improvements in our region," Brewer said. "I am especially excited to see how these funds will be put to use in District 22. We have been awarded funding to go towards local park improvements, economic development, community health initiatives and workforce support."

Historic return: Cleveland area's first full-service Temple of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints to open in Independence; open house set



can strengthen our faith. That's why we sacrificed so much and so often to go to the temples in other cities," said Sarah Jackson, lifelong Kirtland, Ohio member. "You made the drive. You made the sacrifice. Because it mattered."

That's why the announcement of a Cleveland-area temple carries such emotional weight. While the historic Kirtland Temple remains a cherished landmark, drawing 100,000 visitors each year, it was not designed for the full range of today's temple worship practices. The new temple represents something different: access, consistency

and a deeply personal connection to faith in Jesus Christ.

Globally, the Church has more than 200 operating temples.

For the first time, church members from Akron to Cleveland, Sandusky to Ashtabula will have a nearby temple in their own community, eliminating the need for the long journeys that have defined generations of worshippers.

Prior to the temple's dedication, the public is invited to attend free open houses at the temple in Independence, to be held Monday through Friday, noon to 7

p.m., and on Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., from June 18 through July 3, excluding Sundays, offering a rare opportunity to tour the

temple and learn more about its purpose, symbolism and the beliefs of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

For members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Northeast Ohio, a long-awaited event will come to fruition later this summer, which connects the region's sacred past to a deeply meaningful future.

What started in Kirtland nearly 200 years ago is coming home to the Greater Cleveland area with the August 16th dedication of the Cleveland, Ohio Temple, located at 5997 Brecksville Rd., in Independence.

For decades members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Northeast Ohio have traveled great distances to participate in temple worship, journeying to locations such as Salt Lake City, Utah, Washington D.C. and even Toronto, Canada. These trips often required hours of driving, expensive overnight stays, and careful planning just to attend.

"Our worship in the temple

Nearly two centuries ago, early church members established the faith's headquarters in Kirtland, Ohio. There they built the Kirtland Temple. Today that legacy comes full circle. What started in Kirtland is coming home to Cleveland.

In April 2023, Church President Russel Nelson announced plans for a new temple in the Cleveland area. For the past two years construction of the edifice has been ongoing in Independence. It will become the first full-service temple in close proximity for local members.

Bedford Heights Council news

Bedford Heights City Council met on Tuesday, June 2, and heard a first reading for an ordinance to provide Tax Increment Financing (TIF), an economic development tool to finance public infrastructure improvements and, in certain circumstances, residential rehabilitation, for an assisted living facility in the city.

The facility, Silver Birch of Bedford Heights, plans to open in the fall and is located at 24781 Columbus Rd. This ordinance was passed to go to a second reading at a future meeting.

Also at the June 2 meeting, an ordinance was passed authorizing the appointment of a part-time, non-exempt systems support technician for the Information Technology

Department to support city-wide IT operations. The compensation for the part-time IT position would be \$24 per hour.

A resolution was also passed authorizing the city to apply for and accept funding through the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Natureworks Grant program for improvements to Reed Park, including public engagement efforts.

The city seeks to submit a grant request of \$150,000 to support restoration and modernization of Reed Park, one of the city's most important outdoor recreational assets, according to the legislation.

The city would provide the required match of 25% local contribution amounting to approximately \$50,000 of the total project investment.

Assist Other Departments

On June 4, at 1:14 p.m., officers received a BOLO (Be On the Look Out) from Cleveland PD about a male driving a cream-colored GMC Yukon who had allegedly just shot up three houses in the Third District. The vehicle last hit on Flock going south on Broadway Ave., towards Park Dr. about 12:49 p.m. A GHPD officer located the vehicle parked in front of the Metro PCS, 5064 Turney Rd. After parking on Park Heights and deploying his patrol rifle, the officer took cover on the side of the building to maintain a visual. A perimeter was created around the plaza and another officer deployed stop sticks under the vehicle. The suspect was found sitting inside Metro PCS with his back turned. He was taken into custody without incident. Officers observed two handguns in plain view on the front passenger seat of the GMC. CPD was notified and took custody of the suspect.

