Bedford Heights Council notes from Sept. 1 meeting

The following legislation was passed by Bedford Heights Council at its meeting on Sept. 1, 2026:

- Ordinance authorizing the purchase of a 2026 Western Star 47X truck from Valley Truck Centers at a cost of \$301,544 for use by the service department.

- Resolution objecting to the renewal of Ohio D-5 and D-6 liquor permits held by HammerG LLC for the premises known as Uptown Ultra Sports Lounge, 23333 Aurora Rd., Bedford Heights, and requesting a hearing.

- An ordinance adopting the tax budget of the city of Bedford Heights for fiscal year beginning Jan. 1, 2027, and submitting it to the fiscal officer of Cuyahoga County.

- An ordinance certifying delinquent sewer charges to the Cuyahoga County fiscal officer for collection.

- An ordinance certifying grass cutting assessments to the Cuyahoga County fiscal officer for collection.

- An ordinance enacted by the city of Bedford Heights for reconstruction improvements of Bartlett Rd., from Columbus Rd. to Rockside Rd., in cooperation with Cuyahoga County.

Residential Key Lock Box Program approved by Maple Hts. Council for fire department use during house fires, live-saving emergencies

Upon the recommendation of Fire Chief Daniel Syten and city council's Public Safety Committee, Maple Heights Council, at its regular meeting last Wednesday, passed an ordinance to update rules for key lock boxes on certain structures within the city and to provide for a voluntary Residential Key Lock Box Program for owners of single-family and two-family dwellings. City officials at the council meeting pointed out that this program can be of special benefit to the city's senior citizens.

Under the newly enacted Residential Key Lock Box Program, owners of single-family and two-family dwellings may, at the owner's sole discretion, purchase a key lock box through a vendor that has been designated and approved by the fire chief. All those participating in the program grant the Division of Fire personnel, and other first responders, pre-authorized entry to the dwelling in the event of an emergency for live-saving or firefighting purposes.

A residential emergency lock box securely stores a key to your home in a weather-resistant box that can only be opened by the Maple Heights Fire Department using a department-issued key. This allows firefighters and para-

medics to enter your home without causing damage when you are unable to answer the door during an emergency. During life-threatening emergencies such as a working house fire, firefighters may need to force entry if doing so is the quickest and safest option.

Residents interested in purchasing a lock box and participating in the program are asked to contact the Maple Heights Fire Department at 216-662-6035, ext. 2 before ordering so that fire officials can answer any questions residents may have and even visit their home to recommend the best lock box option. After residents receive their lock box, fire officials will install the lock box and place keys inside.

The legislation also requires key lock boxes be located at the following locations:

- (1) Any structure, except single-family and two-family dwellings, protected in whole or part by a fire alarm, sprinkler and/or suppression system.

- (2) Multi-family residential structures that have restricted access through locked doors and have a common corridor for access to the living units.

Photography initiative to assist in property appraisals throughout Cuyahoga County

The Cuyahoga County Fiscal Office is launching an initiative to update exterior photographs of properties and parcels throughout Cuyahoga County as part of its ongoing efforts to maintain current and accurate information. Residents may see contractor vehicles operating in neighborhoods and communities countywide as the project progresses.

"Maintaining accurate and up-to-date property information is essential to operating a fair and efficient appraisal process," said Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer Michael Chambers. "This technology allows the county to document property conditions more consistently while minimizing disruption to residents."

Cyclomedia Technologies, Inc., the contractor working on behalf of Cuyahoga County, will operate vehicles with mounted cameras that will photograph property exteriors from public streets, and in some cases, driveways. All images containing identifiable faces or license plates will be blurred to protect privacy.

The images collected will help to document the overall condition of properties, streets and roads, and will become part of the official property record. The images will be used by the Fiscal Office to make the valuation process more efficient.

All Cyclomedia vehicles deployed to collect images for

this initiative will be clearly marked with Cyclomedia logos. In addition, contractors working in the field will carry photo identification along with a letter of authorization from Cuyahoga County.

Assist Other Departments

•On Aug. 25, at 9:32 p.m., GHPD was notified to search for a vehicle in connection with an armed robbery out of Brook Park PD. The vehicle was located by Flock cameras going east on Broadway near the city limits. An officer observed the suspect vehicle still traveling east on Broadway. Eventually, near the intersection of Broadway and Grant Ave., several Bedford PD units assisted in stopping the vehicle, detaining three subjects and the discovery of a loaded firearm without incident.

•On Sept. 1, at about 11:41 a.m., officers were involved in the pursuit of a 2020 Jeep Cherokee reported stolen during an aggravated robbery in Cleveland. GHPD officers were advised while on patrol that Bedford PD was pursuing a vehicle through Maple Heights and approaching Garfield Heights, and when the pursuit traveled south onto E. 141 St., GHPD officers joined the chase. The pursuit continued west on Peese Ave., until the vehicle entered Garfield Heights on Bangor Ave., before turning north onto E. 135 St. The GHPD unit eventually became the primary pursuing unit as they traveled north on E. 135 St., approaching Granger Rd. The unit began closing the distance between the cruiser and the Jeep in preparation for a PIT maneuver. The Jeep continued going at a high

rate of speed, eventually driving in the center of the road and narrowly missing passing motorists.

The GHPD unit's PIT maneuver was unsuccessful and the driver regained control and continued east on Libby Rd., toward Broadway, driving left of center at a high rate of speed. The vehicle eventually lost control at Warrensville Center Rd. and struck an uninvolved motorist who was stopped at a stop sign while exiting the Giant Eagle parking lot. Both occupants of the vehicle immediately got out and fled north on foot. Both occupants were caught and transported to jail by officers from an assisting jurisdiction. Two firearms were recovered and Cleveland PD took possession at the scene.

Assault

On Aug. 27, at 10:46 p.m., police arrived at Iconic Ultra Lounge, 4912 Turney Rd., for a report of an assault. The victim told officers she went to the Iconic Ultra, and as she walked into the business she was struck by two known females and possibly others. She said she was punched in the face and her hair was pulled. She did not have any observable injuries at the time. The fight was broken up by unknown male and the victim left the bar. She told police she wanted to prosecute for the assault. Report will be forwarded to the prosecutor for review.

Theft

On Aug. 29, about 7:10 p.m., officers arrived at Marc's, 12650 Rockside Rd., for a report of theft. The store manager told them that between 8-10 juveniles came into the store, filled their backpacks with miscellaneous food items and ran in different directions when the manager confronted them. He was able to briefly stop one female juvenile, and she dropped her backpack and ran. The backpack contained a soda and candy. Camera footage will be reviewed.

Traffic Offense-Fleeing

On Aug. 30, at about 3:14 a.m., GHPD units were alerted via FLOCK cameras that a felony vehicle was traveling west on McCracken Rd. near Johnston Parkway. They also learned the possible driver's name who has several felony warrants for rape through the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office and is known to possess a firearm. At about 3:39 a.m., a patrolman observed the suspect vehicle traveling south on E. 143 St., near Saybrook Ave., without lights on. Officers followed the vehicle east on Ohio Ave., then north on E. 147 St., where police attempted a traffic stop, but the vehicle fled and a pursuit followed. During the four-minute pursuit speeds reached up to 75 mph, and the suspect vehicle was not stopping for stop signs and at times driving on the wrong side of the road. When the vehicle was going north on E. 143 St., approaching Caine Ave., it appeared the driver did not negotiate the west turn onto Caine Ave. successfully due to excessive speeds and crashed into a building at 14215 Caine. Officers at gunpoint ordered the driver to show his hands, then he exited the vehicle and was placed under arrest. Cleveland EMS responded and took the suspect to Marymount Hospital for treatment. Before being transported, he began fighting with paramedics and a GHPD officer. After a brief struggle the officer secured him to the medical cot. After being discharged from the hospital, the suspect was taken to city jail and charged with fleeing and eluding, and issued traffic citations for driving under suspension, stop signs, no seatbelt and no required lights. Detective Bureau will follow-up.

Property Damage-Non-Criminal

On Sept. 3, an officer met a complainant in the police lobby for a property damage report. He told the officer that on or about Aug. 21, 2026, at about 2 p.m., he drove his black Cadillac Escalade south on Warner Rd., in front of Karma Construction, 5151 Warner Rd. He noticed that the road was wet and muddy due to large heavy-duty trucks entering and leaving the business at Karma. The complainant said he took his car through a car wash several times to remove the dirt and mud on it, but there was a layer of a substance on the bottom and undercarriage of his vehicle that would not come off. He then took his vehicle to a mechanic/detail shop and was told by the mechanic that the substance might be concrete or cement and would be extremely difficult to remove, requiring hours of labor. The complainant was provided with a police report number.

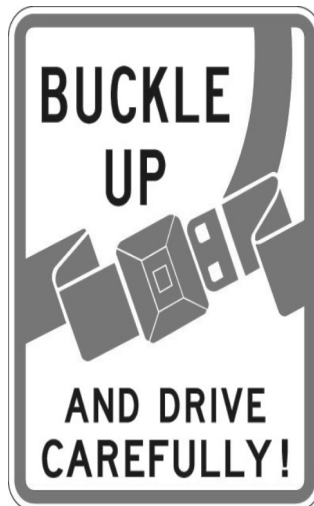

(3) Any structure that the fire chief or fire protection officer determines is unduly difficult to access because of secured openings or where immediate access is necessary for life saving and fire fighting purposes.