Breaking and Entering

On June 4, at 5:24 a.m., officers were notified of an alarm drop at Blaze Exotic Smoke Shop, 5350 Turney Rd. The front glass door was broken and a witness said they saw a male leaving the parking lot area. They said the male was carrying a book bag while jogging across Turney Rd., then quickly placed the bag on his back and ran east through the BP gas station and was last observed going east on Granger Rd. Police canvassed the area but did not locate a suspect. The owner of the smoke shop came on scene and told police he was unsure if anything had been stolen as products were thrown off the shelves and moved. The business did have security cameras but were inaccessible at the time. Report forwarded to the Detective Bureau.

Traffic Offense- Fleeing

On June 6, at 3:37 p.m., police patrolling in a cruiser saw a grey Kia sedan traveling east on Christine Ave., from E. 131 St., which failed to stop behind the stop bar at the stop sign on Christine Ave. and E. 136 St., and also at Christine and E. 139 St. It also had illegal window tint. Officers initiated a traffic stop but the vehicle took off. Officers intended to PIT the suspect vehicle at E. 139 St. and Caine Rd., but the driver of the vehicle lost control at the intersection of Caine Ave., and went off the road over the front lawn of a house on Caine, hitting several poles, branches, parking blocks and other debris in the lawn which kicked up a lot of dust. The vehicle then crashed into a telephone pole in front of the Caine Ave. home. To prevent his vehicle from hitting the suspect vehicle, an officer attempted to maneuver his car out of the way and

slipped on the grass of the front lawn and his push bumper came to rest against the suspect vehicle's left side. Two males, one of whom was the driver, then got out of the car and ran down Caine Ave. A patrolman gave chase and a third passenger who remained in the vehicle was patted down for weapons and secured in a cruiser. The other two suspects who ran were not located, although a perimeter had been established and a drone deployed. The man secured in the cruiser was uncooperative and would not give the names of the other two suspects at large. No contraband was found in the car and he was released on scene.

Resisting Arrest

On June 12, at about midnight, officers on a routine patrol going north on Turney Rd., and stopped at a light near Langton Ave., saw the driver of a car directly in front of them throw a large beverage cup and its contents out the driver's side window. When the light turned green the vehicle accelerated at a high rate of speed, about 63 mph, and continued north. Due to the city's littering ordinance and the erratic driving behavior, a traffic stop was initiated and the suspect vehicle stopped near Garfield Blvd. One of the officers talked with the driver while the other retrieved an unsecured handgun with an extended magazine from the back seat through the open passenger rear window. Police asked the driver to exit the vehicle but he refused and locked the door. One of the officers reached through the window and unlocked the door and opened it. Officers were finally able to pull the driver out of the car and after resisting being handcuffed, he was secured and placed in the rear of the patrol car. The passenger was asked to exit the vehicle and sit on the curb, to which she complied. Police saw an open container in plain view on the driver's side floorboard, and found an open can of alcohol along with an additional handgun magazine near the center console. The driver was placed under arrest for obstructing official business and resisting arrest and

taken to city jail.

Felonious Assault

On June 13, at 2:33 a.m., police arrived at Aries bar, 4619 Warner Rd., for a call that shots had been fired in the parking lot of the business and someone had shot into a black vehicle that fled the area. Bystanders told officers that the shooting happened outside the parking lot across from the bar. While police were looking for spent casings or other evidence, dispatch advised that a male had just been dropped off at Marymount Hospital with a gunshot wound. Cleveland Clinic officers said a black Kia had dropped the male off and fled. Officers went to Marymount and found the victim in stable condition. He had been shot in the left knee and he was being prepared to be taken to Hillcrest Hospital. The victim told officers he was walking to Aries through the parking lot when he heard a single shot go off and realized he had been hit in the knee. He said he got back in his black Kia and his girl drove him to the hospital. He told officers he didn't know her name, she was "just from the neighborhood." He was unable to provide any further information about the incident. The report was referred to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

Reynolds resigns as G.H. Schools superintendent

Garfield Heights Schools Superintendent Dr. Richard D. Reynolds has announced his departure from his position and said he is returning to the southern part of the country he calls home.

He said he is leaving the Garfield Heights Schools with a sense of accomplishment and in the good, capable hands of Interim Superintendent Samuel Vawters.