Legislation also passed

The following legislation was also passed by council at its meeting last Wednesday:

- Accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the Cuyahoga County fiscal officer.

- Authorizing the city to participate in a regional application with Bedford, Garfield Heights, Oakwood, Solon and Valley View for a 2025 Assistance to Firefighters Grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency for operations and safety equipment. The mayor and fire chief have recommended that the city participate in the application for the purpose of securing 21 self-contained breathing apparatus and 2 Rapid Intervention Team kits, with an estimated equipment cost of \$326,400, and an estimated match by the city of Maple Heights of \$32,640, covering the 10% match the city would be responsible for if the award is granted.

- Certifying to the Cuyahoga County fiscal officer the sums due to the city of Maple Heights for boarding up houses and other unsafe structures when the structure owner has failed to reimburse the city. The county fiscal officer will place a lien on such lots in the city to be collected as are other taxes and returned to the General Fund of the city.

- Declaring the necessity of assessing the expense of garbage and rubbish collection and disposal within the city of Maple Heights and certifying to the county fiscal officer the costs due to the city for garbage and rubbish collections.

The finance director has determined that the applicable monthly rate for 2027 for garbage and rubbish collections will be \$19.35 per residential unit and \$9.98 for each residential unit for qualified residents with a Homestead Exemption as of June 1, 2026. These charges will be added to the tax duplicate and collected in the next collection year.

- Certifying to the county fiscal officer the sums due to the city of Maple Heights for weed and grass control when owners have failed to pay the city the sums due for this service. The Cuyahoga County fiscal officer will place a lien on such lots in the city to be collected as are other taxes and returned to the city's General Fund.

- Entering into an Agreement of Cooperation with Cuyahoga County where the county agrees to contribute 50% of the unfunded portion of the actual cost of construction, construction engineering, construction administration and construction inspection, up to a maximum of \$230,000, for the resurfacing of Schreiber Rd., from the west corporation line to Dunham Rd.

- Authorizing the mayor to apply for funding and execute an agreement with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District for Community Cost-Share Program funds for the 14200 Valley Ranch Dr. Storm Sewer Outfall Repair Project design in the city of Maple Heights.

The service director and the city engineer have informed the mayor that storm sewer outfall and appurtenant channel protection at 14200 Valley Ranch Dr. is in a state of disrepair which is causing erosion on the existing hillside and requires significant repair to eliminate the ongoing erosion and the potential for the collapse of the hillside which would result in the release of soil, sediment and other pollutants into the receiving stream.

Passed for third reading

A resolution authorizing the mayor to enter into a Professional Planning Services Agreement with the Cuyahoga County Planning Commission for the development and initial adoption of a unified zoning code in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.

County Planning has convened the Cuyahoga County Unified Zoning Code Consortium, a collaborative body of participating municipalities, of which Maple Heights is a founding member, designed to modernize zoning regulations and unlock development opportunities while preserving local administrative authority.

Mayor's Report

During her Mayor's Report at council last week, Mayor Annette Blackwell said she was proud to announce that Farmer Jones Indoor Market, 16701 Broadway Ave., in Maple Heights, operated by the Rid-All Green Partnership, was named the Best Indoor Market in Cuyahoga County for 2026.

She noted it was a "huge award" and congratulated the market on its achievement.

Chief's Report

On a more somber note, Police Chief Todd Hansen told council that his department had averaged 113 calls a day for the month of August, 2026, the highest one month total ever in Maple Heights. The chief also noted that the MHPD had received 27,400 calls for the year 2026 so far and is on track to have the highest yearly call volume in history.

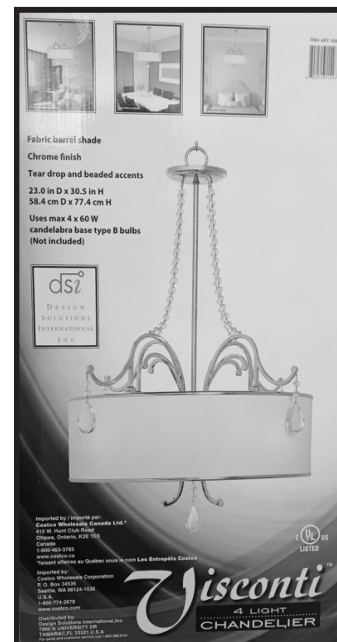
